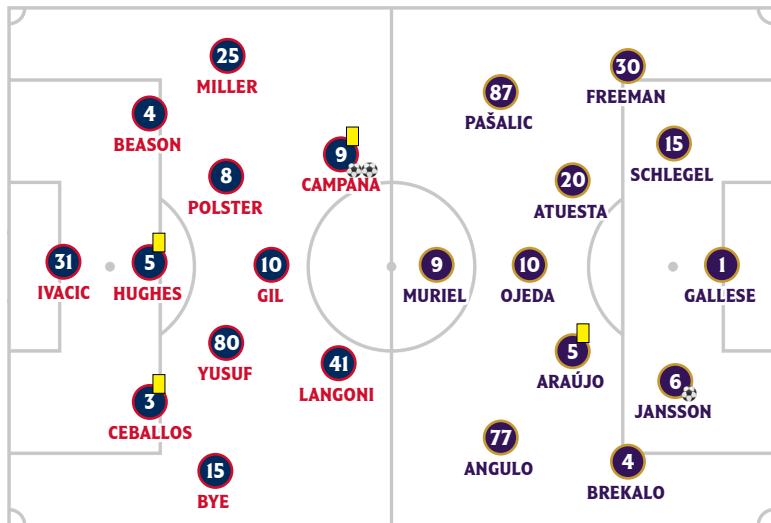

WHAT TO WATCH FOR TEAM NOTES

- Saturday marks the debut of the club's new throwback-themed third kit, "The '96", as part of the adidas x MLS Archive Collection that celebrates the style and aesthetic of the late '90s and early 2000s.
- The Revolution open a four-game homestand on Saturday night, returning to Foxborough for a matchup against Eastern Conference foe Orlando City SC at Gillette Stadium.
- New England owns a 6-1-2 mark against Orlando City at home, and a slight 7-5-8 edge in the all-time regular season series.
- The team's eight clean sheets are tied for second most in MLS, two behind the league leaders Vancouver (10) and two shy of tying a new club record (10), last achieved in three straight seasons from 2005-07.
- The Revolution lead the league with 111 blocked shots this season, while their average of 5.0 blocked shots per 90 minutes also paces MLS.

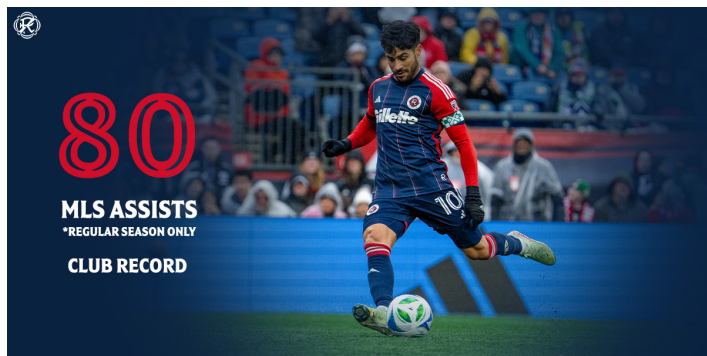

CARLES GIL MAKES 200TH REVOLUTION APPEARANCE

New England captain **Carles Gil** became just the 13th player in Revolution history to reach 200 appearances for the club across all competitions on July 16 against the New York Red Bulls. Gil moved into the top 10 in club annals for minutes played and game started during the regular season with his 90-minute performance on July 12 at Austin FC:

While playmaking has always been Gil's game, the captain has once again shown his prowess for scoring goals and leads the team with eight tallies this season. Gil set the club's regular season assists record on April 19, 2025. The Spaniard is the first Revolution player to reach double-digit assists in four straight seasons. With his team-best 10 helpers in 2024, Gil became the only Revolution player to lead the club in assists in four consecutive seasons (2021-24). Gil now owns the club assists records in both the regular season and across all competitions.

Gil is climbing toward the precipice of the Revolution's all-time goal contributions list. Already the club's leader in assists across the regular season, playoffs, and all competitions, Gil is now closing in on the most goal contributions in club annals. The shirts will be paired with Bright Red socks, while the shorts, shirt details, and numerals utilize a refreshed shade of Night Sky Blue.



MATT POLSTER RE-SIGNED THROUGH 2027

The New England Revolution signed midfielder **Matt Polster** to a new multi-year contract on May 16, keeping the veteran midfielder in Foxborough through the 2027 Major League Soccer season.

During his six seasons in New England, Polster has tallied 175 appearances across all competitions, 158 of them starts, along with seven goals and nine assists. Polster started all 31 of his regular season appearances in each of the last two seasons, 2023 and 2024. The Revolution midfielder and MLS veteran has been a mainstay in the New England lineup since his arrival in August 2020. Polster is one of 28 Revolution players to log 10,000 minutes in all competitions for the club.

This year, Polster has started all 18 of his appearances, and netted his first goal of the 2025 campaign in a come-from-behind 3-3 draw at Orlando City SC on May 10. Since his Revolution debut in August 2020, Polster ranks second among MLS midfielders with 216 interceptions and fifth with 48 blocked shots over parts of six seasons:

GOOD HANDS: ALJAŽ IVACIČ SHINES IN NET THIS SEASON

The New England Revolution signed goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić** last April, and the Slovenian has started all 47 league matches for New England since, jettisoning him into the top 10 in Revolution history for games and minutes played in goal. So far in the 2025 campaign, Ivačić has recorded 64 saves and eight clean sheets - tied for second most in MLS this season and two behind the league lead. The eight shutouts for New England are also two shy of the club's single-season record (10 - 2005, 2006 & 2007).

Ivačić has been named to the MLS Team of the Matchday three times this season, in Matchday 8, 10, and 24. Ivačić collected four straight shutouts for the first time in his MLS career between April 12 and May 3, while his eight clean sheets on the campaign surpassed his career high set in 2022.

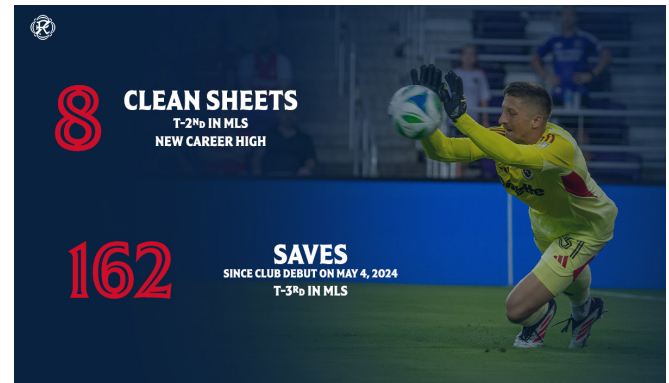

Revolution Head Coach Caleb Porter has carved out a stellar career, with championships in both the collegiate and professional ranks, including two MLS Cup titles in 2015 and 2020 and the 2021 Campeones Cup crown. For his 11-year professional coaching career across all competitions spanning stints with Portland Timbers FC, Columbus Crew, and New England, Porter coached his 400th game on the sidelines on June 25 vs. Nashville SC.

Porter's career record at the professional level through 405 matches sits at 158-141-106. Among current head coaches in MLS, Porter is the ninth to surpass 400 matches on the sidelines in his professional club career.

PACKED HOUSE: REVS HOST FIFTH-LARGEST HOME CROWD

After finishing in the top five in attendance across all of MLS last season, New England again has seen fans turn out in droves for matches in 2025. That included a season-high 43,293 fans on Wednesday, July 9 for the Revs' regular season home match against Inter Miami CF.

New England set a club record during Inter Miami's visit to Foxborough on April 27, 2024 with 65,612 fans, the second-largest soccer match in Gillette Stadium history. Since the start of 2024, New England has seen four of the seven highest-attended home matches in its history.

The 43,293 fans on July 9 marked the fifth-highest single-game attendance in Revolution history, including the fourth-highest regular season total and the third-best standalone attendance.

HOMEGROWN MERIC KLEIN MAKES MLS DEBUT

The New England Revolution signed midfielder Eric Klein, the 2024 Revolution Academy Player of the Year, to the first team roster as a Homegrown Player. Klein, an 18-year-old midfielder from Manheim, Penn., rises to New England's first team as the 15th Homegrown Player in club history less than one year after signing his first MLS NEXT Pro professional contract with Revolution II in September 2024.

Klein becomes the second second-generation player in Revolution team annals, following in the footsteps of his father, Steve, who played for the Revolution in 1997. In 2025, Klein has started seven games, logging one assist in MLS NEXT Pro. The midfielder made his MLS debut off the bench at CF Montreal on May 31, becoming the fifth-youngest MLS debutant in club annals. He previously made his senior team debut in the U.S. Open Cup Round of 32, playing 45 minutes as a substitute in the win against Rhode Island FC on May 7. He then earned his first start in the Round of 16 against Chicago Fire FC on May 20.

PEYTON MILLER MARKS ONE YEAR SINCE MLS DEBUT

Left back Peyton Miller recorded his first goal-and-assist performance in MLS, scoring his first professional goal, a game-winner, in a 3-0 victory at CF Montreal on May 31. Miller, now 17, is building on an impressive debut season in 2024 that saw him make 10 MLS appearances, with eight starts. He earned a spot on the 2024 MLS 22 Under 22 presented by BODYARMOR as the second-youngest player on the prestigious list.

Miller has become a consistent contributor in Caleb Porter's side, logging starts in 15 of his 16 regular season appearances and collecting one goal and one assist as he continues to thrive in the left wingback role. The defender also earned a June call-up to the United States Under-20 Men's National Team for training camp in Cairo, Egypt ahead of the FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile in the fall, the youngest player included on the roster.

Miller, the first Connecticut product to sign a Homegrown Player deal with New England, made his first-team debut last July, becoming the second-youngest player to debut for the club at age 16. On Sept. 18, 2024 against CF Montreal, Miller became the eighth-youngest player in league history to record his first MLS assist at 16 years and 315 days. Even with fellow Homegrown signings Damarío McIntosh (also 17) and Eric Klein (18) on the roster, Miller remains the youngest player on the senior team.

FOUR REVS EARN JUNE INTERNATIONAL CALLUPS

New England Revolution forward/winger **Ignatius Ganago** (Cameroon) and midfielder **Allan Oyirwoth** (Uganda) both earned senior international call-ups for a pair of friendlies in Marrakech, Morocco during the upcoming June FIFA window. Cameroon defeated Oyirwoth's Uganda side, 3-0, at Marrakesh Stadium on Friday, June 6. On Monday, June 9, Uganda played to a 1-1 draw with The Gambia and Cameroon also drew 1-1 Equatorial Guinea.

Ganago, 26, earned his second international call-up of 2025 following his return to international football after two years away from the National Team. Capped 15 times by the senior national team, Ganago saw action off the bench in a World Cup Qualifying match at Eswatini in March. Ganago has started all 13 games for New England in 2025, collecting one goal and a team-leading three assists over his last six appearances. Ganago owns over 200 professional appearances at the club level, most of which came in the topflight French Ligue 1.

Oyirwoth, 18, started both contests for Uganda during the June window. The midfielder earned a third senior international call-up for Uganda, having been capped on two previous occasions. The teenager made his debut for The Cranes in November 2023, starting and playing 68 minutes and recording the game-winning assist in a 1-0 World Cup Qualifying victory over Somalia. Oyirwoth also logged 27 minutes off the bench in a friendly against Kuwait in January 2024.

Additionally, defender **Peyton Miller**, 17, was the youngest player called-up to the United States Under-20 Men's National Team for training camp in Cairo, Egypt ahead of the 2025 FIFA Under-20 World Cup this September in Chile. Miller was among 14 MLS-based players included in Head Coach Marko Mitrović's 22-player roster. The United States lost, 1-0, to the Norway U-20 side on June 6, with Miller coming off the bench at halftime. Miller then started the matchup with the Colombia U-20 team on June 10 to close training camp.

Lastly, forward **Leo Campana** was called-up to the Ecuador Men's National Team for a pair of World Cup Qualifying matches against Brazil and Peru. The 24-year-old, who owns 16 senior caps for Ecuador, has been recovering from a leg injury and missed three straight regular season contests prior to joining *La Tri*. Following a 0-0 draw with Peru on June 10, Ecuador officially qualified for the FIFA 2026 World Cup.

NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION II



LAST TIME OUT (AT CHICAGO FIRE FC II)

New England Revolution II (6-4-5; 27 pts.) defeated Chicago Fire FC II (7-5-4; 27 pts.), 4-3, on Sunday afternoon at SeatGeek Stadium. New England's victory snapped Chicago's nine-game unbeaten streak and extended Revolution's undefeated run on the road to five consecutive matches (3-0-2). New England's **Liam Butts**, Revolution II's leading scorer with seven tallies on the season, highlighted the back-and-forth contest with two goals and one assist.

New England wasted no time starting Sunday's match on the offensive, with MLS NEXT All-Star **Cristiano Oliveira** scoring on a shot from outside the box into the left-hand corner of the net off a feed from Butts in the first minute. Oliveira's goal, the Somerville, Mass. native's third tally of the 2025 campaign, was the fastest of the season for Revolution II. Oliveira has now scored in consecutive matches.

Just five minutes later, forward **Malcolm Fry** converted on a cross into the penalty area from midfielder **Gevork Diarbian**, extending New England's advantage to 2-0. Fry, a Homegrown Player from Groton, Mass., has found the back of the net three times across four appearances after returning to the pitch from a leg injury in May. Diarbian finished Sunday's match with a game-high five shots, including three on target.

Down 2-0 just six minutes into Sunday's contest, the hosts opened their scoring with Fire FC II forward **Dylan Borso's** penalty kick goal in the 11th minute. Chicago equalized in the 27th minute, when midfielder **Harold Osorio** launched a free kick into the penalty area for defender **Olu Oye-gunle**, who registered his first goal of the season with a strike into the top right-hand corner.

New England regained the lead just moments before halftime, when Butts scored the go-ahead goal on defender **Damaro McIntosh's** first assist for Revolution II. Butts added his second goal of the afternoon in the 53rd minute, converting on Fry's helper to boost New England's lead to 4-2. Fry's goal-and-assist performance today was his first of the season.

Chicago closed the scoring in the 86th minute with a goal from **Trip Fleming**. With today's victory, New England improves its road record to 3-3-3 this season. At the conclusion of today's match, Revolution II rank seventh in MLS NEXT Pro with 1.8 points per game.

New England will return home on Sunday, July 20, hosting Orlando City B at Gillette Stadium. Sunday's match kicks off at 3:00 p.m. ET and is available to watch live on MLS Season Pass on Apple TV.

TWO REVS SELECTED TO MLS NEXT ALL STAR GAME

New England Revolution II midfielder **Cristiano Oliveira** and Revolution Academy forward **Josh Macedo** have both been selected to represent New England at the 2025 MLS NEXT All-Star Game presented by All-state. The fourth annual event, showcasing North America's top young talent, will feature an East vs. West matchup on Monday, July 21 at 8:30 p.m. ET. The game will be streamed live on Major League Soccer's YouTube channel from Parmer Field, home of Austin FC II, in Austin, Texas.

Oliveira, 17, and Macedo, 16, become the fifth and sixth Revolution Academy products to feature in the MLS NEXT All-Star game in its four iterations, joining Esmir Bajraktarevic (2022), Jack Panayotou (2022), Olger Escobar (2023), and Damaro McIntosh (2024). They are two of the 50 Revolution Academy players who have earned their professional debuts with Revolution II since the team's inaugural season in 2020.

A native of Somerville, Mass., Oliveira recently became the 14th player to ascend from New England's youth ranks to the Revolution II roster, having signed his first professional contract in October 2024. During the 2025 MLS NEXT Pro season, Oliveira has tallied three goals in 13 appearances, 11 of them starts. On the international stage, Oliveira scored one goal in three appearances with the United States Under-17 National Team in the Concacaf Under-17 Championship this past February.

In May, Oliveira made his first team debut for New England in the 2025 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Round of 32 at USL Championship club Rhode Island FC, where he netted the game-winning goal in the 88th minute to send New England to the Round of 16. The Academy graduate started in the Round of 16 on May 20, contributing a 75-minute shift against MLS side Chicago Fire FC.

Macedo, who hails from Santa Clarita, Calif., has earned two starts with Revolution II in MLS NEXT Pro, playing all 90 minutes in each game. The teenager recorded his first professional goal on June 9 against Chicago Fire FC II. Macedo earned his second-team debut on May 18 at New York Red Bulls II. At the MLS NEXT level, he recorded six goals and five assists for the Under-16s in the 2025 campaign.

Of the 44 players set to compete in Monday night's match, almost half have progressed to sign Homegrown deals or appear in MLS NEXT Pro. Approximately 65 percent of former MLS NEXT All-Stars have signed professional contracts, and more than 30 alumni have gone on to impress in MLS this season, including **Cavan Sullivan** (Philadelphia Union), **Zavier Gozo** (Real Salt Lake), **Jonathan Shore** (New York City FC), and **Benjamin Cremaschi** (Inter Miami CF).

The 44 players were selected following the conclusion of the 2024-25 regular season and 2025 MLS NEXT Cup. To be eligible for selection, players must have been born between 2008-10 and have competed in either the MLS NEXT regular season or in at least one of MLS NEXT's premier events – MLS NEXT Fest, MLS NEXT Flex, Generation adidas Cup, or MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs.

CALEB PORTER
HEAD COACH

PORTER AT A GLANCE

- Named the ninth head coach in Revolution club history on Dec. 19, 2023.
- One of six coaches to win multiple MLS Cups, and one of only three to do so with different clubs, having led the Portland Timbers (2015) and Columbus Crew SC (2020) to league titles.
- Entering 2025, his 329 games of MLS head coaching experience are fifth most among active managers.
- Led Columbus to the 2020 MLS Cup title in second season with the club, before winning the Campeones Cup in 2021.
- Named 2013 MLS Coach of the Year after first MLS season, when he led Portland to a 23-point turnaround over the previous year to finish first in the Western Conference.
- Coached the University of Akron from 2006-12, winning the 2010 NCAA National Championship, seven consecutive MAC regular season titles, and six straight MAC Coach of the Year honors.
- Won back-to-back NCAA College Cup titles (2003 and 2004) as an assistant at his alma mater, Indiana University.

Caleb Porter is in his second season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution following his appointment to the position on Dec. 19, 2023. The ninth head coach in club history, Porter is a two-time MLS Cup winner and NCAA national champion as a head coach with 23 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, the NCAA, and international soccer.

Porter arrived in New England as one of six head coaches to own multiple MLS Cup championships, and one of only three to do so with different clubs. Entering his 11th MLS season as a head coach, Porter's 329 games of experience are fifth most among MLS active coaches, while his .512 career winning percentage stands as the 10th best in league history among coaches with at least 250 games managed. In the MLS Cup Playoffs, Porter's record stands at an impressive 9-3-4 (.688). If he is successful in his mission of leading the Revolution to the club's first MLS Cup victory, Porter will become the only coach to lead three different clubs to MLS Cup titles.

Prior to his appointment in New England, Porter led the Columbus Crew for four seasons from 2019-2022, where he compiled a 52-46-39 record in the regular season. In only his second year with the club, Porter guided the Crew to a 12-5-6 mark in league play en route to the club's second MLS Cup title, also his second, with a 3-0 win over Seattle Sounders FC in the final. The following year, Porter and the Crew claimed the 2021 Campeones Cup trophy with a 2-0 win over LIGA MX champions Cruz Azul.

Porter, born in Tacoma, Wash. and raised in Michigan, began his MLS coaching career in 2013 with the Portland Timbers, where he would deliver the club to the Western Conference Final twice in three seasons. In 2015, Porter won his and the club's first MLS Cup. In his first professional season, Porter won the 2013 MLS Coach of the Year honors after leading the Timbers to a first-place finish in the Western Conference with a 14-5-15 record, marking a historic 23-point turnaround and 46-goal improvement in goal differential from the previous campaign. During his first 100 regular season professional soccer matches, Porter only lost 25 games, posting a record of 39-25-36 over that span.

Porter, 50, recorded a 68-50-52 record with the Timbers over his five seasons with the club. In 2015, he helped Portland set a single-season club record in wins (15) and lead MLS in shutouts (13) on the way to the MLS Cup title. In his final season with the club, Porter helped claim the 2017 Cascadia Cup and led the Timbers to yet another first-place finish in the Western Conference.

Before entering the professional ranks, Porter coached the men's soccer program at University of Akron for seven seasons from 2006-12, where he built one of the most dominant programs in collegiate sports history. Porters' Zips won the Mid-American Conference regular season title in all seven of his years at the helm. After finishing as runners-up in 2009, he led the Zips to the 2010 NCAA DI national championship with a 1-0 victory over the University of Louisville in the final; former Revolution midfielder Scott Caldwell scored the game-winning goal in the title match.

With Akron, Porter compiled a 123-18-17 record and garnered numerous honors including National Soccer Coaches Association of America National Coach of the Year (2009) and six consecutive MAC Coach of the Year awards from 2007-12. He remains the fastest coach in program history to reach 100 wins at Akron, doing so in just 126 matches, while also setting an NCAA record conference unbeaten streak at 47 games (44-0-3) in 2012. His .832 career winning percentage at the NCAA level is sixth-best all-time.

Porter's experience in international club competition includes four Concacaf Champions Cups (2014-15, 2016-17, 2021, and 2024) with three different clubs. Porter boasts a 10-5-3 record in Concacaf Champions Cup play. His 10 coaching victories in the competition are most among active MLS head coaches and third-most among MLS coaches all-time. In 2024, Porter led New England to the Champions Cup Quarterfinals. While at Akron, Porter also gained valuable coaching experience at the international level as Head Coach of the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team from 2011-12. He also worked as an Assistant Coach with the Under-18 national team from 2009-11.

Porter began his coaching career at his alma mater, Indiana University, as an Assistant Coach for six seasons from 2000-05. He helped the Hoosiers win back-to-back NCAA College Cup titles in 2003 and 2004, in addition to five consecutive Big Ten Conference regular season championships and two Big Ten Conference Tournament triumphs in 2001 and 2003. Porter's playing career included four seasons of collegiate soccer at Indiana, where the former midfielder was a three-time All-Big Ten honoree and a MAC Hermann Trophy runner-up.

The San Jose Clash selected Porter in the third round with the 27th overall pick in the 1998 MLS College Draft. He spent the 1999 MLS season with the Clash before joining the A-league's Sacramento Geckos on loan. Porter went on to sign with the Tampa Bay Mutiny in July 1999 before knee injuries led to his retirement on June 30, 2000.

STAFF BIOS

PABLO MOREIRA
ASSISTANT COACH



Pablo Moreira is in his second season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution and his 11th season as an assistant in Major League Soccer. Moreira is a two-time MLS Cup champion with over 370 matches coached in his career. During his time in MLS, Moreira has coached an MLS League MVP, MLS Cup MVP, Newcomer of the Year, Goalkeeper of the Year, seven MLS Best XI selections, and nine MLS All-Star Selections en route to 146 career wins.

Prior to joining the Revolution, Moreira served as an Assistant Coach for the Columbus Crew from 2019-22. Moreira helped the club win the 2020 MLS Cup, becoming the youngest assistant coach in MLS history to win multiple MLS Cups – doing so with two different clubs in each conference. The next year, he helped lead Columbus to the 2021 Campeones Cup, the club's first international trophy, beating Liga MX champions Cruz Azul.

Moreira, 40, entered the professional ranks as an Assistant Coach for the Portland Timbers from 2013-17. Moreira's first season with the Timbers included a 23-point improvement and a 43 goal-differential improvement from the previous season, securing a first-place finish in the Western Conference and the club's first postseason berth. Additionally, Moreira helped lead the Portland Timbers to their first MLS Cup championship in 2015, as well as Concacaf Champions League appearances in 2014 and 2016, Western Conference regular season first-place finishes in 2013 and 2017, and a Cascadia Cup in 2017.

At the college level, Moreira served as an Assistant Coach / Video Analyst at the University of Akron from 2010-2012. During his three seasons with the Zips, Moreira helped the team to a 55-6-9 record through 70 games. In addition, he garnered the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation in each of his first three years, producing 14 professionals into the MLS ranks during that span. In 2011, Akron set an MLS record for most first-round selections from a single school, landing five of the first eight picks in the MLS SuperDraft. Akron won the National Championship in 2010 in addition to winning the Mid-American Conference regular season championship in 2010, 2011, and 2012, and the Mid-American Conference Tournament championship in 2010 and 2012.

KEVIN HITCHCOCK
GOALKEEPERS COACH



Kevin Hitchcock is in his seventh season as Goalkeeper Coach with the New England Revolution, having joined the club on April 30, 2019. Hitchcock brings 25 years of coaching experience to Caleb Porter's staff, including time in the first divisions of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England.

With the Revolution, Hitchcock leads the coaching and development of the club's goalkeepers and has helped New England reach the playoffs in four of his six seasons. During his tenure with the club, he has mentored two of the best shotstoppers in league history in Matt Turner and Djordje Petrović. Both goalkeepers made major strides in their development under Hitchcock's tutelage, resulting in multi-million-dollar transfers to the English Premier League clubs. At the time of Turner's move to Arsenal FC in 2021, it was the largest outgoing transfer fee for a goalkeeper in MLS history, a mark that Petrović surpassed when he made his move to Chelsea FC in 2023. Turner earned his first international experience while being coached by Hitchcock and went on to start for the U.S. Men's National Team at the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022TM.

With Hitchcock as their mentor, Turner (2020 and 2021) and Petrović (2022) finished in the top five of MLS Goalkeeper of the Year voting in four consecutive seasons (2019-22), and placed in the top two three years in a row (2020-22). Turner was named the 2021 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year after the club's historic Supporters' Shield campaign, when he backstopped the Revolution to a then-league-record 73 points. In 2020, Turner finished second in the voting as New England reached the Eastern Conference Final, while setting a new club record for lowest goals-against average. Before joining the Revolution, Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA "A" Goalkeeper License and UEFA "B" Coaching License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach.

BLAIR GAVIN
ASSISTANT COACH



Blair Gavin is in his second season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution. Hired on January 8, 2024 after one season as Head Coach of FC Tulsa in the USL Championship, Gavin, a former Revolution player, reunites with Caleb Porter after serving as an Assistant Coach on his staff in Columbus in 2022.

Gavin, 36, earned his first coaching opportunity in 2018 with Phoenix Rising FC after his retirement. The Scottsdale, Ariz. native, who spent his final two seasons as a player with his hometown club from 2016-17, joined Patrice Carteron's staff at just 29 years old. In his first season coaching Phoenix, Gavin helped guide the club to a Western Conference Championship and its first berth in the USL Cup Final. In 2019, Gavin and Phoenix finished with the best regular season record in the USL Championship. In his final season with Phoenix in 2020, Gavin helped the club reach the USL Cup Final once again, though the championship match was cancelled due to health and safety protocols.

As a player, Gavin spent eight seasons as a midfielder in MLS and the USL. He was originally selected by Chivas USA as the 10th-overall pick in the 2010 MLS SuperDraft. In parts of three seasons with Chivas, Gavin appeared in 43 matches, scoring three goals. Midway through the 2012 season, he was acquired by the New England Revolution and went on to make two appearances for the club. After a brief spell with Seattle Sounders FC, Gavin moved to the NASL with the Atlanta Silverbacks, followed by three years in the USL Championship with Portland Timbers 2 and Arizona United/Phoenix Rising FC, tallying 86 more appearances and five goals.

The former two-time First Team All-Mid-American Conference honoree played three seasons of collegiate soccer under Porter at the University of Akron. Gavin scored seven goals over 68 games for the Zips, helping the team earn a berth in the 2009 College Cup Final.

MARC ORTI ESTEBAN
SET PIECE SPECIALIST



Marc Ortí Esteban is in his first season as Set Piece Specialist with the New England Revolution. Hired in February 2025 after two seasons with Brentford FC of the English Premier League, Ortí Esteban joins the Revolution's growing analytics team after six years coaching and advising in Europe with Brentford FC, FC Midtjylland, FC Barcelona, and E.F. Gavà.

Ortí Esteban, 25, most recently served as a Set Piece Analyst for Brentford FC in the English top-flight from 2023 until his arrival in New England. His responsibilities included pre-, live, and post-match analysis of the club's set pieces, as well as assisting the coaching staff during individual and full-team training sessions. During his first season with Brentford, The Bees ranked third in the English Premier League with 16 set-piece goals. Before his time in England, Ortí Esteban spent the 2022-23 season as a Set Piece Analyst for Danish side FC Midtjylland.

The Catalonia native began his coaching career with FC Barcelona, joining the legendary club in 2019 as an Assistant Academy Coach, working with Barcelona's American-based academy program and coaching camps and clinics in Chicago. Following a successful stint working in the youth ranks, Ortí Esteban was hired by FC Barcelona as an intern, working with first-team performance staff for the 2019-20 campaign. Reporting to the team's Director of Analytics, he helped with the preparation and review of pre- and post-match set-piece reports, as well as opposition analysis and statistical maintenance. He also served as an Assistant Coach for E.F. Gavà in his home region, working with the club's Under-19 squad during the 2019-20 season. During a two-year hiatus from coaching from 2020-22, Ortí Esteban worked as a Research Analyst for Sports Analytics firm Paradine.



STAFF BIOS

CURT ONALFO
SPORTING DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his second season as Sporting Director of the New England Revolution, overseeing all aspects of the club's soccer operations including personnel, scouting, player development, and the pro pathway. After serving as Interim Sporting Director for part of 2023, Onalfo was officially elevated to the post on Nov. 30, 2023. He was previously New England's Technical Director since June 2019, where he led an overhaul of the Revolution's pro player pathway inclusive of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy, and the first team.

Since arriving in New England, Onalfo has helped the Revolution first team reach the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs in four of six seasons and win the 2021 Supporters' Shield with a then-MLS-record 73 regular season points. His expertise in player development has also resulted in a clearly defined professional pathway from the team's youth ranks up to the first team, accelerated by the launch of Revolution II under his direction ahead of its inaugural 2020 season. Through the team's five seasons, nine players have ascended from the Revolution II roster to the first team, while 39 members of the Revolution Academy have made their professional debuts with the second team.

Onalfo, 55, led a renaissance in the Revolution Academy upon taking over the program midway through 2019. Under his guidance, the Revolution Academy became the first in MLS NEXT history to win back-to-back MLS NEXT Cup national championships, with the Under-19s winning the postseason tournament in 2022 and 2023. The Revolution Academy also featured the MLS NEXT Under-17 MVP in forward Olger Escobar. The success of New England's pro pathway under Onalfo has resulted in the influx of youthful Homegrown Players into the first team, including teenagers Noel Buck, Esmir Bajraktarevic, Jack Panayotou, all three of whom have garnered national team recognition. After helping develop Bajraktarević into a regular first-team contributor and member of the Bosnia and Herzegovina national team, Onalfo facilitated the teenager's transfer to PSV Eindhoven, marking the first European transfer for a Revolution Homegrown Player.

A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, Onalfo possesses New England roots as he was raised in Ridgefield, Conn. He arrived in New England following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. He owns 13 years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by head coaching roles with D.C. United (2010), the Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While working as an Assistant Coach with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural Head Coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to lead the Galaxy's first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

Onalfo also spent six years as an Assistant Coach with the United States Men's National Team. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he was the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018-19, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup. He also briefly served as Acting Head Coach of the U-19s for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo entered the coaching ranks as an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as Interim Head Coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed Head Coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named Head Coach of D.C. United.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the 1996 MLS Inaugural Player Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in the league's debut season, helping LA reach the first ever MLS Cup final. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four MLS seasons, including stints with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

CHRIS TIERNEY
ASSISTANT SPORTING DIRECTOR

Chris Tierney is in his second season as Assistant Sporting Director after being promoted to the position on January 8, 2024. Prior to his appointment, Tierney served two seasons as the club's Director of Soccer Operations from 2022-23 and was the club's Player Recruitment Manager from 2019-22. Tierney works in tandem with Sporting Director Curt Onalfo to manage the day-to-day operations of the club's soccer operations including a leading role in player recruitment, scouting, contract negotiations, and salary cap management.

Tierney transitioned into the front office in August 2019 following a decorated 11-year playing career from 2008-18, all with the Revolution, and was long regarded as one of Major League Soccer's top left backs. He announced his retirement in November 2018, finishing his tenure as one of the club's all-time leaders in several statistical categories. Tierney still ranks among the club's top five for games played (246), games started (220), and assists (40).

As a player, the Wellesley, Mass. native helped New England to a 2008 North American SuperLiga title as well as appearances in the 2014 MLS Cup and 2016 U.S. Open Cup finals. Among his career accolades are an MLS All-Star Team selection in 2015, Revolution Defender of the Year honors in 2016, and Midnight Riders Man of the Year recognition in 2016.

After attending Noble and Greenough School in Dedham, Mass., Tierney played college soccer at the University of Virginia from 2004-07, where he made 79 appearances for the Cavaliers. He currently resides in Charlestown, Mass. with his wife, Eliza, and their two children.

REMI ROY
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Remi Roy is in his 16th season with the New England Revolution and his second year as Technical Director, having been appointed to the position on January 8, 2024. Roy previously served as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel since 2018, after initially joining the club as an assistant coach for eight seasons from 2010-17.

In his current role, Roy is focused on scouting, recruitment, and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with Sporting Director Curt Onalfo, Assistant Sporting Director Chris Tierney, and Head of Player Recruitment David Kammarmann in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the club's first-team goalkeepers and provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revolution coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revolution goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy mentored longtime New England goalkeeper Brad Knighton and helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers upon his debut in 2010.
