New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On his message to the team after Saturday's loss at Philadelphia:

Coach Friedel: "Of course, I spoke to them. I normally don't speak to the team post-game — win, lose or draw after games — because in my experiences, I think that's when emotions are running at the highest beat. However, the message is simple. We stay together, we stick together, and it doesn't matter what anyone says. We, the staff and the players, are the only ones that can get us out of this position that we're in. We, the players and the staff, are the only ones that need to have the belief and we are the only ones that can go out to Chicago on Wednesday and get three points."

New England Revolution Defender Michael Mancienne

On moving forward from Saturday's match:

Mancienne: "We have to now. It's important we pick ourselves up. We are really frustrated with ourselves on how well we played that first half, then that second half was not us. I don't know what really happened. Just annoyed and frustrated — all the boys are. We have a massive game coming up, we need to pick ourselves up quick, and have another chance at picking up these three points."

REVOLUTION TRAINING CENTER SET TO OPEN IN 2019

On Oct. 15, 2018, the New England Revolution broke ground on the Revolution Training Center, a world-class facility that will be the center of the Revolution first team and Academy operations. Integrated into the wetlands surrounding Gillette Stadium, the Revolution Training Center will feature state-of-the-art fitness and medical centers, six professional-grade fields, team dining and lounge spaces, and office space for the club's technical staff and front office, among other amenities.



The privately-financed, \$35-million project will give the New England Revolution one of the most advanced and expansive team facilities in Major League Soccer. The center will span 68 acres with 42,000 square feet of buildings and three new full-size fields – two natural grass surfaces and one turf pitch. With the club's existing training field, Gillette Stadium, and the Empower Field House, upon completion the club will boast a total of six professional-grade fields. The existing natural grass field on the site will be dedicated for use by the Revolution Academy.



Construction began with the groundbreaking ceremony on Monday, Oct. 15, and completion is scheduled for the summer of 2019. The two natural grass surfaces, both dedicated for first team use, are expected to open in the spring.

TICKETS ON SALE FOR 'FINAL WHISTLE ON HATE' MATCH

The Revolution and Chelsea FC will play a charity match, the "Final Whistle on Hate", at Gillette Stadium on Wednesday, May 15. Kicking off at 8:00 p.m. ET, the match will be played against a backdrop of ongoing anti-Semitism and discrimination around the world with all proceeds from the match dedicated to initiatives to combat antisemitism and hate crimes. The initial idea for the match was developed by club owners Roman Abramovich and the Kraft family in light of a global rise in antisemitic activity.



The match's primary beneficiaries will include the World Jewish Congress, the Tree of Life synagogue, the Anti-Defamation League, and the Holocaust Educational Trust. Representatives from these and other anti-discrimination organizations will be invited to attend the game, while Abramovich and the Kraft family will also each donate \$1 million in support of the cause.

On Thursday, May 2, delegations from the Revolution and Chelsea joined the "March of the Living" in Poland, held annually in remembrance of the Holocaust. Last year, Chelsea FC was the first Premier League club to ever send a delegation to the March of the Living, and the Revolution's participation this year represented the first appearance by a U.S. team. Participating from Chelsea were Director Eugene Tenenbaum, CEO Guy Laurence, former manager Avram Grant, and club ambassador Steve Redgrave. Participants from the Revolution included President Brian Bilello and Club Ambassador Charlie Davies.

GILLETTE STADIUM TO HOST AC MILAN - BENFICA ON JULY 28

Italian powerhouse AC Milan will take on Portuguese giants Benfica at Gillette Stadium on Sunday, July 28 as part of the International Champions Cup. The match marks the second year the tournament visits Gillette Stadium including a contest between AS Roma and Juventus in 2017.

The tournament format is consistent with last year's ICC. Each team will play three matches, and the club with the most points at the end of the tournament will win the championship and receive the first trophy of the season. The tournament will host U.S.-based matches in iconic locations in Boston/Foxborough, New York/New Jersey, Los Angeles, Washington D.C., Chicago, Charlotte, Santa Clara, Houston, Arlington, and Kansas City. Cardiff, London, Stockholm, Singapore, and Shanghai will serve as hosts for the Europe and Asia matches.

TEAM NOTES

CARLES, THE CREATOR: GIL AMONG MLS LEADERS IN KEY PASSES

Midfielder **Carles Gil** (pronounced CAR-LESS HEEL) has emerged as one of Major League Soccer's most prolific creators through the season's early stages. The Spaniard has scored three goals and collected two assists -- including a game-winning helper on April 20 vs. New York.

Gil registered his first career brace in New England's match on March 17 at Toronto, converting a penalty kick in the ninth minute before scoring with his left foot in the second half. The Valencia native also tallied in his MLS debut at FC Dallas on March 2, delivering the game-tying goal in the 57th minute. His three away goals are tied for fifth most in MLS.

Gil's impact extends well beyond the scoresheet. His vision and work rate have paid immediate dividends for the Revs, especially in the final third, where he has won possession a league-best 26 times and completed more most passes than any other MLS player:

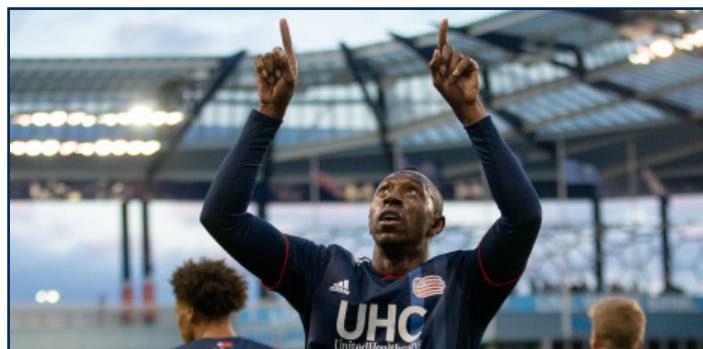

CAICE-DOS: JUAN FERNANDO ON TWO-GAME SCORING STREAK

Forward **Juan Fernando Caicedo** opened his MLS account in a big way on April 27 at Kansas City, tallying twice in the first 35 minutes of the match to put New England on the front foot in a difficult away test. Caicedo followed up his breakthrough performance by scoring for a second consecutive match on May 4 at Philadelphia, giving the newcomer three goals across nine appearances in his debut MLS season.

The forward scored his first career MLS goal in the 18th minute against Kansas City, when he corralled a cross from **Juan Agudelo** and finished with his right foot. Just 17 minutes later, he completed his first-half brace by tapping home a perfectly-weighted cross from **Tajon Buchanan**, marking the rookie's first career assist. His third goal at Philadelphia came from a deft finish with the outside of his right boot after a through ball from **Edgar Castillo**.



A proven goal scorer across nine seasons in the top flights of Colombia and Argentina, Caicedo signed on loan with New England in December. The Carepa, Colombia native potted 89 goals in nearly 300 appearances across all competitions in South America, including Copa Libertadores and Copa Sudamericana.

REVS ROOKIES JONES, BUCHANAN LEADING '19 DRAFT CLASS

New England is seeing early returns on its 2019 MLS SuperDraft selections, as **Tajon Buchanan** (ninth overall) and **DeJuan Jones** (11th overall) have factored into the team's rotation on a regular basis.

For the season, Buchanan has logged 204 minutes played across five appearances, while Jones has registered 373 minutes played across six appearances, including five starts. The rookies' involvement has them ranked among this year's top three most active MLS rookies:

On April 27 at Kansas City, both rookies slotted into the starting lineup and played instrumental roles in helping the Revolution to a 4-4 draw. Buchanan registered his first career assist on Juan Fernando Caicedo's goal in the 35th minute -- and played the cross in for Juan Agudelo's 42nd-minute tally -- before Jones opened his professional account with a goal in the 66th minute. Both players earned second consecutive starts on May 4 at Philadelphia.

The Revolution saw similar results in 2018, when the club selected **Brandon Bye** with the eighth-overall pick. Bye ended the season with the third most appearances and minutes played among last year's draft class, and has established himself as a regular contributor for the club.

TEAM NOTES

CREAM OF THE CROPPER: CODY EARNS STARTING RUN IN NET

Goalkeeper **Cody Cropper** got the nod in net for the Revolution on March 30 vs. Minnesota United FC, marking his first appearance across all competitions since Sept. 27, 2017. Cropper responded with two saves, including a fingertip stop on a point-blank header from Minnesota's Francisco Calvo, in the 2-1 win.

Including that March 30 victory, Cropper has started each of New England's last seven matches, accruing a 2-4-1 record with 29 saves on the season. On May 4 at Philadelphia, Cropper set a single-game career high with nine saves. He had previously set a new single-game career high with six stops on April 24 vs. Montreal.

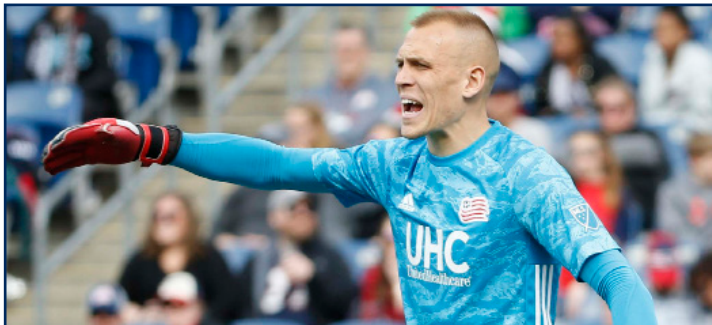

During his run of starts, Cropper has also ascended in the Revolution's record book. On April 24, he made his 35th start with the club, surpassing Juergen Sommer for seventh most appearances and starts by a goalkeeper. By registering his 10th shutout with New England on April 20, he also tied Adin Brown for the third most shutouts in Revs history.

WRIGHT RETURNS FROM BIRMINGHAM LEGION FC LOAN

The New England Revolution recalled forward **Brian Wright** from his open-ended loan with Birmingham Legion FC of the USL Championship on Tuesday, April 16.

On April 24, Wright made his first MLS appearance of the season, logging eight minutes as a substitute vs. Montreal. He logged another substitute appearance on April 27 at Kansas City, where he played two minutes in the 4-4 draw.

During his stint in Birmingham under former Revolution assistant coach and current Legion Head Coach Tom Soehn, Wright played three games and started two. He contributed the game-winning goal and one assist against Louisville on March 31 to earn a spot on the USL Championship Team of the Week.

CALDWELL INKED TO MULTI-YEAR EXTENSION

On March 28, the Revolution signed midfielder **Scott Caldwell** to a multi-year contract extension. The Braintree, Mass. native and second Homegrown Player signing in club history will remain with the club beyond what is currently his seventh Major League Soccer campaign, all with New England.

Caldwell, 28, has been an integral member of the Revolution first team since the 2013 season, totaling 189 regular season appearances and 156 starts across seven seasons, with more than 13,800 minutes played. All three of those totals rank Caldwell among the top-five in MLS history for service by a Homegrown Player, as he became the second Homegrown signing ever to reach the 10,000-minute milestone in 2017. The University of Akron graduate has recorded five goals and 18 assists in league play, with an additional eight games played and two assists in the postseason.



A mainstay in the club's lineup since playing in 29 games as a rookie in 2013, Caldwell's consistency has led him to at least 24 appearances in each of his seven professional campaigns, including a career-high 34 games played and 32 starts in 2015. For his efforts that year, which included two goals and five assists, Caldwell earned 2015 Team MVP honors from fans and the Players' Player of the Year award from teammates.

BYE, BYE, BYE: BRANDON SHOWCASES VERSATILITY FOR REVS

With eight starts at three different positions through the season's first 11 games, second-year standout **Brandon Bye** has proven to be a valuable and versatile asset for Brad Friedel. Among the Revolution's season-high six lineup changes on March 30 vs. Minnesota United FC was a relocation for Bye, who after previously featuring primarily along the back line in his MLS career, logged his first professional start in right midfield in a 4-4-2 formation.

That change saw immediate results, as Bye responded with his first professional game-winning goal in the 62nd minute, when he finished off a ball from **Teal Bunbury** at the back post. On the day, he registered a team-high two shots on target, two chances created, and eight possessions won in a 90-minute shift.

He continued showcasing his versatility against Columbus Crew SC on April 6 and April 13 vs. Atlanta, when he slotted in at left back and played 90 minutes in each contest in Edgar Castillo's absence. Bye again shifted over to right back on April 27 at Sporting Kansas City.

THREE ACADEMY TEAMS JOIN FIRST TEAM IN PHILADELPHIA

The New England Revolution Academy continued its spring season last weekend, as the U-15s, U-17s, and U-19s all traveled to Pennsylvania to take on the Academy teams of the Philadelphia Union. Meanwhile, the U-13s and U-14s traveled to Medway, Mass. to face Oakwood SC.

On Saturday, May 4, the U-19s played the Union to a 1-1 draw in Chester, Pa. Victor Viana (South Dennis, Mass.--2001) scored the Revs' lone goal in the draw. Meanwhile, the U-14s defeated Oakwood SC in a 6-2 rout in Medway, Mass. on Saturday. Midfielder Tyler Duarte (Brockton, Mass.--2005) recorded a brace in the win. Forward Benaiah Hanson (Loudon, N.H.--2006) also scored a goal in the U-13s' 1-1 draw against Oakwood.



Four teams will return to action next weekend when the U-13s, U-14s, U-15s, and U-17s all travel to Maspeth, N.Y. to take on the Academy teams of Met Oval.

The New England Revolution and Special Olympics Massachusetts are once again teaming up to leverage the power of sports to promote an environment of inclusion and friendly competition. For the fifth year, the Revolution will field a Special Olympics Unified soccer team, comprised of more than a dozen local athletes and volunteers with and without intellectual disabilities.

The 13 members of the Revs' Unified team joined the club at Gillette Stadium on Monday, May 6 to sign their official contracts and receive their uniforms. This year's activities kicked off on March 31 with the Special Olympics Unified Clinic at the Empower Field House in Foxborough. Later this year, the Unified squad will follow Revolution matches with their own on July 12 at D.C. United and vs. New York City FC on Sept. 29.

The partnership culminates in the New England Revolution Charitable Foundation's premiere annual event, Bowl for a Goal presented by Arbella Insurance, on Aug. 21. The event at Splitsville Luxury Lanes in Patriot Place begins at 6:00 p.m. ET, with general admission tickets on sale for \$35. BRAD FRIEDEL HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017 and posted a 10-13-11 record in first season.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- One of most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- A decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in 13-year senior career.
- First-ballot inductee to the National Soccer Hall of Fame as part of the 2018 class and member of inaugural Blackburn Rovers Hall of Fame class in 2019.

Brad Friedel is in his second season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated playing career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

In his first season with the Revolution, Friedel worked with General Manager Michael Burns to overhaul the roster with 12 new players for the 2018 campaign and led the club to a 10-13-11 record. Friedel's approach paid dividends for a number of Revolution players, including Ecuadorian forward Cristian Penilla, the 2018 JetBlue Team MVP and club Golden Boot winner, and midfielder Diego Fagundez, who tallied nine goals and a career-high 10 assists after Friedel positioned him in a central attacking midfield role.

Friedel, 47, joined the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player, assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career, which earned him a first-ballot selection to the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2018. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's pre-eminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history. As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is currently in his second season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international is now in his 11th MLS season as a coach and his 17th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 14 years of coaching experience to the staff in New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporters' Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



MARCELO NEVELEFF ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is currently in his second season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Inter-regional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

KEVIN HITCHCOCK ASSISTANT COACH

Kevin Hitchcock enters his first season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in April 2019. Hitchcock arrives in New England with nearly two decades of professional coaching experience in the top flights of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England.

Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA 'A' Goalkeeper License and UEFA 'B' License, has spent the last 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach with several top-flight clubs. His experience includes stints with Watford FC (2001-04), Blackburn Rovers FC (2004-08), Manchester City FC (2008-10), Fulham FC (2011), Queens Park Rangers (2012-15), Al Arabi Sports Club (2015-16), and Birmingham City FC (2016-18). Most recently, Hitchcock spent one year as the goalkeepers coach for Indian Super League side Chennaiyin FC.

During his time with Blackburn Rovers FC, Hitchcock served as Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel's goalkeeper coach. In addition to his work with Friedel, Hitchcock has coached and developed a number of elite professional goalkeepers, including Joe Hart, Kasper Schmeichel, Shay Given, Robert Green, Júlio César, and Mark Schwarzer, among others.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Hitchcock registered nearly 300 appearances across an 18-year playing career in England, highlighted by two FA Cups, one League Cup, one Cup Winners Cup, and one Super Cup with Chelsea FC. In total, he recorded 96 appearances for The Blues from 1988-2001, also completing loan assignments to West Ham United FC (1993) and Northampton Town FC (1990) during his time with the club. Prior to joining Chelsea, Hitchcock began his professional career with Mansfield Town FC, where he made 168 appearances from 1984-88. At the youth level, he played with both Nottingham Forest FC and Barking F.C.

Gabriel Martinez Poch is in his first season as Head Fitness Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the technical staff in January 2019. Poch brings extensive experience with top-flight clubs in South America to the Revolution, most recently with Mineros de Guayana of the Venezuelan First Division.

Poch, 53, has worked for two decades as a sports science specialist with several top clubs around the world, including stints at multiple top-division outfits in South America. A native of La Plata, Argentina, he has worked extensively for clubs in South America, Europe, and Asia. Most recently, he helped guide Argentine side Aldosivi de Mar del Plata to promotion into the Argentina SuperLiga as a methodology and technical assistant in 2018. Poch earned his UEFA Level 3 'B' License in Barcelona in 2015.

In addition to his time with Aldosivi, Poch's prior experience is highlighted by stints with 18 different clubs in Argentina, Bolivia, Ecuador, Venezuela, Spain, Romania, the United States, Kuwait, and Qatar. Poch has helped clubs to a number of major accomplishments, including a Bolivian Primera División title with Wilstermann in 2006, and an Ecuadorian Serie A championship with Deportivo Quito in 2009. He also helped guide several clubs to promotion in their respective leagues.



MICHAEL BURNS GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is currently in his 15th season with the New England Revolution and his eighth season as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel. The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before being named Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management. He has also been instrumental in the development of the new Revolution Training Center in Foxborough, set to open in 2019 as the home of the Revolution first team and Academy. The \$35-million project places the Revolution's facilities among the best in all of Major League Soccer and includes a state-of-the-art headquarters and four new professional-grade fields.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

Burns was the first player in U.S. Soccer history to represent the United States at every level of FIFA-sanctioned tournaments: Under-16 World Cup (Canada 1987), Under-20 World Cup (Saudi Arabia 1989), Olympic Games (Barcelona 1992), and World Cup (United States 1994, France 1998).

The Massachusetts native was allocated to the Revolution in 1995 at the inception of MLS and played for – and captained – New England from 1996 to 2000, before finishing his playing career with the San Jose Earthquakes (2000) and the Kansas City Wizards (2001-02). Overall, he made 169 appearances, scored three goals, and totaled 21 assists. Burns also played for Viborg in the Super League in Denmark in 1995 before joining MLS.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns represents New England at the league level as the club's Chief Soccer Officer, and serves on the MLS Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his 10th season with the New England Revolution and his second as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Saltys (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07).

Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

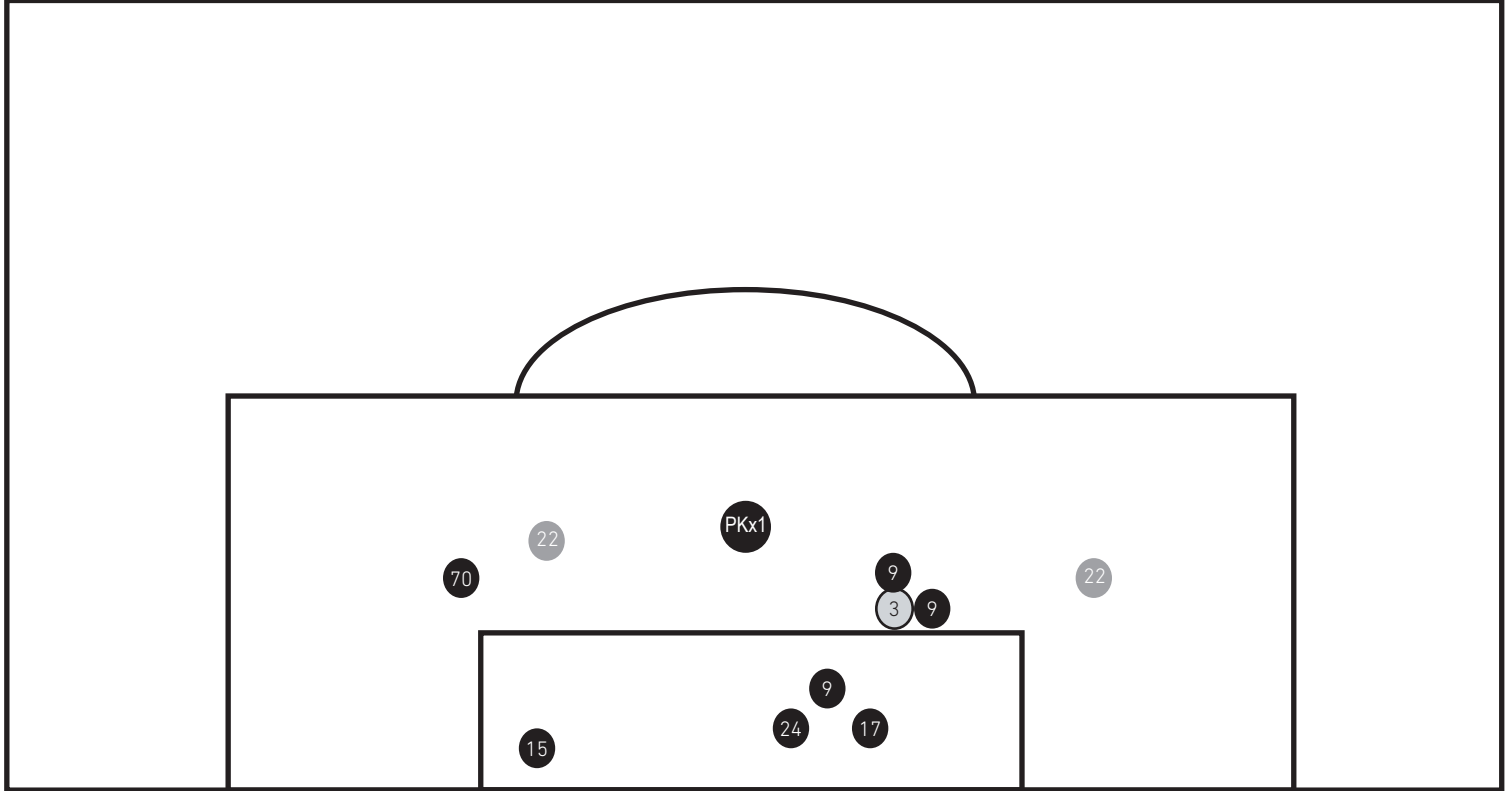
