PREVIEW: Revolution Return Home to Meet Houston Dynamo FC on Saturday

Annual Match for C.H.A.N.G.E. will feature small business pop-up market in Fan Zone

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. (August 7, 2026) – The New England Revolution (9-5-3, 30 pts.) return home this Saturday to host Western Conference foe Houston Dynamo FC (9-6-2, 29 pts.) at Gillette Stadium, the teams' first meeting since 2024. New England's annual 'Match for C.H.A.N.G.E.' kicks off at 4:30 p.m. ET on [Apple TV](#) in English and Spanish. PREVIEW SOUND (8/6): Marko Mitrović and M Brooklyn Raines

New England is back on home soil this weekend following a 2-2 draw at CF Montréal. Last time at Gillette Stadium, the Revolution rolled to a 4-1 victory over Atlanta United in front of a season-high 34,248 fans on July 25. Halfway through the 2026 MLS regular season, Head Coach **Marko Mitrović**'s squad has been the league's strongest home team, collecting a league-leading 25 home points and eight home wins. Defensively, the Revolution have been one of the league's best teams thus far, conceding only 21 goals through 17 games, second fewest in the Eastern Conference.

Revolution fans could be treated to their first glimpse of new arrival **Jack Harrison** on Saturday. The left-footed English winger, signed as a Designated Player through the 2029-30 campaign, recorded 181 appearances in the English Premier League since departing MLS in 2017. Previously with New York City FC, the former Leeds United and Everton staple logged 14 goals and 13 assists across 55 MLS appearances. Harrison joins striker **Dor Turgeman** on the front line, as the Israeli international enters the weekend with goals in back-to-back games, giving him four tallies on the season. Last Saturday in Montreal, Turgeman set a new single-game high with six shot attempts.

In the middle of the park, Revolution captain **Carles Gil** enters the match one goal contribution shy of becoming the 19th MLS player with 150 career goal contributions. He would be one of only three active players to reach the 150 goals and assists, along with active leader **Diego Fagundez** (159). In Montreal, the Spanish playmaker delivered his second straight goal-and-assist performance in his 200th MLS start, climbing into the top 10 all-time in league assists with his 93rd regular season helper. Gil, who earned his sixth 2026 MLS Team of the Matchday selection this week, ranks tied for sixth leaguewide with 42 chances created this season.

Fellow midfielder **Brooklyn Raines** is in line to face his former club for the first time on Saturday. Since joining the Revolution as an U22 signing in December, the 21-year-old U.S. youth international has been a mainstay in New England's midfield, starting all but one match in the 2026 campaign. In the Revolution's last home contest, Raines tallied both his first MLS career goal and assist. Mitrović's youthful roster has also been highlighted by Homegrown Player **Peyton Miller**, who has recorded goal contributions in back-to-back matches. The 18-year-old Connecticut native eyes his 10th straight start of the campaign on Saturday.

Saturday's clash renews a historic rivalry between two clubs that once locked horns in three cup finals over a three-year period: MLS Cup in 2006 and 2007, both won by Houston, and the North American SuperLiga in 2008, which New England claimed. The Revolution hold a 14-7-7 advantage

over the Dynamo in the regular season series, including a dominant 7-2-5 mark at home. Under Head Coach Ben Olson, Houston currently sits fourth in the Western Conference, coming off a 2-0 win over Sporting Kansas City last Saturday behind goals from Guilherme and Agustin Bouzat. Guilherme pulls the strings for Houston's attack, as the Brazilian midfielder leads the team with 10 goals and seven assists.



Match for C.H.A.N.G.E.: As part of the club's C.H.A.N.G.E. platform dedicated to combatting inequity and promoting social justice, the New England Revolution Foundation will host 23 local small businesses, all associated with Women of Color Entrepreneurs (WOCE) or Heritage Market, for a Pop-Up Market in Fan Zone from 1:30-4:30 p.m. [Read here for details](#) on all the BIPOC- and woman-owned businesses participating in Saturday's market.

In addition to the Pop-up Market, Fan Zone will also feature workout activities led by [InnerCity Weightlifting](#), which aims to amplify the voice and agency of people who have been most impacted by systemic racism and mass incarceration. On the pitch, players will wear numbers and a captain's armband designed by Maine-based artist Eamon White, which will be auctioned after the match to benefit the [Eliot Family Resource Center](#) in Everett, Mass.

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign.
