RECAP: Revolution Capture Comeback Victory at Columbus Crew, 3-1

Carles Gil tallies one goal and two assists to surpass 150 career MLS goal contributions

COLUMBUS, Ohio (August 30, 2026) – The New England Revolution (11-7-4, 37 pts.) kicked off a four-game road stretch with a 3-1 win over the Columbus Crew (5-12-5, 20 pts.) in come-from-behind fashion on Sunday afternoon at ScottsMiracle-Gro Field.

Carles Gil delivered a standout performance to power the Revolution attack, tallying two assists and a sensational goal, his third career MLS game with three contributions. **Matt Polster** and **Dor Turgeman** added goals of their own, while **Jack Harrison** became the fastest Revolution player to reach six assists, now with a helper in each of his first four starts for the club.

The home side took an early lead eight minutes into the contest, as Mohamed Farsi slipped a pass to Brais Méndez, whose one-time finish took a slight deflection and found the back of the net. The Revolution responded and settled into the match, keeping Columbus pinned into its own end for the final 30 minutes of the half.

In the 32nd minute, New England found the equalizer from a corner kick opportunity. Gil delivered a service to the back post, where center back **Mamadou Fofana** rose above his marker and headed the ball down to an open **Polster**. The veteran, making his 200th Revolution appearance in all competitions, took a touch before rifling a low strike into the bottom-right corner for his first goal of the 2026 campaign. The helper was Gil's 150th regular season goal contribution, making him the 20th player in league history to reach that mark, while Fofana's primary assist was his second of the year.

With less than five minutes remaining in the first half, New England took a 2-1 lead through **Turgeman**. After **Harrison** connected with Gil outside Columbus' penalty area, the Spaniard slipped a perfectly weighted pass into Turgeman's path, whose well-timed run put him behind the Crew backline. The striker showed no hesitation, drilling a shot into the upper-left corner to mark his sixth tally of the season. Harrison's secondary helper extended his assist streak to four games, while Gil recorded his first two-assist outing since September 2024.

After the break, New England maintained steady control of the action before rounding out the scoring in the 79th minute. After a series of near misses in the attacking end, Gil and Homegrown Player

Peyton Miller combined for the insurance goal with clever combination player on the edge of Columbus' 18-yard box. Despite pressure from multiple Columbus defenders, Gil maintained possession and found Miller on the left side of the box. The 18-year-old took a touch and returned a pass into Gil's path, who deftly curled a lofted chip over Crew goalkeeper Patrick Schulte that nestled into the back of the net. Gil's finish was his eighth goal of the season, while Miller has now garnered an assist in three consecutive games and recorded a team-high four shots on target to match his career high.

Next week, the Revolution will travel cross-country for a matchup with Western Conference side LA Galaxy on Saturday, September 5. The 9:30 p.m. ET kickoff at Dignity Health Sports Park is available to watch on [Apple TV](#) in English and Spanish. MATCH NOTES

- New England began a four-game road swing, their longest stretch of consecutive road matches since the 2002 season, with a second consecutive away victory, improving to 3-5-2 on the road in 2026.
- The Revolution won for a fifth time when conceding the opening goal this season, the most such victories in MLS.
- New England tallied its 11th set piece goal of the season, tied for fifth-most in MLS.
- The Revolution set a season high with 11 shots on target in Sunday's match. The club exceeded 20 shot attempts for the third time this year, all coming in August.
- Through 22 matches, New England has conceded 27 goals, tied for fifth fewest in the league and second fewest in the Eastern Conference.
- **M Carles Gil**'s three goal contributions tied an MLS career high, last achieved in September 2023.
- **Gil**'s 152 goal contributions are tied for 17th most all-time, as he is the 20th player in league annals to reach the 150 mark.
- **Gil** finished with season-high six key passes in his first multi-assist outing in MLS play since Sept. 18, 2024 vs. CF Montreal.
- **Gil** now owns 95 career regular-season assists, 10th most in MLS history and and five shy of becoming the eighth player to reach the century mark.
- **M Matt Polster** marked his 200th Revolution start across all competitions with his first goal of the season. Polster's last goal came on May 10, 2025 at Orlando.
- **Polster** is the 14th different Revolution player to score a goal this season, tied for the fourth-most leaguewise.
- **F Dor Turgeman** scored for a second consecutive contest, his sixth goal of the season, to punctuate his 25th career MLS appearance.
- **D Mamadou Fofana** recorded his second assist of the season. He also recorded an assist in the team's last trip to Columbus in August 2025.
- **F/W Jack Harrison** was credited with a secondary assist on Turgeman's goal, his fourth straight game with an assist, one shy of the club record for consecutive league matches with an assist (5), shared by **Steve Ralston** and **Gil** (2x, last 2022).
- **D/W Peyton Miller** logged his 50th career start for the Revolution across all competitions, recording an assist for a third consecutive game. The 18-year-old matched his career high from last weekend with a team high four shots on target.
- **D Ilay Feingold** made his return to action for the first time since April 25, returning from an ankle injury.

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About the New England Revolution

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. New England also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The club and its acclaimed pro pathway, including Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) and the Revolution Academy, are headquartered at the Revolution Training Center, which opened ahead of the 2020 season.

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
