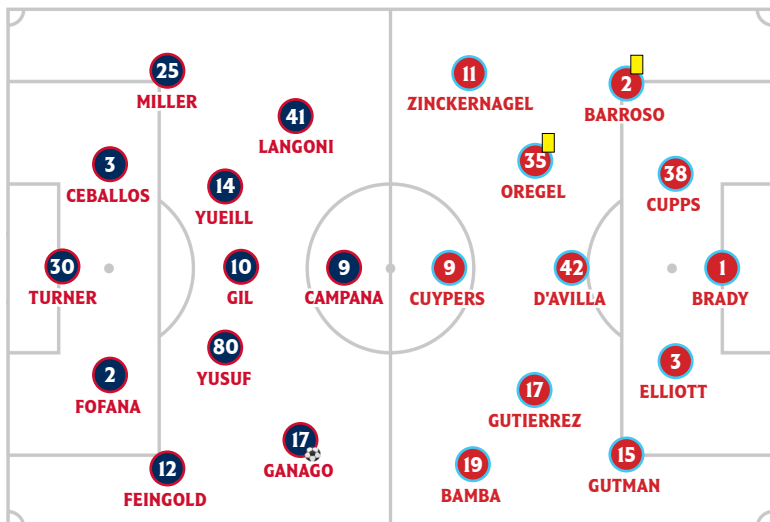

- Gonzalez** played under Revolution Sporting Director **Curt Onalfo**, who was the Galaxy's assistant coach from 2011 to 2016. Together, they helped lead the Galaxy to three MLS Cup championships (2011, 2012, 2014) and two Supporters' Shield titles (2010, 2011).
- Gonzalez** played for the United States Men's National Team with Revolution goalkeeper **Alex Bono** and Revolution Midfielder **Matt Polster** in 2018 and with Revolution midfielder **Jackson Yueill** in 2019.
- Chicago midfielder **Kellyn Acosta** also played for the United States U-18 Men's National team with **Bono** in 2012 and on the United States U-23 Men's National Team with **Polster** in 2016.
- Acosta** was also on United States Men's National Team with teammates **Bono** and **Polster** in 2018, with **Yueill** from 2019-2021 and with Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner** from 2021-23.

Gil set the club's regular season assists record on April 19, 2025. With a brace on March 29 against the New York Red Bulls, Gil became the eighth player in club history to score 40 MLS goals, and the fourth Revolution player to tally 40 goals and 40 assists in regular season play. With his team-best 10 helpers in 2024, Gil became the only Revolution player to lead the club in assists in four consecutive seasons (2021-24). THE RETURN: GK MATT TURNER BACK IN NEW ENGLAND

U.S. international goalkeeper **Matt Turner** returned to the New England Revolution on loan from French Ligue 1 club Olympique Lyonnais through June 30, 2026, with an option to purchase. Turner will be a Designated Player on New England's roster for the remainder of the 2025 MLS season, and will be a TAM-eligible player in 2026.

The goalkeeper has won two of his first three starts since returning in early August, most recently recording five saves in a 2-1 victory at Columbus. In his debut on August 9, Turner surpassed 10,000 minutes played across all competitions for New England. Since making his MLS debut in 2018, Matt Turner holds New England's club record for goalkeeper win percentage with a .594 mark while his 45 wins rank third in club annals. His next victory will mark his 50th for New England in all competitions, and will also match **Bobby Shuttleworth** (46) for the second-most MLS victories in Revolution history.

Before departing for Europe in June 2022, the Park Ridge, N.J. native spent seven seasons with the New England Revolution. In his last full season stateside before transferring to Arsenal, Turner won 2021 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year and MLS Best XI honors, helping New England to the club's first Supporters' Shield title.

Turner has ranked atop the charts in several advanced and traditional statistical categories throughout his MLS tenure. For his MLS career, Turner has prevented 27.45 goals, according to American Soccer Analysis, by far the best total in MLS since the statistic has been tracked (2013). Turner accumulated that impressive total despite playing only six seasons and seeing nearly 10,000 fewer minutes of action than the next four closest players.

TOMÁS CHANCALAY AMONG LEAGUE'S BEST SHOOTERS

Revolution forward **Tomás Chancalay** made his return to action on April 12, appearing in 20 matches with nine starts so far in 2025 and tallying four goals after nearly a year sidelined with a knee injury. In his first MLS start in 364 days on May 24 at Sporting Kansas City, Chancalay scored his first goal of the regular season. Since the start of 2023, Chancalay is tied for the third-most shots per 90 minutes among active MLS forwards:

ALHASSAN YUSUF COVERING GROUND

Revolution midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** has been a consistent starter since joining New England last August from Belgian side Royal Antwerp FC. Following his arrival stateside, the Nigerian midfielder has quickly become a centerpiece in Caleb Porter's squad.

To date in 2025, Yusuf has started all 28 regular season matches for New England, one of two Revs players to do so along with Carles Gil. The Nigeria international has recorded one goal and one assist while playing all but five minutes. Yusuf is among the most active players not just on the Revolution roster but in MLS overall. So far this season, Yusuf ranks in the top five among all MLS outfield players in distance covered:

REVOLUTION ACQUIRE U22 ISRAELI FORWARD DOR TURGEMAN

The New England Revolution acquired Israeli forward **Dor Turgeman** from Maccabi Tel Aviv using Major League Soccer's U22 Initiative on August 20. Turgeman has been signed through the 2028 MLS season, with a club option for 2029, and will join New England after the receipt of his P-1 visa and International Transfer Certificate (ITC).

Turgeman, 21, is a two-time Israeli champion and Israeli Super Cup winner with Maccabi Tel Aviv FC, who also owns 10 senior caps with the Israel Men's National Team. With Maccabi, he has recorded 32 goals and 10 assists in 114 appearances, including 25 tallies in Israel's first division. In the 2024-25 season, he logged 16 goals and three helpers in 32 games as Tel Aviv won its second consecutive league title. Turgeman also boasts five goals and five assists in European competition across the Europa League, Europa League Qualifying, and UEFA Conference League Qualifying.

A native of Ashdod, Israel, Turgeman made his senior international debut in September 2023 in European Qualifying action against Romania. Earlier this year, he recorded his first goal for Israel in a FIFA World Cup Qualifier against Norway, adding his first assist in the next match against Estonia. In total, he has started seven of his 10 senior appearances, playing six times in European qualifiers and once in UEFA Nations League A.

TEAM NOTES

REVS NEARING DOUBLE-DIGIT SHUTOUTS

The Revolution are closing in on double-digit shutouts for the fifth time in club history. Much of that success can be attributed to New England limiting the amount of shots on target and quality chances from their opponents. During the 2025 campaign, New England is tied for the fifth-most clean sheets in MLS this season.

The Revs have held opponents to the lowest shooting accuracy in the league this season, with just 28.3 percent of attempts on target. Additionally, New England's 124 blocked shots rank second in MLS.

FOFANA AMONG LEAGUE-LEADING TACKLERS

Mali international center back **Mamadou Fofana** was named to the MLS Team of the Matchday after a strong performance on August 23 at Columbus, collecting his first MLS assist. The defender has started all 26 of his appearances to date in MLS this year, including all nine shutouts, and has been a steady presence along New England's backline collecting a team-leading 141 clearances.

Among MLS defenders this season, Fofana is second with 102 combined tackles and interceptions - the seventh-best total among all outfield players leaguewide. Fofana also ranks fifth in MLS with 25 blocked shots, and his 47 total blocked shots and passes are tied for second-best leaguewide.

PEYTON MILLER MARKS ONE YEAR SINCE MLS DEBUT

Left back **Peyton Miller** recorded his first goal-and-assist performance in MLS, scoring his first professional goal, a game-winner, in a 3-0 victory at CF Montreal on May 31. Miller, now 17, is building on an impressive debut season in 2024 that saw him make 10 MLS appearances, with eight starts. He earned a spot on the 2024 MLS 22 Under 22 presented by BODYARMOR as the second-youngest player on the prestigious list.

Miller has become a consistent contributor in **Caleb Porter's** side, logging starts in 22 of his 23 regular season appearances and collecting one goal and two assists as he continues to thrive in the left back role. The defender also earned a June call-up to the United States Under-20 Men's National Team for training camp in Cairo, Egypt ahead of the FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile in the fall, the youngest player included on the roster.

Miller, the first Connecticut product to sign a Homegrown Player deal with New England, made his first-team debut last July, becoming the second-youngest player to debut for the club at age 16. On Sept. 18, 2024 against CF Montreal, Miller became the eighth-youngest player in league history to record his first MLS assist at 16 years and 315 days. Even with fellow Homegrown signings **Damarío McIntosh** (also 17) and **Eric Klein** (18) on the roster, Miller remains the youngest player on the senior team.



MATT POLSTER RE-SIGNED THROUGH 2027

New England Revolution midfielder **Matt Polster** has been a mainstay in the New England lineup since his arrival in August 2020. Polster has surpassed 2,000 minutes played for a fifth straight season. This year, Polster has started all 23 of his appearances, and netted his first goal of the 2025 campaign in a come-from-behind 3-3 draw at Orlando City SC on May 10. Since his Revolution debut in August 2020, Polster leads all MLS midfielders with 224 interceptions, and ranks fifth with 48 blocked shots over parts of six seasons:

TRIO OF REVS EARN SEPTEMBER INTERNATIONAL CALLUPS

New England Revolution forwards **Leonardo Campana** (Ecuador) and **Dor Turgeman** (Israel) and defender **Mamadou Fofana** (Mali) earned senior international call-ups for FIFA World Cup Qualifying matches in September.

Campana and the Ecuador Men's National Team have already clinched their qualification for FIFA World Cup 2026, securing their berth earlier this year during the June international window. La Tricolor currently sits in second place in the CONMEBOL World Cup Qualifying table with a 7-2-7 record. Ecuador will visit Paraguay on Thursday, Sept. 4 (7:30 p.m. ET), before hosting FIFA World Cup 2022 winner Argentina on Tuesday, Sept. 9 (7:00 p.m. ET). Campana has made 16 appearances for his native Ecuador, including five starts. The 25-year-old striker most recently saw minutes off the bench in a World Cup Qualifying match against Paraguay on October 10, 2024.

Turgeman will join Head Coach Ran Ben Shimon's 23-man roster ahead of next week's FIFA World Cup European Qualifiers. Israel enters September's European Qualifiers in second place of Group K with a 2-1-0 record through the opening three matches. Turgeman and Israel will visit Moldova on Friday, Sept. 5 (2:45 p.m. ET), before hosting Italy on Monday, Sept. 8 (2:45 p.m. ET) in Hungary. Turgeman, 21, was acquired by New England on Aug. 20 from Israeli club Maccabi Tel Aviv using the MLS U22 Initiative. In total, he has started seven of his 10 senior appearances, playing six times in European qualifiers and once in UEFA Nations League A.

Fofana has been called up by the Mali Men's National Team for international duty in a pair of September FIFA World Cup Qualifying matches. 'Les Aigles' currently sit in fourth place in the Confederation of African Football's (CAF) Group I with a 2-3-1 record over six games played in FIFA World Cup 2026 Qualifying. Mali will host Comoros in Morocco on Thursday, Sept. 4 (3:00 p.m. ET), before visiting Ghana on Monday, Sept. 8 (3:00 p.m. ET). Fofana has collected 44 appearances, including 39 games started, with one goal scored for his native Mali.

NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION II



LAST TIME OUT (Vs CHICAGO FIRE FC II)

New England Revolution II (10-5-7; 42 pts.) battled Chicago Fire FC II (11-6-6; 43 pts.) to a 2-2 draw on Sunday afternoon at Gillette Stadium, falling 3-1 in the ensuing penalty shootout. Brazilian forward **Marcos Dias** scored his ninth goal of the season, while Jamaican striker **Damorney Hutchinson** netted the third goal of his debut professional campaign.

Sunday's result extends New England's unbeaten run to four matches, including four consecutive multi-goal performances. At home this season, Revolution II improves to a 6-1-4 record, having collected points in 10 of their 11 games played at Gillette Stadium. Despite Chicago scoring the opening goal in the 22nd minute, New England leveled the match just moments later. After a giveaway from a Chicago defender fell kindly to the feet of Dias, the Brazilian playmaker capitalized with a curling effort over the visiting goalkeeper and into the net. Dias' tally marked his ninth goal involvement in the last six matches.

New England captured the lead only five minutes later through Hutchinson. The Jamaican striker combined with Revolution Academy midfielder **Javaun Mussenden** on a give-and-go into the penalty area, setting up Hutchinson's shot that struck the crossbar and bounced into the net. Hutchinson has now found the scoresheet three times in his last four appearances. Mussenden, 17, recorded his second MLS NEXT Pro career helper on the play.

Revolution II deployed second-half substitutes in **Michael Tsioulis** and **Chris Mbai-Assem** in the 56th minute, with the latter making his club debut after signing with the team two weeks ago. However, Fire II equalized three minutes later via a penalty kick from Trip Fleming. Dias almost recaptured Revolution II's lead in the 70th minute with a close-range strike on frame, though Chicago goalkeeper Bryan Dowd made a diving save to keep the match level. Dias ended the day with a team-leading three key passes and four shot attempts, including a pair on target.

In net for New England, 2025 MLS SuperDraft first-round pick **Donovan Parisian** made three saves in his 10th start of the season. Joining Parisian on the defensive side, Mussenden and Sweden international **Gabe Dahlin** anchored the center, while left back **Hesron Barry** and 2025 MLS NEXT All-Star **Josh Macedo** covered the flanks. Macedo was one of five current Revolution Academy players to feature in Sunday's contest, alongside Mussenden, **Judah Siqueira**, **Aarin Prajapati**, and **Makai Wells**, who made his professional debut.

New England will resume its three-game homestand next Monday, September 8, welcoming Huntsville City FC to Gillette Stadium. The 7:00 p.m. ET kickoff is available to watch live on MLS Season Pass on Apple TV, with Ryan Le calling the game action.

THREE REVS EARN INTERNATIONAL CALL-UPS

New England Revolution Academy forwards **Grant Emerhi**, **Makai Wells**, and **Brandon Velez** earned call-ups to join their respective national teams for the September FIFA international window. Emerhi will represent Lithuania's Under-19 Men's National Team for its training camp and friendly matches in Cyprus. United States youth international Wells and Velez will both travel to Fayetteville, Ga. to participate in their respective Domestic Identity Training Camps. Wells will join the United States U-17 side, while Velez will represent the Stars and Stripes at the U-16 level.

A member of the Revolution Academy, Emerhi collects his second call-up to Lithuania's U-19 squad. Emerhi and Lithuania will face Cyprus in a pair of friendly matches on Sept. 6 and Sept. 8. In his most recent appearance on the international stage, Emerhi submitted an 87-minute shift against Latvia in the 2025 Under-19 Baltic Cup. With the Revolution Academy's U-18s, the Mansfield, Mass. native logged seven goals and four assists in the 2024-25 MLS NEXT season.

Wells, 16, earns his first international call-up to the U.S youth ranks. A recent addition to the Revolution Academy, Wells previously tallied 27 goals and seven assists with Barca Academy in the 2024-25 MLS NEXT campaign. Last year, Wells was selected as one of three players to attend a two-week training stint at FC Barcelona's famed La Masia youth academy. On Sunday, Wells became the 52nd Academy player to make his professional debut with Revolution II, entering the match against Chicago Fire FC II as a late second-half substitute.

Fellow U.S. youth international Velez, a 15-year-old Concord, Mass. native, will also represent his country for the first time at the U-16 level. Velez recorded eight goals and one helper with the Revolution Academy's U-15 squad last year.

All five Revolution Academy teams will begin the 2025-26 MLS NEXT season at the Revolution Training Center on Saturday, September 6. The U-18s, U-16s, and U-15s will take on Seacoast United, while the U-14s and U-13s will host FC Westchester.

- Won back-to-back NCAA College Cup titles (2003 and 2004) as an assistant at his alma mater, Indiana University.

Caleb Porter is in his second season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution following his appointment to the position on Dec. 19, 2023. The ninth head coach in club history, Porter is a two-time MLS Cup winner and NCAA national champion as a head coach with 23 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, the NCAA, and international soccer.

Porter arrived in New England as one of six head coaches to own multiple MLS Cup championships, and one of only three to do so with different clubs. Entering his 11th MLS season as a head coach, Porter's 329 games of experience are fifth most among MLS active coaches, while his .512 career winning percentage stands as the 10th best in league history among coaches with at least 250 games managed. In the MLS Cup Playoffs, Porter's record stands at an impressive 9-3-4 (.688). If he is successful in his mission of leading the Revolution to the club's first MLS Cup victory, Porter will become the only coach to lead three different clubs to MLS Cup titles.

Prior to his appointment in New England, Porter led the Columbus Crew for four seasons from 2019-2022, where he compiled a 52-46-39 record in the regular season. In only his second year with the club, Porter guided the Crew to a 12-5-6 mark in league play en route to the club's second MLS Cup title, also his second, with a 3-0 win over Seattle Sounders FC in the final. The following year, Porter and the Crew claimed the 2021 Campeones Cup trophy with a 2-0 win over LIGA MX champions Cruz Azul.

Porter, born in Tacoma, Wash. and raised in Michigan, began his MLS coaching career in 2013 with the Portland Timbers, where he would deliver the club to the Western Conference Final twice in three seasons. In 2015, Porter won his and the club's first MLS Cup. In his first professional season, Porter won the 2013 MLS Coach of the Year honors after leading the Timbers to a first-place finish in the Western Conference with a 14-5-15 record, marking a historic 23-point turnaround and 46-goal improvement in goal differential from the previous campaign. During his first 100 regular season professional soccer matches, Porter only lost 25 games, posting a record of 39-25-36 over that span.

Porter, 50, recorded a 68-50-52 record with the Timbers over his five seasons with the club. In 2015, he helped Portland set a single-season club record in wins (15) and lead MLS in shutouts (13) on the way to the MLS Cup title. In his final season with the club, Porter helped claim the 2017 Cascadia Cup and led the Timbers to yet another first-place finish in the Western Conference.

Before entering the professional ranks, Porter coached the men's soccer program at University of Akron for seven seasons from 2006-12, where he built one of the most dominant programs in collegiate sports history. Porters' Zips won the Mid-American Conference regular season title in all seven of his years at the helm. After finishing as runners-up in 2009, he led the Zips to the 2010 NCAA DI national championship with a 1-0 victory over the University of Louisville in the final; former Revolution midfielder Scott Caldwell scored the game-winning goal in the title match.

With Akron, Porter compiled a 123-18-17 record and garnered numerous honors including National Soccer Coaches Association of America National Coach of the Year (2009) and six consecutive MAC Coach of the Year awards from 2007-12. He remains the fastest coach in program history to reach 100 wins at Akron, doing so in just 126 matches, while also setting an NCAA record conference unbeaten streak at 47 games (44-0-3) in 2012. His .832 career winning percentage at the NCAA level is sixth-best all-time.

Porter's experience in international club competition includes four Concacaf Champions Cups (2014-15, 2016-17, 2021, and 2024) with three different clubs. Porter boasts a 10-5-3 record in Concacaf Champions Cup play. His 10 coaching victories in the competition are most among active MLS head coaches and third-most among MLS coaches all-time. In 2024, Porter led New England to the Champions Cup Quarterfinals. While at Akron, Porter also gained valuable coaching experience at the international level as Head Coach of the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team from 2011-12. He also worked as an Assistant Coach with the Under-18 national team from 2009-11.

Porter began his coaching career at his alma mater, Indiana University, as an Assistant Coach for six seasons from 2000-05. He helped the Hoosiers win back-to-back NCAA College Cup titles in 2003 and 2004, in addition to five consecutive Big Ten Conference regular season championships and two Big Ten Conference Tournament triumphs in 2001 and 2003. Porter's playing career included four seasons of collegiate soccer at Indiana, where the former midfielder was a three-time All-Big Ten honoree and a MAC Hermann Trophy runner-up.

The San Jose Clash selected Porter in the third round with the 27th overall pick in the 1998 MLS College Draft. He spent the 1999 MLS season with the Clash before joining the A-league's Sacramento Geckos on loan. Porter went on to sign with the Tampa Bay Mutiny in July 1999 before knee injuries led to his retirement on June 30, 2000.

STAFF BIOS

PABLO MOREIRA

ASSISTANT COACH



Pablo Moreira is in his second season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution and his 11th season as an assistant in Major League Soccer. Moreira is a two-time MLS Cup champion with over 370 matches coached in his career. During his time in MLS, Moreira has coached an MLS League MVP, MLS Cup MVP, Newcomer of the Year, Goalkeeper of the Year, seven MLS Best XI selections, and nine MLS All-Star Selections en route to 146 career wins.

Prior to joining the Revolution, Moreira served as an Assistant Coach for the Columbus Crew from 2019-22. Moreira helped the club win the 2020 MLS Cup, becoming the youngest assistant coach in MLS history to win multiple MLS Cups – doing so with two different clubs in each conference. The next year, he helped lead Columbus to the 2021 Campeones Cup, the club's first international trophy, beating Liga MX champions Cruz Azul.

Moreira, 40, entered the professional ranks as an Assistant Coach for the Portland Timbers from 2013-17. Moreira's first season with the Timbers included a 23-point improvement and a 43 goal-differential improvement from the previous season, securing a first-place finish in the Western Conference and the club's first postseason berth. Additionally, Moreira helped lead the Portland Timbers to their first MLS Cup championship in 2015, as well as Concacaf Champions League appearances in 2014 and 2016, Western Conference regular season first-place finishes in 2013 and 2017, and a Cascadia Cup in 2017.

At the college level, Moreira served as an Assistant Coach / Video Analyst at the University of Akron from 2010-2012. During his three seasons with the Zips, Moreira helped the team to a 55-6-9 record through 70 games. In addition, he garnered the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation in each of his first three years, producing 14 professionals into the MLS ranks during that span. In 2011, Akron set an MLS record for most first-round selections from a single school, landing five of the first eight picks in the MLS SuperDraft. Akron won the National Championship in 2010 in addition to winning the Mid-American Conference regular season championship in 2010, 2011, and 2012, and the Mid-American Conference Tournament championship in 2010 and 2012.

KEVIN HITCHCOCK

GOALKEEPERS COACH



Kevin Hitchcock is in his seventh season as Goalkeeper Coach with the New England Revolution, having joined the club on April 30, 2019. Hitchcock brings 25 years of coaching experience to Caleb Porter's staff, including time in the first divisions of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England.

With the Revolution, Hitchcock leads the coaching and development of the club's goalkeepers and has helped New England reach the playoffs in four of his six seasons. During his tenure with the club, he has mentored two of the best shotstoppers in league history in Matt Turner and Djordje Petrović. Both goalkeepers made major strides in their development under Hitchcock's tutelage, resulting in multi-million-dollar transfers to the English Premier League clubs. At the time of Turner's move to Arsenal FC in 2021, it was the largest outgoing transfer fee for a goalkeeper in MLS history, a mark that Petrović surpassed when he made his move to Chelsea FC in 2023. Turner earned his first international experience while being coached by Hitchcock and went on to start for the U.S. Men's National Team at the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022TM.

With Hitchcock as their mentor, Turner (2020 and 2021) and Petrović (2022) finished in the top five of MLS Goalkeeper of the Year voting in four consecutive seasons (2019-22), and placed in the top two three years in a row (2020-22). Turner was named the 2021 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year after the club's historic Supporters' Shield campaign, when he backstopped the Revolution to a then-league-record 73 points. In 2020, Turner finished second in the voting as New England reached the Eastern Conference Final, while setting a new club record for lowest goals-against average. Before joining the Revolution, Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA "A" Goalkeeper License and UEFA "B" Coaching License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach.

BLAIR GAVIN

ASSISTANT COACH



Blair Gavin is in his second season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution. Hired on January 8, 2024 after one season as Head Coach of FC Tulsa in the USL Championship, Gavin, a former Revolution player, reunites with Caleb Porter after serving as an Assistant Coach on his staff in Columbus in 2022.

Gavin, 36, earned his first coaching opportunity in 2018 with Phoenix Rising FC after his retirement. The Scottsdale, Ariz. native, who spent his final two seasons as a player with his hometown club from 2016-17, joined Patrice Carteron's staff at just 29 years old. In his first season coaching Phoenix, Gavin helped guide the club to a Western Conference Championship and its first berth in the USL Cup Final. In 2019, Gavin and Phoenix finished with the best regular season record in the USL Championship. In his final season with Phoenix in 2020, Gavin helped the club reach the USL Cup Final once again, though the championship match was cancelled due to health and safety protocols.

As a player, Gavin spent eight seasons as a midfielder in MLS and the USL. He was originally selected by Chivas USA as the 10th-overall pick in the 2010 MLS SuperDraft. In parts of three seasons with Chivas, Gavin appeared in 43 matches, scoring three goals. Midway through the 2012 season, he was acquired by the New England Revolution and went on to make two appearances for the club. After a brief spell with Seattle Sounders FC, Gavin moved to the NASL with the Atlanta Silverbacks, followed by three years in the USL Championship with Portland Timbers 2 and Arizona United/Phoenix Rising FC, tallying 86 more appearances and five goals.

The former two-time First Team All-Mid-American Conference honoree played three seasons of collegiate soccer under Porter at the University of Akron. Gavin scored seven goals over 68 games for the Zips, helping the team earn a berth in the 2009 College Cup Final.

MARC ORTI ESTEBAN

SET PIECE SPECIALIST



Marc Ortí Esteban is in his first season as Set Piece Specialist with the New England Revolution. Hired in February 2025 after two seasons with Brentford FC of the English Premier League, Ortí Esteban joins the Revolution's growing analytics team after six years coaching and advising in Europe with Brentford FC, FC Midtjylland, FC Barcelona, and E.F. Gavà.

Ortí Esteban, 25, most recently served as a Set Piece Analyst for Brentford FC in the English top-flight from 2023 until his arrival in New England. His responsibilities included pre-, live, and post-match analysis of the club's set pieces, as well as assisting the coaching staff during individual and full-team training sessions. During his first season with Brentford, The Bees ranked third in the English Premier League with 16 set-piece goals. Before his time in England, Ortí Esteban spent the 2022-23 season as a Set Piece Analyst for Danish side FC Midtjylland.

The Catalonia native began his coaching career with FC Barcelona, joining the legendary club in 2019 as an Assistant Academy Coach, working with Barcelona's American-based academy program and coaching camps and clinics in Chicago. Following a successful stint working in the youth ranks, Ortí Esteban was hired by FC Barcelona as an intern, working with first-team performance staff for the 2019-20 campaign. Reporting to the team's Director of Analytics, he helped with the preparation and review of pre- and post-match set-piece reports, as well as opposition analysis and statistical maintenance. He also served as an Assistant Coach for E.F. Gavà in his home region, working with the club's Under-19 squad during the 2019-20 season. During a two-year hiatus from coaching from 2020-22, Ortí Esteban worked as a Research Analyst for Sports Analytics firm Paradine.



STAFF BIOS

CURT ONALFO
SPORTING DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his second season as Sporting Director of the New England Revolution, overseeing all aspects of the club's soccer operations including personnel, scouting, player development, and the pro pathway. After serving as Interim Sporting Director for part of 2023, Onalfo was officially elevated to the post on Nov. 30, 2023. He was previously New England's Technical Director since June 2019, where he led an overhaul of the Revolution's pro player pathway inclusive of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy, and the first team.

Since arriving in New England, Onalfo has helped the Revolution first team reach the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs in four of six seasons and win the 2021 Supporters' Shield with a then-MLS-record 73 regular season points. His expertise in player development has also resulted in a clearly defined professional pathway from the team's youth ranks up to the first team, accelerated by the launch of Revolution II under his direction ahead of its inaugural 2020 season. Through the team's five seasons, nine players have ascended from the Revolution II roster to the first team, while 39 members of the Revolution Academy have made their professional debuts with the second team.

Onalfo, 55, led a renaissance in the Revolution Academy upon taking over the program midway through 2019. Under his guidance, the Revolution Academy became the first in MLS NEXT history to win back-to-back MLS NEXT Cup national championships, with the Under-19s winning the postseason tournament in 2022 and 2023. The Revolution Academy also featured the MLS NEXT Under-17 MVP in forward Olger Escobar. The success of New England's pro pathway under Onalfo has resulted in the influx of youthful Homegrown Players into the first team, including teenagers Noel Buck, Esmir Bajraktarevic, Jack Panayotou, all three of whom have garnered national team recognition. After helping develop Bajraktarević into a regular first-team contributor and member of the Bosnia and Herzegovina national team, Onalfo facilitated the teenager's transfer to PSV Eindhoven, marking the first European transfer for a Revolution Homegrown Player.

A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, Onalfo possesses New England roots as he was raised in Ridgefield, Conn. He arrived in New England following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. He owns 13 years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by head coaching roles with D.C. United (2010), the Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While working as an Assistant Coach with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural Head Coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to lead the Galaxy's first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

Onalfo also spent six years as an Assistant Coach with the United States Men's National Team. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he was the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018-19, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup. He also briefly served as Acting Head Coach of the U-19s for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo entered the coaching ranks as an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as Interim Head Coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed Head Coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named Head Coach of D.C. United.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the 1996 MLS Inaugural Player Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in the league's debut season, helping LA reach the first ever MLS Cup final. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four MLS seasons, including stints with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

CHRIS TIERNEY
ASSISTANT SPORTING DIRECTOR

Chris Tierney is in his second season as Assistant Sporting Director after being promoted to the position on January 8, 2024. Prior to his appointment, Tierney served two seasons as the club's Director of Soccer Operations from 2022-23 and was the club's Player Recruitment Manager from 2019-22. Tierney works in tandem with Sporting Director Curt Onalfo to manage the day-to-day operations of the club's soccer operations including a leading role in player recruitment, scouting, contract negotiations, and salary cap management.

Tierney transitioned into the front office in August 2019 following a decorated 11-year playing career from 2008-18, all with the Revolution, and was long regarded as one of Major League Soccer's top left backs. He announced his retirement in November 2018, finishing his tenure as one of the club's all-time leaders in several statistical categories. Tierney still ranks among the club's top five for games played (246), games started (220), and assists (40).

As a player, the Wellesley, Mass. native helped New England to a 2008 North American SuperLiga title as well as appearances in the 2014 MLS Cup and 2016 U.S. Open Cup finals. Among his career accolades are an MLS All-Star Team selection in 2015, Revolution Defender of the Year honors in 2016, and Midnight Riders Man of the Year recognition in 2016.

After attending Noble and Greenough School in Dedham, Mass., Tierney played college soccer at the University of Virginia from 2004-07, where he made 79 appearances for the Cavaliers. He currently resides in Charlestown, Mass. with his wife, Eliza, and their two children.

REMI ROY
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Remi Roy is in his 16th season with the New England Revolution and his second year as Technical Director, having been appointed to the position on January 8, 2024. Roy previously served as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel since 2018, after initially joining the club as an assistant coach for eight seasons from 2010-17.

In his current role, Roy is focused on scouting, recruitment, and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with Sporting Director Curt Onalfo, Assistant Sporting Director Chris Tierney, and Head of Player Recruitment David Kammarman in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the club's first-team goalkeepers and provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revolution coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revolution goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy mentored longtime New England goalkeeper Brad Knighton and helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers upon his debut in 2010.
