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BOSTON – To officially kick off Fight Childhood Cancer Month, New England Revolution players **Carles Gil, Matt Turner, Andrew Farrell, Wyatt Omsberg, and Malcolm Fry** visited local pediatric cancer patients at Boston Children's Hospital on Tuesday afternoon. On **Saturday, Sept. 13 vs. Toronto FC**, the Revolution will host the club's annual **Fight Childhood Cancer Match** at Gillette Stadium. The 7:30 p.m. ET home match will feature several in-stadium activations in support of local pediatric cancer fighters and non-profit organizations, including the following highlights:

- The Revolution Foundation will collect supplies at all stadium gates for the **Izzy Foundation Room** at **Hasbro Children's Hospital** in Providence, which will be delivered by Revolution players the following week.
- Revs players will wear jerseys with special numbers featuring the names of past participants in the **NEGU Crew** from the club's longstanding partnership with the **Jessie Rees Foundation**, which is now in its 10th year. NEGU stands for "Never, Ever Give Up". The jerseys will then be auctioned off to benefit the Jessie Rees Foundation.

- Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner** will reunite with a past participant from Matt's NEGU Crew from the 2019 season.
- Children from **Make-a-Wish Massachusetts and Rhode Island** will serve as the Dream Team on Sept. 13, escorting players from both teams onto the pitch.
- Patients from **Boston Children's Hospital** and their families will enjoy the match from the comfort of two premium suites.

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Currently entering the team's 30th season, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. The Revolution also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. and are currently coached by two-time MLS Cup winner Caleb Porter.
