Revolution Start Road Swing at Columbus Crew on Sunday

New England looks for second straight road win against longtime Eastern Conference rival

COLUMBUS, Ohio (August 29, 2026) – The New England Revolution (10-7-4, 34 pts.) open a four-game road swing this weekend, traveling to the Columbus Crew (5-11-5, 20 pts.) on Sunday, August 30. The 4:30 p.m. ET kickoff at ScottsMiracle-Gro Field airs on [Apple TV](#) in English and Spanish. Listen to the Revolution's local radio calls on 98.5 The Sports Hub (English) and 1260 AM Nossa Radio USA (Portuguese).

New England will play six of its next eight regular season contests on the road, beginning with a stretch of four consecutive away fixtures to mark the club's longest road stretch in regular season play since 2002. The Revolution are coming off a four-point week that featured a midweek triumph at D.C. United, 3-0, followed by a 1-1 draw at home on Sunday against New York City FC. In the home tie, New England opened the scoring through Israeli forward **Dor Turgeman**, who tapped home his fifth goal of the campaign off a headed assist from **Peyton Miller**. The 18-year-old Miller, in line for his 50th Revolution start across all competitions, set a new career high with his third helper of the season, giving him assists in back-to-back matches for the first time in his professional career.

English winger **Jack Harrison** was credited with a secondary assist on Turgeman's goal, his third straight match with a helper. Harrison is now the fastest player in Revolution history to collect his first five assists for the club, doing so in just four appearances. Since Major League Soccer returned to action following the FIFA World Cup in July, Harrison has helped the Revolution lead the league in expected goals (15.80) and expected goal differential (7.25), per American Soccer Analysis.

Protected by goalkeeper Matt Turner in net, New England's backline has posted a top-five defensive record this year, ranking fourth with only 26 goals conceded. Turner owns a 3-1-4 career mark against Columbus. At left back, **Will Sands** returns to Columbus to face his former club as he builds on a career-high 21 starts. One of only three outfield players to start every match for the Revs, Sands has covered more ground than any other MLS defender in 2026.

Midfielder **Brooklyn Raines** is available for selection on Sunday after missing the team's last match due to yellow card accumulation. Raines and Nigeria international **Alhassan Yusuf** have become mainstays in the New England midfield, with Yusuf adding goal-scoring to his arsenal. Last week, the midfielder was named MLS Player of the Matchday (Matchday 21) after notching the 11th hat trick in Revolution history last week at D.C. United. **Carles Gil** looks to add to his team-high seven goals and six assists on the year, as he remains one goal contribution away from 150 for his MLS regular season career. The captain owns one goal and four assists against the Crew, including the game-winning penalty in a 2-1 win over Columbus earlier this season.

The Revolution have won their last two meetings with Columbus, edging the crew 2-1 on both occasions. Gil and Turgeman scored in the home leg of the season series back in April. In their last trip to Columbus, New England snapped a 13-year winless drought on the road against the Crew, who currently sit last in the Eastern Conference after a 3-2 defeat at Nashville SC last Saturday. Columbus was also in action on Wednesday night, falling to Club América, 2-0, in the Leagues Cup

Quarterfinal contest. Newly-acquired midfielder Brais Mendez, signed from Spanish side Real Sociedad as a Designated Player in July, has made immediate contributions with one goal and one assist in his first four league appearances.

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About the New England Revolution

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. New England also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The club and its acclaimed pro pathway, including Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) and the Revolution Academy, are headquartered at the Revolution Training Center, which opened ahead of the 2020 season.
