New England Revolution Sporting Director & Head Coach Bruce Arena

On last weekend's 3-3 draw at Orlando:

Arena: "We made some mistakes defensively. We could've been a little bit better in the attack and maybe finish off another chance or two. But over 90 minutes, we had some real good moments, and we also had some mental lapses that cost us dearly in the second half."

New England Revolution Forward Teal Bunbury

On what it will take for the team to qualify for the playoffs:

Bunbury: "I think it's going to come down to our work ethic in training. I think it's a lot about communication. I think a lot of guys who've been in the league for a while need to start stepping it up a bit in terms of just getting guys ready for this last stretch here. It's tough. Everybody's tired in the league. It's not just us. So we have to be mentally stronger than most teams."

New England Revolution Goalkeeper Matt Turner

On matching up with Real Salt Lake:

Turner: "They're very stout defensively. Nick Rimando's been playing really well lately, and then they've got five guys up top that are pretty dangerous attacking-wise, Albert Rusnák being one of them. He can shoot the ball from anywhere. I know they've gotten some good road results this year, so they'll come in and they'll be ready to play, especially trying to right their ship after a loss. But we know this game is important to them, important to us, so it's going to have a playoff vibe to it."

- The Revolution continuing its run of form in the push to the playoffs, having earned points in 16 of 18 matches since May 11 (8-2-8).
- New England defeating RSL at home for a third straight meeting, having won each of the last two home meetings by a 4-0 scoreline.
- **F Gustavo Bou** continuing his torrid scoring pace with seven goals through his first 10 matches, with one assist.
- **Bou** (7) passing New York City's Heber (7) for the third-most goals from the run of play since he debuted on July 17.
- **Bou** (0.70) remaining among the league's top-five players in goals per 90 minutes (min. 4 goals).
- **M Carles Gil** continuing to lead all MLS newcomers with 23 combined goals and assists (9G + 14A).

GIL TURN: CARLES MAKES NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR CASE

Carles Gil (pronounced CAR-LESS HEEL) has established himself as a leading candidate for Major League Soccer's 2019 Newcomer of the Year Award through his first 30 MLS starts. The Spaniard has collected nine goals and 14 assists, both team highs. His combined total of 23 goals and assists is most among all MLS newcomers in 2019, as are his 14 assists and 91 chances created. In addition, his 12 primary assists are tied for the most among all MLS players.

Gil is in the midst of a blistering run of form, having registered a goal or assist in 11 of the team's last 15 league games, including both a goal and an assist in four of his last nine outings. He is fresh off a three-game stretch between July 17 and July 27 where he registered a goal and an assist in three consecutive games, making him one of only nine players in league history to do so.

With one more goal, Gil can join Carles Vela and Alejandro Pozuelo as the only players in MLS with 10 goals and 10 assists in 2019. He would also be the second Revolution player ever to post a 10-and-10 season, joining Lee Nguyen (11G/15A in 2017). His 21 combined goals and primary assists are fourth most in MLS, and lead all of Major League Soccer's 2019 newcomers:

With 14 assists -- already tied for fourth most by a Revolution player in a single regular season -- Gil is on track to post one of the most productive campaigns in club history. By reaching the 15-assist mark, he would surpass Steve Ralston's 2007 campaign (14 assists), and match Lee Nguyen (2017) and Joe-Max Moore (1998) for the second-most assists in a season by a Revs player. Ralston holds the club mark with 19 assists in 2002.

TEAM NOTES

HEAD TURNER: MATT INKS EXTENSION WITH NEW ENGLAND

On Aug. 21, the Revolution signed goalkeeper **Matt Turner** to a new multi-year contract, ensuring the goalkeeper will remain in New England beyond what is currently his fourth season in 2019. After starting the season as the club's third-string goalkeeper, Turner re-claimed his starting role in May and has rocketed up several of the league's goalkeeping charts.

Turner, 25, has registered a 15-13-15 record with 154 saves and eight shutouts since signing with the Revolution as an undrafted college player in March 2016. In 2019, he owns a 7-3-6 record with 71 saves and three shutouts. His saves percentage and winning percentage rank in the top 10 among all qualifying MLS goalkeepers on the season.

Turner has played a pivotal role in New England's turnaround this season. He has started 16 of the team's last 18 matches after retaking the starting goalkeeping role on May 8, missing only two games for a suspension issued following the May 25 draw vs. D.C. United. During the Revolution's 11-game unbeaten run from May 11 through July 27, Turner submitted a 6-0-2 record with 30 saves and three shutouts.

On Aug. 17 at New York, he set a single-game career high with nine saves in the 1-1 draw -- eclipsing his previous best of seven that he reached in back-to-back games on July 21 at Cincinnati and July 27 vs. Orlando. He then matched his nine-save effort on Sept. 7 at New York City. Since retaking the starting goalkeeper role on May 8, Turner ranks among the league's best shot stoppers:

BOU KNOWS GOALS: 'LA PANTERA' ON THE PROWL IN MLS

Forward **Gustavo Bou** has wasted no time showcasing his goal-scoring prowess in MLS. La Pantera has seven goals and one assist through his first 10 games with New England, appearing on the scoresheet in all but two matches.

Bou opened his account with a stunning volley in his MLS debut on July 17 vs. Vancouver, when he combined with fellow newcomer Carles Gil for the game winner. He followed up his memorable debut with the game-winning assist on July 21 at Cincinnati, before scoring his second MLS goal -- and the Revolution's quickest of the season just three minutes after kickoff -- on July 27 vs. Orlando. In the month of August, Bou has exhibited a knack for coming through in the clutch, having netted the game-tying goal on Aug. 17 at New York, the game-winning goal on Aug. 24 vs. Chicago, and the game-tying goal on Aug. 31 vs. Toronto.

Since debuting on July 17, Bou has quickly asserted himself as one of the league's most efficient goal scorers. His seven goals from the run of play are tied for third most league-wide, while his goals scored per 90 minutes and goals per game clips are also among the MLS leaders across the entire season. Since his debut, he also ranks among MLS's top five in total shots and shots on target.

New England acquired Bou (*pronounced BOH; like bow and arrow*) via transfer from Liga MX side Club Tijuana on July 10. He remains the first and only added to the roster under Sporting Director Bruce Arena and Technical Director Curt Onalfo.

The 29-year-old Argentine brings 12 years of experience across Argentina, Mexico, and Ecuador, where he recorded 120 combined goals and assists with top-flight clubs including River Plate and Racing Club. The Concordia, Argentina native spent the last two years with Liga MX side Tijuana, where he recorded 21 goals and 14 assists in 55 appearances after transferring from Racing Club in July 2017.

LONGEST AWAY UNBEATEN RUN IN CLUB HISTORY SNAPPED

The Revolution have turned around the club's road form this season, setting a new club record for longest away unbeaten streak at seven games from May 18 through the club's 1-1 draw on Aug. 17 at New York. New England's seven-game undefeated run on the road eclipsed the club's previous record from 2008. The Revs' historic run on the road was snapped with the 2-1 loss on Sept. 7 at New York City FC:

On the year, New England's 24 goals away from home are tied for third most in the league. Only two clubs have fewer away losses than New England's five -- LAFC (3) and New York City FC (4). The Revolution's 16 away points this season marks the club's most since 2015 with two road trips still remaining on the docket. With two more away wins, the 2019 Revs could come within one point of matching the club's all-time record for away points in a season of 23 (2005 and 2013).

11-GAME UNBEATEN RUN SPARKS HISTORIC TURNAROUND

After a 2-8-2 start to the season, the Revolution reversed course with an 11-game unbeaten run from May 11 through July 27. Since that streak began, New England has earned points in 16 of its last 18 games, with its only two losses coming against the current leaders of their respective conferences: Aug. 3 vs. LAFC, and Sept. 7 at NYCFC. After opening the season with a minus-19 goal differential, the Revs rebounded with a 7-0-4 record and +14 goal differential during the unbeaten run to firmly supplant the club in the Eastern Conference playoff picture with four games remaining.

The Revolution's 11-match unbeaten run spanned 84 days and matched the best single-season stretch in club history (2005). In 2019, only New York City FC has registered a longer undefeated run than New England, having gone unbeaten across 12 games between April 6 and July 3.

FARRELL REACHES 200 STARTS, CLIMBS RECORD BOOKS

Defender **Andrew Farrell** has been one of Major League Soccer's most reliable and durable players since he joined the Revolution as the first-overall pick in the 2013 MLS SuperDraft. The 2016 MLS All-Star recently eclipsed 200 appearances and starts with the Revs. The 27-year old already ranks fifth in club history in games started and minutes played.

For his regular season career, Farrell owns 215 games played, 213 starts, two goals, and eight assists across 18,971 minutes played. Those totals have the Louisville, Ky. native ranking first among all MLS field players in games started and minutes since 2013, trailing only New York Red Bulls goalkeeper Luis Robles.

After missing the first few games of the year with an eye injury, Farrell made 21 consecutive starts at either right back or center back, and played 90 minutes in each of those appearances, before serving a one-game suspension for yellow card accumulation on Aug. 17. He has started 25 league games to date with four remaining in the season, marking the first time he'll make less than 30 appearances in his seven-year career.

FAGUNDEZ NEARS EXCLUSIVE 50 GOAL-50 ASSIST CLUB

Revolution Academy product and nine-year MLS veteran **Diego Fagundez** vaulted past Lee Nguyen for second-most goals scored in Revolution history on July 27 vs. Orlando, scoring the 52nd goal of his MLS regular season career. He now trails only Taylor Twellman (101) for the all-time club scoring mark.

Four minutes after scoring on July 17 vs. Vancouver, the 24-year old registered his 44th career assist -- before picking up his 45th on Aug. 31 vs. Toronto -- edging him closer to becoming the first player in club history to reach both 50 goals and 50 assists. His 45 assists are the third most in the Revs record books, trailing only Lee Nguyen's 49 and Steve Ralston's 73.

By eclipsing the 50-assist mark and joining Major League Soccer's 50-50 club, Fagundez would become the 21st player in league history and only the fourth active player to reach the milestone:

FIVE REVS ON LOAN IN THE USL CHAMPIONSHIP

Five Revolution players are currently on loan in the USL Championship, including Homegrown Players **Justin Rennicks** (North Carolina FC), **Isaac Angking** (Charlotte Independence), and **Zachary Herivaux** (Birmingham Legion FC), as well as **Cody Cropper** (Hartford Athletic) and **Brian Wright** (Birmingham Legion).

Cropper is the most recent addition to the Revolution's list of loaned players. The goalkeeper debuted with USL Championship expansion side Hartford Athletic during a friendly against the Puerto Rico National Team on Aug. 17. Through three league starts, he has posted a 2-2-0 record with 21 saves. Cropper will join Hartford for matches, but will continue to train with the Revolution during the week.

Rennicks joined NCFC on Aug. 1, two days after he played 45 minutes in the 2019 MLS Homegrown Game presented by Energizer®. Rennicks was one of 22 players comprising the side, which featured Major League Soccer's most outstanding Academy products including a number of U.S. and Canada Youth National Team standouts. He has played 279 minutes across eight appearances with one assist. Rennicks is playing under former USMNT interim head coach and Bruce Arena assistant Dave Sarachan with NCFC.

Angking joined Charlotte Independence on Aug. 2, and has played 221 minutes across four appearances, including three starts, with one assist. The Providence, R.I. native owns three career MLS appearances since signing with the first team ahead of the 2018 campaign.

With Birmingham, **Wright** has excelled across his 21 appearances and 18 starts, totaling four goals and four assists. The third-year pro has earned two USL Team of the Week selections this season. Meanwhile, **Herivaux** has made 16 appearances to date, logging 1,273 minutes played primarily in the midfield, but also along the backline.

CHRIS TIERNEY JOINS GROWING SCOUTING OPERATION

The Revolution have further expanded the club's technical staff and scouting operation by adding **Chris Tierney** in the new role of Player Recruitment Manager. A native of Wellesley, Mass., Tierney, who played his entire career with the Revolution from 2008-18 and ranks among the club's all-time leaders in several statistical categories, will serve in a scouting role under the direction of Sporting Director Bruce Arena and Technical Director Curt Onalfo.

"It is always a great moment for our club anytime there is an opportunity to bring one of our former players back in a new role," said Revolution President Brian Bilello. "Chris was a great player, teammate and ambassador for the Revolution on and off the field during his time as a player and we're thrilled to have him join the front office."



Tierney, 33, announced his retirement in Nov. 2018 after 11 professional seasons, all with the Revolution. Long regarded as one of Major League Soccer's best left backs, he finished his career ranked among the club's all-time leaders in games played (3rd; 246), games started (4th; 220), and assists (T-4th; 40). He helped New England to a 2008 North American SuperLiga title as well as appearances in the 2014 MLS Cup and 2016 U.S. Open Cup finals. Among his career accolades are an MLS All-Star Team selection in 2015, Revolution Defender of the Year honors in 2016, and Midnight Riders Man of the Year recognition in 2016.

A native of Wellesley, Mass., Tierney played collegiately from 2004-07 at the University of Virginia, where he was coached by current Revolution Assistant Coach Richie Williams when Williams was an assistant with the Cavaliers (2005-06). Tierney joins several other notable figures in UVA's soccer history in New England's front office, as Sporting Director & Head Coach Bruce Arena served as head coach from 1978-95, winning five

TEAM NOTES

BRUCE ARENA NAMED SPORTING DIRECTOR & HEAD COACH

The New England Revolution appointed Bruce Arena as the club's sporting director and head coach on May 14. Arena, the winningest coach in United States Men's National Team history and a five-time MLS Cup champion, brings more than four decades of coaching experience at the international and domestic levels to the Revolution. After immediately assuming his duties as sporting director, Arena made his debut on the Revolution sidelines on June 2 against his former club, the LA Galaxy, a 2-1 win.

"Bruce is one of the most successful coaches in American soccer history, and we feel his commitment to excellence, track record of winning championships in Major League Soccer, as well as his success at the international level, makes him the best person to bring the Revolution back to MLS Cup contention," Revolution Investor/Operator Robert Kraft said. "We have known Bruce dating back to the advent of MLS, and we have full confidence that he will raise the level of our club to the standard we all expect and demand."



The New York native joined the Revolution following one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history. Arena's resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, three MLS Supporters' Shields, seven MLS conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. In his previous 14 seasons as an MLS coach, Arena earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, first in 1997 with D.C. United before being honored in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy. At the collegiate level with the University of Virginia (1978-95), he also tallied five NCAA College Cup wins with six ACC Men's Soccer championships.

Arena, who served as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, holds the record for most wins by a USMNT head coach with 81. He led the United States to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup – the country's best showing since 1930 – as well as an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also coached the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, having captured the continental trophy in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

"It was evident when talking with Bruce that we share a vision for the future of the Revolution and we look forward to having him oversee our soccer organization," Revolution President Brian Bilello said. "We believe that now is the time for a change in leadership and there is no one better suited to usher in a new era of success in New England."

Arena, 67, became the winningest active coach in MLS history upon his return to the sideline. Prior to New England, he accrued a 202-121-89 record across 14 seasons with D.C. United (1996-98), New York Red Bulls (2006-07), and LA Galaxy (2008-16). His five MLS Cup wins with D.C. United (1996, 1997) and LA Galaxy (2011, 2012, 2014) are the most by a head coach in league history, while his three Supporters Shields are tied with Sigi Schmid for the most all-time.

ARENA NEARS 700-POINT MILESTONE AND WINS RECORD

Bruce Arena can become only the second head coach in Major League Soccer history to reach 700 career regular season points with a win at New York City FC on Saturday afternoon. Arena holds 698 career points (209-123-95), which is second only to Sigi Schmid's 843 regular season points. In addition, Arena's 209 career regular season wins are second only to Schmid's 240.

While Arena has work ahead of him in order to catch Sigi Schmid on the all-time wins list, his five MLS Cup victories are unlikely to be rivaled any time soon, as no other active coach has more than one trophy under their belt. The only other active MLS coaches with MLS Cup wins are Bob Bradley (1998), Caleb Porter (2015), Brian Schmetzer (2016), and Greg Vanney (2017).

- Players will display a gold ribbon patch on their jersey and sport gold wristbands.

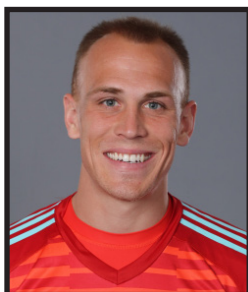
MATT TURNER CARRIES ON "NEGU CREW" TRADITION

BRUCE ARENA

SPORTING DIRECTOR & HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's sporting director and the club's eighth head coach on May 14, 2019.
- Holds a record five MLS Cup titles (1996, 1997, 2011, 2012, 2014) and has amassed three MLS Supporters' Shields (1996, 2010, 2011), tied for the most all time.
- Currently the winningest active head coach in MLS and one of two coaches to reach 200 regular season MLS wins and 675 career points, holding a 209-123-95 record (698 pts.) in MLS.
- Managed the U.S. Men's National Team during two separate stints (1998-2006, 2016-17), appearing in both the 2002 and 2006 World Cups, and winning three Gold Cup titles.
- Built a dynasty over 18 seasons as head coach at the University of Virginia, winning five NCAA Division-1 National Championships and six ACC titles.
- Coached the New York Red Bulls from 2006-07, before serving as the LA Galaxy head coach from 2008-16, where he won three MLS Cups in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Bruce Arena is currently in his first season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and joins the Revolution following a Hall of Fame coaching career that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joins the Revolution following one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, three Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. In his previous 14 seasons as an MLS coach, Arena earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, first in 1997 with D.C. United before being honored in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy. He returned to the sidelines as the winningest active head coach in MLS history with a record of 202-121-89, and is one of two coaches to have surpassed 200 career regular season wins, along with Sigi Schmid.

On the international stage, Arena, 67, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup – the country's best showing since 1930 – as well an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Following the 1998 FIFA Men's World Cup in France, the United States Soccer Federation turned to Arena, who helped the team qualify for the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup. In the tournament, Arena's team recorded an impressive win over powerhouse Portugal and topped Mexico, 2-0, in the Round of 16 en route to the nation's first appearance in the Quarterfinals in a 72-year span. That same year, Arena led the USMNT to the Concacaf Gold Cup title, one of his three triumphs in the competition.

In 2005, Arena won his second Concacaf Gold Cup ahead of the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup in Germany. In the 2006 tournament, the United States earned a 1-1 draw against Italy, but a 2-1 defeat to Ghana sent the USMNT home early.

The next season, Arena took charge of the New York Red Bulls, where he spent the end of the 2006 season and all of the 2007 campaign. In 2008, Arena joined the LA Galaxy for what would be an incredible nine-year tenure that included three MLS Cups in a four-year span and two Supporters' Shields in 2010 and 2011.

Following his decorated career with the Galaxy, Arena rejoined the U.S. Men's National Team in November 2016. In his second run as head coach, he lost only two out of 18 games at the helm, though the United States fell short of qualification for the 2018 FIFA Men's World Cup.

A 2010 National Soccer Hall of Fame inductee, Arena was named the 2015 Werner Fricker Builder Award recipient, earning U.S. Soccer's highest honor for his more than 40 years of service to the game.

A talented lacrosse player, Arena grew up on Long Island and would go on to attend Nassau Community College, where he played both lacrosse and soccer. Arena then transferred to Cornell University in 1971, where as a goalkeeper, he led his team to the 1972 NCAA College Cup Final Four and earned the tournament's Most Valuable Defensive Player award. During the 1973 season, Arena contributed as an assistant coach with Cornell, before then accepting a head coaching position at the University of Puget Sound.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16, before joining the staff of Los Angeles FC in 2018, where he currently serves as an assistant coach.

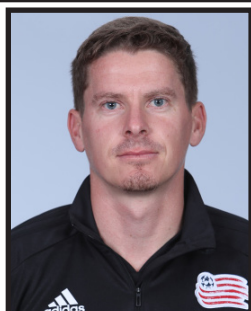
**RICHIE WILLIAMS****ASSISTANT COACH**

Richie Williams is in his first season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution when he officially joins Bruce Arena's staff in June. Williams brings 15 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, USL Championship, and the United States Men's National Team to New England. He most recently served as the first ever head coach of USL Championship side Loudoun United FC.

A native of Middletown Township, New Jersey, Williams has previously served as either an assistant coach or head coach for seven different teams over the course of his coaching career. Prior to managing Loudoun United in 2019, he served as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team from 2017-18. In addition, he has served as an assistant for Real Salt Lake in 2016, the U.S. U-17 MNT from 2012-15, the U.S. U-18 MNT from 2011-12, the New York Red Bulls from 2006-11 -- where he also completed two stints as interim head coach in 2006 and 2009 -- and the University of Virginia from 2005-06.

Williams enjoyed a successful playing career prior to entering the coaching ranks. He played under Bruce Arena at multiple stops during his career, including at the University of Virginia from 1988-91, D.C. United from 1996-98, and the United States Men's National Team from 1998-2002. Together, Arena and Williams won an NCAA Championship at the University of Virginia in 1991, before helping D.C. United to three consecutive MLS Cup appearances, including championships in 1996 and 1997.

The former midfielder also earned 20 international caps with the USMNT under Arena, highlighted by a CONCACAF Gold Cup title in 2002. He also spent time with the Richmond Kickers in 1993 and 2004-05, Scottish side Ayr United FC from 1993-94, and the New York/New Jersey MetroStars in 2001 and 2003.

**JARRYD PHILLIPS**
DIRECTOR OF SPORTS PERFORMANCE

Jarryd Phillips is currently in his first season as Director of Sports Performance for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. He brings six years of experience as a sports science and performance coach to the Revolution, including time in MLS, USL, NASL, and the NCAA.

Phillips arrives in New England after spending nearly three years as Director of Performance & Sports Science for Minnesota United FC. He established and directed all facets of the performance department for Minnesota's first team and academy beginning in July 2016, as the club prepared to ascend from the NASL to MLS in 2017. In his role with the Loons, he oversaw all nutritional aspects of the squad, administered strength and fitness programs, and participated in daily training sessions.

Prior to joining Minnesota, Phillips spent nearly two seasons as a performance coach with Seattle Sounders FC from January 2015 through July 2016. Before entering the professional coaching ranks, he worked as an assistant coach at the University of Mary in North Dakota from 2013-14. Phillips began his coaching career with the Premier Development League's Thunder Bay Chill in 2012.

Phillips earned his undergraduate degree at the University of Maine before attending graduate school at the University of Mary in South Dakota, where he received a master's degree in kinesiology and exercise science. He holds USSF and UEFA coaching licenses and is an NSCA Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS).

**KEVIN HITCHCOCK****ASSISTANT COACH**

Kevin Hitchcock is in his first season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in April 2019. Hitchcock arrives in New England with nearly two decades of professional coaching experience in the top flights of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England.

Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA 'A' Goalkeeper License and UEFA 'B' License, has spent the last 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach with several top-flight clubs. His experience includes stints with Watford FC (2001-04), Blackburn Rovers FC (2004-08), Manchester City FC (2008-10), Fulham FC (2011), Queens Park Rangers (2012-15), Al Arabi Sports Club (2015-16), and Birmingham City FC (2016-18). Most recently, Hitchcock spent one year as the goalkeepers coach for Indian Super League side Chennaiyin FC.

Hitchcock has coached and developed a number of elite professional goalkeepers, including Joe Hart, Kasper Schmeichel, Shay Given, Robert Green, Júlio César, and Mark Schwarzer, among others.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Hitchcock registered nearly 300 appearances across an 18-year playing career in England, highlighted by two FA Cups, one League Cup, one Cup Winners Cup, and one Super Cup with Chelsea FC. In total, he recorded 96 appearances for The Blues from 1988-2001, also completing loan assignments to West Ham United FC (1993) and Northampton Town FC (1990) during his time with the club. Prior to joining Chelsea, Hitchcock began his professional career with Mansfield Town FC, where he made 168 appearances from 1984-88. At the youth level, he played with both Nottingham Forest FC and Barking F.C.

DAVE VAN DEN BERGH**ASSISTANT COACH**

Dave van den Bergh is in his first season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in June 2019. Van den Bergh, 43, arrives in New England following nine years as a coach with various United States Youth National teams.

The Amsterdam native served as assistant coach for the United States Under-20 Men's National Team in 2019 and from 2010-16, head coach of the United States Under-19 Men's National Team in 2018, and head coach of the United States Under-15s from 2016-18. Van den Bergh recorded a 6-0-4 record as head of the U.S. U-15s, and helped guide the U-20s to consecutive Quarterfinal appearances in the 2015 and 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cups.

Van den Bergh enjoyed a decorated playing career from 1995-2009, featuring extensively in the Dutch Eredivisie, La Liga, and Major League Soccer. He began his career with Dutch powerhouse Ajax in 1995 after spending 10 years in the club's academy. Van den Bergh made 12 appearances across three seasons for Ajax -- highlighted by a league title in the 1995-96 season -- before moving to Spanish side Rayo Vallecano, where he logged 47 appearances from 1997-2000. He returned to the Eredivisie in 2000, joining FC Utrecht. The winger scored 29 goals across 184 games played for Utrecht, and led the club to consecutive Dutch Cup wins in 2003 and 2004, as well as a Dutch Super Cup title in 2004. Van den Bergh signed with the Kansas City Wizards of Major League Soccer in 2006. After one season with Kansas City, he joined the New York Red Bulls, where he played under Bruce Arena in 2007. Following two seasons with New York, Van den Bergh featured for FC Dallas in 2009.

On the international stage, Van den Bergh collected two caps with the Netherlands in 2004.

CURT ONALFO
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his first season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo will work closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joins the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 49, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring for Ridgefield High School, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.


REMI ROY
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his 10th season with the New England Revolution and his second as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salt Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07).

Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

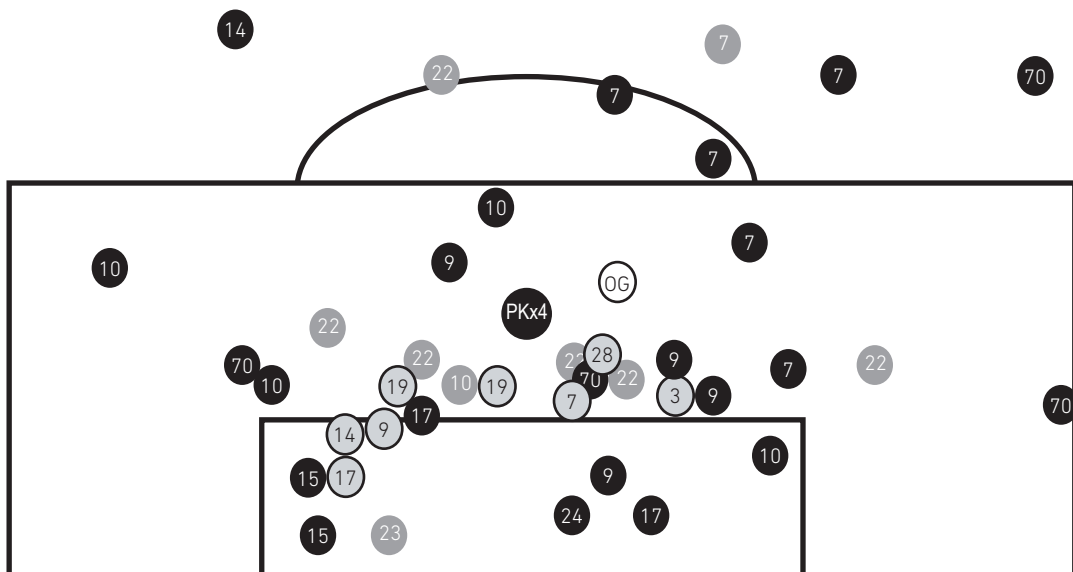
