Signed F/W Luis Díaz to the club's supplemental roster on a one-year MLS contract for the 2025 MLS season with club options for 2026 and 2027.

Transferred Homegrown M Esmir Bajraktarević to PSV Eindhoven (NED) for an undisclosed fee and retain a percentage of the Homegrown Player's sell-on rights.

**January 3, 2025**

Signed rookie GK Donovan Parisian to a two-year MLS contract through 2026, with club options for 2027 and 2028.

**January 6, 2025**

Acquired \$200,000 in 2025 General Allocation Money from San Diego FC in exchange for M Emmanuel Boateng.

Recalled M Noel Buck from loan.

**January 7, 2025**

Acquired \$50,000 in 2025 General Allocation Money from CF Montreal in exchange for F Giacomo Vrioni. New England retains a portion of Vrioni's salary and a percentage of any future sale.

**January 8, 2025**

Signed M Allan Oyirwot to an MLS contract through the 2028 MLS season, with a one-year club option for 2029.

**January 10, 2025**

Acquired F/W Ignatius Ganago on a six-month loan from FC Nantes (FRA), with an option to purchase. The loan will be extended by six months if certain playing-time conditions are met.

**January 11, 2025**

Players report for 2025 preseason.

**January 14, 2025**

Signed free agent D Wyatt Omsberg to a one-year MLS contract through the 2025 MLS season with a one-year club option for 2026.

**January 16, 2025**

Signed free agent F Maximiliano Urruti to a one-year MLS contract through the 2025 MLS season with a one-year club option for 2026.

Loaned D Santiago Suarez to Birmingham Legion FC of the USL Championship for the 2025 season, with the option to recall.

Signed Revolution II D Keegan Hughes to the supplemental roster for the 2025 MLS season, with club options for 2026 and 2027.




**CARLES GIL**  
**REVOLUTION TEAM MVP**  
**&**  
**GOLDEN BOOT WINNER**



- Revolution captain started each of the team's 34 matches this season, tallying a team best 10 goals and 14 assists while leading all MLS out-field players in minutes played (3,054).
- Five-time Team MVP winner holds the club's all-time records with 87 regular season assists, and 98 assists in all competitions.
- The first Revs player with six seasons of 10-or-more assists, and one of five players in MLS history with double-digit assists in five consecutive seasons.
- Owns additional club records for assists per game (0.45), assists per 90 minutes (0.48), game-winning assists (28), fouls won (486), and corner kicks (761).
- Surpassed Taylor Twellman's club record for goal contributions, with 136 combined goals and assists in 193 regular season appearances.
- Since joining New England in 2019, leads the league with 92 assists (incl. playoffs), most among all active MLS players.
- Became fifth player in club history to score 50 goals across all competitions for the club.
- Led MLS this season in shot-creating actions (214), progressive passes (390), and passes into the penalty area (117), and also ranked second in MLS with 102 key passes and seventh with 14 assists.

**BRAYAN CEBALLOS**  
**DEFENDER OF THE YEAR**

- 24-year-old Colombian center back started all 29 of his appearances during his debut MLS campaign.
- Led the team with 51 aerial duels won,
- Ranked top three on the team in clearances (150), interceptions (43), blocked shots (22), and minutes played (2,551).
- Won 74.2 percent of his challenges this season.
- Earned selection to MLS Team of the Matchday following a shutout performance on the road in the season opener at Nashville SC on Feb. 22, one of 10 shutouts for New England in 2025.
- Played every minute of the team's 409-minute shutout streak from April 5 - May 10, the second-longest streak in Revolution history.
- Tallied first MLS goal on June 25 at Gillette Stadium against Nashville.
- Set season highs with 12 clearances and eight aerial duels won on April 5 at FC Cincinnati.





- Tied the club record with his fourth Humanitarian of the Year honors (Matt Reis & Kelyn Rowe).
- Voted by teammates as Players' Player of the Year for the first time in his career.
- Has firmly established on-field legacy as New England all-time leader in games (344), starts (328), and minutes played (29,294).
- Ranks fifth among all MLS players in regular season min. played since entering the league as the first-overall SuperDraft pick in 2013.
- Long-time supporter of Special Olympics Massachusetts and the Revolution Unified Team for the program's full 11-year duration.
- Leader in the club's Kick Childhood Cancer efforts, attending Box Car Movie Night, Boston Children's Hospital visits, and more.
- Hosts Andrew's NEGU Crew, welcoming five local pediatric cancer fighters to Gillette Stadium with the Jessie Rees Foundation during the 2025 campaign.
- First player in club history to sign a dual Player Professional Development contract, serving as an assistant coach in the Revolution Academy.
- Set club record for most minutes played in U.S. Open Cup (1,343), and tied the club mark for most Open Cup games started (17).

## JAVAUN MUSSENDEN

### REVOLUTION ACADEMY PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- A native of Dallas, Georgia, the 18-year-old midfielder joined Revolution Academy in 2023 as part of the club's residency program.
- 11th different recipient of Revolution Academy Player of the Year award given annually to the most exceptional amateur talent developing in the club's Pro Player Pathway.
- Made his professional debut for Revolution II in MLS NEXT Pro in August 2024.
- Over the last two seasons with Revolution II, has tallied one goal and two assists across 27 appearances, including 16 starts.
- At the youth level, recorded three goals and one helper with the Revolution's Under-18 team during the 2024-25 MLS NEXT campaign.

## CARLES BREAKS REVS' GOAL CONTRIBUTIONS RECORD

## RETURN OF THE MATT: TURNER BACK IN NEW ENGLAND

U.S. international goalkeeper **Matt Turner** returned to the New England Revolution on loan from French Ligue 1 club Olympique Lyonnais through June 30, 2026, with an option to purchase. Turner occupied Designated Player slot on New England's roster for the remainder of the 2025 MLS season, and will be a TAM-eligible player in 2026.

In his debut on August 9, Turner surpassed 10,000 minutes played across all competitions for New England. Since making his MLS debut in 2018, Matt Turner holds New England's club record for goalkeeper win percentage (.572) and save percentage (72.3), while his 46 wins are tied with **Bobby Shuttleworth** for the second-most MLS victories in Revolution history.

Feingold tallied his first two MLS assists on May 10 at Orlando. The 21-year-old also became the second Revolution defender to record a multi-goal game on May 31 at Montreal.

The defender has represented Israel on the international stage, including a pair of appearances at the senior level. Feingold was also a member of Israel's roster at the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris, appearing in all three matches. At the youth international level, Feingold has featured over 30 times, helping Israel to a third-place finish at the 2023 FIFA U-20 World Cup and a runner-up finish at the 2022 UEFA U-19 European Championships.

## REVS ROAD FORM FUELED EARLY SEASON SUCCESS

The Revolution caught fire throughout April and May, riding an nine-game unbeaten run, posting a 5-0-4 record with six clean sheets. This run of form marks just the eighth time in club history New England has rattled off a streak of eight or more straight games without a loss in MLS play, and the longest such streak since a 10-game run in 2022.

## FOFANA AMONG LEAGUE-LEADING TACKLERS

Mali international center back **Mamadou Fofana** started each of his 30 appearances in MLS this year, including all 10 of New England's shutouts. Fofana was a steady presence along the Revs' backline collecting a team-leading 157 clearances. The defender was named to the MLS Team of the Matchday after a strong performance on August 23 at Columbus, when he collected his first MLS assist.

The center back enjoyed a successful first MLS season, while earning consistent international call-ups from his native Mali. Among MLS defenders in 2025, Fofana ranked third with 111 combined tackles and interceptions. Fofana also ranks fourth in MLS with 51 total blocked shots and passes.

## THROWBACKS: REVS REVEAL "THE '96" ARCHIVE COLLECTION KIT

The New England Revolution unveiled the club's new Archive Collection third kit, "The '96", as one of 10 Major League Soccer clubs featured in the return of the throwback-themed adidas x MLS Archive Collection. The Revolution debuted "The '96" kit against Orlando City SC on July 19 at Gillette Stadium, and donned the shirts again on Aug. 9 (vs. DC), Aug. 23 (at CLB), Aug. 30 (vs. CLT), and Oct. 18 (vs. CHI).

An unapologetic tribute to the club's start in the '90s, the New England Revolution '96 kit revives the team's original wordmark, bold colors, and front-facing numbers on the pitch. The jersey is primarily Bright Red and features a gradient pattern that invokes the '96 jerseys with a contemporary flare. The retro Revolution wordmark is emblazoned on the shirt's front, while the back features the original MLS logo and "Gillette," the Revolution's primary jersey sponsor since 2025. The shirts will be paired with Bright Red socks, while the shorts, shirt details, and numerals utilize a refreshed shade of Night Sky Blue.



## SANDS NAMED CLUB AMBASSADOR TO NE AMPUTEE SOCCER

The New England Revolution announced that defender **Will Sands** has been named the club's ambassador of the New England Amputee Soccer Association (NEASA). Sands visited a Revolution Amputee Soccer Team training session on ahead of the team's second annual full-length exhibition match at Gillette Stadium on Saturday, April 19. The Revolution Amputee Soccer Team earned a 5-0 victory over the Metro NY Amputee Soccer Team.

Sands, 24, and his twin brother, James, have long been supporters of the U.S. Amputee Soccer Association (AASA) and the Bionic Project, a non-profit organization founded in 2018 that aims to dismantle disability bias through education, story, and sport, fostering empathy and connection for people of all abilities. Prior to the exhibition match, Sands and the Revolution will outfit the NEASA with brand-new uniforms, including goalkeeper kits and adidas backpacks. The Revolution have also invited the NEASA to hold monthly training sessions at the Revolution Training Center in Foxborough, Mass. This is an extension of the Revolution's longstanding support of NEASA, which has included past donations of durable high-performance crutches designed for use in competition.

The 2025 U.S. Amputee Soccer Cup was once again held in New England this year. From September 12th to 14th, Weymouth High School in Massachusetts hosted the tournament, which for the first time featured six teams: New England Revolution Amputee Soccer, Metro NY Amputee Soccer, Miami Amputee Soccer Club, Chicago Amputee Soccer Club, Colorado/Columbus, and Delaware's Arena Football Club. For a second year in a row, Miami defeated New England in the tournament final to claim to cup title.

## PACKED HOUSE: REVS HOST FIFTH-LARGEST HOME CROWD

After finishing fourth in MLS attendance in 2024, New England again has seen fans turn out in droves for matches in 2025. That included a season-high 43,293 fans on Wednesday, July 9 for the regular season home match against Inter Miami CF.

New England set a club record during Inter Miami's visit to Foxborough on April 27, 2024 with 65,612 fans, the second-largest crowd for a soccer match in Gillette Stadium history. Since the start of the 2024 campaign, New England has seen four of the seven highest-attended home matches in its history.

The 43,293 fans on July 9 marked the fifth-highest single-game attendance in Revolution history. It was the fourth-highest regular season total and the third-best standalone attendance in team annals.

## ANDREW FARRELL BOSTON'S LONGEST-TENURED ATHLETE

Revolution defender **Andrew Farrell** concluded his record 13th season with New England after inking a one-year deal in the offseason that saw him become the first player in club history to serve in a dual Player Development role. In addition to a first-team roster spot, Farrell is also serving as an assistant coach with the Revolution Academy.

Farrell has rewritten the Revolution record book, owning the most appearances, starts, and minutes played in both the MLS regular season and across all competitions. The five-time Revolution Defender of the Year and four-time Revolution Humanitarian of the Year first arrived in New England as the number-one overall pick in the 2013 MLS SuperDraft, having played in 344 MLS matches since along with the fifth-most minutes played leaguewide over that span. Farrell is now the longest-tenured athlete among Boston's five major men's professional sports teams.

## MLS HIGH EIGHT REVS EARN OCTOBER INT'L CALL-UPS

Tied for the most in MLS, eight Revolution players earned national team call-ups in October: **Matt Turner** (United States), **Leo Campana** (Ecuador), **Mamadou Fofana** (Mali), **Alhassan Yusuf** (Nigeria), **Dor Turgeman** (Israel), and **Allan Oyirwoth** (Uganda) at the senior level, along with **Eric Klein** and **Peyton Miller** (United States Under-20).

New England Revolution defender **Peyton Miller** was called up by the United States Under-20 Men's National Team as the youngest player on the roster for the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile. Miller and the U.S. U-20 team defeated New Caledonia 2-1 in the quarterfinals, 3-1, on Sunday, Oct. 12. The 17-year-old appeared in all five matches for the United States, starting in a 3-0 victory over France in group play.

The homegrown defender recently joined the U.S. U-20 roster in June for a training camp and friendly matches in Egypt as the youngest member on Head Coach Marko Mitrovic's 22-player squad. The Unionville, Conn. native came off the bench in a 1-0 defeat to the Norway U-20 side on June 6, before starting against Colombia U-20s on June 10.

**Campana** and Ecuador faced **Turner** and the United States on Friday, Oct. 10, before battling Mexico to a 1-1 draw on Tuesday, Oct. 14 in Guadalajara. Campana appeared in both matches off the bench, marking his first international appearances in a calendar year. *La Tricolor* already clinched their qualification for the FIFA World Cup 26™ in June.

**Yusuf** and Nigeria advanced to the Second Round of FIFA World Cup qualification with victories over Lesotho, 2-1, on Friday, Oct. 10, and at home over Benin, 4-0, on Tuesday, Oct. 14. Yusuf was an unused substitute in both matches during the October window. *The Super Eagles* finished second in the CAF Group C with a 4-1-5 record, advancing on goal differential over the runners-up in Group A Burkina Faso and Group E Niger.

**Oyirwoth** and Uganda, as well as **Fofana's** Mali, both fell short of qualification for the FIFA World Cup 2026. **Turgeman** and Israel can still qualify for a Second Round berth based on their UEFA Nations League ranking.

## SPECIAL OLYMPICS MASSACHUSETTS REVOLUTION UNIFIED TEAM CONCLUDES 11TH SEASON



The 2025 season marks the 11th year of the New England Revolution's partnership with Special Olympics Massachusetts' Unified Sports® program, supported throughout by the Arbella Insurance Group. The Revolution welcomed Special Olympics Massachusetts athletes and Unified partners to the 2025 New England Revolution Unified Team on May 14 at Gillette Stadium for the team's annual signing day. This year's Unified roster featured 19 athletes and partners, matching last year's record of the largest team in the program's 11-year history.

# AMPUTEE SOCCER EXHIBITION MATCH

## REVOLUTION AMPUTEE SOCCER TEAM DEFEATED METRO NEW YORK

The New England Amputee Soccer Association hosted its annual exhibition match between the Revolution Amputee Soccer Team and the Metro New York Amputee Soccer Team on Saturday, April 19 at Gillette Stadium. The full-length exhibition soccer contest at Gillette Stadium, featuring two 20-minute halves, commenced following an MLS match between the New England Revolution and New York City FC, marking a continuation of the Revolution's longstanding support of amputee soccer in New England, which has included past donations of team uniforms, training field time, and durable high-performance crutches designed for use in competition.

The New England Revolution and Metro New York Amputee Soccer Teams are captained by Nico Calabria and Jovan Lehfeld-Booker, respectively. In 2023, New England defeated the Metro New York Amputee Soccer Team, etching its name into soccer history by winning the first-ever U.S. Amputee Soccer Cup. Fans were treated competitive and exciting rematch of the 2023 U.S. Amputee Soccer Cup Final, with New England etching its name into soccer history by winning the first-ever title.

Amputee soccer follows the same rules as traditional soccer, with few modifications. The exhibition match presents an opportunity to unite, support, and learn from amputee athletes. Fans attending the MLS match are encouraged to remain at Gillette Stadium following the conclusion of the contest to support the amputee athletes. The amputee match offers a new and exciting form of entertainment for soccer fans and serves as a platform for the athletes to display their skills and raise awareness about limb differences, important of inclusivity in sports and diverse representation in athletic competitions, and the broader sports landscape of adaptive sports among the disability community.

## WOMEN OF COLOR ENTREPRENEURS (WOCE) POP-UP MARKET HEADLINES NIGHT OF INITIATIVES




The New England Revolution hosted the club's annual **Match for C.H.A.N.G.E.** on Saturday, August 16. This year's Match for C.H.A.N.G.E. provided a variety of activations, including an online auction of match-worn jerseys with a special patch, designed by local artist **Eamon White**. All proceeds from the jersey auction benefitted **The Chica Project**, a non-profit that works towards creating a world where women, girls, and all people experiencing oppression at the intersection of race, ethnicity, and gender can have the opportunity to rise to their full potential.

The New England Revolution, **Women of Color Entrepreneurs (WOCE)**, and the **Heritage Market** partnered to bring 20 women- and BIPOC-owned local businesses to a Pop-Up Market in the Revolution Fan Zone prior to the match. Founded in 2019, WOCE supports women of color entrepreneurs with the goal to expand and build women of color owned businesses. The nonprofit is dedicated to providing mentorship, programming, peer support, technical assistance, and curated access to potential customers, leaders, and investors in the Greater Boston Area. The New England Revolution Foundation and WOCE partnership began in November of 2022, when WOCE was selected as the beneficiary of a \$20,000 grant from the Revolution **Players Collaborative Fund**, as part of the company's C.H.A.N.G.E. platform, which is dedicated to combatting inequity and promoting social justice.

# ANDREW'S NEGU CREW

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE REVOLUTION FOUNDATION & THE JESSE REES FOUNDATION



Back again for the 2025 season is one of the New England Revolution Foundation's signature programs - **NEGU Crew**. Andrew's NEGU Crew provided a unique and memorable matchday experience for pediatric cancer patients. The acronym NEGU (pronounced *nee-goo*), Never Ever Give Up, is a phrase adopted from the Jesse Rees Foundation, which ensures every child fighting cancer has the support and resources they need to never ever give up.

Originally launched in 2015 with **Kelyn Rowe**, and continuing with **Matt Turner**, NEGU Crew returned in 2024 after a pause due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Taking the reins was defender and three-time Revolution Humanitarian of the Year **Andrew Farrell**. As part of the NEGU Crew matchday experience, families were presented with a \$500 Gillette Stadium gift card to use on concessions and merchandise. Prior to the match, each child received their own custom Revolution jersey presented by Farrell as he takes the pitch for pregame warmups. Omsberg, the first Revolution player to hail from Maine, earned his first start of the season before an injury forced him off in the 37th minute, when he was replaced by Beason. In addition, 17-year-old Homegrown product **Peyton Miller**, who missed the opening four matches with a groin injury, started in his season debut.

## POSTGAME NOTES

- Saturday's match marked the 100th all-time meeting between the Revs and Red Bulls across all competitions, with New England holding a 43-36-21 edge.

The New England Revolution (1-4-1, 4 pts.) fell on the road to FC Cincinnati (4-2-1, 13 pts.), 1-0, on a rainy Saturday at TQL Stadium. Despite attempting a season high 15 shots, including two off the woodwork, New England was stymied by the hosts who broke the deadlock in the 65th minute.

The teams battled through a scoreless first half as New England struck the post twice. Defender **Brayan Ceballos**, returning to the starting lineup after missing last weekend's match with a leg injury, thumped a header off the post from a **Carles Gil** corner kick. Seven minutes later, **Ignatius Ganago** fired a quick shot through the hands of Cincinnati goalkeeper **Roman Celentano** and off the frame. The hosts were close to a breakthrough in the final five minutes of the first half, with **Kévin Denkey** and **Luca Orellano** each narrowly missing wide.


Cincinnati scored the lone goal of the contest in the 65th minute when **Sergio Santos** tapped a feed in front from **Pavel Bucha**, who picked up a rebound off a save by Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivacič**. The New England Revolution (2-4-1, 7 pts.) secured their first road win of the season, shutting out Atlanta United FC (2-3-3, 9 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday afternoon, April 12, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. Revolution midfielder **Carles Gil** netted the lone goal of the match after drawing a penalty in the first half, while goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivacič** collected his second clean sheet of the season with five saves.

Atlanta thought they had the game's first breakthrough when **Miguel Almiron** curled a shot past Ivačić, but the goal was negated for offside after video review. New England opened the scoring soon after in the 36th minute after Gil was fouled inside the box. He buried the ensuing penalty kick into the top-left corner, beating his former Aston Villa teammate **Brad Guzan**, for the game's only tally.


The goal was Gil's third in as many games and his second penalty conversion of the season. It marked the Spaniard's 42nd MLS regular season goal and 115th career goal contribution, tying **Steve Ralston** for the sixth and second most in team annals, respectively. The captain led the team with five shots on the day, three on target, with four key passes. Forward **Maxi Urruti** also placed three attempts on frame, including two well-hit strikes from outside the area that tested Guzan in the first half.

After the intermission, Revolution Head Coach **Caleb Porter** deployed several substitutes to see out the win, headlined by the returns of forwards **Leo Campana** and **Tomás Chancalay** from injury. Campana entered the pitch in the 58th minute for his fourth appearance of the season, having missed the last three games with a hamstring strain. For Chancalay, it was the Argentine's first action since a knee injury last May. The Designated Player recorded one shot in his season debut.


In net for New England, Ivačić recorded five saves behind a three-man backline en route to the team's second clean sheet of the season. Beason, a regular starter over the previous five seasons in San Jose, played all 90 minutes in his first start with New England today. The New England Revolution (3-4-1, 10 pts.) defeated New York City FC (3-4-2, 11 pts.), 2-0, on Saturday, April 19 in front of 21,081 fans at Gillette Stadium. Ecuadorian forward **Leo Campana** opened his New England account, while Cameroon international **Ignatius Ganago** posted a goal-and-assist performance. In the second half, Revolution midfielder **Carles Gil** tallied his 74th MLS assist, passing club legend **Steve Ralston** for the most regular season assists in team annals.

With tonight's triumph, the Revolution have now posted victories in three of their last four games, including two consecutive clean sheets, with back-to-back wins at home. New England's strong defensive form continues with their third shutout through eight matches, as their seven goals allowed are only one more than the league low.


The Eastern Conference clash appeared to be headed towards a scoreless first half until Campana broke the stalemate with his first goal of the 2025 MLS season, also his first in a Revolution jersey. Campana connected with Ganago on a give-and-go in the penalty area to set up a first-time shot, which took a deflection and sailed past New York City's diving goalkeeper into the net. In his first start since suffering a hamstring injury on March 8, Campana led New England's attack with four shots, two on target.

New England wasted no time doubling its lead after the intermission as Ganago fired home an insurance goal in the 48th minute. After taking a short corner, Gil created space for himself to fire in a curling cross, which found Ganago open on the doorstep for a simple finish. With the assist, Gil passed Ralston (73) for the most regular season helpers in team history, while he also jumped Ralston (115) for the second most goal contributions for New England.

In net for New England, **Aljaz Ivačić** posted a two-save performance to collect his second consecutive clean sheet, the club's third of the season. The Slovenian goalkeeper was protected by a center back trio of **Mamadou Fofana**, **Brayan Ceballos**, and **Tanner Beason**, who held New York City without a shot on target for over 85 minutes. On the wings, Israel international **Ilay Feingold** made his eighth straight appearance, while Homegrown player **Peyton Miller** recorded one shot on target in his fourth consecutive start.

The New England Revolution (4-4-1; 13 pts.) posted their third straight shutout victory, and the team's fourth win in the last five matches, with a 1-0 triumph over Charlotte FC (6-3-1; 19 pts.) on Saturday, April 26, at Bank of America Stadium. Midfielder **Carles Gil** broke a scoreless deadlock with the game-winning goal in the 77th minute, a left-footed curler assisted by **Luca Langoni**. With tonight's clean sheet, the Revolution tied the club record for fewest goals allowed through nine games (7 - 2005).

New England is the first visiting side to collect points at Bank of America Stadium this season from Charlotte FC, which entered tonight's match with a perfect 5-0-0 home record and eight straight home wins. After a scoreless opening 45 minutes, the Revolution kept the pressure on in the second half, creating multiple chances in search of the game's opening goal. Forward **Ignatius Ganago**, making the 200th appearance of his club career, nearly broke the ice in the 58th minute with a low finish inside the far post, set up by Gil's lofted pass, but his goal was ruled offside to keep the match level.


New England's pressure paid dividends in the 77th minute, when Gil curled in the winning goal past the outstretched hands of Charlotte FC goalkeeper **Kris-tijan Kahlina**. Gil, New England's leading scorer with four goals in 2025, has netted three game-winning tallies this season. The Spanish playmaker has found the scoresheet in three of the last five matches, with four goals and one assist during that span. Gil finished tonight's match with two shots, one on target, and two key passes. Langoni was credited with an assist on the play, his first of the campaign.

On the defensive end, New England goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivacič** recorded a four-save performance en route to his fourth clean sheet of the 2025 campaign. The last time the Revolution kept three consecutive clean sheets was in the 2022 season. The Revolution's trio of central defenders, **Mamadou Fofana**, **Brayan Ceballos**, and North Carolina native **Tanner Beason**, comprised the starting backline for all three of the team's shutout wins. On the outside, Homegrown Player **Peyton Miller** suited up for his fifth straight start, while **Ilay Feingold** earned his ninth appearance of the campaign.

Veteran midfielder **Matt Polster** reached a career milestone tonight as he suited up for his 200th MLS regular season start. Forward **Leo Campana** made his second start and third consecutive appearance since returning from injury, submitting a 73-minute shift. He was replaced by **Tomás Chancalay**, who has also logged three successive appearances since making his way back from injury earlier this month.

- Saturday's 1-0 victory was the third consecutive shutout victory for New England and its fourth win in the last five games.
- New England matches its club record for the fewest goals allowed through the first nine games of a season (7, last in 2005).

The New England Revolution (5-4-1; 16 pts.) claimed all three points against Toronto FC (1-6-4; 7 pts.), winning 2-0 at BMO Field on Saturday, May 3, behind goals from **Carles Gil** and **Leo Campana**. The Revolution extended their winning streak to four games, with five wins in their last six matches. The team's shutout streak stands at 385 minutes, tied for the third longest in club history. For the first time, New England has posted three consecutive shutout wins on the road.

It only took 11 minutes for New England to gain the advantage through Gil, who recorded his team-leading fifth goal of the season. It was also his sixth goal contribution in as many games. **Ilay Feingold's** cross was headed away towards the top of the area, where the captain met it with a perfect volley into the top corner.

New England doubled its lead in the 27th minute as **Leo Campana** tallied his second goal for the Revolution, the 30th of his MLS regular season career. **Alhassan Yusuf** launched the counterattack by finding Campana on the break, and the Ecuadorian delivered a calm finish past Toronto goalkeeper **Sean Johnson**. Yusuf and fellow central midfielder **Matt Polster** were both pivotal in the win, each completing better than 90 percent of their pass attempts.

Campana created another golden opportunity for the visitors in the 32nd minute, when he played a quick pass to put **Ignatius Ganago** in on goal. The Cameroonian's shot was saved by Johnson, and Gil's follow-up attempt was also parried by the Toronto goalkeeper. Moments before halftime, Ganago nearly found himself on the scoresheet when he fired a shot on target, again created by Feingold's work on the right side, but Johnson made another impressive save to deny New England a third goal before halftime.



The New England Revolution (5-4-2; 17 pts.) battled Orlando City SC (4-2-6; 18 pts.) to a thrilling 3-3 draw on Saturday, May 10 at Inter&Co Stadium. Orlando midfielder **Martin Ojeda** netted a hat trick, but **Carles Gil's** goal-and-assist performance helped the Revolution erase a pair of deficits and stretch their unbeaten run to five games in league play.

Ojeda scored twice in the opening 33 minutes to give the hosts a 2-0 lead, snapping the Revolution's shutout streak at 409 minutes, 10 minutes shy of equaling the club record. Facing a two-goal deficit, New England rallied to even the proceedings before halftime, ending Orlando's own MLS-long shutout streak at 563 minutes. Midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** cut into the lead with his first MLS goal. **Ignatius Ganago** whipped in a cross from the left edge of the penalty area toward the back post, where **Ilay Feingold** tapped a cutback pass for the Nigerian to slot home from close range.

Yusuf's midfield partner, **Matt Polster**, leveled the score with his 10th career goal, his first since July 2023, flicking a header past Orlando goalkeeper **Pedro Gallese** off a Gil cross. Gil's assist was the 75th of his MLS career, extending his club record. Feingold earned a secondary assist on Polster's tally, giving the Israeli his first two MLS helpers and the first multi-assist game of his professional career.

As New England pushed forward in search of a fourth consecutive road win, momentum swung back towards the hosts when Ojeda put the Lions back ahead in the 55th minute, completing his hat trick from the penalty spot after Orlando's **Joran Gerbet** was fouled in the box. With time ticking down, Ganago was taken down in the Lions' penalty area. Gil stepped to the spot and calmly finished past Gallese for his sixth goal of the season. The Spaniard's 11th goal-and-assist performance in MLS also makes him the fifth Revolution player with 50 goals in all competitions.




It took less than 10 minutes for the Revolution to double the lead on an own goal charged to Sporting's **Jacob Bartlett** in the 22nd minute. **Ilay Feingold** charged in from the right side and connected with Gil, who switched play with a line-breaking diagonal pass to Miller. The 17-year-old Homegrown sent a hard roller across the face of goal toward **Alhassan Yusuf**, which Bartlett deflected into his own net. The chances continued for New England for the rest of the half, as Chancalay tested SKC goalkeeper **John Pulskamp** with two long-range shots on target. In the 42nd minute, Feingold found the Argentinian alone in the center of the penalty area, but his shot was sent over the bar. Chancalay finished the first half with five shots and three on target, tied for his single-game career high.

Kansas City recaptured momentum in the second half, pulling a goal back in the 53rd minute through their captain **Daniel Salloi**. His first effort was saved by Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič**, but the rebound fell kindly to Salloi, who made no mistake with the follow up. Soon after, **Mamadou Fofana** was called for a foul in the box and **Dejan Joveljić** converted from the penalty spot for the equalizer. In the 61st minute, the hosts pulled ahead on a goal by **Manu García**.


The Revolution pulled level in the 84th minute on a combination by two second-half substitutes. **Alhassan Yusuf** played a long pass to spring **Luis Diaz** in behind the Kansas City defense. The New England Revolution (5-4-5; 20 pts.) dueled D.C. United (3-7-6; 15 pts.) to a 1-1 draw at Audi Field on Wednesday, May 28. Defender **Ilay Feingold** scored his first MLS goal to open his Revolution account. Tonight's draw extended the Revolution's unbeaten run to eight games, while the team remains undefeated in their last six road contests (3-0-3), with points in seven of their nine games away from home (3-2-4).

Feingold broke the stalemate moments before halftime, finding the back of the net three minutes into first-half stoppage time. Revolution playmaker **Carles Gil** initiated the play, slotting a pass up the right flank to **Brandon Bye**, who delivered a cross into the box. A deflection off a D.C. United defender sent the ball to the feet of Feingold, and the 20-year-old calmly buried his shot to give New England the 1-0 edge just before the midway break.

The Revolution nearly doubled their lead in the second half, with winger **Luis Diaz** firing back-to-back shots on target within a four-minute span. The Costa Rican submitted a 23-minute shift in relief of Argentine forward **Tomás Chancalay**, who logged his second consecutive start tonight. Despite New England's attempts to add an insurance goal, it was the hosts who found an equalizer as **Gabriel Pirani** netted the tying goal at the 90-minute mark.

Diaz provided a spark off the bench for New England, finishing the night with three shots, including two on target, in his 10th appearance of the 2025 campaign. Gil and midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** also contributed to the attacking efforts with three shots each, while Gil also logged a game-high six key passes.



The New England Revolution (6-4-5; 23 pts.) concluded their three-game road week with a 3-0 triumph against CF Montréal (1-11-5; 8 pts.) at Stade Saputo on Saturday, May 31. After Montréal was reduced to 10 men by a **Giacomo Vrioni** red card in the 37th minute, Revolution Homegrown Player **Peyton Miller** tallied his first MLS goal and added an assist, while **Ilay Feingold** recorded two second-half goals to seal the three points for the visitors. With the victory, the Revs extended their unbeaten streak to nine games, the club's longest since 2022, with six clean sheets during that span. New England's seven-game away undefeated streak is its longest since 2019, as the Revolution have now earned points in eight of their 10 away games this season (4-2-4).

After Vrioni was issued a red card in the 37th minute, New England ramped up the pressure in search of the breakthrough against the 10-man Montréal side. Moments before halftime, **Ignatius Ganago** drove into the penalty area and fired a shot just wide of the frame for New England's best chance of the first half.


After the intermission, New England wasted no time breaking the stalemate as Miller opened his MLS account in the 48th minute. The 17-year-old snuck inside of his defender and got his left foot on the end of Feingold's cross, tucking a low volley into the far corner for the game winner. The Revolution's dynamic wingbacks once again linked up for the third goal of the night. 

The New England Revolution (6-5-5; 23 pts.) fell to FC Cincinnati (10-5-3, 33 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday, June 14 in front of 27,184 fans at Gillette Stadium in the opening match of a three-game homestand. A first-half strike by Cincinnati's **Kévin Denkey** provided the game's only goal, ending New England's unbeaten streak at nine games.

The second meeting of the season between New England and FC Cincinnati began as a back-and-forth affair that saw each side trade scoring chances at either end. The visitors opened the scoring midway through the first half, with **Kévin Denkey** slotting home his 11th goal of the season off a low cross from **Luca Orellano** in the 26th minute. Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič** had kept his net clean with two quick-reaction stops in the game's early moments, both the result of deflections off a New England defender, before Denkey was able to elevate his shot over Ivačič from close range to provide the difference.

New England pushed for the equalizer before halftime, generating four shots in the final 20 minutes of the opening stanza and forcing Cincinnati goalkeeper **Roman Celentano** into a pair of saves. After the break, New England continued to press for a goal despite missing the services of key attacking pieces in **Leo Campana**, **Ignatius Ganago**, and **Luca Langoni**, all of whom were absent due to injury. **Luis Diaz** made his first start of the regular season alongside forward **Tomás Chancalay**, who recorded three shots in the contest.



The New England Revolution (6-6-5; 23 pts.) fell to Nashville SC (10-4-5; 35 pts.), 3-2, on Wednesday, June 25 at Gillette Stadium. Argentinian forward **Tomás Chancalay** contributed a goal and assist, while Colombian defender **Brayan Ceballos** opened his Revolution account with a headed goal in the contest.

New England started the night on the front foot, claiming an early lead in the 15th minute. A lofted long ball from Spanish playmaker **Carles Gil** found the foot of Chancalay, who brought the ball down with a clean touch and buried his shot past Nashville's **Joe Willis**. Gil recorded his fifth assist of the season on the set-piece goal, marking his 11th goal contribution in the last 13 games. Chancalay led New England's attack with four shots on the night, putting two on target.





The New England Revolution (6-6-6; 24 pts.) rallied back from a three-goal deficit to draw the Colorado Rapids (7-8-5; 26 pts.) 3-3, on Saturday, June 25. After conceding a third goal to the visiting Rapids shortly after halftime, an own goal and late tallies by **Carles Gil** and **Maxi Urruti** gave the Revolution a hard-fought point in the final match of a three-game homestand.

New England nearly opened the scoring in the seventh minute when **Peyton Miller** launched a shot on target, set up by a pass from **Alhassan Yusuf**, who made his 25th MLS appearance tonight. Yusuf connected with one of New England's eight first-half corners with an attempt in the 20th minute, but it was saved by Rapids goalkeeper **Nicholas Hansen**.

Colorado struck first in the 29th minute on a counter attack finished off by midfielder **Calvin Harris**, who capitalized on a second opportunity after Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič**'s initial save. The Rapids added to their lead in the 40th minute as forward **Rafael Navarro** converted inside the box, assisted by **Darren Yapi**. Forward **Leo Campana**, in his first start since returning from injury, responded with a powerful shot from outside the area, but it was saved by Hansen. Campana and **Luca Langoni**, who relieved an injured **Tomás Chancalay** in the 40th minute, both recorded headed shots at the end of the half. The Revolution entered the intermission scoreless, despite controlling the opening stanza with 72.2 percent possession and 10 shot attempts.



The New England Revolution (6-7-6; 24 pts.) were defeated, 2-1, by Portland Timbers FC (9-5-6; 33 pts.) at Providence Park on Saturday, July 5. Forward **Luca Langoni** scored his first goal of the season in the match. With the loss, New England's road unbeaten streak ends at seven games.

The Revolution had the first big chance of the night in the 17th minute when **Peyton Miller** got behind his defender and found himself in alone on goal, but the young wingback sent his shot directly at Portland's **Maxime Cr  peau**. The Timbers then struck first in the 20th minute as rookie **Ian Smith** put his laces through a shot that found the top corner.

New England found its breakthrough through **Luca Langoni** in the 35th minute, capitalizing with a direct counterattack to level the match. **Tanner Beason** started the surge forward with an interception at the top of his own penalty area and played it wide to **Carles Gil**, who launched his delivery to a streaking Langoni. The Argentinian dribbled into the box, chopped the ball onto his left foot, and calmly rolled it into the far corner for his first goal of the season. Gil's seventh assist of the year gives him a helper in three straight games, and 14 combined goals and assists in the last 15 games.





The New England Revolution (6-8-6; 24 pts.) were defeated by Inter Miami CF (10-3-5; 35 pts.), 2-1, with 43,293 fans in attendance at Gillette Stadium on Wednesday, July 9. Inter Miami captain **Lionel Messi** completed a brace with two goals in the first half, while Spanish playmaker **Carles Gil** scored New England's lone goal in the second half.

In front of the fourth-largest regular season crowd in Revolution club history, Inter Miami got on the board first in the 27th minute. A giveaway by New England's backline fell kindly to the feet of Messi near the penalty spot. The reigning MLS MVP slotted his first-time finish past Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič** for the opening tally.

Roughly 10 minutes later, Inter Miami doubled its lead as midfielder **Sergio Busquets** played a through ball to Messi, who finished the play for his second goal of the night in the 38th minute. New England nearly pulled one back shortly before intermission, with **Leo Campana** drilling a shot on target, but Miami goalkeeper **Oscar Ustari** punched it away to preserve Miami's advantage.

The Revolution heaped on the pressure after the intermission in search of a breakthrough. Head Coach **Caleb Porter** turned to his bench and deployed forward **Tomás Chancalay** in the 62nd minute. Soon after, Chancalay had his best chance of the match when a shot from Campana forced a save by Ustari. Chancalay pounced on the rebound but put his shot off the side netting.

New England cut Miami's lead in half in the 79th minute, as Gil weaved his way through Miami's defense and finished with his right foot for his team-leading eighth goal of the season. The Revolution captain has reached the scoresheet in four straight games and is now only two goal contributions away from tying the club record held by **Taylor Twellman**.



The New England Revolution (6-8-7; 25 pts.) battled Austin FC (7-8-6, 27 pts.) to a 0-0 draw at Q2 Stadium on Saturday, July 12. In New England's first visit to Austin, Revolution goalkeeper Aljaž Ivačič made four saves as New England collected its eighth clean sheet of the campaign in the stalemate. With the draw, New England's away record moves to 4-3-5, with results in eight of the team's last nine away contests.

The hosts had a pair of opportunities to open the scoring inside the opening 15 minutes. First, Jon Gallagher was stifled by Revolution defender Brayan Ceballos, whose sliding effort blocked a would-be goal in the 11th minute. Four minutes later, Ivačič came up with a point-blank stop on Austin's Myrto Uzuni to keep the match scoreless. Uzuni had another big chance late in the match, striking the woodwork in the 81st minute.

New England battled back with Luca Langoni kissing a shot off the post just shy of the half-hour mark. Langoni nearly broke the deadlock with the last action of the first half, uncorking a shot from close range that Austin goalkeeper Brad Stuver turned aside. Stuver came up big again twice in the opening 10 minutes of the second half, denying Tomás Chancalay on the counter attack before fighting off a curling effort from Carles Gil on a free kick.

Gil had one final chance late in the game's final moments, with his volley taking a deflection off an Austin defender on the way towards goal, but the shot fell kindly to Stuver. During the match, Gil climbed into the top 10 in club history in MLS minutes played (15,409), surpassing Scott Caldwell.


Both goalkeepers made big saves late in the match in a back-and-forth sequence. Ivačič first denied Osman Bukari's attempt from distance in the 76th minute. Moments later, Stuver answered with a save on Leo Campana from close range. Stuver slammed the door once more in the 89th minute, when Will Sands streaked in behind the defense and delivered a low shot at the goalkeeper.

- With tonight's result, the Revolution's record on the road shifts to 4-3-5.
- New England has collected points in eight of its last nine away matches.
- Tonight's match marked New England's first visit to Austin FC, a 2021 MLS expansion side. Both meetings between the two clubs have ended in draws.
- Aljaž Ivačič** collected his eighth shutout performance of the 2025 campaign tonight, adding to his career high. Ivačič, who tallied four saves in tonight's match, made his 100th MLS appearance on Saturday. His next start will be the 100th of his MLS regular season career.
- Carles Gil** surpassed **Scott Caldwell** for the 10th-most minutes played in club history (MLS regular season). Gil also tied **Kelyn Rowe** (170) for the 10th-most starts in club history.
- Luca Langoni** recorded his 25th MLS appearance tonight and featured in the Starting XI for the third consecutive match. The 23-year-old Argentinian logged a team-high three key passes and two shots, one on target.

The New England Revolution (6-9-7; 25 pts.) fell to the New York Red Bulls (9-8-6, 33 pts.), 5-3, at Sports Illustrated Stadium on Wednesday, July 16. Forward **Leo Campana** bagged a brace for his first multi-goal game of the season, but the hosts rallied from a halftime deficit with five second-half goals to claim all three points.

New England immediately began the night on the front foot, with Campana opening the scoring in just the fifth minute. After a deflected pass from **Luca Langoni** fell into his path, Campana placed a low, left-footed shot past a diving **Carlos Coronel** to give the Revolution an early lead. The Ecuadorian forward nearly struck again off a corner kick in the 21st minute, but the referee disallowed the goal after video review for a handball on the attempt. Campana ended the night with a season-high six shots and recorded a new MLS career-best with four attempts on target.

The Revolution doubled their advantage in the 30th minute through an own goal off Red Bulls defender **Kyle Duncan**. Langoni burst into the box and nailed a shot off the left post, which caromed off Duncan and into the net. Langoni, making his fourth straight start, tallied two shots and two key passes in Wednesday's contest. New York cut into the deficit in the 56th minute, as **Daniel Edelman** snuck a shot through New England's backline and into the bottom-left corner of the net. The Red Bulls pulled even in the 70th minute with **Eric Maxim Choupo-Moting** capitalizing on an assist from **Emil Forsberg**, who scored a goal of his own two minutes later to put the hosts ahead. Choupo-Moting netted his second goal of the night in the 83rd minute, before Forsberg closed the host's scoring from the penalty spot.


In second-half stoppage time, Campana completed his first brace with the Revolution, volleying home a giveaway from New York defender **Alexander Hack**, who had knocked down a cross by Revolution captain **Carles Gil**. Gil, who was added to the 2025 MLS All-Star roster this week, logged two key passes in his 200th appearance across all competitions for the club. In net for New England, **Aljaž Ivacič** made four saves in his 100th MLS start.

On "Alumni Night" at Gillette Stadium, the New England Revolution (7-11-7; 28 pts.) scored twice in the second half to defeat D.C. United (4-15-7, 19 pts.), 2-0, on Saturday, August 9. In the 100th all-time meeting between the two MLS original clubs, **Carles Gil's** goal-and-assist performance propelled the Spaniard past Revolution legend **Taylor Twellman** for the most goal contributions in the club's history (130). Goalkeeper **Matt Turner** collected his 23rd clean sheet in a Revolution uniform with a three-save performance in his first appearance for the club since May 2022.

In his first match back in New England since arriving on loan, Turner was tested multiple times in the opening half, denying both of D.C.'s early shots on target. The visitors' best chance of the half came from **Hosei Kijima** as he broke free on the right side, but Turner made the diving save to his right to keep the match scoreless. The American international recorded three saves in his Revolution return and controlled his penalty area with poise, coming off his line for three high claims.


After the intermission, New England opened the scoring in the 62nd minute as Gil and **Leo Campana** combined for the icebreaker. Gil whipped in a cross to the Ecuadorian at the near post, which Campana headed home for the game-winning goal. Campana raised his total to five goals on the season, second most on the team behind Gil, and registered a team-high six shots in the contest.



The New England Revolution (8-12-7; 31 pts.) defeated Columbus Crew (12-6-9, 45 pts.), 2-1, on Saturday, August 23 at Lower.com Field, powered by first-half goals from forwards **Leo Campana** and **Ignatius Ganago**. Tonight's victory marks New England's first win over Columbus since 2021 and continues the club's strong road form, having collected points in 10 of its 14 away contests this season (5-4-5).

The Revolution weathered early pressure from the hosts before striking first in the 25th minute. Making his 100th MLS regular season appearance, Campana found himself open at the back post to tap in a pass from Luca Langoni for his sixth goal of the campaign. **Carles Gil** initiated the sequence with a pass into the box for Langoni, giving the captain his 10th assist of the season. The club's all-time leader in assists is now the only Revolution player to reach double-digit helpers in five consecutive seasons, and six times overall.

It took less than 15 minutes for the Revolution to double their lead, capitalizing on a transition moment to stun the hosts against the run of play. From inside his own half, defender **Mamadou Fofana** picked out Ganago with a lofted long ball over the top of Columbus' backline. The Cameroonian winger beat the Crew defenders to the loose ball and poked it past goalkeeper **Patrick Schulte** for his second goal of the season. The game-winning assist marked Fofana's first in a Revolution uniform.


New England had a chance to put the game out of reach when Campana pressed Schulte to force a turnover inside the Revolution's attacking half. Campana laid a pass off to Gil, whose chipped shot toward the empty net sailed just high of the target. Forward **Ignatius Ganago** netted New England's lone goal in the first half, his third tally of the 2025 campaign, before a late set-piece goal by Charlotte's **Idan Toklomati** sealed the win for the visitors. The Revolution tied their season high with 20 shot attempts to Charlotte's nine, while **Matt Turner** logged three saves in his fourth start.

Charlotte began the night on the front foot and opened the scoring in the 13th minute through midfielder **Brandt Bronico**. After his initial shot was parried by Turner, the rebound deflected back off Bronico's body towards the line. Defender **Mamadou Fofana** nearly cleared it off the line, but the ball had just crossed over the threshold to give the visitors a 1-0 lead.

New England nearly added the go-ahead goal in the 67th minute, with Gil whipping in a shot that ricocheted off the left side of the woodwork. The captain had another shot on net in the 86th minute, but it fell safely into the hands of Charlotte goalkeeper **Kristjan Kahilna**. The Spaniard was fouled a game-high five times and led the Revolution attack tonight with five key passes and five shot attempts, including three on target. He also surpassed 16,000 minutes played for the club, the ninth player in Revolution history to reach the milestone.



The New England Revolution (8-14-7; 31 pts.) were defeated by Chicago Fire FC (12-10-6, 42 pts.), 3-2, on Saturday, Sept. 6 at SeatGeek Stadium. Chicago struck early with a pair of goals in the opening 10 minutes and added a third goal in the 68th minute. New England fought back with a pair of late goals from Homegrown defender **Peyton Miller** and Revolution captain **Carles Gil**, who netted from the penalty spot, but the comeback effort fell just short.

Chicago immediately began the night on the front foot, opening the scoring within two minutes of the opening whistle as forward **Jonathan Bamba** tapped a long ball from **Brian Gutierrez** under goalkeeper Matt Turner, who had come charging off his line. The hosts doubled their lead eight minutes later, as **Philip Zinckernagel** unleashed a long-range strike into the bottom-left corner, bouncing just over Turner's outstretched palm.

The 17-year-old left back received a through ball from Argentinian forward **Tomás Chancalay** and slotted his shot into the far corner. Chancalay registered his second assist of the season and recorded a team-best four key passes in the match.


In stoppage time, defender **Will Sands** drew a foul inside the box as he was fouled by former Revolution defender **Omar Gonzalez**. Gil stepped up to the spot and buried his attempt, giving him 10 goals on the season. Along with his 11 assists, Gil now has reached double-digit goals and assists for the third time in MLS. Gil and Miller shared the team lead with four shot attempts each, a single-game high for the Homegrown defender. Off the bench, Ugandan international midfielder **Allan Oyirwoth**, 18, made his MLS debut with a 21-minute shift in the midfield.

The New England Revolution (8-14-8; 32 pts.) dueled Toronto FC (5-13-11, 26 pts.) to a 1-1 draw on Saturday, Sept. 13 at Gillette Stadium. After Toronto broke the deadlock in the 75th minute, Argentinian attacker **Luca Langoni** leveled the match in the 90th minute to rescue a draw for the Revolution.

Despite a scoreless first half, New England created plenty of attacking chances in front of the home crowd of 22,391. Forward **Tomás Chancalay** nearly opened the scoring in just the eighth minute, sending a right-footed effort wide of the right post. In the 21st minute, Revolution captain **Carles Gil** split Toronto's defense with a long-range shot from outside the box, finding the hands of Toronto goalkeeper **Luka Gavran**. Moments later, the Spaniard slipped a pass through Toronto's defense to **Alhassan Yusuf** in the penalty area, but his first-time shot sailed over the crossbar.

Toronto broke the stalemate in the 75th minute, with winger **Theo Corbeanu** slotting home a low strike past a diving **Matt Turner**. The goalkeeper posted a four-save performance in his sixth consecutive start for New England, including a point-blank save on Toronto forward **Jules-Anthony Vilsaint** in the 83rd minute to keep the game within reach.

Ugandan international **Allan Oyirwoth** earned his first career MLS start tonight, recording a pair of shots with one attempt on frame in his 87-minute shift. The 18-year-old nearly scored his first MLS goal when he unleashed a shot on frame from outside the box in the 83rd minute, but his attempt was saved by Gavran. In search of an equalizer, Head Coach **Caleb Porter** deployed several second-half substitutes, including Revolution II forward **Sharod George**, 21, who made his MLS debut tonight in his second straight match with the first team.


In the final moments of the contest, the Revolution found the equalizer through Langoni. Right wingback **Ilay Feingold** initiated the play, crossing a ball into the box that deflected off the head of a Toronto defender and fell kindly to Langoni at the top of the area. The Argentine took a touch and rifled a shot towards the Toronto goal, which deflected off a TFC player and past Gavran for the tying strike.

## POSTGAME NOTES

- **Luca Langoni** tallied his second goal of the season, a 90th-minute equalizer. It was the Argentine's fifth goal in MLS.
- 18-year-old Ugandan midfielder **Allan Oyirwoth** collected his first MLS start, one week after making his MLS debut at Chicago Fire FC, and completed 87 percent of his pass attempts.

- Revolution II forward **Sharod George** made his MLS debut, entering the game in the 86th minute. The 21-year-old was called up to the first team on a short-term agreement for the second consecutive match.

The New England Revolution (8-15-8; 32 pts.) fell to the Philadelphia Union (18-7-6; 60 pts.), 1-0, in a Saturday matinee at Subaru Park on Sept. 20. Saturday's defeat, which saw the Revolution reduced to 10 men late in the contest, eliminates New England from Audi MLS Cup Playoffs contention.

Midfielder **Allan Oyirwoth**, making his second straight start and third consecutive MLS appearance, provided an early chance for New England in just the fourth minute. The 18-year-old Uganda international combined with fellow midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** on a give-and-go into the box, but his effort was blocked and cleared by a Union defender. Oyirwoth matched second-half substitute **Tomás Chancalay** with a team-high two shot attempts on the day.

The Revolution stifled Philadelphia's potent attack in a scoreless first half, though the hosts nearly struck first in the 38th minute, when **Kai Wagner** delivered a lofted corner kick into the box. Philadelphia forward **Bruno Damiani** met the cross with a powerful header, forcing a reaction save from Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner**. Turner, in his seventh start for New England since returning to MLS last month, posted a three-save performance.

On the other side of halftime, wing back **Ilay Feingold** provided the first big chance for the Revolution when he connected with **Carles Gil** on the captain's free-kick delivery, but his shot went just wide into the side netting. Feingold, 21, suited up for the 25th start of his debut campaign today. Fifteen minutes later, Philadelphia broke the deadlock through Damiani in the 71st minute. The Uruguayan striker, who had been contained by New England center back **Brayan Ceballos** for most of the match, scored the game's lone goal with a left-footed finish into the corner, assisted by **Milan Iloski**.


New England was reduced to 10 men for the final stretch of the match, as Homegrown defender **Peyton Miller** was shown a red card in the 75th minute. Revolution Interim Head Coach **Pablo Moreira** deployed several late substitutes in search of an equalizer, including veteran defender **Andrew Farrell**, who made his 2025 season debut. Farrell nearly provided an assist on Chancalay's last-gasp attempt to tie the game, which Union goalkeeper **Andre Blake** parried away to seal the Union victory.

The New England Revolution (9-15-8; 35 pts.) defeated Atlanta United FC (5-13-12, 27 pts.), 2-0, on Saturday, Sept. 27 at Gillette Stadium with 25,790 fans in attendance. The Revolution's newest striker **Dor Turgeman** recorded a goal and assist in his MLS debut, and forward **Leo Campana** netted his seventh goal of the season to seal the victory. New England's goalkeeper **Matt Turner** made four saves for his second clean sheet of the season and the team's 10th of the year, their most since 2013.


New England came close to scoring the opener in the eighth minute, when midfielder **Allan Oyirwoth** unleashed a shot from distance that went wide of the left post. The 18-year-old Uganda international earned his third straight start and fourth consecutive MLS appearance in tonight's contest. Forward **Tomás Chancalay** followed that effort with a powerful strike from outside of the penalty area in the 23rd minute, one of the team's seven shots in the opening frame, but his attempt curled past the post to keep the match scoreless heading into halftime.

New England ramped up the pressure after play resumed, forcing three turnovers in quick succession inside Atlanta's half. Forward **Luca Langoni** unleashed a cultured strike towards the corner, as the shot ricocheted off the crossbar. In the 58th minute, Interim Head Coach **Pablo Moreira** turned to his bench and brought on the club's marquee summer signing, Turgeman, whose influence tilted the match in New England's favor. The Israeli international opened the scoring in the 72nd minute, as he chopped the ball past an Atlanta defender and curled his first MLS shot attempt into the net. Midfielder **Carles Gil** provided the slick feed for the game-winning goal, giving the captain 12 helpers on the year and 150 goal contributions in all competitions. Gil's 85th league assist moved him into a tie with **Maxi Moralez** for the most among all active MLS players.


Campana scored his seventh goal of the season just three minutes later, assisted by a clever pass from Turgeman. The Ecuadorian returned from a three-game injury absence and thumped home a shot only 10 minutes into his shift. Turner was credited with a secondary assist on the goal, the second of his MLS career and only the seventh goalkeeper assist in club history. Turner tied **Bobby Shuttleworth** (46) for second-most victories in club annals. The Revolution have now reached double-digit shutouts for the fifth time in team history.

## POSTGAME NOTES

- New England improves to 7-5-4 all-time against Atlanta United FC, including 6-1-2 in the last nine meetings, with three straight wins.
- The Revolution swept the season series with Atlanta for the first time since 2021.

- Leo Campana** made his return to action with a 25-minute shift and tallied his seventh goal of the season.
- Carles Gil** recorded his 12th assist of the season on **Turgeman's** opening goal. The assist was Gil's 150th goal contribution for New England across all competitions. The captain's 85 regular season assists are tied for the most among active MLS players (**Maxi Moralez**).
- Matt Turner** was credited with a secondary assist on **Campana's** goal, the second of his MLS career and seventh goalkeeper assist in club history. Turner's helper was the first by a Revolution goalkeeper since **Djordje Petrović** on April 8, 2023. He joins **Matt Reis** (2) as the only keepers in club annals with multiple career assists. **Turner** collected his second clean sheet of the season with a four-save performance. The New England Revolution (9-16-8; 35 pts.) fell to Inter Miami CF (17-7-8, 59 pts.), 4-1, on Saturday, Oct. 4 at Chase Stadium. Revolution newcomer Dor Turgeman became the first player in club history to score in each of his first two MLS games, but a pair of Miami goals in each half, three of them assisted by Lionel Messi, lifted the hosts to victory in New England's final away match of the 2025 MLS campaign.

New England had a bright start to the match and nearly stunned Inter Miami by finding the scoresheet within 10 minutes. Revolution captain Carles Gil lofted a cross to the back post towards a streaking Brandon Bye, whose header ricocheted off the crossbar. Miami rebounded from the early chance and began testing New England's backline, as Messi forced a diving save out of Matt Turner in the 14th minute. Turner posted four saves on the night in what was his last match before departing for international duty next week with the United States Men's National Team.

Miami found its breakthrough in the 32nd minute from Tadeo Allende, who drove a low shot into the net on Messi's assist. The hosts doubled their lead moments before the halftime whistle, as Messi pounced on a turnover and slipped a centering pass to Jordi Alba, who touched the ball around a sliding defender and finished with his left foot from close range.

Interim Head Coach Pablo Moreira made two changes at the intermission, as Luca Langoni replaced Mamadou Fofana and Alhassan Yusuf came on for Allan Oyirwoth. The change paid dividends before the hour mark as New England pulled one back through Turgeman in the 59th minute. The 21-year-old striker collected a pass from Gil, nutmegged an opponent, and rippled the net with a powerful right-footed shot past a frozen Miami goalkeeper.

With his second goal since arriving to New England, Turgeman became the first Revolution player to score in each of his first two MLS matches. Gil recorded his team-leading 13th of the season on the play and finished with a game-high five key passes.


The Revolution's comeback attempt was cut short by Miami's third goal coming quickly off the ensuing kickoff. Allende scored in the 60th minute to restore the two-goal advantage, and Alba completed his brace in the 63rd minute to put the match out of reach. In an effort to cut into the deficit, the Revolution deployed Argentinian forward Tomás Chancalay in the 71st minute, who logged three shot attempts in his brief appearance.

The New England Revolution (9-16-9; 36 pts.) battled Chicago Fire FC (15-11-8; 53 pts.), to a 2-2 draw in their final match of the 2025 MLS regular season, with 36,432 fans in attendance at Gillette Stadium. Midfielder Alhassan Yusuf netted New England's quickest goal of the season in the first minute of the match. In stoppage time, newly acquired forward Dor Turgeman recorded his third goal in as many games, before an own goal deep into stoppage time pulled Chicago back level.


New England began the MLS Decision Day contest with a goal only 44 seconds into the match. Yusuf intercepted a loose touch by a Chicago defender and chipped a shot past goalkeeper Chris Brady for his second tally of the season. Yusuf was one of two Revolution players to appear in all 34 games this season, along with Carles Gil, the 2025 Revolution Team MVP and Golden Boot winner.

Chicago's best first-half chance came in the 29th minute, when the visitors fired a shot toward the bottom-left corner, but a sprawling save from New England goalkeeper Matt Turner kept the visitors off the scoresheet. Turner posted four saves in his 10th start of the campaign. Moments later, Gil sent a cross into the penalty area for Keegan Hughes, whose header missed wide. Gil finished the night with a team-high two key passes and one assist, his 14th of the season, in the captain's 200th Revolution start across all competitions.

Late in the match, Chicago fought back to equalize on Philip Zinckernagel's goal in the 82nd minute, a close-range shot over Turner's head. The Revolution reclaimed the lead in the sixth minute of stoppage time, as Turgeman got his head on the end of Gil's free kick to put New England ahead 2-1. With the goal, Turgeman became the 10th MLS player, and the first Revolution player, to score in each of his first three matches. Nine minutes into second-half stoppage time, Chicago concluded the scoring with an own goal credited to Turgeman.

The New England Revolution defeated USL Championship side Rhode Island FC, 2-1 in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Round of 32 on Wednesday, May 7 at Centreville Bank Stadium. Argentinian forward **Tomás Chancalay** netted his first goal of 2025, giving New England a 1-0 lead at halftime. Revolution Academy product and Somerville, Mass. native **Cristiano Oliveira** tallied the game-winning goal in the 88th minute, sealing New England's victory.

With the win, New England advances to the U.S. Open Cup Round of 16 and will host Chicago Fire FC at Providence College's Chapey Field at Anderson Stadium. Match details including date, kickoff time, and broadcast information will be announced Thursday. Tickets will go on sale to Revolution Season Members this Friday, May 9, before going on sale to the general public on Monday, May 12.

In the first meeting between the two New England clubs, the two sides were evenly matched through the first half hour. The Revolution broke the stalemate in the 38th minute with Chancalay scoring his first goal of 2025. **Maxi Urruti** forced a deflected pass from the hosts into the penalty area, which Chancalay slotted through the legs of Rhode Island goalkeeper **Jackson Lee**.

Rhode Island pulled one back early in the second half, knotting the score at 1-1 in the 49th minute off the foot of **Maxi Rodriguez**. With extra time looming, Oliveira, who made his first team debut for the Revolution tonight with a 15-minute performance off the bench, tallied the winning goal with a clutch strike in the 88th minute. Cranston, R.I. native **Gevork Diarbian** whipped in a cross that deflected off the right post and fell to the feet of Oliveira, who buried his first goal for the Revolution.

**Allan Oyirwoth**, an 18-year-old from Uganda, posted a 75-minute outing in tonight's victory. **Andrew Farrell** earned his first start of the season as he moves into a tie with **Scott Caldwell** (16) for the second-most U.S. Open Cup appearances in Revolution history. Goalkeeper **Alex Bono** registered one save in his Revs debut.

The New England Revolution fell to Chicago Fire FC, 3-1, in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Round of 16 on Tuesday, May 20 at Chapey Field at Anderson Stadium on the campus of Providence College. Despite New England outshooting Chicago 9-4, the visitors used a late first-half goal to swing momentum against a young Revolution lineup.

New England almost opened the scoring in the 27th minute, as defender **Brandon Bye** glanced a header off a corner kick right at Chicago goalkeeper **Chris Brady**. Bye suited up for his ninth U.S. Open Cup appearance tonight, his fifth career start in the tournament. Chicago broke the stalemate in the 38th minute as forward **Jonathan Bamba** delivered a cross into the box that deflected off Revolution midfielder **Eric Klein** and into the net to give the visitors a 1-0 lead just shy of halftime.

Chicago started the second half on the front foot, with **Hugo Cuypers** scoring an insurance goal in the 70th minute. Fire FC midfielder **Philip Zinckernagel** put the game out of reach with the visitors' third goal in the 79th minute. New England pulled one back with a late 89th-minute goal, as Cranston, R.I. native **Gevork Diarbian** fired a shot from inside the box that deflected off Chicago defender **Justin Reynolds** and into the net. Diarbian, playing at his alma mater tonight, logged 23 minutes in his second U.S. Open Cup appearance.

**Allan Oyirwoth**, 18, led New England's attack with four shots in his 90-minute outing. In total, eight Revolution II players earned minutes in Tuesday's match.

MLS veteran **Andrew Farrell** suited up for his second consecutive start in this year's competition, logging all 90 minutes to set a new club record for most minutes played in the tournament. The 13th-year pro also moved into a tie with **Diego Fagundez** (17) for most U.S. Open Cup appearances in Revolution history.
