### MATCHDAY HEADLINES

- New England and CF Montreal will faceoff for the first of two regular season meetings this year, with the Revolution holding a 17-13-4 edge in the all-time regular season series.
- M Carles Gil** owns the most regular season assists (89) among active MLS players, with his nine career helpers against Montreal tied for his most against any MLS opponent.
- With a goal this weekend, **Gil** will become the second Revolution player with 50 goals and 50 assists in regular season play.
- F/W Luca Langoni** looks to add to his league-leading four assists this season. The Argentine has found the scoresheet in back-to-back matches for the first time in his MLS career.
- D Brayán Ceballos** owns a team-high two goals this season, tied for the most goals by a defender in 2026.
- F Dor Turgeman** could become the second Revolution player to tally goals in each of his first four home appearances for the club, joining Joe-Max Moore (1996). The Israel international is averaging 1.05 goal contributions per 90 minutes in his Revolution tenure.
- GK Matt Turner** returns from international duty with the United States Men's National Team last week. Turner ranks second in club history in goalkeeper wins (47), winning percentage (.561) and in save percentage (71.6).
- F/W Diego Fagundez** is one goal away from becoming the fourth player in MLS history with 80 goals and 80 assists in the regular season. His next goal contribution will be his 100th for the club.
- D Ilay Feingold** looks to find the scoresheet for a third consecutive match, having provided an assist on March 15 and his first goal of the season on March 21.
- F Marcos Zambrano**, acquired on loan last week from Real Salt Lake, seeks his club and MLS debut.

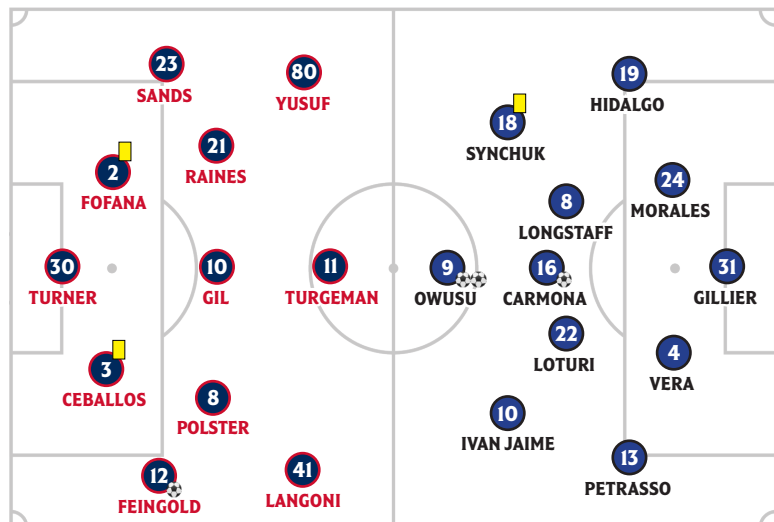

#### GO DIEGO GO: FAGUNDEZ RETURNS TO REVS

After five seasons away from club, veteran forward/winger **Diego Fagundez** officially returned to New England on March 13. Fagundez, who spent the first 10 seasons of his MLS career as the Revolution's first Homegrown Player signing, made an immediate impact with an assist off the bench in a 6-1 rout over FC Cincinnati on March 15.

A 15-year veteran in MLS, Fagundez has netted 79 goals along with 80 assists over 426 regular season appearances, 10th most on the MLS all-time list, between New England, Austin FC (2021-2023), and the LA Galaxy (2023-2025). His appearance and goal totals are both fourth among all active players, while his 159 goal contributions are the most in MLS today and the 15th most all-time.

The 31-year-old attacker owns an additional 12 games played, six of them starts, in the MLS Cup Playoffs, most recently collecting five appearances and one assist during the Galaxy's run to the MLS Cup title in 2024. He was voted the LA Galaxy's 2025 Player of the Year after recording six goals with three assists. Last year, he became the youngest player to record 300 MLS starts and also the eighth player in league history to reach the 75-goal, 75-assist mark. He is now one goal shy of becoming the fourth member of the league's 80-80 club.

The first of 16 players to sign to New England's MLS roster after developing in the Revolution Academy, Fagundez was named the Revolution Team MVP in 2013 and helped New England reach MLS Cup in 2014. He is one of only four players in team annals to log 40 goals and 40 assists in MLS play.

Fagundez's name remains etched across the club's record books, as he ranks among the top five players in Revolution history in MLS games played (2nd), goals scored (2nd), and assists (4th). He became the youngest debutant and goalscorer in Revolution club history in August 2011 at just 15 years old – a distinction he still holds.

New England's center back duo of Colombian **Brayan Ceballos** and Mali international **Mamadou Fofana** both returned to action for their season debuts on Feb. 28 at Red Bull New York. The duo formed a steady presence along the Revs' backline in 2025. Fofana enjoyed a successful first MLS season, while earning consistent international call-ups from his native Mali. Ceballos was voted 2025 Revolution Defender of the Year by the local media for his efforts.

In New England's home opener, Ceballos powered New England to a 6-1 victory with two goals and a strong defensive showing. Ceballos headed home a pair of crosses from **Luca Langoni** off set pieces, doubling his MLS career output. Ceballos, who announced he was expecting a baby with his celebrations, became just the third Revs defender ever to tally a multi-goal game and is now tied for the most goals by a defender in 2026.

New England Revolution forward **Dor Turgeman** has quickly established himself as one of the league's top attacking threats. REVS STRIKE GOLD WITH U22 SIGNING FEINGOLD

Israeli defender **Ilay Feingold** has appeared in the first four contests of 2026 for New England. Feingold tallied his first assist of the season, a game winner, on March 15 against FC Cincinnati. In the next match, Feingold opened his account for the season with a goal at St. Louis CITY SC on March 21. It's the second time in his MLS career finding the score-sheet in back-to-back matches.

Last season, Feingold became just the second Revs defender ever to tally a multi-goal game. Feingold had three goal contributions on May 31, the third-youngest Revs player to do so in club history, behind **Diego Fagundez** (twice).

EIGHT REVOLUTION PLAYERS EARN INTERNATIONAL CALL-UPS

Six different Revolution players represented their respective national teams during the March FIFA window, headlined by goalkeeper **Matt Turner's** return to the United States Men's National Team. Turner joins Head Coach Mauricio Pochettino's side for their final training camp before the World Cup roster is selected in May. The goalkeeper earned his first start since June 2025 for *The Stars & Stripes* against Belgium on Saturday, March 28, and served as the backup against Portugal on Tuesday, March 31, with both matches played at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.

Turner has been capped 53 times by the U.S. National Team, collecting 27 clean sheets. The Park Ridge, N.J. native was on the U.S. roster for the Concacaf Gold Cup last summer, serving as the backup goalkeeper during the team's run to the tournament final. The goalkeeper saw extensive action for the United States over the past five years, most notably starting all four games at the FIFA 2022 World Cup in Qatar. Turner owns a 29-15-8 record at the international level, with just 43 goals conceded.

Forward **Dor Turgeman** was selected for international duty by the Israel Men's National Team for a friendly match on Thursday, March 26 against Georgia at Boris Paichadze Dinamo Arena in Tbilisi. The forward made a 31-minute substitute appearance in a 2-2 draw. Turgeman has started nine of his 17 senior international appearances for Israel. The forward owns a pair of international goals, both in World Cup Qualifying action, with his latest tally in November 2025 against Moldova.

**Leo Campana** (Ecuador) and **Mamadou Fofana** (Mali) were also called into their respective national teams, but did not make the trip abroad.

On the youth international level, midfielders **Cristiano Oliveira** (U.S. U-18), **Eric Klein** (U.S. U-20), **Brooklyn Raines** (U.S. U-21), and defender **Ethan Kohler** (U.S. U-21) also saw action with invitations to March training camps and friendly matches abroad.

Klein joined the Stars and Stripes for the 20-player roster's March training camp in Buenos Aires, which included a 3-0 victory over Argentina.

Oliveira suited up for the Lisbon International Tournament, making substitute appearances in matches against Iceland U-18 (March 26), Morocco U-18 (March 28), and Portugal U-18 (March 31).

Raines and Kohler were invited to a training camp in South Korea. The duo started together in a 2-0 victory over the Japan U-21 team on March 27. Kohler logged a start against the Korea Republic U-23 squad on March 31, while Raines appeared off the bench in a 4-1 victory.

#### REVS BEGIN NEW SPANISH-LANGUAGE RADIO PARTNERSHIP

The New England Revolution and iHeartMedia Boston announced a new media partnership that will see **Rumba 97.7 FM**, Boston's #1 Spanish-language radio station, broadcast all 17 Revolution home games during the 2026 season. Listen to every home match this season over the air on Rumba 97.7 FM, online at [rumba977.iheart.com](http://rumba977.iheart.com), and in the iHeartRadio app.

Through the new partnership, Rumba 97.7 will serve as the official radio partner for the Revolution's annual Noche Latina e Hispana, scheduled for Saturday, September 19 at Gillette Stadium, where one of Rumba 97.7's dynamic DJs will serve as the in-house guest entertainment for the match. The collaboration also creates opportunities for collaboration on community and cultural initiatives, including soccer clinics, throughout the Boston area.

Revolution home matches on Rumba 97.7 FM will be called by three experienced broadcasters with over 50 years of collective experience covering the Revolution and MLS. **Omar Cabrera** will anchor the play-by-play duties, while **Marcelo Briones** and **Juan David Rozo** will serve as analysts. The trio also called Revolution home games on Spanish radio in 2025. Cabrera, an El Salvador native, has been a mainstay in Boston sports media for more than two decades. Briones hails from Chile and has spent the last 20 years covering MLS while working as a respected radio host in Boston. Rozo, originally from Bogota, Colombia, has been covering soccer for 10 years, reporting on MLS, Liga MX, the Revolution, LA Galaxy, and LAFC.

#### BEM-VINDO: OLIVEIRA LATEST HOMEGROWN SIGNING

The New England Revolution signed midfielder **Cristiano Oliveira** as the club's 16th Homegrown Player. The 17-year-old Somerville, Mass. resident is the second Brazilian-American to graduate from the Revolution Academy and ascend to the first team roster. Oliveira has started the first four MLS NEXT Pro matches for Revolution II this season, tallying two assists and helping the team to a 2-0-2 start, including a pair of shootout victories. The midfielder ranks tied for fourth leaguewide with 10 key passes.

Oliveira spent the last two seasons developing with Revolution II. He scored five goals with two assists over 34 regular season games for the second team. During the 2025 season, he represented New England at the MLS NEXT All-Star Game in Austin, Texas, where he started and tallied a goal. The six-foot midfielder made his first team debut last season in U.S. Open Cup action, scoring the game-winning goal in the 88th minute as a substitute in the Round of 32 at Rhode Island FC, before starting the Round of 16 contest against Chicago Fire FC.

#### ANDREW FARRELL RE-SIGNS FOR RECORD 14<sup>TH</sup> SEASON

The New England Revolution re-signed veteran defender Andrew Farrell to a one-year player professional development contract for the 2026 season. Farrell returned for his club-record 14th MLS season, starting in New England's 2026 season opener at Nashville SC.

Farrell ranks as New England's all-time leader in appearances (345), starts (329), and minutes played (29,384) during the regular season. At the conclusion of the 2025 campaign, Farrell ranked fifth among all MLS players in regular season minutes played since entering the league. Farrell remains the longest-tenured active player in Boston professional sports, and one of four players from the 2013 MLS SuperDraft still playing in the league.

#### RAMPANT REVS MATCH GOAL SCORING RECORD

The result gave New England its first victory when allowing the opening goal since a 2-1 win over Philadelphia Union on Oct. 21, 2023, snapping a 35-game winless skid when conceding first. Additionally, New England's four headed goals were the most in a single MLS match since Red Bull New York did so on May 21, 2016.

#### OYIRWOTH, KLEIN LATEST REVS TEENS TO MAKE MLS DEBUT

Uganda international midfielder **Allan Oyirwoth**, 19, made his league debut on Sept. 6 off the bench at Chicago Fire FC. He was one of three teenagers to earn MLS minutes for New England last year along with defender **Peyton Miller** and midfielder **Eric Klein**, who made his MLS debut on May 31. Oyirwoth was 18 years, 226 days old at the time of his debut, the seventh-youngest MLS debutant in club history.

#### REVOLUTION TO COMPETE IN 2026 U.S. OPEN CUP

The New England Revolution will be one of the 16 Major League Soccer clubs participating in the 2026 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. The 11th edition of U.S. Soccer's historic national club championship, which celebrates elite amateur and pro soccer in communities across the country, begins in mid-March and will conclude with a showpiece final on October 21, 2026.

A field of 80 teams – 32 Open Division / Amateur Clubs and 48 professional sides – will contest for a \$1 million purse with a place in the 2027 Concacaf Champions Cup on the line. League standings served as the qualifying criteria to determine which teams are eligible for the 2026 U.S. Open Cup. CBS Sports is the multimedia rights partner for the 2026 competition.

The U.S. Open Cup will feature seven rounds, one fewer than recent editions to avoid an overlap with the FIFA Men's World Cup. The First Round saw 32 matches played from March 17-19, with the second round slated for March 31-April 1.

The 16 participating MLS clubs will then enter the tournament in the Round of 32 from April 14-15. New England will learn their first pairing in a live draw on Thursday, April 2. Per last season's MLS standings, New England is one of eight MLS sides to qualify with hosting priority for the Round of 32.

**TEAM NOTES**

**REVS ADD U.S. U-20 F MARCOS ZAMBRANO ON LOAN**

The New England Revolution acquired forward **Marcos Zambrano** on loan from Real Salt Lake through Dec. 31, 2026, in exchange for New England's natural third-round selection in the 2027 MLS SuperDraft. The transaction was completed prior to the close of the MLS Primary Transfer Window. New England will have the option to permanently acquire the player via trade and retain the right to terminate the loan at the open of the secondary window on July 13.

Zambrano, 21, arrives in New England after returning stateside last summer to join Real Salt Lake. The striker featured for MLS NEXT Pro side Real Monarchs, tallying five goals in nine appearances to close the 2025 campaign. Zambrano, who owns professional experience in both Portugal and the United States, spent two-and-a-half seasons overseas with Portuguese clubs Benfica B and Vitória Guimarães B.

The forward reunites with Revolution Head Coach Marko Mitrović, having played under New England's manager at the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile. Zambrano appeared in all five tournament matches last fall, tallying one goal. Overall, Zambrano owns 27 youth caps for the United States Under-19 and Under-20 sides, scoring eight goals. Zambrano previously featured for his native Ecuador at the U-15 and U-17 levels.

A native of Guayaquil, Ecuador, Zambrano and his family moved to the United States in 2020. Zambrano and his younger brother, Matteo, joined the Philadelphia Union Academy. During his time with Philadelphia, Zambrano spent time with the club's MLS NEXT Pro affiliate, Union 2, where he made his professional debut in late 2022 appearing in two matches, with one start. He also represented Philadelphia in the 2022 MLS NEXT All-Star match.

**FANS FLOCK TO FOXBOROUGH FOR ROAD TO 26 FRIENDLY**

With the FIFA World Cup 2026 set to take North America by storm this summer, several cities and venues have already begun preparations for the upcoming tournament. Gillette Stadium, which will be renamed as Boston Stadium for the World Cup this summer, has installed a new natural grass surface for the first time in 20 years.

Gillette Stadium hosted its first major international friendly in over a decade, welcoming the storied France and Brazil men's national teams to Foxborough on March 26. A crowd of 66,215 fans were in attendance to watch 10-man France hold off Brazil in a 2-1 victory. It was the first time France has ever played at Gillette, with another match in Foxboro scheduled for June 26 against Norway; and the sixth appearance at the venue for Brazil.

The crowd of 66,215 was the second-largest soccer crowd in Gillette Stadium history. The Brazil National Team has now also been part of three of the five largest soccer crowds since the venue opened in 2002.

As far as major events in Gillette's history, the Brazil vs. France friendly drew a larger crowd than the 2023 Army-Navy college football game (65,878), and only slightly less than the 2016 NHL Winter Classic between the Boston Bruins and Montreal Canadiens (67,246). The stadium's record attendance for any event was set by Ed Sheeran on July 1, 2023, as part of his +-=÷x Tour (71,723).

**MLS TO ALIGN CALENDAR WITH WORLD'S TOP LEAGUES**

Major League Soccer announced a shift in its competition calendar, aligning the league's schedule with the world's top soccer leagues. Beginning in the summer of 2027, MLS will adopt a summer-to-spring season format, marking one of the most significant developments in the league's history.

In conjunction with this transition, MLS will introduce a new regular season format that blends elements of the global game with North American sports traditions. The league will also review potential adjustments to its Audi MLS Cup Playoffs format as part of an ongoing evaluation process but has not yet finalized any changes.

The 2027-28 MLS regular season will kick off in mid-to-late July 2027 and conclude with the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs and MLS Cup presented by Audi in late May 2028. Like many other major international leagues, MLS will observe a midwinter break from mid-December through early February, with no league matches scheduled in January.

Before the change to the new calendar, MLS will stage a transition season from February to May 2027, featuring a 14-game regular season, playoffs, and MLS Cup. The results will determine 2027 qualification for the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, Canadian Championship, Leagues Cup, and Concacaf Champions Cup.



**MLS ANNOUNCES FORMAT FOR 2027 SPRINT SEASON**

Major League Soccer announced details of the 2027 MLS Sprint Season, the MLS season that will launch Major League Soccer's transition into its new summer-to-spring calendar, as the league aligns its schedule with the world's top soccer leagues. The 2027 Sprint Season schedule will be announced in the coming months.

The fast-paced, high-stakes campaign will kick off in February and culminate in the Audi 2027 MLS Cup Playoffs and 2027 MLS Cup presented by Audi in May. Not only will the Sprint Season crown an MLS Cup champion, but it will also have international competition implications, determining qualification for the 2028 Concacaf Champions Cup and 2028 Leagues Cup.

The Sprint Season will see each MLS team play 14 regular season games from February to April. Regular season matches will consist of intra-conference play with teams facing each of their 14 conference opponents once - seven matches at home and seven matches away. At the conclusion of the regular season, the top eight teams in each of the two conferences will qualify for the Audi 2027 MLS Cup Playoffs. In each conference, the postseason will be played in a single-elimination bracket format to determine a conference champion. The Eastern Conference Champion and Western Conference Champion will meet in 2027 MLS Cup presented by Audi.

MLS NEXT Pro played its fourth season in 2025 with 29 teams.

**NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION**

**BRING THE FIGHT**

**Marko Mitrović** is in his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution in 2026, following his appointment to the position on Nov. 7, 2025. The 10th head coach in club history, Mitrović brings 15 years of coaching experience including successful tenures as a head coach for youth national teams of the United States and his native Serbia. As an assistant coach, Mitrović has four previous seasons of MLS experience with Chicago Fire FC, spent two years in the English Championship with Reading FC, and helped guide the Serbia Under-20 Men's National Team to a FIFA U-20 World Cup title.

Prior to joining New England, Mitrović compiled a 19-9-7 record as a head coach for the United States across multiple youth levels. He most recently led the U.S. Under-20 side to the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup quarterfinals in Chile, earning decisive 3-0 wins against two European powerhouses, France and Italy. Mitrović earned the opportunity after leading the United States Olympic Team at the 2024 Paris Games, where he also reached the quarterfinals. Mitrović joined U.S. Soccer as the head coach of the Under-19 team from 2022-23, winning all four of his friendly matches at the helm.

Mitrović, a UEFA Pro License holder, returns for his second stint in MLS after previously serving four years as an assistant coach for Chicago Fire FC from 2016-19 under compatriot Veljko Paunovic. He helped guide Chicago to a third-place finish in the Eastern Conference and the MLS Cup Playoffs in 2017. With the Fire, Mitrović worked with current Revolution midfielder Matt Polster for three seasons. While in Chicago, he also earned the opportunity to coach in the 2017 MLS All-Star Game against Real Madrid at Soldier Field.

After departing Chicago, Mitrović spent parts of two seasons as Paunovic's assistant with Reading FC, finishing seventh in the Championship his first year. During the 2021-22 season, Mitrović took charge for a pair of matches while Paunovic was out with illness, earning his first victory over Birmingham City on Nov. 6, 2021. At the club level, Mitrović has held roles as an assistant coach for Serbian clubs FK Banat Zrenjanin and FK Napredak Kruševac.

Hailing from Belgrade, Serbia, Mitrović earned his first head coaching opportunity with his boyhood academy, leading the Red Star Belgrade Under-15 side for two seasons from 2013-15. During his time with Red Star, Mitrović also

served as an assistant coach for the Serbia U-20 national team from 2012-15, and the U-15 side from 2014-16. The Serbia Under-20 team enjoyed sustained success during Mitrović's tenure, winning the 2015 FIFA U-20 World Cup with a victory over Brazil after extra time in the Final, and finishing third at the 2014 UEFA European U-19 Championship.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Mitrović played 16 seasons of professional football in Europe spanning clubs in Serbia, Hungary, Azerbaijan, and Kazakhstan. The former midfielder began his career in the esteemed Red Star Belgrade Academy, making his professional debut for the club in 1996 at 17 years old. During his youth career, Mitrović earned one call-up to the FR Yugoslavia Under-18 National Team for the 1995 UEFA European U-18 Championship, where he appeared in a pair of group stage victories over Austria and Georgia.

After featuring for multiple clubs in Serbia and one season in Hungary, Mitrović returned home to sign with FK Budućnost Banatski Dvor. In three seasons, Mitrović made 85 appearances, helping earn promotion to the Serbian top flight in 2002-03, a berth in the Serbian Cup Final in 2004, and qualification to the 2004-05 UEFA Europa League. Mitrović retired from professional football in 2010.

Mitrović, 47, became a naturalized U.S. Citizen in 2024 and is fluent in four languages – English, Spanish, Serbian, and Russian. He earned his education from the Mathematical Grammar School in his native Belgrade, graduating in 1997. Mitrović holds a UEFA Pro coaching license and has served as a UEFA Official Lecturer for both A and B license courses.

He is married to his wife, Marija, with whom he shares three children: Mitar, Matija, and Mia. His eldest son, Mitar, is a graduate student on the Men's Soccer Team at the University of Michigan after three years at Marquette University. His youngest son, Matija, is a midfielder for Portuguese Primeira Liga side Vitoria SC and spent time in the Chicago Fire FC Academy.

The youngest of three siblings, Mitrović comes from a family rooted in academics. His father, Stanko, was an engineer, a path also followed by his older brother Vladimir, who now resides in the United States. His sister, Jelena, is a surgeon, while his mother, Jelica, has a background in linguistics.

**BLAIR GAVIN**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Blair Gavin is in his third season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution. Hired on January 8, 2024, after one season as Head Coach of FC Tulsa in the USL Championship, Gavin, a former Revolution player, remains on staff under new Head Coach Marko Mitrović.

Gavin, 37, spent the 2023 season at the helm of FC Tulsa, leading the team to a 10-15-9 record. In his lone season with the club, Gavin was hired for his extensive knowledge of USL, MLS experience, and attack-minded style, with an ability to relate to both veterans and young players. Prior to his time with FC Tulsa, Gavin spent two seasons on staff with the Columbus Crew in MLS. Initially joining as a video analyst for the 2021 season, Gavin matriculated to a full-time assistant coach for the 2022 campaign. Gavin earned his first coaching opportunity in 2018 with Phoenix Rising FC after his retirement. The Scottsdale, Ariz. native joined Patrice Carteron's staff at just 29 years old, helping the club to a 54-16-14 record in league play during his three-year tenure.



**SEAN HUGHES**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Sean Hughes is entering his first season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution, appointed to the position on December 4, 2025. Hughes, who spent 14 seasons coaching at the collegiate level, reunites with Marko Mitrović after serving as an assistant coach on his staff with the United States U-20 National Team before and during the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup.

Since 2024, Hughes had been the associate head coach of the University of Michigan men's soccer team. With the Wolverines, Hughes helped Michigan earn back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths in 2024 and 2025. Michigan also advanced to the Big Ten Tournament Final in 2024 and 2025, ending a five-year drought. In 2024, he helped Michigan notch a win in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 12 years. Hughes, a native of Blackburn, England, entered the coaching ranks in 2012 with Quincy University in NCAA Division II, where he helped compile a 48-9-8 record and reach the 2014 NCAA semifinals.



**MICHAEL MORRIS**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Michael Morris is entering his first season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution. Hired on December 4, 2025 following 16 years in the Seattle Sounders organization, the last five spent with the club's developmental team, Tacoma Defiance, Morris reunites with Marko Mitrović after serving as his assistant with the United States Under-20 team in 2025, including at the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup.

Morris, 41, is a USSF A License holder who helped oversee the development of 18 first-team players during his time in Seattle. A longtime integral member of the club's development programs, he led the U-15, U-16, and U-19 sides during his tenure, while also serving as a lead scout. Morris also oversaw Sounders FC's Youth Camps, expanding the program under his leadership to offer a wide variety of programs for boys and girls of all ages. After 11 years with the Sounders Academy, Morris was promoted to Assistant Coach and Head of Methodology for the club's developmental side, Tacoma Defiance, in 2021.



**KEVIN HITCHCOCK**  
GOALKEEPING COACH

Kevin Hitchcock is in his eighth season as Goalkeeper Coach with the New England Revolution, having joined the club on April 30, 2019. Hitchcock brings over 25 years of coaching experience to Marko Mitrović's staff, including time in the first divisions of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England.

With the Revolution, Hitchcock leads the coaching and development of the club's goalkeepers and has helped New England reach the playoffs in four of his seven seasons. During his tenure with the club, he has mentored two of the best shot-stoppers in league history in Matt Turner and Djordje Petrović. Before joining the Revolution, Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA "A" Goalkeeper License and UEFA "B" Coaching License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach, including nine seasons working with top-flight players in the English Premier League.



**MARC ORTÍ ESTEBAN**  
SET PIECE COACH

Marc Ortí Esteban enters his second season as a Set Piece Coach with the New England Revolution. Hired in February 2025 after two seasons with Brentford FC of the English Premier League, Ortí Esteban joins the Revolution's growing analytics team after six years coaching and advising in Europe with Brentford FC, FC Midtjylland, FC Barcelona, and E.F. Gavà.

Ortí Esteban, 25, most recently served as a Set Piece Analyst for Brentford FC in the English topflight from 2023 until his arrival in New England. His responsibilities included pre-, live, and post-match analysis of the club's set pieces, as well as assisting the coaching staff during individual and full-team training sessions. The Catalonia native began his coaching career with FC Barcelona, joining the legendary club in 2019 as an Assistant Academy Coach, working with Barcelona's American-based academy program and coaching camps and clinics in Chicago.
