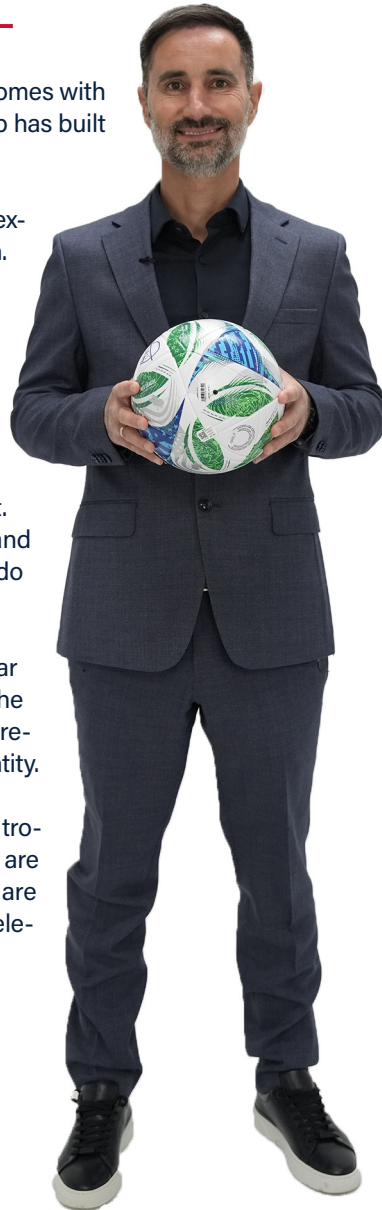

The New England Revolution (7-4-1, 22 pts.) fell to Nashville SC (8-1-3, 27 pts.), 3-0, on Wednesday, May 12 at Gillette Stadium. Despite New England holding the edge in possession, Nashville's two first-half goals and 74th-minute tally gave the visitors all three points in the battle between the Eastern Conference's top two teams entering the day.

New England generated its first look on frame in the 30th minute when defender **Ethan Kohler** rose up to meet a corner kick from midfielder **Carles Gil**, but his headed effort was denied by Nashville goalkeeper Brian Schwake. Nashville broke through moments later as Cristian Espinoza created space down the right side and centered a pass for Bryan Acosta, who slotted a low, driven shot into the bottom left corner in the 34th minute.

The visitors doubled their lead in the 41st minute after a giveaway from New England goalkeeper **Matt Turner** fell kindly to the feet of Warren Madrigal, who slotted home his finish to put Nashville ahead 2-0 at the break. In the second half, Nashville extended its lead with Acosta and Espinoza connecting again in the 74th minute.

Forward **Marcos Zambrano** made his MLS debut with a 12-minute shift off the bench. Zambrano was one of six U.S. youth internationals to appear in tonight's contest, alongside Kohler, **Griffin Yow**, **Brooklyn Raines**, **Peyton Miller**, and **Eric Klein**. Miller earned in his 50th Revolution appearance across all competitions.

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CARLES THE CONSISTENT

The New England Revolution have looked like a new team this season, putting on a series of entertaining performances which have rocketed them to third in the East. They've broken records at home, scored 20 goals, and re-established themselves as contenders. Plenty has changed in New England from the past few seasons, but one thing has remained the same: **Carles Gil**.

The Spaniard currently leads New England in both goals and overall goal contributions, just as he's done nearly every year since his arrival in 2019. With four goals and four assists, Gil has been the difference maker several times this season, and the 33-year-old maestro is showing no signs of slowing down.

It's no coincidence that the captain has remained so consistent throughout his time in New England. Gil is a humble leader, who is constantly searching for any way to help his team win.

"For me, what's important are the wins – the team wins. I try to help with every possible thing. Sometimes it's with a goal or assists. Sometimes just helping the team to find good places to hurt the other team," he explained. "I try to do what Marko (Mitrović) wants in every moment. I've been lucky to score in the last games and I'm very happy."

Gil has lived some of the Revolution's best moments – notably in 2021 when they won the Supporters' Shield – and he sees similarities from that historic group with this year's team.



"It's a different team, a different staff, but I think there is a similar mentality. Since preseason you could feel that we are trying to build a winning mentality, and that's the key to winning games. If you don't have that, it's very difficult to win," Gil said.

While the roster has remained largely the same from last season, the arrival of Mitrović as head coach has reshaped the team's mindset in ways Gil immediately felt.

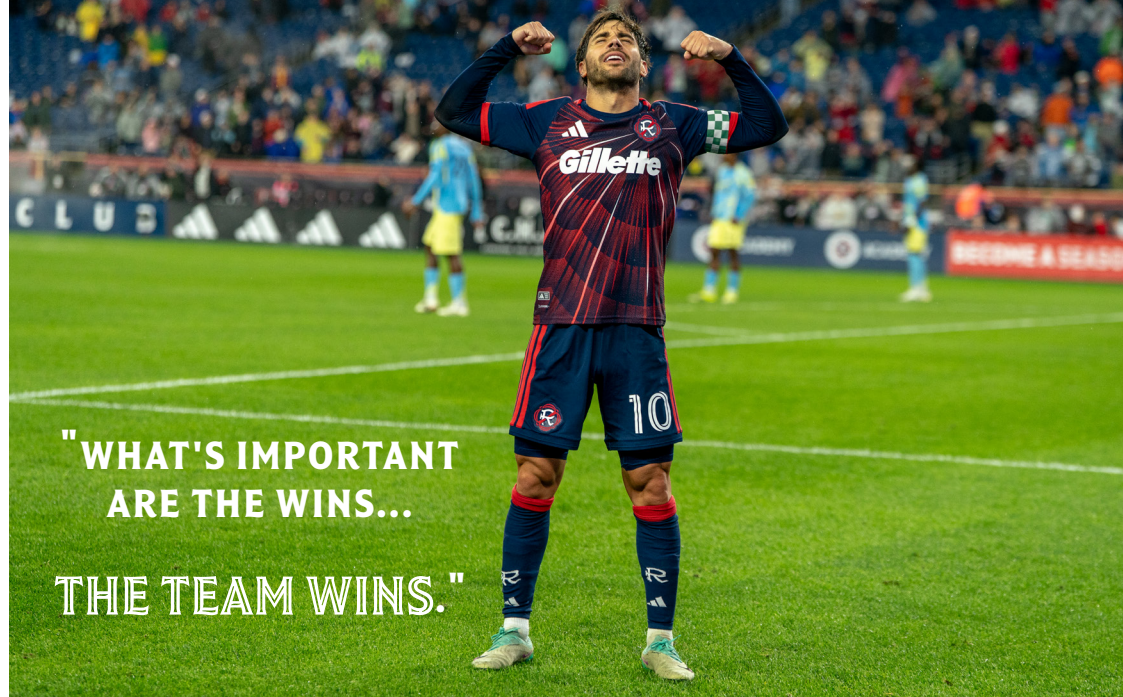
"From the very first call I had with him, in the off-season, I could tell that he is a person that you can know from the first day. He's very transparent. Not just him, but his staff, too. He's the boss and he's been key for everyone," Gil said. "It's been great the way he treats everyone on the field, off the field. But you also need to train hard with him. If you don't, you will not be in a good way, but if you do – you know good things are going to happen."

In a locker room filled with young talent, Gil understands the responsibility that comes with being captain. Players naturally look to him, but he prefers to blend in as just another member of the group. His advice always remains simple, "to enjoy every moment."

Gil has always emphasized that he is not the only leader in this Revolution locker room, giving credit to other players who continually step up. Under Mitrović, he says, that collective voice has only grown stronger.

"He involves everyone. Everyone is important and everyone has their own role. On the pitch it's the same. To keep having this success, we need a group like this where everyone feels like they have a spot," he said.

Mitrović's impact on Gil and the team shows up in the small moments away from the pitch, too. Sometimes, it's not even Carles who shows it, but a different Gil entirely. A few games back, Carles' young son – also named Marco – joined his dad on the field to celebrate a hard-fought point in Miami.

But it wasn't just Carles he ran to see. The usually reserved toddler made a beeline for Mitrović, throwing his arms around him in a giant hug.

"I was so surprised because Marco doesn't usually give hugs that easily. Last week he did the same in the locker room, he ran to give Marko a hug. They met before the season when we did a family day at the training center, but these moments have been so good," Gil said with a smile.

While it's great to see a star of Gil's caliber deflect praise toward his teammates and coaching staff – especially during a strong run of form – what stands out more is his hunger to keep improving.

"Sure, I'm experienced, but I still think there are many things I can improve," said Gil. "Marko has been helping me a lot without the ball to find good movements and space. Offensively too, there are many small things that are new for me, even at 33. It's important because you need to feel that every day.

"As I get older, I've appreciated everything more, coming here and training hard. Normally, what people see is just the game, but there is so much happening during the week that I'm enjoying a lot. And I think the key is to just keep showing that on the pitch."

And if the Revs keep matching Gil's hunger, it feels like this season could just keep getting better.

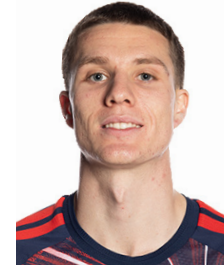

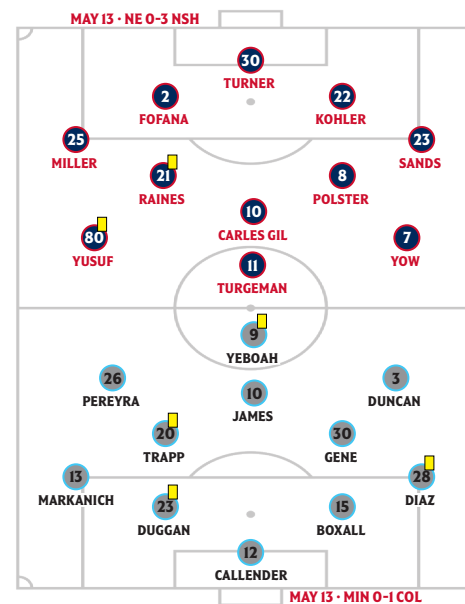


GAME NOTES

MATCHDAY HEADLINES

- The Revolution renew acquaintances with Minnesota United FC on Saturday night for just the sixth all-time meeting between the two sides. New England owns a 3-1-1 edge in the previous five meetings, including victories in all three encounters at Gillette Stadium.
- New England remains one of the league's best teams at home, collecting 18 points over the first seven contests in Foxborough this season.
- **M Carles Gil's** next appearance will be the Spaniard's 225th for New England across all competitions. Gil's 30 chances created this season are tied for seventh-most in MLS and second among Eastern Conference players.
- **GK Matt Turner** holds the third-best save percentage in the league this season (75.0), while his 51 saves rank fifth. His next appearance will be the 125th of his MLS career.

"It's a new day. For us, it's always a new day. It doesn't matter what the result of the [previous] game was. Obviously, it's always better when you win. But we already switched our minds to today, to how we can use today to recover, because the game is coming in 48 hours. The staff has completely switched to the next game, and we only speak about Minnesota."

"[Minnesota] are a team that from one starting shape that they have when they defend, they get into man-to-man and are very aggressive to press you higher on the field. When they create situations, they're very direct, either playing build-up from the mid-third or when they get to finishing their attacks. They don't hesitate to finish their attacks. They're also a team that's very strong on the ball. It's going to be difficult to sustain the attack. We'll have to find a way to break their man-to-man press and find moments where we can control the game with the ball."

"I think everyone on this team is very competitive, so obviously, everyone is a little frustrated about the result [Wednesday night]. It was a big game and I think that we just came up a little bit short in the end. I think there were pieces of that match where our identity really came out, and I think there was a piece of the match where we played well. I think it's just little details that kind of broke us in the end. If we can shore that up, I think we are very close. [We were] a little frustrated, but I think [we need to focus on] what Marko has stressed all year of putting one foot in front of the other and taking every day one step at a time. There is definitely stuff we can learn from [Wednesday] and prepare for the next match."



PLAY UNIFIED

May 6 was a special day for everyone at the New England Revolution. The date marked the 12th annual Unified Team Signing Day in partnership with Special Olympics Massachusetts and the Arbella Insurance Group, as 19 Special Olympics athletes and Unified partners signed with the 2026 Revolution Unified squad.

"It was probably one of the greatest days of my life – besides tryouts," said Special Olympics athlete Liam Wise. "I'm happy the team is back and can't wait for the season."

Wise, a veteran of the program, joined his teammates in signing contracts, participating in media like first-team players, and soaking in the cheers of friends and family. They were also welcomed by Revolution sporting director Curt Onalfo, head coach Marko Mitrović, and several Revolution players who gave them some inspiration ahead of their upcoming season.

"It's a special day to celebrate the athletes going to tryouts, working hard, making the team, and just being on a team. There are core values we talked about, Marko talked about, Curt talked about – be brave, be courageous, be honest, be hardworking, but I also think the most important thing for me in sports and in life is to have fun," said defender Andrew Farrell, who has worked with the Unified Team since its inception. "Inclusivity is so important and I think the club does a great job at doing that with the partnership with Special Olympics Massachusetts."

The Unified Team is led by coach Deb Godbout, who has been involved with the program since the beginning, but is entering her fifth year as head coach. Her impact on the athletes has been unmistakable.

"We are really lucky to have Coach Deb as our coach. She makes a huge impact on us, not just on the field, but also off. She teaches us so many things, how to be great people, and just impacts our lives so greatly and deeply," said Unified partner Alyson Green, who signed for her third season on the team.

Like both Green and Wise, many athletes are inspired to return year after year, but a spot isn't always guaranteed. Every Unified Team player must earn their place at tryouts. For Wise, the experience goes far beyond competition or stepping onto the field at Gillette Stadium.

"It's special to me because we get to travel and meet new people from different states and countries, but the friendships are my favorite part," he said.

The Revolution Unified Team will play two games this season, as they prepare to put the power of inclusivity on full display. The squad will kick off its 2026 campaign at Gillette Stadium on July 22 against Toronto FC's Unified Team, before going international and taking them on in Canada on August 15.

Signing day doesn't just mark the start of a new Unified season, it also represents another year of growth in the Revolution's partnership with Special Olympics Massachusetts, as they work together to make sports more accessible to people of all abilities.

"There's that phrase out there, 'if you can see it, you can be it,' and I think what this program delivers is an opportunity to see it, and seeing someone like you playing on the field at Gillette Stadium gives you the confidence that you might be able to be there someday," explained Charles Hirsch, Assistant Vice President of Development, Brand and Marketing for Special Olympics Massachusetts. "Maybe it's not Gillette Stadium, but it's your high school team or local club team that you didn't think you could participate in."

"Having the first-team players be part of this just falls right in with the values that the Revolution hold their players and staff to. Having it be the first team, second team, Academy, and the Unified Team and talking about them all in the same breath – it just elevates the visibility."

For fans looking to uplift the message of Unified sports, staying after the first-team match on July 22 to cheer on the Unified athletes is a meaningful place to start. Just as much as visibility matters, even one person in the stands cheering them on can go a long way. In the Revolution family, it's all one team. A Revs fan is a Unified fan.

"The Unified Team is part of our family and we support them. They support us," Farrell said. "It's a great thing, a beautiful thing, and when everyone's supporting each other, big and important things can happen."

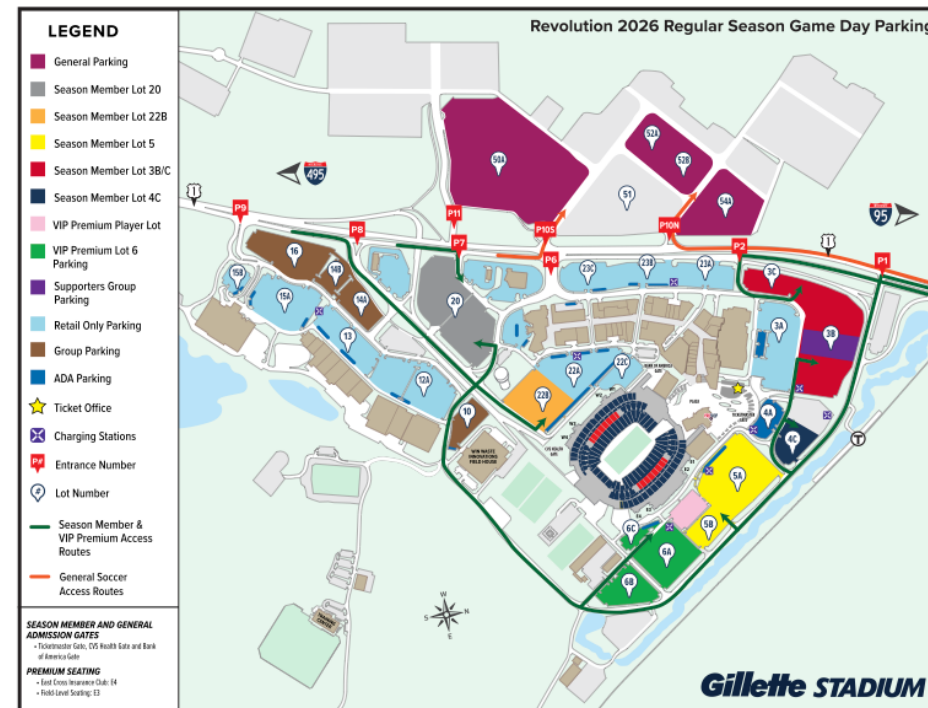
