PREVIEW: Revolution Back on the Road Wednesday at D.C. United

New England opens two-game week with Eastern Conference clash

WASHINGTON, D.C. (August 18, 2026) – The New England Revolution (9-7-3, 30 pts.) begin a two-game week Wednesday night, heading back on the road to visit D.C. United at Audi Field. The 7:30 p.m. ET kickoff airs on [Apple TV](#) in English and Spanish. Listen to the Revolution's local radio calls on 98.5 The Sports Hub (English) and 1260 AM Nossa Radio USA (Portuguese).

New England continues to maintain a top-four position in the table despite a three-game winless skid, which includes a narrow 2-1 defeat at Toronto FC on Saturday night. Despite a season-high 25 shot attempts and 65 percent possession for New England, the hosts scored twice in the first half and held on after being reduced to 10 men for the final 18 minutes. Revolution winger **Jack Harrison** was involved in nine of those shots in his first start for the club, logging four attempts and five chances created over a 90-minute shift.

The Englishman earned his first Revolution assist late in the match, setting up forward **Wilson Harris** for his first career MLS tally. Harris became the 13th different Revolution player to score a goal this season, tied for fourth most in MLS. The headed goal was New England's seventh of the season as a team, tied with Wednesday's opponent D.C. United for second most in the league.

Center back **Mamadou Fofana** was credited with a secondary assist on Harris' tally last weekend, his first helper of the season and second of his MLS career. Fofana, currently tied for the league lead with 55 clearances on the campaign, has started 18 of 19 matches this season for New England. The Mali international has paired in central defense with U.S. youth international **Ethan Kohler**, who completed all 91 of his passes in Saturday's defeat. Kohler owns the league's best passing accuracy (min. 900 minutes played), connecting at a 95.6 percent clip. Their formidable partnership has helped the Revolution post a 1.32 goals-against average, the fifth-best defensive record in MLS.

The Revolution and D.C. United meet for the 102nd time in all competitions, their 92nd encounter in the regular season. New England holds a slight 38-37-16 edge in MLS play, including a 1-0 win in the teams' first meeting this season on April 11. Revolution midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** contributed a first-half goal in that decisive victory, while **Sands** and forward **Dor Torgeman** earned assists on the goal, while **Turner** improved to 9-1-2 in his career against D.C. The Revolution are unbeaten (2-0-1) in their last three meetings with the Black and Red, including consecutive clean sheet victories.

Revolution captain **Carles Gil** has been lethal against D.C. in his career, posting five goals and seven assists in 15 meetings. With another goal or assist on Wednesday, he will reach 150 goal contributions in regular season play. Four of his six assists this season have come on the road, and his 44 career helpers away from home are fifth most in MLS annals.

D.C. United also made a trip to Canada last weekend, battling CF Montreal to a 1-1 draw at Stade Saputo. Striker Tai Baribo netted an equalizer in the second half to cancel out a penalty strike from the hosts, as veteran goalkeeper Sean Johnson marked his 450th MLS appearance with six saves.

Baribo is one of the league's top scorers this season with 12 tallies, while strike partner Louis Munteanu has added five goals on a team-best 44 shots.

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About the New England Revolution

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. New England also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The club and its acclaimed pro pathway, including Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) and the Revolution Academy, are headquartered at the Revolution Training Center, which opened ahead of the 2020 season.
