### New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

*On Atlanta United FC:*

**Coach Friedel:** "There are some differences. I've watched a lot of their games. They've been very unlucky in games. They've been creating chances, and of course they don't have Miguel Almiron, so that was a big piece of their attacking puzzle. But they've got some very good players and we're going to have to be at the top of our game to be able to beat them."

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### New England Revolution Midfielder Scott Caldwell

*On combining with Carles Gil in the midfield:*

**Caldwell:** "I just have to read off him. He's such a talented player. If he wants to get the ball deep, then I'll move into the attack. If he wants to join the attack, then I'll give coverage on both sides of the ball. We just have to play off each other. He's done great for us and we have to continue to keep getting better as a team."

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### New England Revolution Defender Jalil Anibaba

*On Atlanta's form thus far in 2019:*

**Anibaba:** "I don't think their recent form is indicative to them as a team at all. I think we're very aware of that. I think the whole league is aware of that. It's just a matter of taking the game as it comes, but like I said, home games are paramount and we feel when we're at home, we can beat any team. It's just a matter of actually proving it when we get out there."

### FARRELL SET TO MAKE MILESTONE 200<sup>TH</sup> APPEARANCE

Defender **Andrew Farrell** is poised to reach a major milestone with his next appearance, as the seventh-year defender is one game away from 200 MLS appearances in the regular season and MLS Cup Playoffs combined, all with New England. Farrell has played in 192 regular season games, with seven additional postseason starts, and is also 92 minutes shy of becoming the sixth Revs player to reach 17,000 minutes played for his career. His totals for regular season games played ranks eighth in club annals, while his 190 starts are sixth most in Revs history.

After suffering an eye injury in a preseason training session that kept him sidelined for several weeks – and briefly blind in his left eye – defender **Andrew Farrell** made his return to the field on March 30 vs. Minnesota. Farrell was officially cleared to resume full activity on Friday, March 15, and promptly made an appearance in the 18-man matchday roster for New England's match on March 17 at Toronto. With two weeks of training under his belt, he was able to slot back into the Revs' rotation and played 90 minutes in each of the last two contests.

Prior to missing New England's first three games of this season, the Louisville, Ky. native had missed only three league games in his entire six-year MLS career. Farrell started 32 games in each of his first four MLS seasons, and started 30 matches in both 2017 and 2018. He leads all MLS field players in games started and minutes played since he entered the league in 2013, and ranks fourth since then in games played.

### TICKETS ON SALE FOR 'FINAL WHISTLE ON HATE' MATCH

The Revolution and Chelsea FC will play a charity match, the "Final Whistle on Hate", at Gillette Stadium on Wednesday, May 15. Kicking off at 8:00 p.m. ET, the match will be played against a backdrop of ongoing anti-Semitism and discrimination around the world with all proceeds from the match dedicated to initiatives to combat antisemitism and hate crimes. The initial idea for the match was developed by club owners Roman Abramovich and Robert Kraft in light of a global rise in antisemitic activity.

The match's primary beneficiaries will include the World Jewish Congress, the Tree of Life synagogue, the Anti-Defamation League, and the Holocaust Educational Trust. Representatives from these and other anti-discrimination organizations will be invited to attend the game, while Abramovich and Kraft will also each donate \$1 million in support of the cause, with further initiatives to combat antisemitism to be announced closer to the game.



### REVOLUTION TRAINING CENTER SET TO OPEN IN 2019

On Oct. 15, 2018, the New England Revolution broke ground on the Revolution Training Center, a world-class facility that will be the center of the Revolution first team and Academy operations. Integrated into the wetlands surrounding Gillette Stadium, the Revolution Training Center will feature state-of-the-art fitness and medical centers, six professional-grade fields, team dining and lounge spaces, and office space for the club's technical staff and front office, among other amenities.



The privately-financed, \$35-million project will give the New England Revolution one of the most advanced and expansive team facilities in Major League Soccer. The center will span 68 acres with 42,000 square feet of buildings and three new full-size fields – two natural grass surfaces and one turf pitch. With the club's existing training field, Gillette Stadium, and the Empower Field House, upon completion the club will boast a total of six professional-grade fields. The existing natural grass field on the site will be dedicated for use by the Revolution Academy.



Construction began with the groundbreaking ceremony on Monday, Oct. 15, and completion is scheduled for the summer of 2019. The two natural grass surfaces, both dedicated for first team use, are expected to open in the spring.

### GILLETTE STADIUM TO HOST AC MILAN - BENFICA ON JULY 28

Italian powerhouse AC Milan will take on Portuguese giants Benfica at Gillette Stadium on Sunday, July 28 as part of the International Champions Cup. The match marks the second year the tournament visits Gillette Stadium including a contest between AS Roma and Juventus in 2017.

The tournament format is consistent with last year's ICC. Each team will play three matches, and the club with the most points at the end of the tournament will win the championship and receive the first trophy of the season.

The tournament will host U.S.-based matches in iconic locations in Boston/Foxborough, New York/New Jersey, Los Angeles, Washington D.C., Chicago, Charlotte, Santa Clara, Houston, Arlington, and Kansas City. Cardiff, London, Stockholm, Singapore, and Shanghai will serve as hosts for the Europe and Asia matches.

## ON-FIELD NOTES

### CARLES, THE CREATOR: GIL AMONG MLS LEADERS IN KEY PASSES

Midfielder **Carles Gil** (pronounced CAR-LESS HEEL) has opened his MLS career as one of the league's top creators through the season's early stages. The Spaniard has already scored three goals, which is tied for seventh most among all MLS players, and collected one assist.

Gil registered his first career brace in New England's match on March 17 at Toronto, converting a penalty kick in the ninth minute before scoring with his left foot in the second half. The Valencia, Spain native also tallied in his MLS debut at FC Dallas on March 2, delivering the game-tying goal in the 57th minute. His three away goals are second most in MLS, behind only LAFC's Carlos Vela, who owns five.

Gil's impact extends well beyond the scoresheet. His vision and work rate have paid immediate dividends for the Revs, especially in the final third, where he has won possession a league-best 18 times and completed more most passes than any other MLS player:

### CALDWELL INKED TO MULTI-YEAR EXTENSION

On Thursday, March 28, the Revolution signed midfielder **Scott Caldwell** to a multi-year contract extension. The Braintree, Mass. native and second Homegrown Player signing in club history will remain with the club beyond what is currently his seventh Major League Soccer campaign, all with New England.

Caldwell, 28, has been an integral member of the Revolution first team since the 2013 season, totaling 184 regular season appearances and 151 starts over his seven-year MLS career, with more than 13,000 minutes played. All three of those totals rank Caldwell among the top-five in MLS history for service by a Homegrown Player, as he became the second Homegrown signing ever to reach the 10,000-minute milestone in 2017. The University of Akron graduate has recorded five goals and 17 assists in league play, with an additional eight games played and two assists in the postseason.



A mainstay in the club's lineup since playing in 29 games as a rookie in 2013, Caldwell's consistency has led him to at least 24 appearances in each of his seven professional campaigns, including a career-high 34 games played and 32 starts in 2015. For his efforts that year, which included two goals and five assists, Caldwell earned 2015 Team MVP honors from fans and the Players' Player of the Year award from teammates.

Off the field, Caldwell has long been one of the Revolution's leading ambassadors in the community, volunteering his time to events benefitting more than a dozen of the club's community partners in 2018 alone. Beginning this season, Caldwell will also be partnering with Boston Children's Hospital to host Scott's BCH Dream Team. Starting on Saturday, April 20, Caldwell will host and meet groups of patients from BCH prior to six games this season.

### ANIBABA ECLIPSES 200 CAREER MLS APPEARANCES

Defender **Jalil Anibaba** reached a major milestone on April 6 at Columbus, where he registered his 200th career MLS appearance. The nine-year veteran owns the second most games played among all Revolution players, trailing only Teal Bunbury, who has made 243 league appearances.

Since joining New England as a free agent ahead of the 2018 season, Anibaba has asserted himself as a pivotal member of the back line, logging 34 appearances, including 32 starts, with one goal and two assists.

Dating back to the beginning of last season, he is tied for fifth among all MLS players in blocks -- showcasing a positional awareness that gives the Revolution a security blanket from opponents' scoring chances.

## TEAM NOTES

### BYE, BYE, BYE: BRANDON SCORES FIRST CAREER GAME WINNER

Among the Revolution's six lineup changes on March 30 vs. Minnesota United FC was a relocation for **Brandon Bye**. With Andrew Farrell back in the Starting XI and fully recovered from his eye injury, Bye played moved up to right midfield in the team's 4-4-2 formation, officially logging his first career MLS start as a midfielder.

Bye responded with his first professional game-winning goal in the 62nd minute, when he finished off a ball from **Teal Bunbury** at the back post. On the day, he registered a team-high two shots on target, two chances created, and eight possessions won in a 90-minute shift.



He continued showcasing his versatility against Columbus Crew SC on April 6, when he slotted in at left back and played 90 minutes in Edgar Castillo's absence. Through six games, Bye has already logged starts at three different positions. He is one of two Revolution players -- along with Carles Gil -- to play all 540 minutes this season.

Selected by New England in the first round of the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, Bye featured primarily as an attacking player at Western Michigan University, but has asserted himself as an MLS-caliber outside back since arriving in the league.

### CASTILLO OFFERS REVS ATTACK-MINDED ASSET AT LEFT BACK

Defender **Edgar Castillo** has provided the Revolution with a stabilizing option at left back, a position that saw three different players log starts in 2018. He started each of New England's first five matches, but missed last weekend's contest at Columbus with a calf injury.

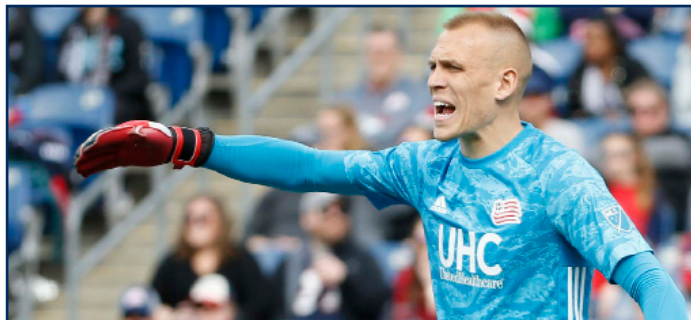
Castillo's contributions extend into the middle and final thirds of the field, as he has exhibited an eagerness to be on the ball and join the attack. This season, Castillo has registered the third most touches (363) among Revolution players. In addition, his five total shots are tied for sixth most among MLS defenders, according to Opta.

New England acquired Castillo in a trade with the Colorado Rapids in exchange for midfielder Kelyn Rowe. The 32-year old brings more than 12 years of experience to the Revolution, including 11 professional seasons and multiple championships in Mexico's Liga MX, as well as one season in MLS with Colorado.

### CREAM OF THE CROPPER: CODY MAKES FIRST START SINCE '17

Goalkeeper **Cody Cropper** got the call in net for the Revolution on March 30 vs. Minnesota United FC, marking his first appearance across all competitions since Sept. 27, 2017. Cropper responded with two saves, including a fingertop stop on a point-blank header from Minnesota's Francisco Calvo, in the 2-1 win.

He earned a second consecutive start last weekend against Columbus Crew SC, and will continue battling with **Brad Knighton** and **Matt Turner** for the starting shirt.



After signing with the Revolution from English side MK Dons in Aug. 2016, Cropper held the starting goalkeeper shirt in 2017, submitting a 10-14-4 record across 28 league starts. Despite not making an appearance throughout 2018, he showed no signs of rust in last Saturday's winning effort.

For his MLS career, Cropper now owns a 12-15-4 record as a starter with with nine shutouts, 75 saves, and a 1.68 goals against average.

### JONES-ING FOR A CHANCE: DEJUAN MAKES FIRST PRO START

One week removed from his MLS debut, rookie **DeJuan Jones** made his first career start vs. Minnesota United FC on March 30. He contributed a secondary assist on Brandon Bye's game-winning goal, playing Teal Bunbury into the scoring area with a well-weighted through ball. Across 90 minutes in left midfield, Jones recorded two shots, including one on target, one chance created, and a team-high six open play crosses.



Jones' performance against Minnesota nothced him a second consecutive start on April 6 at Columbus, where he played 61 minutes. The 11th-overall selection in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft, Jones played 13 minutes in his first professional appearance vs. FC Cincinnati on March 24, contributing one chance created, 12 touches, and an 83.3 percent passing accuracy rate.

The former Michigan State standout recorded 16 goals and 14 assists across 75 career appearances for his collegiate career prior to joining the Revs in January. He officially signed with the Revolution on Feb. 25 after earning a roster spot in preseason.



## TEAM NOTES

### WRIGHT MAKES USL TEAM OF THE WEEK WITH BIRMINGHAM

The New England Revolution loaned midfielder **Zachary Herivaux** and forward **Brian Wright** to Birmingham Legion FC of the USL Championship on March 14. Both players may be recalled by New England from their open-ended loans at any time.

Herivaux and Wright have each seen action under former Revolution assistant coach and current Legion Head Coach Tom Soehn. Wright has played two games with Birmingham, starting one, and contributed the game-winning goal and one assist against Louisville City FC on March 31 to earn a spot on the USL Championship Team of the Week. Herivaux has also seen two appearances, both starts, and totaled 180 minutes of action.

Herivaux, 23, is in his fifth professional season after signing with the Revolution as the club's third ever Homegrown Player in 2015. The Brookline, Mass. native owns 10 career MLS appearances, including two starts, as well as eight additional appearances and two goals in Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup play. Herivaux, who owns five international caps with the Haiti National Team, also registered four appearances and one goal while on loan with USL side San Antonio FC in 2017.

Wright, 23, is in his third professional season after being selected by New England with the 20<sup>th</sup>-overall pick in the 2017 MLS SuperDraft. The Ajax, Ontario native has made 12 appearances in MLS play with one goal scored. In U.S. Open Cup competition, Wright has added one goal in four games for the Revs. In 2017, he made three appearances with two starts in USL play while on loan with Tulsa Roughnecks FC.

### THREE FORMER REVS ELIGIBLE FOR NATIONAL SOCCER HOF

This March, the U.S. Soccer Federation announced that three former New England Revolution players are eligible for 2019 National Soccer Hall of Fame induction. **Taylor Twellman** and **Steve Ralston** have been named to the 2019 National Soccer Hall of Fame Player ballot, while current General Manager and former Revs captain **Mike Burns** is listed on the 2019 National Soccer Hall of Fame Veteran ballot. Voting ended on Monday, April 1 for the Player, Veteran Player, and Builder categories.

Burns, 48, is currently in his 15<sup>th</sup> season with the Revolution organization and eighth season as the team's General Manager. Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad. He captained the Revs from 1996-2000, scored three goals, and tallied 15 assists in a New England uniform.

Twellman, 39, was born in Minneapolis, Minn., and raised in St. Louis, Mo., and played nine memorable seasons in Major League Soccer, all with the Revolution. The 2005 MLS Most Valuable Player scored 101 career goals in 174 career appearances after joining MLS in 2002, and remains New England's top all-time scorer. He was also a two-time MLS Best XI performer (2002, 2005) and a five-time MLS All-Star.

Ralston, 44, scored 42 goals and recorded a club-record 73 assists over eight seasons with the Revs from 2002-10 and helped lift the team to four MLS Cup finals. Ralston totaled over 33,000 minutes in MLS play and recorded 36 caps with the United States Men's National Team throughout his career, notching four goals.

### REVOLUTION ACADEMY CONTINUES SPRING SEASON

The New England Revolution Academy continued its spring season last weekend as all five teams resumed their campaigns at Gillette Stadium. The Under-19s, Under-17s, Under-15s, Under-14s, and Under-13s all hosted Beachside SC on Saturday, April 6. The following day, the Under-17s and Under-15s additionally hosted Oakwood SC at Gillette Stadium on April 7.



Midfielder **Nicolas Firmino** (Somerville, Mass.—2001) started, scored a goal, and played 90 minutes in the U-19s' 4-1 win over Beachside SC at Gillette Stadium on Saturday, April 6. Firmino has two goals for the U-19s this spring season. Another notable performance came from forward Tico Rivera (Cranston, R.I.—2002), who scored three goals in two games this past weekend. Rivera scored a goal in the U-17s' 5-2 win over Beachside SC on Saturday, followed by a brace against Oakwood SC on Sunday.

### REVOLUTION AND SPECIAL OLYMPICS MASS. HOLD CLINIC

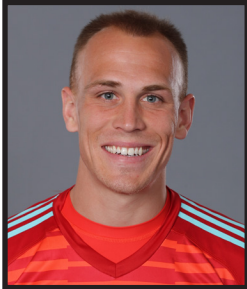

## TECHNICAL STAFF BIOS



### BRAD FRIEDEL HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017 and posted a 10-13-11 record in first season.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- One of most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- A decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in 13-year senior career.
- First-ballot inductee to the National Soccer Hall of Fame as part of the 2018 class and member of inaugural Blackburn Rovers Hall of Fame class in 2019.

Brad Friedel is in his second season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated playing career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

In his first season with the Revolution, Friedel worked with General Manager Michael Burns to overhaul the roster with 12 new players for the 2018 campaign and led the club to a 10-13-11 record. Friedel's approach paid dividends for a number of Revolution players, including Ecuadorian forward Cristian Penilla, the 2018 JetBlue Team MVP and club Golden Boot winner, and midfielder Diego Fagundez, who tallied nine goals and a career-high 10 assists after Friedel positioned him in a central attacking midfield role.

Friedel, 47, joined the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player, assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career, which earned him a first-ballot selection to the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2018. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's pre-eminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history. As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



### MIKE LAPPER ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is currently in his second season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international is now in his 11th MLS season as a coach and his 17th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 14 years of coaching experience to the staff in New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporters' Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



### MARCELO NEVELEFF ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is currently in his second season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Inter-regional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

# TECHNICAL STAFF BIOS



## RUBEN GARCIA ASSISTANT COACH

Rubén García is currently in his second season as Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. Garcia, who was also known as Ruben Martin during his playing days, spent time with clubs including Toledo CV, Alaves CF, Albacete, Atlético Madrid, Ciudad de Murcia, Talavera, and Alcala de Henares.

Garcia graduated from the University of San Pablo CEU in Madrid in 2006 with a Bachelor Degree in Criminology.



## GABRIEL MARTINEZ POCH HEAD FITNESS COACH

Gabriel Martínez Poch is in his first season as Head Fitness Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the technical staff in January 2019. Poch brings extensive experience with top-flight clubs in South America to the Revolution, most recently with Mineros de Guayana of the Venezuelan First Division.

Poch, 53, has worked for two decades as a sports science specialist with several top clubs around the world, including stints at multiple top-division outfits in South America. A native of La Plata, Argentina, he has worked extensively for clubs in South America, Europe, and Asia. Most recently, he helped guide Argentine side Aldosivi de Mar del Plata to promotion into the Argentina SuperLiga as a methodology and technical assistant in 2018. Poch earned his UEFA Level 3 'B' License in Barcelona in 2015.

In addition to his time with Aldosivi, Poch's prior experience is highlighted by stints with 18 different clubs in Argentina, Bolivia, Ecuador, Venezuela, Spain, Romania, the United States, Kuwait, and Qatar. Poch has helped clubs to a number of major accomplishments, including a Bolivian Primera División title with Wilstermann in 2006, and an Ecuadorian Serie A championship with Deportivo Quito in 2009. He also helped guide several clubs to promotion in their respective leagues.



## MICHAEL BURNS GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is currently in his 15th season with the New England Revolution and his eighth season as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel. The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before being named Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management. He has also been instrumental in the development of the new Revolution Training Center in Foxborough, set to open in 2019 as the home of the Revolution first team and Academy. The \$35-million project places the Revolution's facilities among the best in all of Major League Soccer and includes a state-of-the-art headquarters and four new professional-grade fields.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

Burns was the first player in U.S. Soccer history to represent the United States at every level of FIFA-sanctioned tournaments: Under-16 World Cup (Canada 1987), Under-20 World Cup (Saudi Arabia 1989), Olympic Games (Barcelona 1992), and World Cup (United States 1994, France 1998).

The Massachusetts native was allocated to the Revolution in 1995 at the inception of MLS and played for – and captained – New England from 1996 to 2000, before finishing his playing career with the San Jose Earthquakes (2000) and the Kansas City Wizards (2001-02). Overall, he made 169 appearances, scored three goals, and totaled 21 assists. Burns also played for Viborg in the Super League in Denmark in 1995 before joining MLS.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns represents New England at the league level as the club's Chief Soccer Officer, and serves on the MLS Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



## REMI ROY DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his 10th season with the New England Revolution and his second as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07).

Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

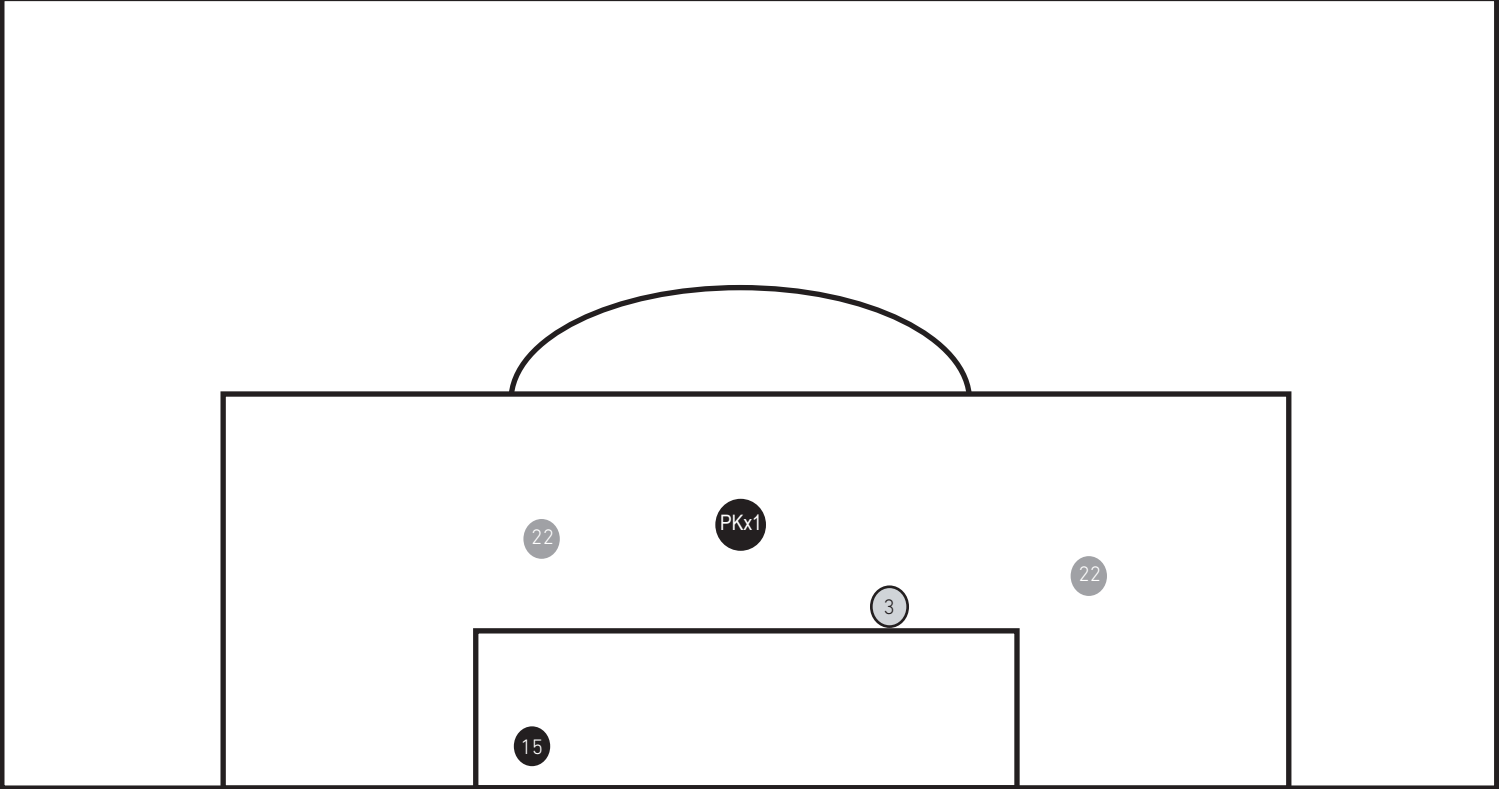
