PREVIEW: Revolution Visit New York Red Bulls on Wednesday Night

Watch the 7:30 p.m. ET kickoff on MLS Season Pass

HARRISON, N.J. (July 15, 2025) – The New England Revolution (6-8-7; 25 pts.) will visit the New York Red Bulls (8-8-6; 30 pts.) for a 7:30 p.m. ET kickoff on Wednesday night at Sports Illustrated Stadium. Wednesday's match airs on [MLS Season Pass](#) in English and Spanish. Listen locally on 98.5 The Sports Hub (WBZ-FM), with Brad Feldman and Charlie Davies on the call, and 1260 AM Nossa Radio USA in Portuguese.

SOUND: Preview Interviews

New England, continuing a stretch of five matches within 15 days, is on the road for a second consecutive match to meet their regional rivals. The Revolution hold a 37-32-17 edge in the regular season series with New York, including wins in three of the last four meetings. The Revolution will look to sweep the season series against New York, following a 2-1 win in the first meeting on March 29. Revolution leading scorer **Carles Gil** netted both goals for New England, including a stoppage-time winner in the 97th minute.

Gil, who was named to the 2025 MLS All-Star roster this week, owns three goals and nine assists over 12 career games played against the Red Bulls. The four-time MLS All-Star is set to make his 200th appearance for the club across all competitions on Wednesday night. Gil has registered 15 goals contributions on the season and needs three more to surpass Taylor Twellman (129) for the most in Revolution history.

Last weekend, the Revs collected points on the road for the eighth time in the last nine away games (4-1-4), dueling Austin FC to a scoreless draw at Q2 Stadium. The Revolution have taken points in nine of their 12 games on the road this season, going 4-3-5. The shutout in Austin lifted the team's total to eight clean sheets, two shy of equaling the club's single-season record (10) reached three previous times.

Veteran goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič**, in line for his 100th MLS start on Wednesday, was crucial to preserving the shutout in Austin, posting four saves to earn a spot on the MLS Team of the Matchday bench. His eighth clean sheet of the year moves him within one of the league leader. Against New York, Ivačič owns a 2-1-0 career record with one shutout.

The Revolution's last match saw a new element in the final third as the Argentinian duo of **Luca Langoni** and **Tomás Chancalay** started together for the first time. Langoni led the team with three key chances against Austin, his 25th MLS appearance. Behind them in the midfield, **Alhassan Yusuf** looks to continue his streak of 26 consecutive starts for the Revolution.

The Red Bulls have lost just once at home this season, carrying a 7-1-2 record through 10 games played in Harrison. New York, the defending Eastern Conference champion, carries a five-game winless streak into Wednesday's encounter. Forward **Eric Maxim Choupo-Moting** leads the attack with 11 goals, tied for eighth most in MLS, while former Bundesliga midfielder and Sweden international **Emil Forsberg** owns seven goals and five assists.

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Currently in the team's 30th season, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign.
