New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On Cincinnati's international call-ups affecting preparation for Sunday:

Coach Friedel: "I think you see the identity of the team. I don't think that's going to change. Personnel will change, of course, but we'll see if Fanendo Adi is fit. It looked like he turned his ankle and came off at halftime. That might change a little bit of how direct they'll be because he's very, very good in the air and they have [Kekuta] Manneh running off him. ... [Roland] Lamah will still be there, and he'll try to go forward when they counterattack, so I don't really see them changing the way they're going to play, whether they play a 4-5-1 or a 4-4-2, we'll just have to wait and see."

New England Revolution Forward Teal Bunbury

On the team's tactical flexibility from week to week:

Bunbury: "Week in and week out, we're able to adjust to different formations that we need to if we're playing with two forwards up top, if we're playing with a lone striker and someone kind of underneath, if we're playing with wide guys, if the outside backs are trying to get forward. There's a lot of tweaks that we've been doing in the first three games, and it's shown to me and to the rest of the guys that we're able to adjust depending on what the coach wants and depending on what the opposing team is going to bring."

New England Revolution Defender Andrew Farrell

On getting cleared to return after his eye injury:

Farrell: "It was crazy, because the doctor first said April 7 was the date. So, we were just going in [last Friday] for a check up to see how it was progressing. They said the eye was looking great. They couldn't see the rupture anymore and there was limited-to-no bleeding or blood spots left. They were, like, yeah, we don't see why you wouldn't be able to join the group. That was obviously great news that Friday, and then came back, packed, and got ready to go to Toronto."

TICKETS ON SALE FOR 'FINAL WHISTLE ON HATE' MATCH

The Revolution and Chelsea FC will play a friendly match, the "Final Whistle on Hate", at Gillette Stadium on Wednesday, May 15. Kicking off at 8:00 p.m. ET, the match will be played against a backdrop of ongoing antisemitism and discrimination around the world with all proceeds from the match dedicated to initiatives to combat antisemitism and hate crimes. The initial idea for the match was developed by club owners Roman Abramovich and Robert Kraft in light of a global rise in antisemitic activity.

Chelsea and the Revolution have teamed up to highlight the ongoing rise of hate crimes around the world and are working together to harness the power of sport in bringing people together to tackle hate and prejudice in all its forms.

The match's primary beneficiaries will include the World Jewish Congress, the Tree of Life synagogue, the Anti-Defamation League, and the Holocaust Educational Trust. Representatives from these and other anti-discrimination organizations will be invited to attend the game, while Abramovich and Kraft will also each donate \$1 million in support of the cause, with further initiatives to combat antisemitism to be announced closer to the game.

REVOLUTION TRAINING CENTER SET TO OPEN IN 2019

On Oct. 15, 2018, the New England Revolution broke ground on the Revolution Training Center, a world-class facility that will be the center of the Revolution first team and Academy operations. Integrated into the wetlands surrounding Gillette Stadium, the Revolution Training Center will feature state-of-the-art fitness and medical centers, six professional-grade fields, team dining and lounge spaces, and office space for the club's technical staff and front office, among other amenities.



The privately-financed, \$35-million project will give the New England Revolution one of the most advanced and expansive team facilities in Major League Soccer. The center will span 68 acres with 42,000 square feet of buildings and three new full-size fields – two natural grass surfaces and one turf pitch. With the club's existing training field, Gillette Stadium, and the Empower Field House, upon completion the club will boast a total of six professional-grade fields. The existing natural grass field on the site will be dedicated for use by the Revolution Academy.



In addition to cutting-edge amenities for the first team, which also include an on-site barbershop for the first team, the Revolution's training facility will house members of the front office and technical staff. The complex will feature office space, multiple conference rooms, and a state-of-the-art in-house media studio.

Construction began with the groundbreaking ceremony on Monday, Oct. 15, and completion is scheduled for the summer of 2019. The two natural grass surfaces, both dedicated for first team use, are expected to open in the spring.

TEAM NOTES

'GIL YEAH!': CARLES WITH THREE GOALS THROUGH THREE TILTS

Midfielder **Carles Gil** (pronounced CAR-LESS HEEL) has opened his MLS career in a blistering run of form. The Spaniard has already scored three goals, which is tied for most among all MLS players through the first three weeks of the 2019 campaign. Gil registered his first career brace in New England's most recent match on March 17 at Toronto, converting a penalty kick in the ninth minute before scoring with his left foot in the second half. Only one other MLS player, Montreal's Ignacio Piatti, equals Gil's total of three away goals this season.

The Valencia, Spain native also tallied in his MLS debut at FC Dallas on March 2, delivering the game-tying goal in the 57th minute. He is now the third Revolution player to score three goals through the first three games of a season:

Gil arrived in New England with more than 180 games experiences across all competitions with top-flight European clubs, including Aston Villa, Valencia CF, Elche FC, and Deportivo de La Coruña. His career highlights include helping Elche earn promotion from La Liga 2 into La Liga in 2013, marking the club's first ascension into Spain's top flight in 25 years. Gil also contributed to Aston Villa's run to the 2015 FA Cup Final.



WORK RATE BEARS RESULTS IN FINAL THIRD

New England's attack has been launching from advantageous positions at an exceptionally high rate this season, as the Revs' high-intensity defensive approach has led to 28 possessions gained in the attacking end, nine more than any other club, according to Opta:

In addition to Carles Gil's league-best eight possessions won in the final third, Homegrown midfielder **Diego Fagundez** is tied for fifth in MLS with four, while fellow Revs Academy product forward **Justin Rennicks** has contributed three on the year.

EYEING A RETURN: FARRELL ON MEND FROM RETINA INJURY

After suffering an eye injury in a preseason training session that kept him sidelined for several weeks – and briefly blind in his left eye – defender **Andrew Farrell** is on the mend. He was officially cleared to resume full activity on Friday, March 15, and promptly made an appearance in the 18-man matchday roster for New England's match on March 17 at Toronto.

Although Farrell did not see the field against TFC, he could return to the starting lineup as soon as this weekend following a full week of training.



Farrell has been a staple at right back for the Revolution since the club selected him with the first-overall pick in the 2013 MLS SuperDraft. He leads all MLS outfield players in games started (188) and minutes played (16,728) since entering the league. Prior to missing New England's first three games of this season, the Louisville, Ky. native had missed only three league games in his entire six-year MLS career.

In Farrell's absence, second-year defender **Brandon Bye** has stepped in admirably at right back, playing all 270 minutes in the club's first three games. Bye, selected by the Revolution with the eighth-overall pick in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, owns 27 appearances with 19 starts, one goal, and two assists. He logged the third-most appearances and minutes played among all 2018 SuperDraft picks last season.

CAICE-DOS: JUAN FERNANDO, LUIS RETURN FROM INJURY

The Revolution's match on March 17 at Toronto FC saw both of the club's Caicedos – Juan Fernando and Luis – log minutes. Both players suffered minor injuries in preseason, which delayed their full integration into the rotation. The match marked the first start and second appearance of the young season for Luis, 22, while the six-minute outing for Juan Fernando was the striker's MLS debut.

Forward **Juan Fernando Caicedo**, acquired by the Revs this offseason on loan from Colombian side Independiente Medellín, made his MLS debut as a substitute in the 84th minute. Caicedo, 29, scored 89 goals in nearly 300 appearances across all competitions through nine professional seasons in the top divisions of Colombia and Argentina.



Meanwhile, **Luis Caicedo** made his first start of the season and played 84 minutes in central midfield. Caicedo previously played one minute as a substitute on March 2 at FC Dallas as he has been working his way back toward full match fitness. The Colombian midfielder enjoyed an outstanding debut campaign with New England in 2018, recording 30 appearances with 29 starts, one goal, and four assists. Following the season, the club exercised its permanent transfer option on Caicedo from his former club, Cortuluá.

CASTILLO OFFERS REVS STABILITY AT LEFT BACK

On Dec. 18, the Revolution acquired left back **Edgar Castillo** in a trade with the Colorado Rapids in exchange for midfielder Kelyn Rowe. Castillo, 32, brings over 12 years of experience to the Revolution, including 11 professional seasons and multiple championships in Mexico's Liga MX, as well as one season in MLS with Colorado.

Thus far in 2019, Castillo has played 90 minutes in each of the Revolution's first three matches. An attack-minded outside back, Castillo leads the Revolution in touches this season and has exhibited his ability to join the attack. He has provided the Revs with a stabilizing option at left back, a position that saw three different players log starts in 2018.



The Las Cruces, New Mexico native began his senior career with Santos Laguna in 2006. After winning a championship with Santos in 2008, Castillo departed for Club América. During subsequent loan stints with Tigres UANL (2009-10), San Luis FC (2010), and Puebla FC (2011), he totaled 49 appearances and four goals. Castillo then joined Club Tijuana, first on loan before a permanent transfer, where he appeared in 94 games across more than 7,800 minutes. He also spent time with Atlas Guadalajara and Monterrey.

Castillo is a dual citizen of Mexico and the United States and is one of only two players ever to earn senior caps from both nations. He began his international career by playing three senior games for Mexico, debuting against Colombia in August 2007, before making the one-time switch permitted by FIFA to represent the United States in 2009. Since joining the American side, Castillo has earned 18 caps, including six in both 2014 and 2018 FIFA World Cup qualification.

RENNICKS, BUCHANAN MAKE PRO DEBUTS IN HOME OPENER

A pair of MLS rookies, Revolution Academy product **Justin Rennicks** and first-round SuperDraft selection **Tajon Buchanan**, made their professional debuts during the Revolution's home opener on March 9 vs. Columbus.

Rennicks, the sixth Homegrown Player signing in club history, entered the match as a halftime substitute and recorded two shots, one chance created, and a foul won in 45 minutes of action. The South Hamilton, Mass. native made more than 100 appearances during his Revolution Academy career before making his MLS debut with the first team last weekend. Rennicks is currently away in Spain on international duty with the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team.

Buchanan, selected by New England with the ninth-overall pick in January's SuperDraft, saw nine minutes after replacing Scott Caldwell as a substitute in the 81st minute. The Brampton, Ontario native registered two shots in his nine-minute run out, in addition to two passes and eight total touches.

O CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: MANCIENNE ANCHORS BACK LINE

After joining the Revolution during last summer's secondary transfer window, defender **Michael Mancienne** is settled in and prepared to anchor New England's back line for the 2019 season. The beginning of his 2019 campaign was delayed when he suffered a back injury in warmups on March 2 at FC Dallas, but the London native quickly returned to his quarters in central defense for the Revolution's home opener and played 90 minutes vs. Columbus on March 9. He logged another 90-minute shift on March 17 at Toronto.



Mancienne, who arrived in Aug. 2018 via a transfer from EFL Championship side Nottingham Forest F.C., started 10 games in his first season with the Revolution. Mancienne wore the captain's armband throughout New England's 2019 preseason and in each of his first two regular season contests, channeling his experience across Europe's top flight to organize and guide the Revs both on and off the field.

A former England youth international and graduate of Chelsea's youth system with 99 combined career appearances in the English Premier League and German Bundesliga, Mancienne's professional experience includes more than 320 senior appearances and 25,000 minutes played across Europe with Chelsea (2006-11), Queens Park Rangers (2006-08), Wolverhampton (2008-11), Hamburger SV (2011-14), and Forest (2014-18).

KNIGHTON SHINING ARMOR: BRAD GETS THE NOD IN NET

After a competitive preseason battle for the starting goalkeeper shirt, veteran **Brad Knighton** has gotten the call for each of the club's first three matches. Knighton played 90 minutes in the Revs' 1-1 draw in Dallas on March 2 to open the 2019 campaign, marking the first time in his MLS career that he started a season-opening match. He slotted in between the sticks again on March 9 vs. Columbus and March 17 at Toronto.



Knighton, now in his 12th MLS season, has tallied 224 saves, 13 shutouts, and holds a goals-against average of 1.50 for his career. In club history, he ranks sixth in games played in goal, games started in goal, minutes played in goal, and wins. The 34-year-old North Carolina native is in his second stint with the Revs, after previously spending time with both Philadelphia (2010) and Vancouver (2012-13).

Last January, Knighton was inducted into the UNC-Wilmington Athletic Hall of Fame after spending time with the Seahawks under former Revolution goalkeeper Aidan Healey. Knighton holds the program record of 25 shutouts.

TEAM NOTES

REVS LOAN HERIVAU, WRIGHT TO BIRMINGHAM LEGION FC

The New England Revolution loaned midfielder **Zachary Herivaux** and forward **Brian Wright** to Birmingham Legion FC of the USL Championship on March 14. Both players may be recalled by New England from their open-ended loans at any time. Herivaux started and played 90 minutes in his first appearance with Birmingham, while Wright saw 31 minutes of action.

Herivaux, 23, is in his fifth professional season after signing with the Revolution as the club's third ever Homegrown Player in 2015. The Brookline, Mass. native owns 10 career MLS appearances, including two starts, as well as eight additional appearances and two goals in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup play. Herivaux, who owns five international caps with the Haiti National Team, also registered four appearances and one goal while on loan with USL side San Antonio FC in 2017.

Wright, 23, is in his third professional season after being selected by New England with the 20th-overall pick in the 2017 MLS SuperDraft. The Ajax, Ontario native has made 12 appearances in MLS play with one goal scored. In U.S. Open Cup competition, Wright has added one goal in four games for the Revs. In 2017, he made three appearances with two starts in USL play while on loan with Tulsa Roughnecks FC.

Revolution connections abound with Birmingham Legion FC, which is in its first season of play in the USL Championship after launching in 2018 under the direction of former Revolution defender (2001-09) and head coach (2012-17) Jay Heaps, who serves as the Legion's president and general manager. Former Revolution assistant coach (2014-17) and interim head coach (2017) Tom Soehn is Birmingham's first ever head coach, while former Revs forward Khano Smith (2005-08, 2010) is an assistant coach with the club. Three other former Revs players are currently on Birmingham's roster including Femi Hollinger-Janzen (2016-18), Daigo Kobayashi (2014-17), and Trevor Spangenberg (2015).

RENNICKS, HERIVAU & SOMI TAPPED FOR INTERNATIONAL DUTY

Three New England Revolution players have been called in for national team duty, as Revolution Academy products **Justin Rennicks** (United States U-20 MNT) and **Zachary Herivaux** (Haiti), and defender **Gabriel Somo** (Syria) have joined their respective national teams for training camps and matches. All three players are expected to be unavailable on March 24 vs. FC Cincinnati.

Rennicks, 19, has joined the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team for a pair of matches in Spain from March 18-26 in preparation for this summer's 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Poland. The U.S. team will play France on Friday, March 22 (10:00 a.m. ET) and Japan on Monday, March 25 (7:00 a.m. ET). Rennicks saw his most recent international action in November 2018, when he helped the U.S. Under-20 squad win the Concacaf U-20 Championship. He registered four goals and six assists across eight appearances in that tournament, and has appeared in a team-high seven-of-eight U-20 camps during this World Cup cycle.

Herivaux, 23, joined the Haiti National Team on March 17 in preparation for its fourth and final 2019/20 Concacaf Nations League qualifying match against Cuba. The contest will be played at Stade Sylvio Cator in Port-au-Prince on Sunday, March 24. Through the first three matches of the tournament, which will determine 10 of the 16 participants for the 2019 Concacaf Gold Cup, Haiti owns a perfect 3-0-0 record and sits tied atop the qualifying table with nine points.

Somi, 27, joined the Syria National Team in Basra, Iraq to participate in the 2019 International Friendship Championship between Syria, Iraq, and Jordan. He made his debut for the Qasoun Eagles on March 20 vs. Iraq in a 1-0 loss. On Sunday, March 24, Syria will take on Jordan. Somo is expected to return to New England on March 27.

REVOLUTION ACADEMY KICKS OFF SPRING SEASON

The New England Revolution Academy began the home portion of its spring season last weekend as all five teams continued their U.S. Soccer Development Academy campaigns. The Under-19s, Under-17s, Under-15s, Under-14s, and Under-13s all saw action against Seacoast United at Gillette Stadium on March 16, while the older three age groups also played the Montreal Impact on March 17.



Notable performances from the weekend included a 71st-minute strike in a 90-minute outing from Nicolas Firmino against the Montreal Impact in the U-19s' 4-2 victory on St. Patrick's Day. The 18-year-old signed with the Revolution first team on Nov. 27, 2018 as the club's fifth-ever Homegrown Player. In addition, fellow Homegrown Player signing Isaac Angking started and played 90 minutes in the U-19s' 4-2 win over Montreal on Sunday. Angking has made three MLS appearances since signing as a Homegrown Player on Jan. 2, 2017.

All five Academy teams will return to action this weekend. On Saturday, March 23, the U-19s, U-17s, and U-15s travel to Stamford, Conn. to face Beachside SC, while the U-14s and U-13s will host NEFC at Gillette Stadium on Sunday, March 24.

REVS SIGN ACADEMY PRODUCTS FIRMINO, RENNICKS

Prior to the start of the 2019 season, the Revolution signed two Academy products to Homegrown Player contracts, adding midfielder **Nicolas Firmino** (signed Nov. 27, 2018) and forward **Justin Rennicks** (signed Jan. 18, 2019) to the first team roster.

Firmino, 18, a resident of Somerville, Mass. and native of Mantena, Brazil, joined the Revolution Academy at the Under-14 level before the 2014 fall season. In more than four seasons with the Academy, the Brazilian attacking midfielder, who has also gone by the name Elio, scored over 35 goals in more than 90 appearances. He contributed at four different age groups during his Academy tenure, debuting with the U-14s before stints at the then-U-16, U-17, and U-19 levels.

Rennicks, 19, emerged as one of the Revolution Academy's most productive players upon joining the program at the Under-14 level ahead of the 2012-13 U.S. Soccer Development Academy season. The forward graduated from the Academy with 38 goals and 25 assists in more than 100 appearances across the U-14, U-16, and U-18 levels. He was named the UnitedHealthcare Academy Player of the Year in 2015 and 2016, becoming the first and only player to win the award twice. The South Hamilton, Mass. native then spent two years at Indiana University after playing five years in the Revolution Academy, and is a regular fixture in U.S. Youth National Team camps, most recently earning a call-up to the U.S. U-20 camp in Spain ahead of this summer's FIFA U-20 World Cup.

New England now rosters six Homegrown Players in total, three of whom have joined the squad during Brad Friedel's tenure as head coach. In addition to Firmino and Rennicks, the club also has local products **Diego Fagundez** (Leominster, Mass.), **Scott Caldwell** (Braintree, Mass.), **Zachary Herivaux** (Brookline, Mass.), and **Isaac Angking** (Providence, R.I.) on the first team.

This March, the U.S. Soccer Federation announced that three former New England Revolution players are eligible for 2019 National Soccer Hall of Fame induction. **Taylor Twellman** and **Steve Ralston** have been named to the 2019 National Soccer Hall of Fame Player ballot, while current General Manager and former Revs captain **Mike Burns** is listed on the 2019 National Soccer Hall of Fame Veteran ballot.

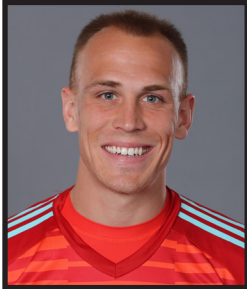
Voting has begun and runs through Monday, April 1 for the Player, Veteran, and Builder categories. The results of the voting will be announced at a later date.

Burns, 48, is currently in his 15th season with the Revolution organization and eighth season as the team's General Manager. Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad. He captained the Revs from 1996-2000, scored three goals, and tallied 15 assists in a New England uniform.

Twellman, 39, was born in Minneapolis, Minn., and raised in St. Louis, Mo., and played nine memorable seasons in Major League Soccer, all with the Revolution. The 2005 MLS Most Valuable Player scored 101 career goals in 174 career appearances after joining MLS in 2002, and remains New England's top all-time scorer. He was also a two-time MLS Best XI performer (2002, 2005) and a five-time MLS All-Star.

Ralston, 44, scored 42 goals and recorded a club-record 73 assists over eight seasons with the Revs from 2002-10 and helped lift the team to four MLS Cup finals. Ralston totaled over 33,000 minutes in MLS play and recorded 36 caps with the United States Men's National Team throughout his career, notching four goals.

TECHNICAL STAFF BIOS



BRAD FRIEDEL HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017 and posted a 10-13-11 record in first season.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- One of most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- A decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in 13-year senior career.
- First-ballot inductee to the National Soccer Hall of Fame as part of the 2018 class and member of inaugural Blackburn Rovers Hall of Fame class in 2019.

Brad Friedel is in his second season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated playing career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

In his first season with the Revolution, Friedel worked with General Manager Michael Burns to overhaul the roster with 12 new players for the 2018 campaign and led the club to a 10-13-11 record. Friedel's approach paid dividends for a number of Revolution players, including Ecuadorian forward Cristian Penilla, the 2018 JetBlue Team MVP and club Golden Boot winner, and midfielder Diego Fagundez, who tallied nine goals and a career-high 10 assists after Friedel positioned him in a central attacking midfield role.

Friedel, 47, joined the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player, assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career, which earned him a first-ballot selection to the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2018. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's pre-eminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history. As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is currently in his second season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international is now in his 11th MLS season as a coach and his 17th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 14 years of coaching experience to the staff in New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporters' Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



MARCELO NEVELEFF ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is currently in his second season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Inter-regional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

TECHNICAL STAFF BIOS



RUBEN GARCIA ASSISTANT COACH

Rubén García is currently in his second season as Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. Garcia, who was also known as Ruben Martin during his playing days, spent time with clubs including Toledo CV, Alaves CF, Albacete, Atlético Madrid, Ciudad de Murcia, Talavera, and Alcala de Henares.

Garcia graduated from the University of San Pablo CEU in Madrid in 2006 with a Bachelor Degree in Criminology.



GABRIEL MARTINEZ POCH HEAD FITNESS COACH

Gabriel Martínez Poch is in his first season as Head Fitness Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the technical staff in January 2019. Poch brings extensive experience with top-flight clubs in South America to the Revolution, most recently with Mineros de Guayana of the Venezuelan First Division.

Poch, 53, has worked for two decades as a sports science specialist with several top clubs around the world, including stints at multiple top-division outfits in South America. A native of La Plata, Argentina, he has worked extensively for clubs in South America, Europe, and Asia. Most recently, he helped guide Argentine side Aldosivi de Mar del Plata to promotion into the Argentina SuperLiga as a methodology and technical assistant in 2018. Poch earned his UEFA Level 3 'B' License in Barcelona in 2015.

In addition to his time with Aldosivi, Poch's prior experience is highlighted by stints with 18 different clubs in Argentina, Bolivia, Ecuador, Venezuela, Spain, Romania, the United States, Kuwait, and Qatar. Poch has helped clubs to a number of major accomplishments, including a Bolivian Primera División title with Wilstermann in 2006, and an Ecuadorian Serie A championship with Deportivo Quito in 2009. He also helped guide several clubs to promotion in their respective leagues.



MICHAEL BURNS GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is currently in his 15th season with the New England Revolution and his eighth season as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel. The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before being named Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management. He has also been instrumental in the development of the new Revolution Training Center in Foxborough, set to open in 2019 as the home of the Revolution first team and Academy. The \$35-million project places the Revolution's facilities among the best in all of Major League Soccer and includes a state-of-the-art headquarters and four new professional-grade fields.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

Burns was the first player in U.S. Soccer history to represent the United States at every level of FIFA-sanctioned tournaments: Under-16 World Cup (Canada 1987), Under-20 World Cup (Saudi Arabia 1989), Olympic Games (Barcelona 1992), and World Cup (United States 1994, France 1998).

The Massachusetts native was allocated to the Revolution in 1995 at the inception of MLS and played for – and captained – New England from 1996 to 2000, before finishing his playing career with the San Jose Earthquakes (2000) and the Kansas City Wizards (2001-02). Overall, he made 169 appearances, scored three goals, and totaled 21 assists. Burns also played for Viborg in the Super League in Denmark in 1995 before joining MLS.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns represents New England at the league level as the club's Chief Soccer Officer, and serves on the MLS Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his 10th season with the New England Revolution and his second as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07).

Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

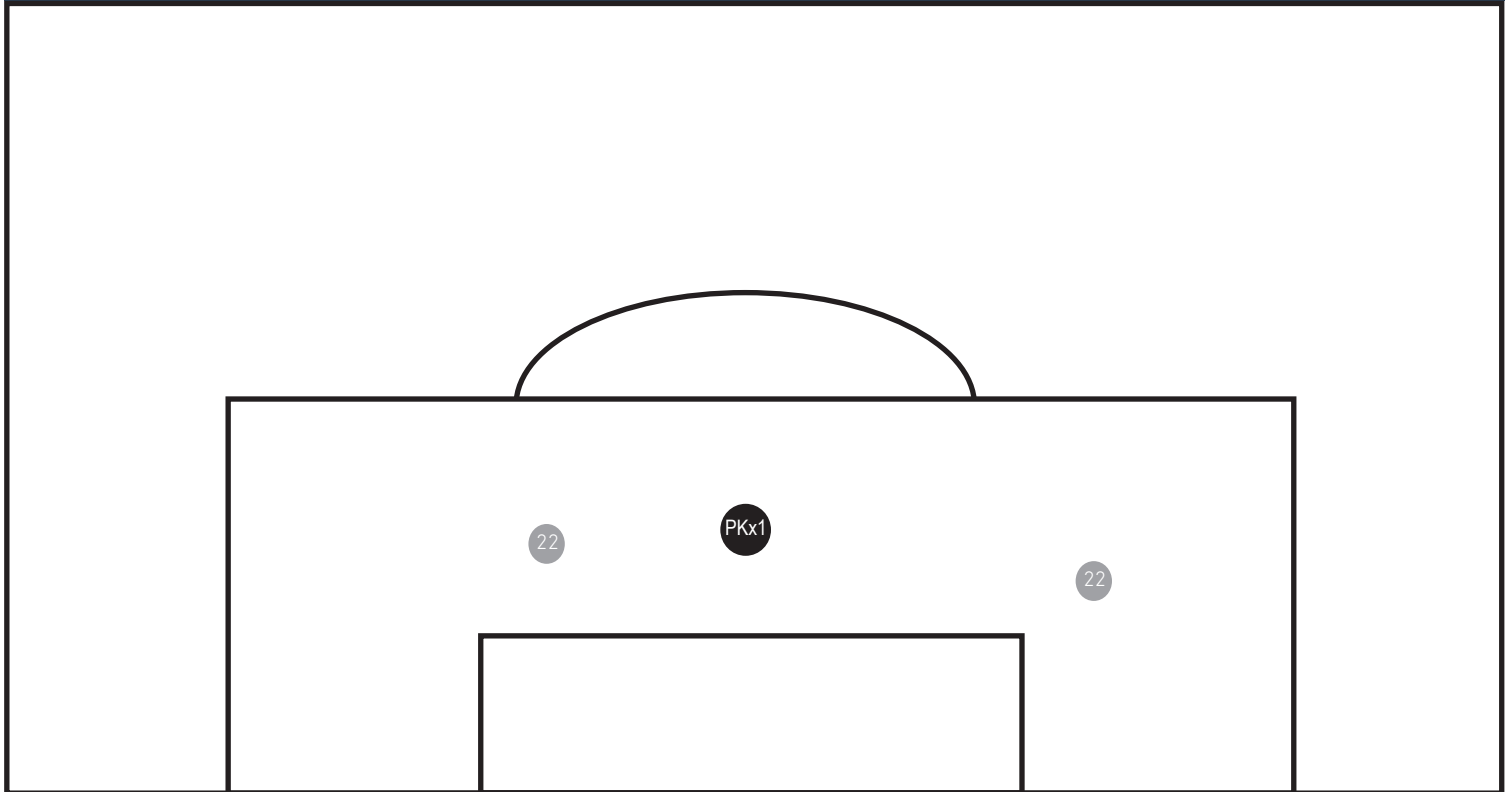
