WELCOME TO THE 2026 SEASON

THANK YOU FOR YOUR COVERAGE OF THE NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION AND MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER IN 2026

The New England Revolution, one of the 10 founding clubs in Major League Soccer, begin the club's 31st season amidst a period of unprecedented growth for the league and the sports of soccer in North America. Under the leadership of Robert and Jonathan Kraft, the Revolution continue their pursuit of the club's first MLS Cup title as they look to add to a trophy cabinet that includes five Eastern Conference Champions, the 2021 Supporters' Shield title, the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup trophy, and 2008 North American Super-Liga honors.

In 2026, the Revolution enter a new era under the tutelage of first-year Head Coach Marko Mitrović, a 15-year coaching veteran who most recently led the United States U-20 National Team to the quarterfinals of the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup. He will look to lead New England back to the playoffs for the first time since 2023, and the second time since 2021, when the Revolution set a then-MLS-record with 73 regular season points en route to the Supporters' Shield. Since that momentous season, the Revolution have been making major waves locally and nationally as they continue to pack Gillette Stadium with season attendance averages that ranked fourth and seventh leaguewide in 2024 and 2025, respectively.

As MLS emerges as a league of choice for players worldwide, New England has become a major player in the global transfer market, ranking among the highest-spending teams in the Eastern hemisphere. The Revolution have become a destination for emerging players around the world, as well as locally, boasting a reputation for regularly advancing promising young talents to the top leagues of Europe. After bursting onto the scene with New England, Revolution alumni Tajon Buchanan (Villarreal - ESP), Adam Buksa (Udinese - ITA), Djordje Petrović (AFC Bournemouth - ENG), and Esmir Bajraktarevic (PSV Eindhoven - NED) are now excelling abroad.

Simultaneously, New England consistently replenishes its roster with new rising stars, leveraging every mechanism available including the MLS Under-22 Initiative. Building around 2021 MLS MVP and five-time Team MVP Carles Gil, the club has restocked with impact players including Israel international striker Dor Turgeman, who scored in all three of his appearances to close the 2025 season. Ecuadorian forward Leo Campana returns to lead the line, aided on the wing by 2024 U.S. Olympian Griffin Yow. This offseason, New England also executed a cash-for-player trade with Houston Dynamo FC to add American midfielder Brooklyn Raines in the midfield. The Revs also added American defender Ethan Kohler, 20, from Werder Bremen, while in the middle of the backline, Brayán Ceballos and Mamadou Fofana return to anchor the defense.

The Revolution's nationally acclaimed Pro Player Pathway, ranked No. 2 in the country by the U.S. Soccer Collective in 2025, has also become renowned for developing MLS-ready players. The Revolution Academy fields five teams in MLS NEXT and is completely fully funded, eliminating costly barriers to entry for youth players. The program became the first to win back-to-back MLS NEXT Cup championships, winning the Under-19 division in 2022 and 2023. The pathway to the first team is bridged by Revolution II, which competes in the development-focused MLS NEXT Pro league in the third tier of U.S. Soccer. Through the second team's first six seasons, Revolution II has provided 52 academy products with their first professional soccer minutes.

With the 2026 FIFA Men's World Cup™ returning to Boston with seven matches this June and July, we invite you to join us in celebrating a landmark year for the beautiful game's growth in the United States. This packet is complete with storylines and information about MLS, the Revolution, the FIFA 2026 World Cup and our players, to support your coverage of the league throughout the 2026 season.




REVOLUTION TRAINING CENTER



The Revolution Training Center, opened ahead of the 2020 season, is the state-of-the-art home for the MLS club and its esteemed pro player pathway, inclusive of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy. Spanning 68 acres of naturally restored New England wetlands, the facility includes four full-sized grass fields, one equipped with advanced heating technology that allows for year-round training on a natural surface. The fourth field, with an artificial turf surface, opened in 2024 and is one of the several professional-caliber fields available year-round for the Revolution Academy and second team.

The Revolution Training Center, privately built with an initial \$35 million investment by the Kraft family, features a 1,200-square foot locker room for the first team and modern office space for the front office and player pathway staff. The first team also benefits from a spacious player dining lounge, three hydrotherapy pools, medical treatment room, and gym facility featuring weight training equipment powered by a hydraulic air system. The complex also features a grass conditioning hill that climbs 140 feet at a steep 10 percent grade.

MLS COMPETITION CALENDAR CHANGE



Major League Soccer announced a shift in its competition calendar, aligning the league's schedule with the world's top soccer leagues. Beginning in the summer of 2027, MLS will adopt a summer-to-spring season format, marking one of the most significant developments in the league's history. MLS is continuing to work with the MLS-PA to finalize agreement on a transition plan.

In conjunction with this transition, MLS will introduce a new regular season format that blends elements of the global game with North American sports traditions. The league will also review potential adjustments to its Audi MLS Cup Playoffs format as part of an ongoing evaluation process but has not yet finalized any changes.

2027-28 SEASON STRUCTURE

The 2027–28 MLS regular season will kick off in mid-to-late July 2027 and conclude with the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs and MLS Cup in late May 2028.

Like many other top leagues, MLS will observe a midwinter break from mid-December through early February, with no league matches scheduled in January.

Before the change to the new calendar, MLS will stage a transition season from February to May 2027, featuring a 14-game regular season, playoffs, and MLS Cup. The results will determine 2027 qualification for the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, Canadian Championship, Leagues Cup, and Concacaf Champions Cup.

Although the start and end dates of the season will change, the vast majority of MLS matches will still be played within the same general timeframe as today's schedule. Initial projections for the 2027–28 season indicate that 91% of matches will fall within the current MLS season window.

STRATEGIC BENEFITS

- **Maximize Player Signings:** With the majority of global player transfers occurring in the summer, participation in the most active transfer window will now enhance, rather than disrupt, a team's ambitions for the season. With marquee players joining in the summer window, the new calendar allows MLS teams to fully acclimate summer transfers before the season begins.
- **Optimize Global Transfer Market for Players:** Aligning with global calendar allows MLS clubs to participate more effectively in the world's primary transfer window, improving opportunities to acquire and sell top talent with more favorable value.
- **Elevate the Playoffs:** The Audi MLS Cup Playoffs and MLS Cup will be played in May, delivering ideal timing and weather for the pinnacle of the MLS season, uninterrupted by FIFA international windows. This change would provide premier placement on the sports calendar, ensuring maximum attention and visibility.
- **Align with FIFA International Match Windows:** The new calendar will significantly reduce conflicts between MLS league matches and national team call-ups for players, particularly during summer tournaments.

PRO PLAYER PATHWAY



REVOLUTION ACADEMY

The Revolution Academy is one of the most innovative youth training programs in Major League Soccer, recognized by the U.S. Soccer Collective as the No. 2 youth development program in the country. In addition to its five elite age groups competing in MLS NEXT, the Revolution Academy's various player development programs, camps, and clinics train players of all abilities in every aspect of the game, including ball mastery, speed of play, coordination, balance, and movement both with and without the ball.

The Revolution Academy is the region's only fully funded program for elite youth players, eliminating costly barriers to entry for high-potential players throughout the region and beyond. The Revolution Academy develops young athletes in New England's esteemed Pro Player Pathway, which includes Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) as a critical bridge between the youth ranks and Major League Soccer.

With all activities based at the state-of-the-art Revolution Training Center in Foxborough, built with an initial \$35 million investment from the Kraft Family, the Academy also boasts three Residency homes within walking distance of the facility. Entering 2026, the Residency currently houses 17 academy athletes, all of whom are completing high school online while benefiting from daily access to the club's professional-style training environment and world-class facilities. The Residency program has graduated future Homegrown Players like Esmir Bajraktarević, now playing in the Netherlands, and current first-teamers Peyton Miller, Cristiano Oliveira, Eric Klein, and Damario McIntosh.

In 2022 and 2023, the Revolution Academy became the first program to win back-to-back MLS NEXT Cup championships, claiming consecutive national titles in the Under-19 division. To date, the Revolution Academy has produced 16 Homegrown Players to New England's MLS roster, along with 15 academy alumni who signed their first pro deals with Revolution II.

In New England's fully funded Academy program, all player expenses related to competition are covered by the Revolution, including training facilities, adidas uniforms, cleats, and gear, and game-related travel expenses.

RESIDENCY PROGRAM



The Revolution Academy currently houses 17 athletes in three residency homes, each located within a short walk of the Revolution Training Center. These Residency homes allow elite players from throughout New England and the country to benefit from the club's Pro Player Pathway without geographic or financial barriers.



NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION II



New England Revolution II, a player-development focused team competing in MLS NEXT Pro, is set to begin its seventh season in 2026. The addition of a second professional team has helped elevate the player development process by providing a fully defined pathway from the Academy to the professional ranks, facilitating growth through higher-level competition and a professional structure.
