Revolution Visit New York City FC on Wednesday Night

New England opens two-match week with 8:00 p.m. ET kickoff at Citi Field

QUEENS, N.Y. (September 8, 2026) – The New England Revolution (11-8-4, 37 pts.) will close their four-match road trip with two away games this week, starting with an 8:00 p.m. ET kickoff at New York City FC (7-8-8; 29 pts.) on Wednesday night. Watch the midweek match at Citi Field live on [Apple TV](#) in English and Spanish. PREVIEW SOUND (9/7): Marko Mitrović & M Brooklyn Raines

The Revolution will meet their I-95 rivals for the second time this season, following a 1-1 draw in the first encounter three weeks ago on Aug. 23 at Gillette Stadium. Forward **Dor Torgeman**, a 22-year-old Israeli international, accounted for New England's scoring with assists from **Peyton Miller** and **Jack Harrison**. The latter began his professional career with New York City FC from 2016-17 before making his move to England. With the Revolution, Harrison owns six assists through his first six appearances, most in MLS since the World Cup break. New England leads the all-time series against New York City FC, 12-10-6, though Wednesday's contest marks the Revolution's first visit to Citi Field.

In a road-heavy portion of the schedule, New England has found its form away from home, posting a 2-2-1 record over its last five away matches, outscoring opponents 12-9 during that span. The Revolution had a three-match unbeaten streak snapped on Saturday with a narrow 2-1 defeat to LA Galaxy. The Revolution fell into an early 2-0 hole in the opening half before finding their rhythm on the attacking end, producing a season-high 25 shot attempts on the night, including seven on frame and three shots off the woodwork.

Midfielder **Carles Gil** netted New England's lone goal from the penalty spot, his 22nd penalty goal to move into a tie for seventh most in MLS history. Gil added six chances created to his total, moving into the league lead with 68 key passes this season. With nine goals on the season, the 2026 MLS All-Star is now two tallies shy of matching his career high of 11, set during the 2023 season. With two more assists, he would become just the second player in MLS history to record 10 helpers in at least six consecutive seasons (Preki - 8).

Saturday's match in LA also featured the Revolution debut of midfielder **Dániel Gazdag**, who posted a 15-minute outing off the bench. Gazdag, a 30-year-old Hungary international, joined New England as a free agent on Sept. 1. The MLS veteran has posted strong numbers against New York City FC, netting five goals over 11 career appearances, including one tally earlier this season during his tenure with the Columbus Crew.

Defender **Ilay Feingold** and forward/winger **Luca Langoni** provided reinforcements for the club last weekend, with both returning to the pitch following lengthy injury absences. Langoni saw his first minutes after missing five matches and made an immediate impact off the bench, drawing a penalty to help set up Gil's goal in stoppage time. Feingold has now suited up for back-to-back games after being sidelined for four months with an ankle ailment.

Between the posts, Wednesday's tilt features both of the United States Men's National Team's starting goalkeepers at the 2026 FIFA World Cup in the Revolution's **Matt Turner** and New York City FC's **Matt Freese**, a Harvard University product. Over 10 career appearances against the Pigeons, Turner has registered a 4-3-3 record with two shutout performances.

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About the New England Revolution

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. New England also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The club and its acclaimed pro pathway, including Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) and the Revolution Academy, are headquartered at the Revolution Training Center, which opened ahead of the 2020 season.

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
