New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On the challenges presented by the Chicago Fire:

Coach Friedel: "They have a couple of very good players, as everyone knows. I think it's important that we take control of the transitions in the game. I think that will be very important. I think we need to try to possess the ball. I think we could frustrate them a little bit if we do so in the areas, but there's not going to be a lot of changing our philosophy against them. We're going to do and try to do a lot of the things we've been successful with this season. We just need to shore up and fix a few minor problems."

New England Revolution Forward Teal Bunbury

On having several players going into the road trip fresh:

Bunbury: "It's so important. I've been in this league a long time and it's a lot about having fresh legs, it's a lot about having depth on your team, especially come summertime when a lot of these games kind of bunch up together. A lot of it boils down to your mindset and your mentality, and knowing that maybe you're not going to get as much rest as you might need or want, but knowing that you put the work in in preseason and through the rest of the season to be ready to grind these games out."

WHAT TO WATCH FOR vs. CHICAGO

- The Revolution tallying at least two goals for the ninth time through the club's first 15 matches. The Revs are 5-1-2 when scoring at least two goals this season.
- The Revs remaining undefeated in 2018 when **Teal Bunbury** (5-0-3), **Diego Fagundez** (3-0-1), or **Cristian Penilla** (2-0-2) scores a goal. Penilla and Bunbury have both scored in the same match three times in the club's last four away games (at Houston, at Columbus, and at Vancouver).
- New England snapping a four-match losing streak against the Chicago Fire in MLS regular season play. Last week, the Revs ended a three-match losing skid against the New York Red Bulls with a 2-1 win.

- F Teal Bunbury** finding the net for the ninth time in the club's last 12 games. Bunbury has scored in eight-of-11 games dating back to March 31 at Houston.
- Bunbury** (seven) scoring two non-penalty kick goals to tie Bradley Wright-Phillips (nine) for the most in MLS this season. Bunbury's eight total goals are four shy of the league leader, Josef Martinez (12).
- Bunbury** continuing to lead the league in game-winning goals. He enters the week with five on the season, two more than any other MLS player.
- Bunbury** moving into the league's top five in shots on goal. He currently ranks tied for sixth in MLS with 19 shots on target.
- F Cristian Penilla** recording a sixth primary assist on the season to tie Miguel Almiron (Atlanta) and Romell Quioto (Houston) for the league lead.
- Penilla** scoring one away goal to become the sixth MLS player to record at least three goal and three assists on the road in 2018.
- M Diego Fagundez** moving closer to a pair of MLS milestones: 200 regular season MLS appearances and 150 regular starts starts. He currently has 197 games played and 147 starts.

Forward **Teal Bunbury** is in excellent form through 14 games of the 2018 season. The ninth-year MLS veteran paces the Revolution with eight goals, good for the fourth most in MLS. Excluding penalties, Bunbury's seven goals are only two shy of the MLS lead (nine) held by Bradley Wright-Phillips.

With his next goal, Bunbury will match his previous single-season career high of nine goals, a mark he set in 2011 with Sporting Kansas City. All eight goals of his tallies have come in the club's last 11 matches dating back to March 31 at Houston.

Bunbury also leads MLS in game-winning goals this season with five, two more than any other player in the league. The club record for game-winning goals in a season is nine, set by Lee Nguyen in 2014. In addition, Bunbury's 19 shots on goal are tied for the sixth most in MLS.

TURNER THRIVING IN STARTING ROLE

Third-year goalkeeper **Matt Turner** has been a revelation for the Revolution this season, starting every MLS match to date for New England after claiming the starting role in preseason. In his 14 league appearances, Turner has posted a 6-4-4 record, a 1.43 goals against average, 51 saves, and three shutouts.

Turner's 2018 campaign has featured a number of memorable moments, including his save of a Colorado Rapids penalty attempt on March 10 which earned him a spot on MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week. In total, he has made the league's Team of the Week three times, twice as a starter and once on the bench. The New Jersey native has also earned JetBlue Man of the Match honors, selected by the fans, on three occasions this season.

Forward **Cristian Penilla** has added an electric element to the Revolution attack in his debut MLS campaign. In 14 starts, Penilla has contributed five goals and a team-best five assists. Two of those helpers have been game-winning assists, including his latest on June 2 vs. New York Red Bulls.

Penilla's most recent goal came in the Revs' 3-3 draw at Vancouver Whitecaps FC on May 26, an outing for which he earned MLSsoccer.com Team of the Week honors. Penilla has made the league's Team of the Week four times this season, the most selections among Revolution players.

REVS CLOSE OUT HOME-HEAVY STRETCH

On June 2 vs. New York, the Revs concluded a critical stretch of the season that included seven out of 10 matches at home beginning on April 6. In those seven games, New England posted a 4-2-1 record at Gillette Stadium. In all, 12 of the team's first 19 matches this season will be set in Foxborough, including three straight games from June 30 - July 14 following the upcoming two-match road swing at Chicago and San Jose.

To date, New England owns a 5-2-2 home record in 2018 with a +6 goal differential. In 2017, the Revs set a club record for home wins by posting an impressive 12-2-3 mark at Gillette Stadium. FRIEDEL NAMED TO NATIONAL SOCCER HALL OF FAME 2018 CLASS

Revolution Head Coach **Brad Friedel** has been named to the National Soccer Hall of Fame 2018 class in his first year of eligibility, U.S. Soccer announced on May 31. Friedel was delivered the news by his former U.S. Men's National Team teammate and current U.S. Youth National Team technical director Tab Ramos in a surprise announcement on May 31. The Class of 2018 will be enshrined during an induction ceremony on October 20 at the brand-new National Soccer Hall of Fame at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.

Friedel's recognition came after a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League and 13 years with the USMNT. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances, including a record 310 consecutive starts, in England's top flight. As a U.S. international, he collected 82 caps and was a member of three World Cup squads (1994, 1998, and 2002). The Lakewood, Ohio native also represented the U.S. at two Olympics Games in 1992 and 2000, and earned the 1992 Hermann Trophy as the NCAA's top collegiate player while at UCLA.

The 2018 class includes four members in addition to Friedel: former U.S. Women's National Team stars Cindy Parlow Cone (veteran) and Tiffeny Milbrett (player), MLS Commissioner Don Garber (builder), and former U.S. Soccer president Dr. Bob Contiguglia (builder).

HERIVAUX REPRESENTS HAITI AGAINST MESSI, ARGENTINA

Revolution midfielder **Zachary Herivaux** started and played 67 minutes for the Haiti National Team in its friendly against the Argentina "A" National Team on May 29. The match was Argentina's last before departing for the 2018 FIFA World Cup™ in Russia, and it afforded the Revolution Home-grown Player the chance to square off with Barcelona's Lionel Messi.

Herivaux, 22, debuted for Haiti's senior team in a friendly against Japan on Oct. 10, 2017. The Brookline, Mass., native played 90 minutes and registered an assist in the 3-3 draw. He also represented Haiti at the youth level in the 2015 CONCACAF Under-20 Championship.

With New England this season, Herivaux has made one substitute appearances and earned six additional selections to the 18-man matchday squad. Herivaux started the club's lone U.S. Open Cup match in central midfield and played all 90 minutes at Louisville City FC on June 5.



SEGBERS RETURNS FROM PRODUCTIVE USL LOAN SPELL

Rookie midfielder/defender **Mark Segbers**, the ninth-overall pick in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, gained valuable experience during his loan spell with USL side Orange County SC. In his time with Orange County from March 15—May 28, 2018, Segbers made 11 appearances, including eight starts, and tallied two goals with three assists. His goal total is tied for second on the squad, while his three helpers are tied for the ninth most among USL players.

Segbers' most productive professional match to date came on April 7 vs. LA Galaxy II, when he registered a brace in the victory. The performance earned him a spot on the USL Team of the Week. The St. Louis, Mo. native notched his first pro assist on March 28 at OKC Energy FC, and his second helper came just a few days later on March 31 at Tulsa Roughnecks FC. Segbers joined Real Monarchs SLC's Maikel Chang and Swope Park Rangers' Hadji Berry for the USL lead with his third assist on April 14 at San Antonio FC.

Segbers returned from his loan on May 28 and made his New England debut in the club's U.S. Open Cup Fourth Round match at Louisville City FC on June 5. Segbers started on the right wing, played 90 minutes, and scored the game's opening goal in the fifth minute, his first in a Revs uniform.

WHEN THE "REVS SCORE, BOSTON SCORES"

The Revolution and Boston SCORES are continuing to team up through the "Revs Score, Boston SCORES" initiative to assist under-resourced youth in the greater Boston area. For every goal the Revolution score at Gillette Stadium this season, the New England Revolution Charitable Foundation will contribute \$100, which equates to the cost of one week of programming for a child. Through nine home games in 2018, the Revs have raised **\$1,500** for Boston SCORES, or **15 full weeks of programming**.

The collaboration, which began in October 2016, expands player involvement with youth in Boston SCORES' after-school program through Academy-run soccer clinics and participation in SCORES' Service Learning Projects.

In addition, the 14th annual SCORES Cup will take place at Gillette Stadium on Saturday, June 16. Last year's event raised over \$320,000 for Boston SCORES. In partnership with the Revolution, the 2017 edition of the corporate charity soccer tournament brought over 600 players and more than 50 sponsors together for the record-breaking fundraising event.

For every Revolution goal scored at Gillette Stadium this season, the New England Revolution Charitable Foundation will contribute \$100 per goal to BOSTON SCORES.

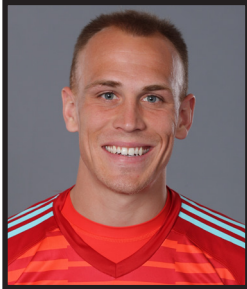

BRAD FRIEDEL
HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's seventh head coach on November 9, 2017, and owns a 6-4-4 record through 14 games.
- One of the most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- Decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in a 13-year senior career.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- Appeared in a league-record 310 consecutive Premier League contests and ranks among the top 10 with 132 clean sheets.

Brad Friedel is in his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

Friedel, 46, joins the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player,

assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's preeminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history.

As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER
ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is in his first season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international enters his 10th MLS season as a coach and his 16th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 13 years of coaching experience to New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. He most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporter's Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating in the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



MARCELO NEVELEFF
ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is in his first season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Interregional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

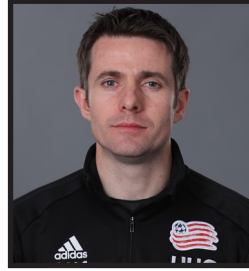
Ruben Garcia is in his first season as Assistant Coach/Goalkeeping Coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. Garcia, who was also known as Ruben Martin during his playing days, spent time with clubs including Toledo CV, Alaves CF, Albacete, Atlético Madrid, Ciudad de Murcia, Talavera, and Alcalá de Henares.

Anton McElhone is in his first season as Head of Fitness for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in December 2017. He brings significant fitness experience with top-flight clubs in the United Kingdom to the Revolution, most recently with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club.

McElhone has spent the last 10 years on the technical staff of Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur F.C., including the last six as the club's First Team Fitness and Reconditioning Coach. He assumed the role in July 2011 after nearly four years as the Development and Fitness Coach of the Under-21 and Under-18 squads, where he oversaw strength and conditioning and sports science beginning in November 2007.

Prior to joining Tottenham, McElhone began his professional career as the First Team Sports Scientist with Hibernian FC in the top-flight Scottish Premiership. He spent three years with Hibs from 2004-07, and during that time earned his Master of Science degree in strength and conditioning from the University of Edinburgh.

McElhone received his undergraduate degree in sports studies with exercise science from the University of the West of Scotland in 2004, and also holds a UEFA A coaching license.

GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is in his 14th season with the New England Revolution and his seventh as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management.

Since Burns assumed his role ahead of the 2012 season, the club amassed a 78-82-44 record in his first six seasons, improving upon its five-win campaign in 2011 with a core of burgeoning, explosive players. The Revolution made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2013 through 2015, a run that included the Revs' fifth trip to MLS Cup in 2014.

The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before earning a promotion to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns serves on MLS' Technical Committee and its Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his ninth season with the New England Revolution and his first as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

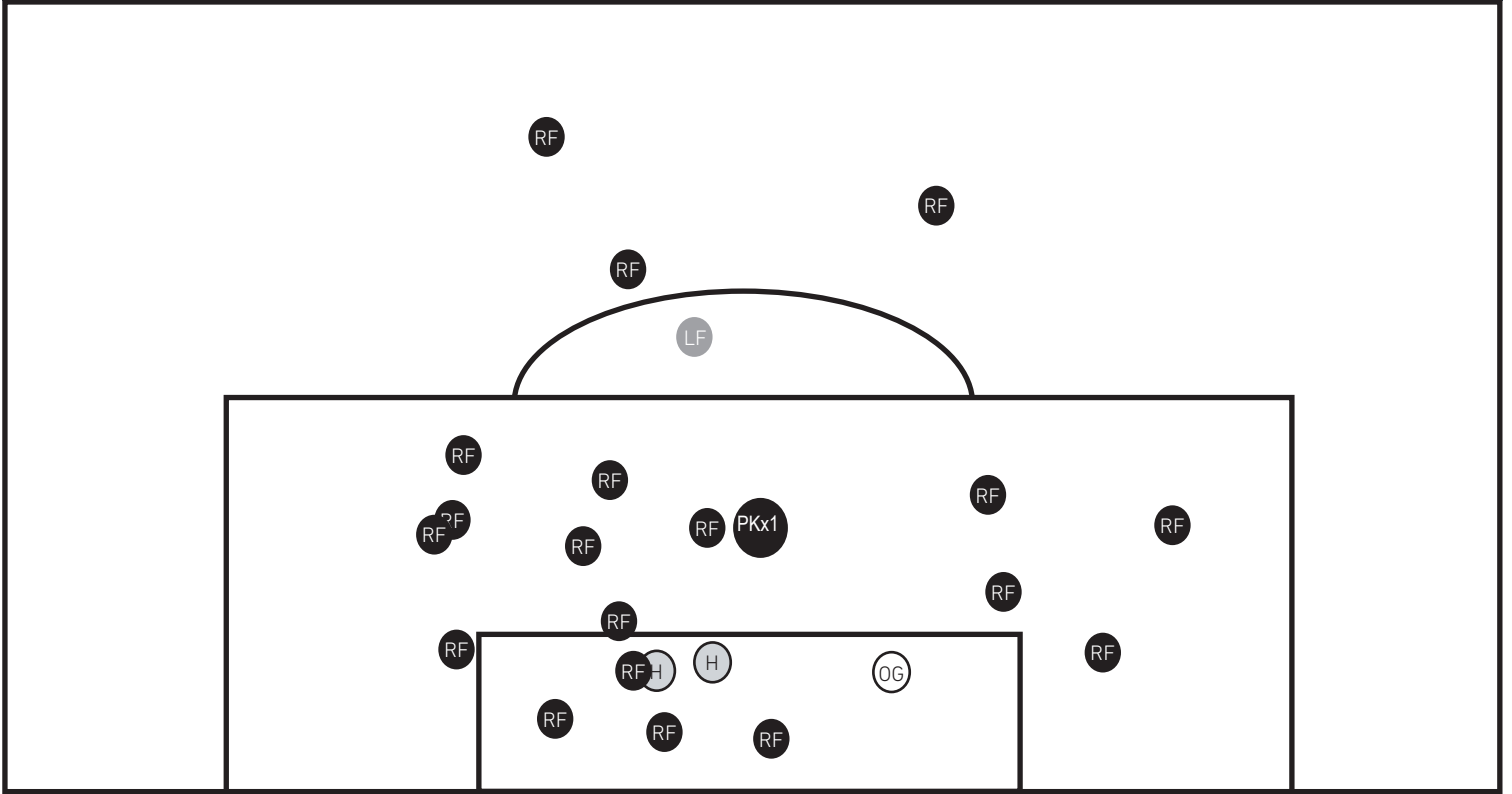
