New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On Montreal's recent form:

Coach Friedel: "They're a very patient team in their defense and even when they have the ball. I know [Impact Head Coach] Remi [Garde] a little bit from his time in Europe. He'll have the team structured in a very resilient manner and they'll be difficult to break down. I assume they're going to be playing with five across the back or three in the back, because that's how they've gotten two of their results. If they do go to four in the back, that's something that we can cope with as well, but it'll be hard game. There's no doubt about it. They have a very good player in [Ignacio] Piatti, so we'll have to be at the top of our game to beat them. That's going to be a saying every single week that we talk."

On Luis Caicedo's first start and him seeing minutes on the wing vs. Houston:

Coach Friedel: "It [his minutes on the wing] was more of a product of the game. I mean, you never say never and he has played out there in his career as well and he is a very versatile player. We just felt in the second half we wanted to move Diego [Fagundez] back inside for the entirety of the game to get him on the ball when we had a man advantage, and also to put Scott [Caldwell] back into a position that was a little bit more comfortable where he was seeing the field in front of him. That was the main reason, but Luis [Caicedo] is a very versatile player, so we can play him in many positions. We'll try to solidify one for him soon."

New England Revolution Midfielder Diego Fagundez

On how the team has adapted to the style the coaching staff wants to play:

Fagundez: "I think Coach [Friedel] has definitely brought this team together, the way he wants us to play, the way the energy, everything about the locker room has definitely changed. I think it is better for us. I think it is definitely showing in the games. We just have to keep doing it, keep having fun. At the end of the day, when we're winning games, everybody is happy. So, we just have to keep this vibe going and keep it rolling."

FRIEDEL'S PHILOSOPHY TAKING HOLD IN NEW ENGLAND

The 2018 MLS season marks a new era of Revolution soccer with Brad Friedel patrolling the sidelines in his first season as the club's head coach. Friday will mark his fifth match at the helm (2-1-1) as the club looks to continue its recent run of dominance at Gillette Stadium.

Friedel, appointed in November 2017 after a legendary two-decade career as a Premier League and U.S. Men's National Team goalkeeper, has taken the club's reins after time as head coach of the United States U-19 National Team's, an assistant on various other U.S. Youth National Teams, and an assistant at all levels of Tottenham Hotspur's Academy.



Flanked by an experienced group of assistant coaches including Mike Lapper, Marcelo Neveleff, and Ruben Garcia, and committed to an arduous fitness program led by former Tottenham trainer Anton McElhone, Friedel's outlook is centered on one goal – winning. Competition and professionalism are also pillars of Friedel's approach, which includes an expanded and more demanding training regiment for the team.

TURNER THRIVING IN STARTING ROLE

Third-year Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner** is turning heads in the starting goalkeeper role following an impressive preseason campaign. Turner was rewarded with his first MLS start on March 3 at Philadelphia and has backstopped the Revs in all four matches since, posting two wins with one shutout.

Turner's 2018 campaign has featured a number of highlights, including his save of a Colorado Rapids penalty attempt on March 10 which earned him a spot on MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week. He also earned a bench spot on Team of the Week after recording a career-best six saves in his first career shutout on March 31 at Houston. Turner has also earned Jet-Blue Man of the Match honors on two occasions this season.

CAICEDO MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT FOR NEW ENGLAND

On March 8, the Revolution acquired 21-year-old midfielder **Luis Caicedo** on loan from Colombian side Cortuluá. Caicedo, who was added to the roster using Targeted Allocation Money (TAM), arrived in New England on March 21 and quickly worked his way into the fold, making his MLS debut only days later with a two-minute substitute appearance against New York City FC on March 24.

Only nine days after his first training session with the club, Caicedo made his first MLS start on March 31 at Houston. In the 2-0 win, Caicedo completed 30-of-35 passes (85.7 percent) and recorded a secondary assist on Teal Bunbury's game-winning goal.

Caicedo joined New England after five professional seasons – four in Colombia's top two tiers and one in Portugal's second division. He totaled over 70 appearances and 67 starts across all competitions with Cortuluá, tallying three goals. Prior to joining the Colombian club, he spent the 2014-15 season with Portugal's Sporting CP II.

PENILLA'S PACE PACKS A PUNCH FOR REVS ATTACK

Forward/midfielder **Cristian Penilla** has been electric going forward for the Revolution in his first MLS campaign. In four starts, Penilla has contributed one goal and three assists, including helpers in each of his last three outings.

When he registered his third assist on March 31 at Houston, Penilla became the first Revolution player with an assist in three consecutive matches since both Diego Fagundez and Kelyn Rowe did it from September 3-17, 2016. If he records another helper on April 6 vs. Montreal, he will be the first to do so in four straight games since Lee Nguyen did it from May 14 - June 18, 2016.

Penilla's strong start to the season has him among the most dynamic and productive MLS playmakers in 2018. Here is how he stacks up with the rest of the league in primary assists (tied for first), big chances created (first), and fast breaks (tied for third), according to Opta.

ZAHIBO IMPACTFUL ON BOTH ENDS OF PITCH

Midfielder **Wilfried Zahibo** has made his presence felt on both sides of the ball early in the 2018 season, his first campaign in Major League Soccer. The French midfielder provided an offensive spark in the Revolution's 2-2 draw with New York City FC on March 24, registering a pair of assists in the contest. Through four matches, Zahibo is one of two Revs players with at least two assists in the young season, along with fellow MLS newcomer **Cristian Penilla** (3).

Zahibo's multi-assist performance was the first two-assist game by a Revolution player since Chris Tierney notched a pair of helpers on Sept. 27, 2017 vs. Toronto FC.

On the defensive end, Zahibo has been instrumental in shutting down opposing attacks. He currently ranks among the top 10 in MLS in duels won, and his 15 duels won on March 24 vs. New York City FC are tied for the fourth most in a single MLS match this season.

GO, DIEGO, GO: FAGUNDEZ CLIMBING REVS RECORD BOOK

Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** has tallied twice through four games this season, jumping out to an early lead on the club's goal scoring list. Fagundez's two goals also propelled him into third place on New England's all-time goal scoring chart.

The midfielder provided the Revolution's first goal of the 2018 MLS season in the 48th minute of New England's home opener on March 10. The goal was Fagundez's 42nd career goal, moving him into a tie with Steve Ralston for third place on the club's all-time regular season list. Just two weeks later, he surpassed Ralston for sole possession of third place when he curled a shot from range past New York City FC goalkeeper Sean Johnson.

FORTRESS FOXBOROUGH: REVS EMBARK ON EARLY HOMESTAND

Beginning with Friday's matchup against Montreal, the Revs are embarking on a critical homestand that includes seven home matches in the club's next nine contests. In all, 12 of the team's first 19 matches this season were or will be set in Foxborough.

New England posted a 1-0-1 record at Gillette Stadium through March 2018, continuing an impressive run of home form that extends back several seasons. In 2017, the Revs set a club record for home wins by posting an impressive 12-2-3 mark at Gillette Stadium. The 12 wins were tied for the second most in MLS last season. Dating back to July 22, 2017, New England has gone unbeaten in its last nine home matches.

TIERNEY'S MILESTONE DAY ENDS WITH DRAMATIC GOAL

Defender **Chris Tierney** provided the Revolution's first game-winning goal of the 2018 MLS season in dramatic fashion on March 10 vs. Colorado. Following a foul on Wilfried Zaha deep into second-half stoppage time, Tierney curled a last-gasp free kick from the top of the 18-yard box into the back of the Rapids' net just before to the final whistle.

The goal was Tierney's 13th career tally and fourth game-winning goal in his MLS career. It was also New England's second latest game-winning goal dating back to 2014, trailing only Kelyn Rowe's game winner in the sixth minute of stoppage time in the 2017 regular season finale at Montreal on Oct. 22, 2017.

When the Wellesley, Mass. native made his first appearance of the 2018 season in that match, he became the first field player in Revolution history to feature in 11 different MLS seasons (2008-18), surpassing Shalrie Joseph (2003-12). He is equaled only by goalkeeper Matt Reis, who played in 11 seasons from 2003-13.

Among active players on Boston's five major professional sports teams, Tierney holds the distinction of being the sixth longest-tenured pro athlete in Boston. The five athletes who have played in Boston's pro sports scene longer than Tierney are Tom Brady (Patriots), Stephen Gostkowski (Patriots), Patrice Bergeron (Bruins), Zdeno Chára (Bruins), and Dustin Pedroia (Red Sox).

NEMETH SCORES STUNNER FOR HUNGARY NATIONAL TEAM

Forward **Krisztian Nemeth** scored the fourth goal of his international career with a right-footed wonder strike from distance on March 23 vs. Kazakhstan. He also appeared as a substitute against Scotland on March 27, giving him 34 career caps and four goals in his international career.

Nemeth hopes he can carry his goal-scoring touch back across the Atlantic: *"It's always good to score in the national team, after a long time [since] I [had] scored, so that's a positive and of course, it gives me a little bit more confidence."*

REVOLUTION HIT MATCH MILESTONES IN MARCH

In the club's 23rd season, the Revolution hit major milestones for all-time games played against New York City FC on March 24. The Revs' last home match against New York City FC marked the club's 700th all-time regular season contest, and the 350th home game in club history. The Revolution have claimed all three points in more than half of those home games with 176 wins all-time.

The club's 350th away game took place on March 3 with the season opener at Philadelphia, a 2-0 loss.

SOMI SETTLING IN AT LEFT BACK

Defender **Gabriel Soma** has established himself as an integral member of the Revolution's back line through the club's first four matches this season.

Soma, a Syrian international who signed with New England on Jan. 5 after six professional seasons in Sweden, delivered his best performance to date on March 31 at Houston. He registered his first MLS assist with a perfectly-weighted long ball to Cristian Penilla and finished the match with a pair of chances created, two tackles, one shot, and 71 touches.

On the season, Soma has played 284 minutes across four starts with two shots and one assist.



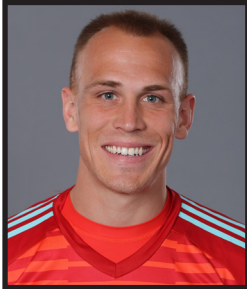
ANGKING INKS HOMEGROWN PLAYER CONTRACT

The New England Revolution added a fourth Homegrown Player to the roster on Jan. 2, signing midfielder **Isaac Angking** to a first-team contract. A native of Providence, R.I., Angking joins New England's senior roster after developing over more than four seasons in the Revolution Academy. Upon signing his contract, Angking became the second youngest Homegrown Player signing in club history at just 17 years old (now 18).

After joining the academy system before the 2013-14 season, Angking quickly climbed the ranks from the Under-14s to the Under-19s. For his Revolution Academy career, he totaled 81 appearances, 67 starts, 28 goals, and 18 assists. The New England product tallied 12 goals in 11 games with the Under-19s during the 2017-18 fall season, tying for the sixth most goals among all U.S. Soccer Development Academy players in the U-18/19 age group.

Angking has represented various U.S. Youth National Teams since his first call up to the Under-14s in August 2014. He was selected for the U.S. Under-17 Residency Program for three consecutive semesters beginning in spring 2016. Angking was also named to the Under-17 roster for the 13th edition of the Nike International Friendlies, a competition the U.S. side swept with victories over Brazil, Portugal, and Turkey.

BRAD FRIEDEL HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017.
- One of the most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- Decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in a 13-year senior career.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- Appeared in a league-record 310 consecutive Premier League contests and ranks among the top 10 with 132 clean sheets.

Brad Friedel is in his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

Friedel, 46, joins the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player,

assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's preeminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history.

As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is in his first season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international enters his 10th MLS season as a coach and his 16th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 13 years of coaching experience to New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. He most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporters' Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating in the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



MARCELO NEVELEFF ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is in his first season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Interregional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

RUBEN GARCIA GOALKEEPER COACH

Ruben Garcia is in his first season as Assistant Coach/Goalkeeping Coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. Garcia, who was also known as Ruben Martin during his playing days, spent time with clubs including Toledo CV, Alaves CF, Albacete, Atlético Madrid, Ciudad de Murcia, Talavera, and Alcala de Henares.

Garcia graduated from the University of San Pablo CEU in Madrid in 2006 with a Bachelor Degree in Criminology.



ANTON McELHONE HEAD OF FITNESS

Anton McElhone is in his first season as Head of Fitness for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in December 2017. He brings significant fitness experience with top-flight clubs in the United Kingdom to the Revolution, most recently with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club.

McElhone has spent the last 10 years on the technical staff of Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur F.C., including the last six as the club's First Team Fitness and Reconditioning Coach. He assumed the role in July 2011 after nearly four years as the Development and Fitness Coach of the Under-21 and Under-18 squads, where he oversaw strength and conditioning and sports science beginning in November 2007.

Prior to joining Tottenham, McElhone began his professional career as the First Team Sports Scientist with Hibernian FC in the top-flight Scottish Premiership. He spent three years with Hibs from 2004-07, and during that time earned his Master of Science degree in strength and conditioning from the University of Edinburgh.

McElhone received his undergraduate degree in sports studies with exercise science from the University of the West of Scotland in 2004, and also holds a UEFA A coaching license.



MICHAEL BURNS GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is in his 14th season with the New England Revolution and his seventh as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management.

Since Burns assumed his role ahead of the 2012 season, the club amassed a 78-82-44 record in his first six seasons, improving upon its five-win campaign in 2011 with a core of burgeoning, explosive players. The Revolution made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2013 through 2015, a run that included the Revs' fifth trip to MLS Cup in 2014.

The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before earning a promotion to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns serves on MLS' Technical Committee and its Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his ninth season with the New England Revolution and his first as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

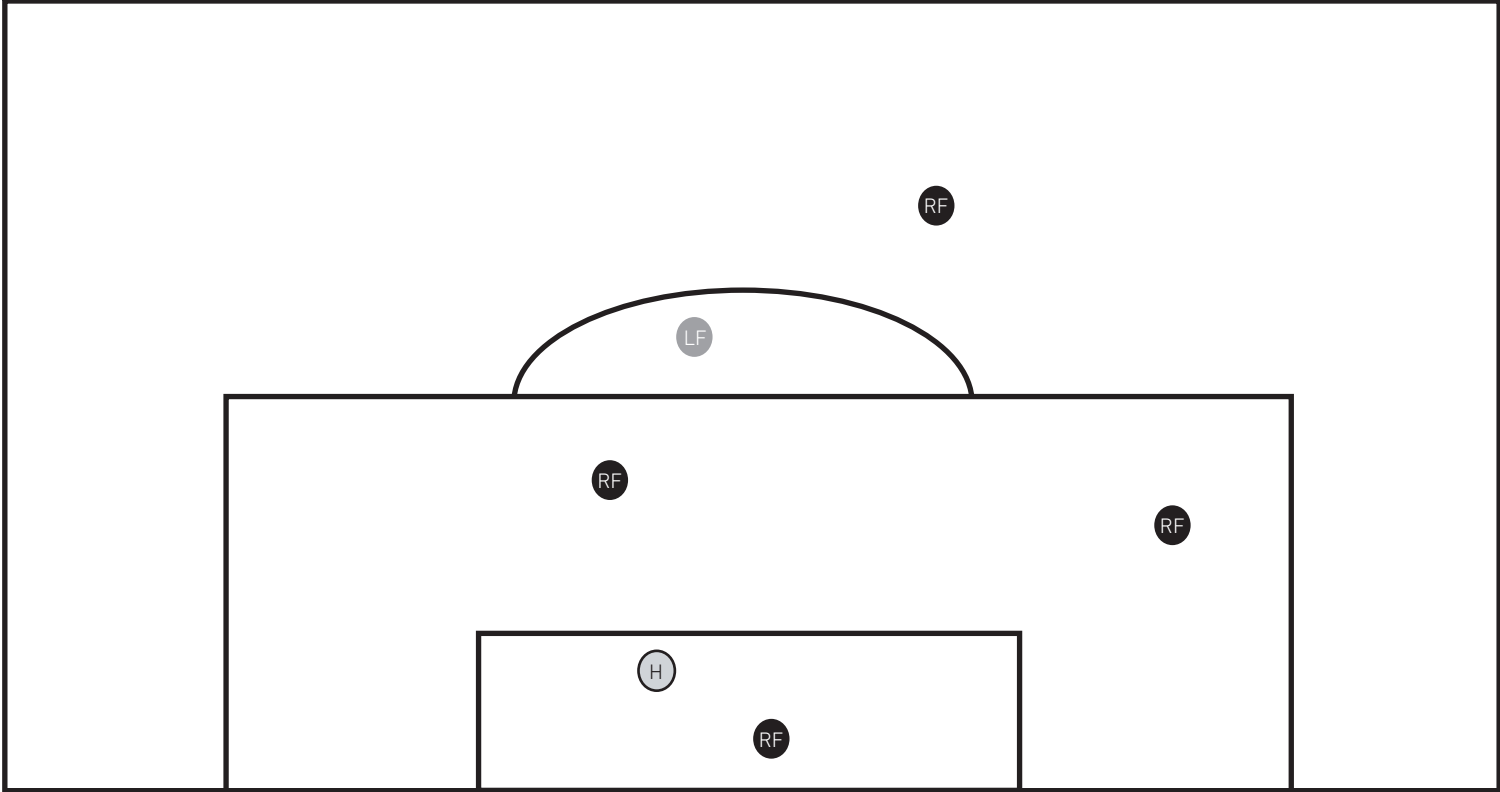
