New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On getting results early in the season as the team continues to develop:

Coach Friedel: "We are a team in its infancy as I've stated many times, but we also are in an industry where we need to win. So, you have to try to balance the two. It's just been really nice that the players have applied themselves as they have from day one. Our numbers on the physical fitness side of things are improving game-by-game, our stats overall on where we want to get certain players on the ball in dangerous positions on the field are improving game-by-game. Hopefully, we'll have a couple more additions come the summer that will make the squad even stronger and more competition for places. It's really time now for all the players and staff to just focus on the one-game-at-a-time scenario and just keep trying to improve as each day goes by."

New England Revolution Defender Jalil Anibaba

On facing Montreal for the second time in the young season:

Anibaba: "It's going to be a completely different game. Obviously, we're playing at their place, so that changes things. We're expecting to finish out the match 11-v-11, so it's going to be a [more] complete test than it was here. We're excited for it, we're ready for it, and we've started off this week of training on the right foot."

New England Revolution Defender Gabriel Somi

On securing three clean sheets through eight matches:

Somi: "The whole team defends really well. It starts up at the top with Teal [Bunbury] back to the goalkeeper with Matt [Turner], that's been brilliant. We put in a lot of work during the weekends and it gives a result against the team we play."

- **F Cristian Penilla** recording one primary assist to give him five on the season. The Ecuadorian attacker enters the week tied for the MLS lead in primary assists with four.
- **M Diego Fagundez** tallying one goal to reach 45 goals scored for his MLS career.
- **D Jalil Anibaba** making his 175th career MLS appearance.
- **D Chris Tierney** and **M Kelyn Rowe** breaking their tie at third place on the club's all-time assists chart with 40 career helpers apiece.

BUNBURY LIGHTING UP THE LEAGUE

Forward **Teal Bunbury** is in excellent form through eight games of the 2018 season, as the ninth-year MLS striker currently leads the Revolution with four goals through eight starts. He has contributed four goals in the club's last five matches dating back to March 31 at Houston, tied for the most productive five-game stretch of his MLS career.

Three of Bunbury's four goals this season proved to be game winners, including his most recent tally in a 1-0 win against Sporting Kansas City on April 28. He is tied with Orlando's Dom Dwyer and Kansas City's Felipe Gutierrez for the most game-winning goals this season.

REVS TRADE NGUYEN TO LAFC

The Revolution traded 31-year-old midfielder **Lee Nguyen** to Los Angeles FC on Tuesday, May 1 before the close of the Primary Transfer Window. In exchange, the Revs received \$350,000 in General Allocation Money, \$350,000 in Targeted Allocation Money, and additional conditional considerations to be determined that could increase the total compensation to as much as \$950,000 in allocation funds.

The move concluded Nguyen's remarkable six-year New England career, which saw him rank near the top of several offensive charts around the league and in Revolution club history. He concluded his tenure in Foxborough ranked second all-time in regular season goals (51), assists (49), and shots (398). He is one of only two players in the Revs' 40-goal, 40-assist club, and earned MLS MVP finalist honors after posting a 20-goal campaign, playoffs included, in 2014.

ANIBABA, DIEINA HELP BACKLINE TO THIRD CLEAN SHEET

The Revolution defense is benefitting from a new partnership in central defense between defenders **Jalil Anibaba** and **Claude Dielna**. In their first season together, the pair brings nearly two decades of combined professional experience to the defensive unit. Anibaba is in his eighth MLS season and Dielna spent 10 years playing across Europe before signing with New England in July 2017. Each of the defenders has seven starts to their credit this season, and they have started alongside one another in six straight contests.

The combination is paying early dividends for the Revs in 2018. Through eight games this season, the defense, backstopped by goalkeeper **Matt Turner**, has conceded only eight goals, the fewest in the Eastern Conference and the second fewest league-wide. The team's three clean sheets are tied for the most in MLS thus far.

Individually, Dielna's 40 clearances this season are currently tied for the ninth most in MLS. Anibaba enjoyed a breakout game in the club's last road match on April 21 at Columbus Crew SC, a 2-2 draw. In the match, the California native registered 19 key defensive actions according to Opta: six interceptions, six clearances, four recoveries, and three defensive blocks. After the match, Head Coach Brad Friedel called Anibaba's performance "absolutely tremendous," and fans echoed that sentiment by voting him the JetBlue Man of the Match.

TURNER THRIVING IN STARTING ROLE

Third-year Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner** is turning heads in the starting goalkeeper role following an impressive preseason campaign. Turner was rewarded with his first MLS start on March 3 at Philadelphia and has backstopped the Revs in all eight matches this season, posting a 4-2-2 record, a 1.00 goals against average, and three shutouts. His eight goals allowed are tied for the third fewest among all MLS goalkeepers with at least three starts.

Turner's 2018 campaign has featured a number of memorable moments, including his save of a Colorado Rapids penalty attempt on March 10 which earned him a spot on MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week. He also earned a bench spot on MLS Team of the Week after recording a career-best six saves in his first career shutout on March 31 at Houston. The New Jersey native has earned JetBlue Man of the Match honors on three occasions this season.

Currently among the top five MLS goalkeepers in both save percentage, total saves, and saves from outside the area, here is a look at how the Fairfield University graduate stacks up against the league's top keepers in a trio of critical categories:

When he registered his third assist on March 31 at Houston, Penilla became the first Revolution player with an assist in three consecutive matches since both Diego Fagundez and Kelyn Rowe did it from September 3-17, 2016.

ZAHIBO IMPACTFUL ON BOTH ENDS OF PITCH

Midfielder **Wilfried Zahibo** has made his presence felt on both ends of the field early in the 2018 season, his first campaign in Major League Soccer. Through eight matches, the French midfielder is tied with fellow MLS newcomer **Cristian Penilla** for the team lead with four assists and tallied his first MLS goal on April 6 vs. Montreal.

The French midfielder provided an offensive spark in the Revolution's 2-2 draw with New York City FC on March 24, registering a pair of assists in the contest. Zahibo's multi-assist performance was the first two-assist game by a Revolution player since Chris Tierney notched a pair of helpers on Sept. 27, 2017 vs. Toronto FC.

On the defensive end, Zahibo has been instrumental in thwarting opposing attacks. He is currently tied for sixth in MLS with 31 tackles and sixth in the league with 69 duels won. His 15 duels won on March 24 vs. New York City FC are tied for the sixth most in a single MLS match this season.

CAICEDO'S PINPOINT PASSING STABILIZES REVS

On March 8, the Revolution acquired 21-year-old midfielder **Luis Caicedo** on loan from Colombian side Cortuluá. Caicedo, who was added to the roster using Targeted Allocation Money (TAM), arrived in New England on March 21 and quickly worked his way into the fold, making his MLS debut only days later with a two-minute substitute appearance against New York City FC on March 24.

Caicedo made his first MLS start on March 31 at Houston, completing 30-of-35 passes (85.7 percent) in the match with a secondary assist on Teal Bunbury's game-winning goal. He followed that performance with another 90-minute outing in the 4-0 win on April 6 vs. Montreal, a contest in which he completed a team-best 91.8 percent of his passes attempts and gained possession five times.

In 2018, Caicedo leads all Revolution field players with at least 50 pass attempts in overall passing accuracy and passing accuracy in the attacking half.

On April 6 vs. Montreal, the Revs entered a critical stretch that includes seven out of nine matches at home. Through the first three games of that period, New England is 2-1-0 at home. In all, 12 of the team's first 19 matches this season were or will be set in Foxborough.

New England has posted a 3-1-1 record at Gillette Stadium in 2018 with a +5 goal differential. In 2017, the Revs set a club record for home wins by posting an impressive 12-2-3 mark at Gillette Stadium. The 12 wins were tied for the second most in MLS last season. SOMI SETTLING IN AT LEFT BACK

Defender **Gabriel Somi** has established himself as an integral member of the Revolution's backline through the club's first eight matches. The Syrian international has an attacking mindset and blistering pace going forward, which has helped him produce two assists on the young season.

Somi signed with New England on Jan. 5 after six professional seasons in Sweden. He has found his form in MLS over the last several weeks, registering assists in back-to-back matches against Houston (March 31) and Montreal (April 6). In 2018, Somi has played 643 minutes across eight starts with two assists and seven shots.



FEMI STARTS FOR TULSA

Revolution forward **Femi Hollinger-Janzen** was recently loaned to USL side Tulsa Roughnecks FC for a midweek match against Fresno FC on Wednesday, April 18. In his first career USL appearance, Femi started on the right wing, played all 90 minutes, and registered two shots in the 2-2 draw.

The third-year forward has totaled 32 MLS appearances, with two starts, since he was drafted by New England in the third round of the 2016 MLS SuperDraft. As a rookie in 2016, the Indiana University graduate recorded two goals with one assist.

TIERNEY'S MILESTONE DAY ENDS WITH DRAMATIC GOAL

Defender **Chris Tierney** provided the Revolution's first game-winning goal of the 2018 MLS season in dramatic fashion on March 10 vs. Colorado. Following a foul deep into second-half stoppage time, Tierney curled a last-gasp free kick from the top of the 18-yard box into the back of the Rapids' net just before the final whistle. The goal was Tierney's 13th career tally and fourth game-winning goal in his MLS career. It was also New England's second latest game-winning goal dating back to 2014.

When the Wellesley, Mass. native made his first appearance of the 2018 season in that match, he became the first field player in Revolution history to feature in 11 different MLS seasons (2008-18), surpassing Shalrie Joseph (2003-12). He is equaled only by goalkeeper Matt Reis, who played in 11 seasons from 2003-13.

Among active players on Boston's five major professional sports teams, Tierney holds the distinction of being the sixth longest-tenured pro athlete in Boston. The five athletes who have played in Boston's pro sports scene longer than Tierney are Tom Brady (Patriots), Stephen Gostkowski (Patriots), Patrice Bergeron (Bruins), Zdeno Chára (Bruins), and Dustin Pedroia (Red Sox).

SEGBERS PRODUCING IN USL DURING LOAN SPELL

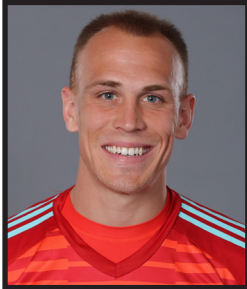
Rookie midfielder/defender **Mark Segbers**, the ninth-overall pick in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, is gaining valuable experience during his loan spell with USL side Orange County SC. Since joining Orange County on March 15, Segbers has made eight appearances, including six starts, and tallied two goals with three assists. His goal total ranks second on the squad, while his three helpers are tied for the second most among USL players.

Segbers' most productive professional match to date came on April 7 vs. LA Galaxy II, when he registered a brace in the victory. The performance earned him a spot on the USL Team of the Week. The St. Louis, Mo. native notched his first pro assist on March 28 at OKC Energy FC, and his second helper came just a few days later on March 31 at Tulsa Roughnecks FC. Segbers joined Real Monarchs SLC's Maikel Chang and Swope Park Rangers' Hadji Berry for the USL lead with his third assist on April 14 at San Antonio FC.

Segbers will remain on loan with Orange County for an indefinite period of time, as the Revolution have the ability to recall him at any point during the season.

BRAD FRIEDEL
HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017.
- One of the most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- Decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in a 13-year senior career.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- Appeared in a league-record 310 consecutive Premier League contests and ranks among the top 10 with 132 clean sheets.

Brad Friedel is in his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

Friedel, 46, joins the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player,

assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's preeminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history.

As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER
ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is in his first season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international enters his 10th MLS season as a coach and his 16th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 13 years of coaching experience to New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. He most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporter's Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating in the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



MARCELO NEVELEFF
ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is in his first season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Interregional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

RUBEN GARCIA
GOALKEEPER COACH

Ruben Garcia is in his first season as Assistant Coach/Goalkeeping Coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. Garcia, who was also known as Ruben Martin during his playing days, spent time with clubs including Toledo CV, Alaves CF, Albacete, Atlético Madrid, Ciudad de Murcia, Talavera, and Alcalá de Henares.

Garcia graduated from the University of San Pablo CEU in Madrid in 2006 with a Bachelor Degree in Criminology.



ANTON McELHONE
HEAD OF FITNESS

Anton McElhone is in his first season as Head of Fitness for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in December 2017. He brings significant fitness experience with top-flight clubs in the United Kingdom to the Revolution, most recently with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club.

McElhone has spent the last 10 years on the technical staff of Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur F.C., including the last six as the club's First Team Fitness and Conditioning Coach. He assumed the role in July 2011 after nearly four years as the Development and Fitness Coach of the Under-21 and Under-18 squads, where he oversaw strength and conditioning and sports science beginning in November 2007.

Prior to joining Tottenham, McElhone began his professional career as the First Team Sports Scientist with Hibernian FC in the top-flight Scottish Premiership. He spent three years with Hibs from 2004-07, and during that time earned his Master of Science degree in strength and conditioning from the University of Edinburgh.

McElhone received his undergraduate degree in sports studies with exercise science from the University of the West of Scotland in 2004, and also holds a UEFA A coaching license.



MICHAEL BURNS
GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is in his 14th season with the New England Revolution and his seventh as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management.

Since Burns assumed his role ahead of the 2012 season, the club amassed a 78-82-44 record in his first six seasons, improving upon its five-win campaign in 2011 with a core of burgeoning, explosive players. The Revolution made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2013 through 2015, a run that included the Revs' fifth trip to MLS Cup in 2014.

The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before earning a promotion to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns serves on MLS' Technical Committee and its Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his ninth season with the New England Revolution and his first as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

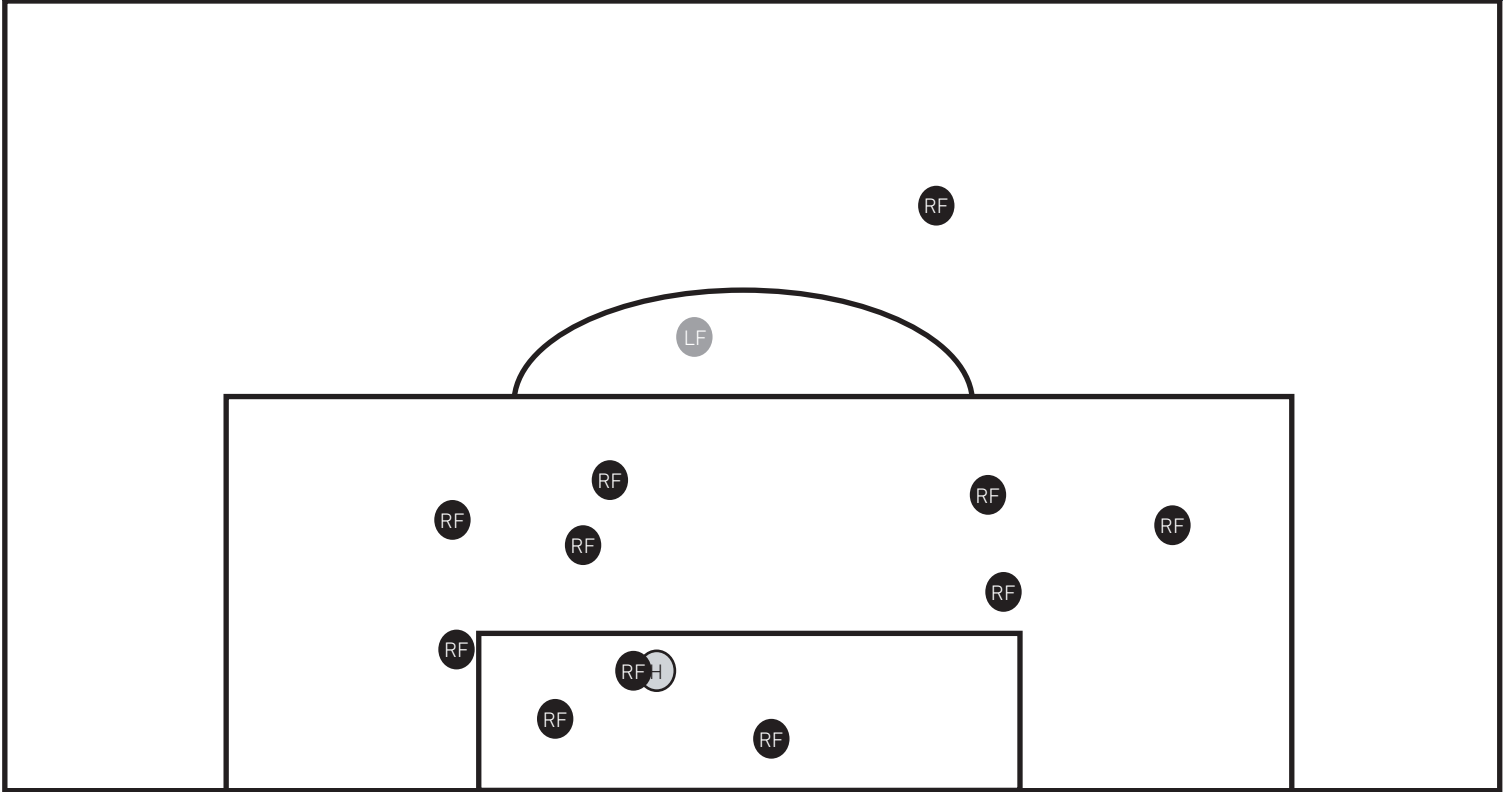
