Revolution Visit Chicago Fire FC Seeking Third Win of Road Trip

Two of the top-four teams in the Eastern Conference, separated by just one point, kick off at 5:30 p.m. ET at Soldier Field

CHICAGO (September 12, 2026) – The New England Revolution (12-8-4, 40 pts.) will play their fourth straight match on the road this Sunday, visiting historic Soldier Field to face Eastern Conference rival Chicago Fire FC (11-6-6, 39 pts.). The 5:30 p.m. ET kickoff, a pivotal matchup between two of the top four teams in the East, is available to watch on [Apple TV](#) in English and Spanish. PREVIEW SOUND (9/11): Marko Mitrović & Peyton Miller

New England and Chicago, currently third and fourth in the Eastern Conference, respectively, are separated by just one point as they face off for the first of two meetings over the final 10 games of the campaign. The Revolution leapfrogged Chicago in the standings on Wednesday night with a dramatic 2-1 victory at New York City FC. Knotted at 1-1 entering second-half stoppage time, New England snatched victory with newcomer **Dániel Gazdag** netting the decider to open his Revolution account. The Revolution are now 2-1-0 entering the final leg of a four-match road stretch, with a 3-2-1 away record since the MLS season resumed in July.

Defender **Ilay Feingold** registered the winning assist on Wednesday night off the bench, adding three key passes in an 18-minute shift. Despite the limited minutes, Feingold's performance earned him a selection to the MLS Team of the Matchday. The 22-year-old outside back has appeared as a substitute in the last three contests following his return from a four-month injury absence, adding reinforcement to one of the league's top defenses. New England has conceded just 30 goals in 24 games, with its 1.25 goals against average ranking fifth-best leaguewide. Goalkeeper **Matt Turner** continues to pace the league in goals prevented (-10.06) this season, and ranks top five leaguewide in saves (4th - 93), wins (T-3rd - 12), and save percentage (3rd - 75.4).

In Wednesday's victory, captain and midfielder **Carles Gil** converted his league-leading sixth penalty goal of the campaign, giving him a team-high 10 tallies this season. The Spaniard has reached double-digit goals for the fourth time in his MLS career, becoming the third different player in club annals to do so in consecutive seasons. With goals in back-to-back matches, Gil currently leads MLS with 69 chances created. He needs two more assists to become just the second player in MLS history with 10-plus helpers in six straight seasons (Preki - 8).

Sunday could mark another milestone in the young career of **Peyton Miller**, with the Connecticut native in line to potentially make his 50th MLS start. Miller would become just the fourth player in league history to reach that mark before age 19, joining Andy Najar, Eddy Gaven, and Freddy Adu. Miller has recorded four assists and team-high 14 shots on target since the regular season resumed in July. Fellow U.S. youth international **Brooklyn Raines** is also set for his 50th MLS start. The midfielder earned a secondary assist, his second of the year, on Wednesday's winning goal.

Sunday's opponent, Chicago Fire FC, battled Inter Miami CF to a 1-1 draw on Wednesday night in front of a sold-out Soldier Field. During the summer window, Chicago added legendary Polish striker

Robert Lewandowski, who has tallied six goals and two assists in his first nine MLS appearances since arriving from Barcelona. MLS All-Star Philip Zinckernagel owns a team-high nine assists along with five goals, while Swiss winger Maren Haile-Selassie has added seven goals and eight assists. In goal, Chris Brady, who represented the United States at the FIFA 2026 World Cup along with Turner, owns 11 wins and six clean sheets between the posts.

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About the New England Revolution

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. New England also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The club and its acclaimed pro pathway, including Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) and the Revolution Academy, are headquartered at the Revolution Training Center, which opened ahead of the 2020 season.

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
