New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On starting the season strong with a result away from home:

Coach Friedel: "A lot of times, playing on the road is your mindset. There's a lot of clubs that I've played at, you for some reason couldn't win at certain stadiums and you can't really make heads or tails of why. We're going to try to go into Philadelphia with a winning mentality that we've tried to promote during preseason. We're not going to change the way we're playing just because we're going on the road. We'll see what happens, but hopefully we'll instill a winning mentality on the road and at home. An impeccable home form and home record last year and hopefully we can build on that a little bit this year."

On how confident he is in the team he has entering the season:

Coach Friedel: "I like the group that I inherited in the first place, which I've said many times, and I like the pieces that we've added so far – each and every one of them. Obviously, they will contribute in different ways from Mark [Segbers] and Brandon [Bye] and Nico [Nicolas Samayoa], up to Wilfried [Zahibo], Gabriel [Somi], and Cristian Penilla. All the players that were on the squad before that are returning have been great and the application has been outstanding, so we're happy. Any player that we do bring in from here on out will hopefully be a boost and another added [level of] competition to places. I want to bring in at least two at every position that can play at the highest level, and that's what we're trying to strive for."

BRAD FRIEDEL ERA BEGINS IN NEW ENGLAND

Saturday's season opener against the Philadelphia Union marks Brad Friedel's first match at the helm for the New England Revolution. Friedel, appointed in November 2017 after a legendary two-decade career as a Premier League and U.S. Men's National Team goalkeeper, takes the club's reins after time as head coach of the United States U-19 National Team's head coach, an assistant on various other U.S. Youth National Teams, and an assistant at all levels of Tottenham Hotspur's Academy.



Flanked by an experienced group of assistant coaches including Mike Lapper, Marcelo Neveleff, and Ruben Garcia, and committed to an elite fitness program led by former Tottenham trainer Anton McElhone, Friedel's outlook is centered on one goal – winning. By implementing a high-octane approach, he aims to put the Revolution on the front foot from day one as the team looks to reclaim its place as one of MLS' most dominant clubs.

REVOLUTION OPEN 2018 SEASON ON ROAD

For the 22nd time in 23 Major League Soccer seasons, The Revolution are set to open the season on the road on Saturday at Talen Energy Stadium against the Philadelphia Union. In the club's history, the Revolution are 5-12-5 in season-opening matches. Saturday's contest will mark the first time New England and Philadelphia have played in a season opener.

The Revs most recently earned a result in the season opening contest at Houston in 2016, when a stoppage-time goal from former Revolution midfielder Daigo Kobayashi guaranteed the Revs a point in the 3-3 draw. The Revs' most recent season opening win came at Chicago in 2013, when Jerry Bengtson scored the lone goal of the contest in the second half to give the Revs all three points.

350, 350, 700: REVS APPROACH MILESTONE MATCHES

On Saturday, the Revolution will reach the first of three milestones set to be achieved in the month of March. Saturday's season-opening match against the Philadelphia Union will be the 350th regular season road match played in club history. The Revs are 88-189-72 all-time in road contests, having recorded 407 goals with 401 assists.

Three weeks later on March 24 vs. New York City FC, the Revs will achieve two additional milestones. The contest will be the club's 350th regular season home match, as well as 700th regular season match played in the club's 23-year history. New England has posted a 175-107-66 record all-time in home matches, and have scored 567 goals with an equal 567 assists.

TEAM NOTES

REVS TIE MLS HIGH, SEND THREE TO USMNT JANUARY CAMP

Forward **Juan Agudelo**, midfielder **Kelyn Rowe**, and goalkeeper **Cody Cropper** were among 30 players called in by the United States Men's National Team for its annual January training camp. The club's three selections were tied for the most of any MLS club in the camp.

The players spent three weeks at the U.S. Soccer National Training Center in Carson, Calif., training under interim head coach Dave Sarachan. New England's three representatives helped comprise a squad that was built with an emphasis on the future as the USMNT shifts its focus toward the 2020 CONCACAF Gold Cup and 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying cycle.

For Agudelo and Rowe, the selection helped reaffirm their status as national team regulars. Both players earned at least three call-ups last year, including the 2017 Gold Cup roster. They each entered the USMNT's friendly against Bosnia on Jan. 28 as second-half substitutes, with Rowe logging 44 minutes and Agudelo submitting a 21-minute shift.

Cropper was one of four goalkeepers included in Sarachan's roster. A seasoned veteran of the United States Youth National Team system, Cropper's inclusion on the January camp roster marked his first appearance on a senior team squad since 2015.



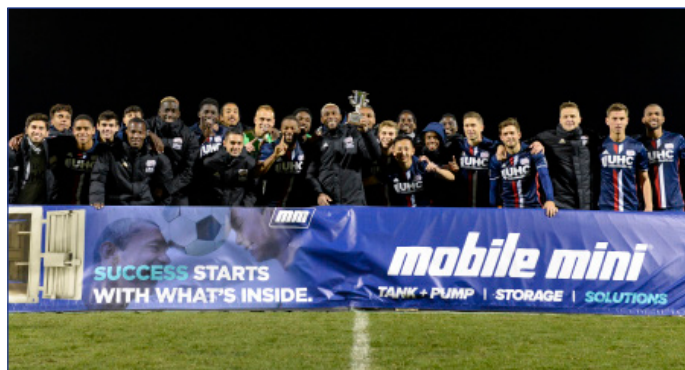
REVOLUTION CAP PRESEASON WITH MOBILE MINI SUN CUP TITLE

New England closed its first preseason under Head Coach Brad Friedel by capturing the Mobile Mini Sun Cup title with a 1(4)-1(3) win in penalty kicks against the Houston Dynamo on Feb. 24.

Forward **Krisztián Németh** provided the lone regulation goal, as well as the decisive penalty to propel the Revs to victory. For his performance in all four matches of the tournament, **Diego Fagundez** was named Mobile Mini Sun Cup Most Valuable Player.

The win against Houston preserved New England's unbeaten 2-0-2 record against MLS competition for the preseason. It also secured the Revolution's second Mobile Mini Sun Cup (formerly the Desert Diamond Cup) title in the last three years, having also won the tournament in 2016.

New England's preseason was highlighted by a diverse list of goal scorers. Nine different players, including newcomer **Cristian Penilla** and first-round SuperDraft selection **Brandon Bye**, accounted for the club's 13 preseason goals. In addition, five Revolution Academy players - Kevin Vang, Prince Loney-Bailey, Trevor Burns, Nicolas Firmino, and Pierre Spiegel - were on hand for the Tucson trip to train with the first team.



DELAMEA, DIELNA FORM FOUNDATION FOR REVS BACK LINE

In 2017, the Revolution invested valuable resources into central defense, using Targeted Allocation Money to sign Slovenian international **Antonio Delamea** and a Designated Player slot on left-footed center back **Claude Dielna**. Now entering their second seasons in New England, Delamea and Dielna are poised to give the club one of Major League Soccer's most imposing center back tandems.

Dielna emerged as a vocal team leader during preseason and wore the captain's armband in all seven matches. Here is what Brad Friedel had to say about Dielna's leadership:

"When a new staff comes in, we get to see who we feel have the leadership qualities within the group," Head Coach Brad Friedel said. "Claude is definitely one of those players who has not only the experience, but the leadership qualities, and he's a very, very good player."

For Dielna, who joined the Revolution during the secondary transfer window last summer, acclimation is key: *"Now I know the team, I know the country," he said. "It's easier for me and I'm excited to start the new season."*

Delamea, meanwhile, will try to build upon a standout debut season. After pacing Revolution field players in minutes, he took home both JetBlue Team MVP and Defender of the Year honors. In 2018, he'll look to resume his role as the anchor on New England's backline.

FAGUNDEZ SEES TIME IN CENTER OF PITCH

Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** has primarily played on the left side of the pitch in his seven previous seasons with the Revolution. However, this preseason, Fagundez found himself in the middle of the action in a central attacking midfield role. Fagundez was named Mobile Mini Sun Cup Tournament Most Valuable Player for his performances in four matches of the preseason tournament.

Following New England's preseason contest against San Antonio FC on Feb. 17, head coach Brad Friedel said the following about Fagundez:

"We have him pushed up a little bit higher, so he's really in the number 10 role," Friedel said. "He's been somebody, not that it has surprised us, but we've been very, very pleased with from day one. His attitude has been outstanding and his vision and how he reads the game is very good. On top of that, he's a very skillful boy. His linkup play with Cristian Penilla is excellent and anyone else that we put up there alongside him, he'll be able to play, so we're very happy with Diego."

REVS PLAY AT HOME EARLY AND OFTEN

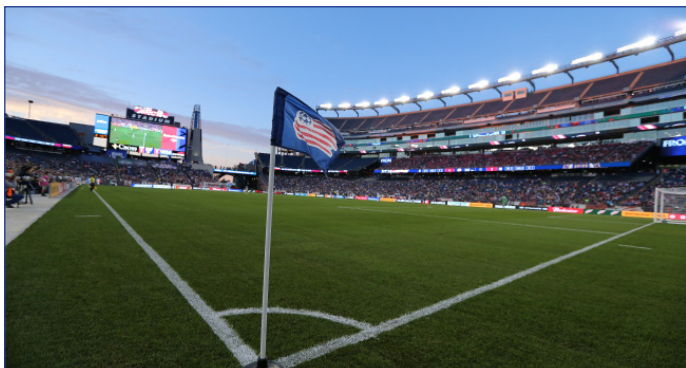
While the Revs will open the season on the road, they will be at Gillette Stadium often through the first half of the season. Five of New England's first eight matches, as well as 12 of the first 19 matches, will be played in Foxborough.

Last season, the Revs set a record for home wins by posting an impressive 12-2-3 record at Gillette Stadium, and will look to replicate the same success at home to get off to a hot start. Dating back to last season, the Revolution have gone unbeaten in the club's previous eight home matches.

REVS SIGN THREE MLS SUPERDRAFT SELECTIONS

The New England Revolution made three selections in the MLS Superdraft: Western Michigan midfielder/defender **Brandon Bye** (first round, eighth overall), Wisconsin midfielder/defender **Mark Segbers** (first round, ninth overall), and Florida Gulf Coast defender **Nicolas Samayoa** (fourth round, 78th overall).

Bye and Segbers provide the Revs with versatile, attack-minded defenders along the right side of the formation, but also possess the attacking ability to contribute further up the pitch. Samayoa serves as an additional option at the center back position.

Samayoa, along with MLS veteran defender **Jalil Anibaba**, officially signed with the Revolution, on Feb. 9, while Bye and Segbers put pen to paper on Feb. 10. All three Revolution SuperDraft picks played extended minutes over the course of preseason, including exhibition matches at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. as well as at the Mobile Minu Sun Cup in Tucson, Ariz. Bye finished the preseason with one goal and one assist, making the highlight reels with his equalizing tally against FC Cincinnati on Feb. 6.

INTERNATIONAL ADDITIONS BOLSTER ROSTER

The Revolution added to three different position groups through offseason international signings. Swedish-born Syrian international **Gabriel Somi** will compete for a starting position at left back. French midfielder **Wilfried Zahibo** is set to provide a physical presence in a holding midfield role. Finally, Ecuadorian **Cristian Penilla** brings exceptional pace to the attacking corps.



New England made Somi its first international signing of the offseason on Jan. 5, 2018. The Örebro, Sweden native joins the Revolution after six professional seasons in Sweden. In 132 combined senior appearances in Sweden's top two divisions, Somi registered six goals and 12 assists.

Nearly one week later, the Revs announced the addition of Zahibo. The towering midfielder, standing at 6-foot-2, joins the squad following seven professional seasons in France and Spain. Zahibo most recently played for Gimnàstic de Tarragona, but has also spent time with Valencia CF, Valencia III, CF Fuenlabrada of Spain, as well as AC Ajaccio and Ajaccio II of France. Zahibo helped lead Gimnàstic de Tarragona to a first-place finish in the 2016-17 Copa Catalunya.

On Jan. 23, 2018, the Revs made a third international signing to bolster the attacking group by adding Penilla. He joins the Revolution for 2018 on loan from Liga MX club Pachuca. At 26-years-old, the right-footed attacker has significant experience, having made more than 200 appearances and logging over 12,000 minutes in his eight-year professional career. Penilla has spent played in top divisions in Mexico (Pachuca, Monarcas Morelia), Brazil (Chapecoense), and Ecuador (Barcelona SC, Deportivo Quito).

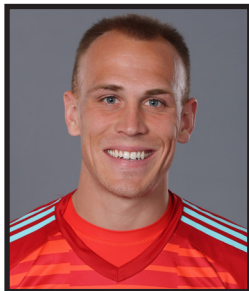
ANGKING INKS HOMEGROWN PLAYER CONTRACT

The New England Revolution added a fourth Homegrown Player to the roster on Jan. 2, signing midfielder **Isaac Angking** to a first-team contract. A native of Providence, R.I., Angking joins New England's senior roster after developing over more than four seasons in the Revolution Academy. Upon signing his contract, Angking became the second youngest Homegrown Player signing in club history at just 17 years old (now 18).

After joining the academy system before the 2013-14 season, Angking quickly climbed the ranks from the Under-14s to the Under-19s. For his Revolution Academy career, he totaled 81 appearances, 67 starts, 28 goals, and 18 assists. The New England product tallied 12 goals in 11 games with the Under-19s during the 2017-18 fall season, tying for the sixth most goals among all U.S. Soccer Development Academy players in the U-18/19 age group.

Angking has represented various U.S. Youth National Teams since his first call up to the Under-14s in August 2014. He was selected for the U.S. Under-17 Residency Program for three consecutive semesters beginning in spring 2016. Angking was also named to the Under-17 roster for the 13th edition of the Nike International Friendlies, a competition the U.S. side swept with victories over Brazil, Portugal, and Turkey.

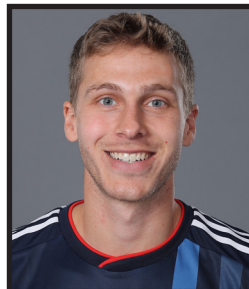

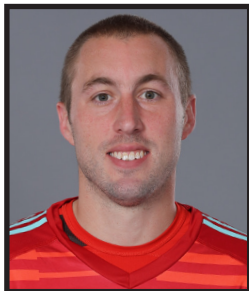

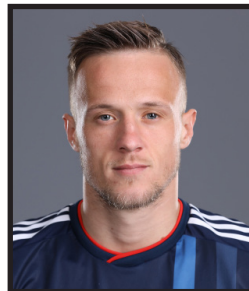

HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017.
- One of the most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- Decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in a 13-year senior career.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- Appeared in a league-record 310 consecutive Premier League contests and ranks among the top 10 with 132 clean sheets.

Brad Friedel enters his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

Friedel, 46, joins the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player,

assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's preeminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history.

As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER
ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper enters his first season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international enters his 10th MLS season as a coach and his 16th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 13 years of coaching experience to New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. He most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporter's Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating in the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.

Marcelo Neveleff enters his first season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Interregional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

ANTON McELHONE
HEAD OF FITNESS

Anton McElhone enters his first season as Head of Fitness for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in December 2017. He brings significant fitness experience with top-flight clubs in the United Kingdom to the Revolution, most recently with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club.

McElhone has spent the last 10 years on the technical staff of Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur F.C., including the last six as the club's First Team Fitness and Conditioning Coach. He assumed the role in July 2011 after nearly four years as the Development and Fitness Coach of the Under-21 and Under-18 squads, where he oversaw strength and conditioning and sports science beginning in November 2007.

MICHAEL BURNS
GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is in his 14th season with the New England Revolution and his seventh as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management.

Since Burns assumed his role ahead of the 2012 season, the club amassed a 78-82-44 record in his first six seasons, improving upon its five-win campaign in 2011 with a core of burgeoning, explosive players. The Revolution made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2013 through 2015, a run that included the Revs' fifth trip to MLS Cup in 2014.

The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before earning a promotion to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns serves on MLS' Technical Committee and its Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his ninth season with the New England Revolution and his first as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

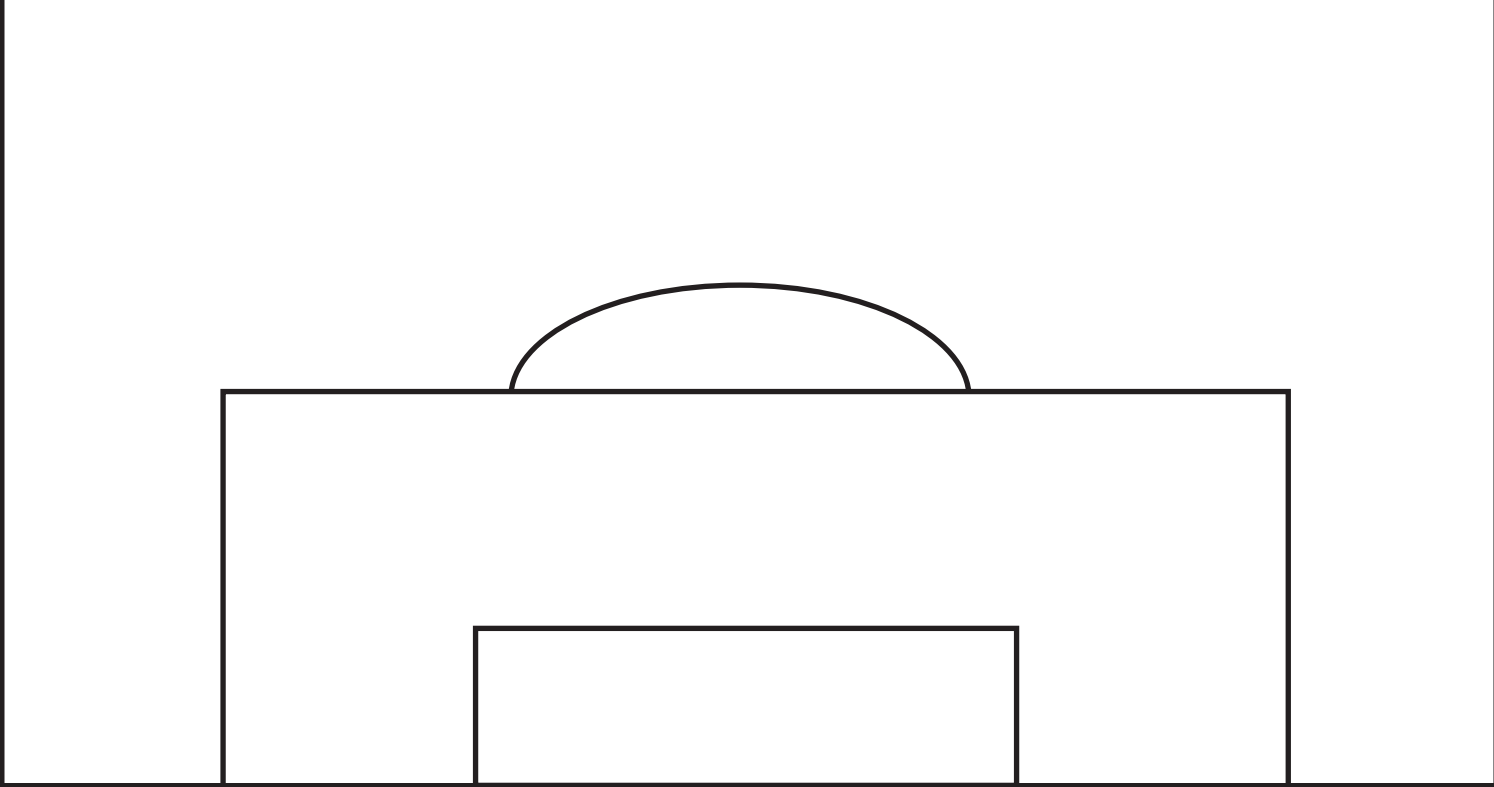
