### New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

*On facing Columbus for the second time in a month:*

**Coach Friedel:** "In watching lots of [Crew SC Head Coach] Gregg's [Berhalter] teams, I don't think they're going to change too much, and I don't think we're going to change a lot, so I think it'll probably be another exciting game if truth be told. Gregg's done a great job, as I think I said before we played them the first time. I'm sure they're going to send the fullbacks high and they're going to try to create overloads and they're going to try to create a lot of chances, and we're going to do the same on the opposite side of the field. Again, I'm sure it's going to be a very, very competitive game – two teams that are going to go out to try to win the game, not to go try to get a draw. Hopefully the fans come out and they'll get entertainment, but with that said, we hope that is with us with the three points."

### FORTRESS FOXBOROUGH: REVS THRIVING IN EARLY HOMESTAND

On April 6 vs. Montreal, the Revs commenced a critical stretch of the season that includes seven out of nine matches at home. Through the first four games of that period, New England is 3-1-0 at Gillette Stadium. In all, 12 of the team's first 19 matches this season were or will be set in Foxborough, including three of the next four games.

To date, New England owns a 4-1-1 home record in 2018 with a +6 goal differential. In 2017, the Revs set a club record for home wins by posting an impressive 12-2-3 mark at Gillette Stadium. The 12 wins were tied for the second most in MLS last season. Before falling to FC Dallas on April 14, the Revs had gone unbeaten in 11 straight home matches dating back to July 22, 2017.

### TURNER THRIVING IN STARTING ROLE

Third-year Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner** is turning heads in the starting goalkeeper role after claiming the starting job in preseason. Turner was rewarded with his first MLS start on March 3 at Philadelphia and has backstopped the Revs in all 10 matches this season, posting a 5-3-2 record, a 1.40 goals against average, 35 saves, and three shutouts.

Turner's 2018 campaign has featured a number of memorable moments, including his save of a Colorado Rapids penalty attempt on March 10 which earned him a spot on MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week. He also earned a bench spot on MLS Team of the Week after recording a career-best six saves in his first career shutout on March 31 at Houston. The New Jersey native has earned JetBlue Man of the Match honors on three occasions this season.

### BUNBURY LIGHTING UP THE LEAGUE

Forward **Teal Bunbury** is in excellent form through 10 games of the 2018 season, as the ninth-year MLS striker currently leads the Revolution with five goals through 10 matches, all starts. He has contributed five goals in the club's last seven matches dating back to March 31 at Houston.

Since July 5, 2017, Bunbury has scored 12 goals in 26 contests, good for the seventh most among all MLS players during that span. Excluding penalties, Bunbury is tied for the third-most goals (12) with David Villa, trailing only New York's Bradley Wright-Phillips (15) and Atlanta's Josef Martinez (16).

Four of Bunbury's five goals this season proved to be game winners, including his most recent tally in a 3-2 win against Toronto FC on May 12. He currently leads MLS in game-winning goals this season.

### ZAHIBO IMPACTFUL ON BOTH ENDS OF PITCH

Midfielder **Wilfried Zahibo** has made his presence felt on both ends of the field early in the 2018 season, his first campaign in Major League Soccer. Through 10 games and nine starts, the French midfielder is tied with fellow Revs/MLS newcomer Cristian Penilla for the team lead with four assists and has added three goals on the young season.

His first MLS goal came on April 6 vs. Montreal, and one month later at Stade Saputo, he tallied twice in the second half against the Impact. His two-goal outing was the first by a Revs player since Diego Fagundez did so on Oct. 15, 2017. The French midfielder also provided an offensive spark in the Revolution's 2-2 draw with New York City FC on March 24, registering a pair of assists in the contest. The multi-assist performance was the first by a Revolution player since Chris Tierney notched a pair of helpers on Sept. 27, 2017 vs. Toronto FC.

On the defensive end, Zahibo has been instrumental in thwarting opposing attacks. He is currently tied for seventh in MLS with 34 tackles and 11th in the league with 79 duels won, according to Opta.

CAICEDO'S PINPOINT PASSING STABILIZES REVS

On March 8, the Revolution acquired 21-year-old midfielder **Luis Caicedo** on loan from Colombian side Cortuluá. Caicedo, who was added to the roster using Targeted Allocation Money (TAM), arrived in New England on March 21 and quickly worked his way into the fold, making his MLS debut only days later with a two-minute substitute appearance against New York City FC on March 24. He has started seven straight matches in the center of the pitch for New England, totaling 632 minutes and one assist.

Caicedo made his first MLS start on March 31 at Houston, completing 30-of-35 passes (85.7 percent) in the match with a secondary assist on Teal Bunbury's game-winning goal. He followed that performance with another 90-minute outing in the 4-0 win on April 6 vs. Montreal, a contest in which he completed a team-best 91.8 percent of his passes attempts and gained possession five times.

In 2018, Caicedo leads all Revolution field players with at least 50 pass attempts in overall passing accuracy and ranks second in passing accuracy in the attacking half, trailing only **Scott Caldwell** (79.9).

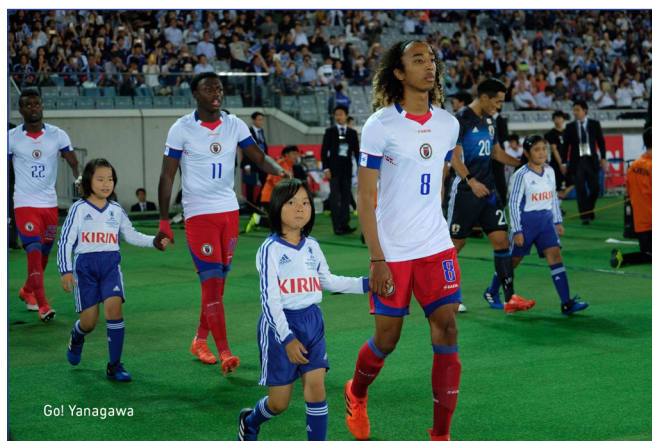

Revolution midfielder **Zachary Herivaux** has been called in to the Haiti National Team for its upcoming friendly against the Argentina "A" National Team. The match will take place on Tuesday, May 29, and will be Argentina's last match before departing for the 2018 FIFA World Cup™ in Russia.

Herivaux, 22, recently debuted for Haiti's senior team in a friendly against Japan on Oct. 10, 2017. The Revolution Homegrown midfielder from Brookline, Mass. played 90 minutes and registered an assist in the 3-3 draw. He also represented Haiti at the youth level in the 2015 CONCACAF Under-20 Championship.

With New England this season, Herivaux has made one substitute appearances and earned six additional selections to the 18-man matchday squad.



SEGBERS PRODUCING IN USL DURING LOAN SPELL

Rookie midfielder/defender **Mark Segbers**, the ninth-overall pick in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, is gaining valuable experience during his loan spell with USL side Orange County SC. Since joining Orange County on March 15, Segbers has made 10 appearances, including seven starts, and tallied two goals with three assists. His goal total is tied for second on the squad, while his three helpers are tied for the sixth most among USL players.

Segbers' most productive professional match to date came on April 7 vs. LA Galaxy II, when he registered a brace in the victory. The performance earned him a spot on the USL Team of the Week. The St. Louis, Mo. native notched his first pro assist on March 28 at OKC Energy FC, and his second helper came just a few days later on March 31 at Tulsa Roughnecks FC. Segbers joined Real Monarchs SLC's Maikel Chang and Swope Park Rangers' Hadji Berry for the USL lead with his third assist on April 14 at San Antonio FC.

Segbers will remain on loan with Orange County for an indefinite period of time, as the Revolution have the ability to recall him at any point during the season.



TIERNEY'S MILESTONE DAY ENDS WITH DRAMATIC GOAL

Defender **Chris Tierney** provided the Revolution's first game-winning goal of the 2018 MLS season in dramatic fashion on March 10 vs. Colorado. Following a foul deep into second-half stoppage time, Tierney curled a last-gasp free kick from the top of the 18-yard box into the back of the Rapids' net just before to the final whistle. The goal was Tierney's 13th career tally and fourth game-winning goal in his MLS career. It was also New England's second latest game-winning goal dating back to 2014.

When the Wellesley, Mass. native made his first appearance of the 2018 season in that match, he became the first field player in Revolution history to feature in 11 different MLS seasons (2008-18), surpassing Shalrie Joseph (2003-12). He is equaled only by goalkeeper Matt Reis, who played in 11 seasons from 2003-13.

Among active players on Boston's five major professional sports teams, Tierney holds the distinction of being the sixth longest-tenured pro athlete in Boston. The five athletes who have played in Boston's pro sports scene longer than Tierney are Tom Brady (Patriots), Stephen Gostkowski (Patriots), Patrice Bergeron (Bruins), Zdeno Chára (Bruins), and Dustin Pedroia (Red Sox).

**REVS SIGN 2018 SPECIAL OLYMPICS MA UNIFIED TEAM**

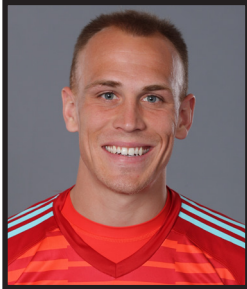

**BRAD FRIEDEL**  
HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017, and owns a 5-3-2 record through 10 games.
- One of the most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- Decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in a 13-year senior career.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- Appeared in a league-record 310 consecutive Premier League contests and ranks among the top 10 with 132 clean sheets.

Brad Friedel is in his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

Friedel, 46, joins the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player,

assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's preeminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history.

As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



**MIKE LAPPER**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is in his first season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international enters his 10th MLS season as a coach and his 16th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 13 years of coaching experience to New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. He most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporter's Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating in the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



**MARCELO NEVELEFF**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is in his first season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Interregional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. Garcia, who was also known as Ruben Martin during his playing days, spent time with clubs including Toledo CV, Alaves CF, Albacete, Atlético Madrid, Ciudad de Murcia, Talavera, and Alcalá de Henares.

Garcia graduated from the University of San Pablo CEU in Madrid in 2006 with a Bachelor Degree in Criminology.



**ANTON McELHONE**  
HEAD OF FITNESS

Anton McElhone is in his first season as Head of Fitness for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in December 2017. He brings significant fitness experience with top-flight clubs in the United Kingdom to the Revolution, most recently with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club.

McElhone has spent the last 10 years on the technical staff of Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur F.C., including the last six as the club's First Team Fitness and Conditioning Coach. He assumed the role in July 2011 after nearly four years as the Development and Fitness Coach of the Under-21 and Under-18 squads, where he oversaw strength and conditioning and sports science beginning in November 2007.

Prior to joining Tottenham, McElhone began his professional career as the First Team Sports Scientist with Hibernian FC in the top-flight Scottish Premiership. He spent three years with Hibs from 2004-07, and during that time earned his Master of Science degree in strength and conditioning from the University of Edinburgh.

McElhone received his undergraduate degree in sports studies with exercise science from the University of the West of Scotland in 2004, and also holds a UEFA A coaching license.



**MICHAEL BURNS**  
GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is in his 14th season with the New England Revolution and his seventh as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management.

Since Burns assumed his role ahead of the 2012 season, the club amassed a 78-82-44 record in his first six seasons, improving upon its five-win campaign in 2011 with a core of burgeoning, explosive players. The Revolution made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2013 through 2015, a run that included the Revs' fifth trip to MLS Cup in 2014.

The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before earning a promotion to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns serves on MLS' Technical Committee and its Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



**REMI ROY**  
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his ninth season with the New England Revolution and his first as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

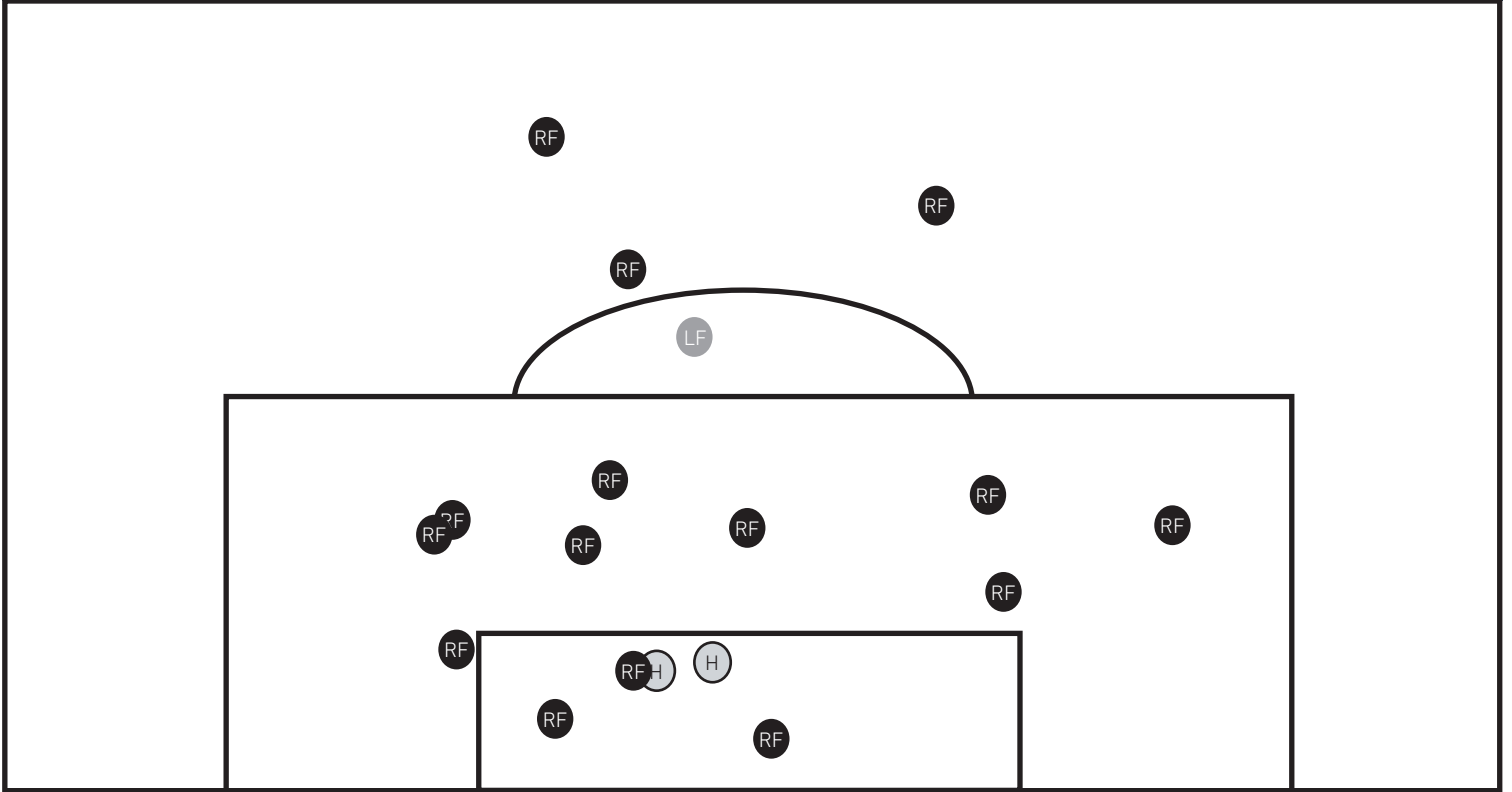
