New England Revolution Head Coach Brad Friedel

On the team's mentality heading into the season's final two games:

Coach Friedel: "To win the games – that's the primary objective. We're still in the season and we still want to finish as high up on the table as we can. We want to get maximum points out of the next two games. I don't think any time, as a pro, when you go out onto the field, whether it's a friendly or a league game or a cup final, you're going to want to go out to try to lose. It's going to be important for the players to keep concentrating, keep focused, and work really hard to get maximum points out of the last two games."

New England Revolution Forward Teal Bunbury

On the club breaking ground on a new training facility on Monday:

Bunbury: "This is huge for the program – I can't stress that enough. Not just for all the players and the first team, but the Academy. It's something that has been needed for a long time, and I'm really proud that I'm here and a part of that. I know the rest of the guys in the locker room are really proud, happy and grateful to the Krafts, to [Brian] Bilello, to [Mike] Burns to everybody who's kind of put that together. It's going to be a special place, and I'm really excited to get going and start training there."

New England Revolution Midfielder Scott Caldwell

On Thursday's matchup with Real Salt Lake:

Caldwell: "They're a very good team. They're sitting on the line, I believe, and they need to get a win, but so do we. We want to end the season strong. It's going to take another collective team effort on the road and we're prepared to go out and try to get a win."

REVOLUTION BREAK GROUND ON NEW TRAINING CENTER

On Monday, the Revolution broke ground on the Revolution Training Center, a world-class facility that will be the center of the Revolution first team and Academy operations. Integrated into the surrounding wetlands at Gillette Stadium, upon completion the Revolution Training Center will feature state-of-the-art fitness and medical centers, six professional-grade fields, a team dining and lounge space, and office space for the club's technical staff and front office, amongst other amenities.

The new privately-financed, \$35-million development will give the New England Revolution one of the most expansive team facilities in Major League Soccer. The center will span 68 acres with 42,000 square feet of buildings and three new full-size fields – two natural grass surfaces and one turf pitch. With the club's existing training field, Gillette Stadium, and the Empower Field House, upon completion the center will feature a total of six professional-grade fields. The existing natural grass field will be dedicated for use by the Revolution Academy.



Construction began with the groundbreaking ceremony on Monday, Oct. 15, and completion is scheduled for the summer of 2019. The two natural grass surfaces, both dedicated for first team use, are expected to open in spring 2019.

Designed in collaboration with global architecture firm Populous and landscaping consultants Activitas, the training center's layout is framed to prioritize ecological preservation. The complex will be integrated around the area's restored wetlands and blend seamlessly into the surrounding environment, embracing the densely wooded aesthetic of New England. Pedestrian and cart pathways will connect the main facility with its adjacent training fields.

In addition to cutting-edge amenities for the first team, which also include an on-site barbershop for the first team, the Revolution's training facility will house members of the front office and technical staff. The complex will feature office space, multiple conference rooms, and a state-of-the-art in-house media studio.

TEAM NOTES

GO, DIEGO, GO: FAGUNDEZ APPROACHING MORE MILESTONES

Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** has been thriving in a central attacking mid-field role this season. In addition to his team-best nine assists, a single-season career high, he has tallied eight goals through 31 appearances this season. With one more goal, Fagundez (23years, 244 days on Oct. 18) could become the first MLS player to hit the 50-goal mark before his 24th birthday, per the Elias Sports Bureau. Only two players have done so at 25-or-younger: Landon Donovan (24 years, 175 days) and Carlos Ruiz (24 years, 341 days). Fagundez also ranks second all-time in goals scored by a Homegrown Player in MLS, trailing only Gyasi Zardes (50).

In addition to closing in on the 50-goal mark, Fagundez is only two goals shy of matching Lee Nguyen (51) for the second-most goals scored in Revolution history. If those three goals come in 2018, Fagundez will give New England three 10-goal scorers for the first time in club history.

On Aug. 11, Fagundez registered his 40th assist and joined Lee Nguyen (51G/49A) and Steve Ralston (42G/73A) in the Revs' exclusive 40-goal and 40-assist club. He notched his 41st assist on Oct. 6 at Atlanta, surpassing teammates Kelyn Rowe and Chris Tierney for sole possession of third place in the club record book. Fagundez also paces MLS in chances created away from home this season with 48 – 10 more than any other players – and ranks third overall with 86 chances created.

Fagundez added another milestone to his résumé on June 30 vs. D.C. United, becoming the youngest player in MLS history to appear in 200 regular season MLS matches at 23 years and 136 days old. On the same night, he also became the second-youngest player, behind only Eddie Gaven (22 years, 245 days), to reach 150 career starts in MLS history, per the Elias Sports Bureau.

The Homegrown midfielder currently ranks fifth in club history in all-time appearances (215) and ninth in club history in all-time starts (162). For his career, Fagundez has already set a number of age-related club records as the youngest player to:

Forward **Cristian Penilla** has infused an electric element into New England's attack in his debut MLS campaign. Across 31 appearances, Penilla has contributed 12 goals and seven assists. With his goal on Sept. 22 vs. Chicago, he gave the Revs a pair of players with at least 10 goals – along with **Teal Bunbury** – for only the fifth time in club history. He now also owns the most goals ever by an international signing in his first season with the Revolution, passing French striker Saer Sene, who tallied 11 times in 2012.

Meanwhile, Bunbury is enjoying the best scoring campaign of his nine-year MLS career. MANCIENNE BRINGS TOP-FLIGHT EXPERIENCE TO NEW ENGLAND

The Revolution announced a key addition to the squad on Aug. 3, signing defender **Michael Mancienne** on a free transfer from EFL Championship side Nottingham Forest F.C. Since his arrival, the veteran center back has integrated seamlessly into the Revs' backline, starting eight games.

Mancienne made his debut in a Revolution shirt on Aug. 19 at D.C. United, just days after joining the team. Despite a short acclimation period, he slotted into the starting XI in central defense and provided a calm, composed presence for the Revs' backline. In a 90-minute shift, Mancienne recorded 55 touches, four tackles, and completed 88.1 percent of his passes. He has played all 90 minutes in eight of the Revolution's last nine games overall, and helped anchored the team to clean sheets on Sept. 5 at New York City and Oct. 13 vs. Orlando. Mancienne missed the club's match at LAFC on Sept. 15 for the birth of his first child, Noah, on Sept. 13.

A former England youth international and graduate of Chelsea's youth system with 99 combined career appearances in the English Premier League and German Bundesliga, Mancienne officially began training with the club on Aug. 16. The six-foot-one defender brings a bevy of experience, including more than 320 senior appearances and 25,000 minutes played across Europe with Chelsea (2006-11), Queens Park Rangers (2006-08), Wolverhampton (2008-11), Hamburger SV (2011-14), and Forest (2014-18).



FARRELL AMONG MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER IRONMEN

Since joining the Revolution as the first-overall selection in the 2013 MLS SuperDraft, defender **Andrew Farrell** has been virtually irreplaceable as one of the club's defensive anchors. Until suffering a hamstring injury on Sept. 29 in Toronto, he was the only Revolution player to start every MLS match this season through the team's first 30 games. The Louisville, Ky. native ranks first among all MLS field players, and second overall, in regular season games started and minutes played since the start of 2013. He is tied with Revolution Homegrown Player **Diego Fagundez** for third in games played.

BYE THE WAY: BRANDON AMONG MOST PRODUCTIVE ROOKIES

Defender **Brandon Bye** has gained valuable experience in his first professional season, emerging as one of Brad Friedel's go-to selections at outside back. Selected by New England with the eighth-overall pick in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft, Bye has appeared in 14 straight matches, including eight consecutive starts at left back between Aug. 4 and Sept. 22. Friedel's trust in Bye paid dividends in the club's 1-1 draw at LAFC on Sept. 15, when Bye opened his professional account with the equalizing goal in the 82nd minute.

HOMEGROWN HERIVAUX MAKES FIRST MLS START

On Oct. 6 at Atlanta, Brookline native and Revolution Homegrown Player Zachary Herivaux made his first career MLS start. The Revolution Academy graduate played 69 minutes in central midfield and registered 21 touches, one tackle, and one foul won.

Since signing his first professional contract in May 2015, Herivaux has recorded 533 minutes played in 16 appearances across all competitions. He has scored twice at the professional level, with both goals coming in U.S. Open Cup play.

On the international stage, Herivaux is growing into a fixture for the Haiti National Team. A tri-citizen of the United States, Haiti, and Japan, Herivaux opted to represent Les Grenadiers' in 2017, and debuted with the senior team in a friendly at Japan on Oct. 10, 2017. Since then, the midfielder has collected three additional caps, and is poised to notch another on Oct. 16, when Haiti faces Saint Lucia in a CONCACAF Nations League Qualifying match.



FRIEDEL NAMED TO NATIONAL SOCCER HALL OF FAME 2018 CLASS

Revolution Head Coach **Brad Friedel** has been named to the National Soccer Hall of Fame 2018 class in his first year of eligibility, U.S. Soccer announced on May 31. Friedel was delivered the news by his former U.S. Men's National Team teammate and current U.S. Youth National Team technical director Tab Ramos in a surprise announcement on May 31. The Class of 2018 will be enshrined during an induction ceremony on October 20 at the brand-new National Soccer Hall of Fame at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.

Friedel's recognition came after a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League and 13 years with the USMNT. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances, including a record 310 consecutive starts, in England's top flight. As a U.S. international, he collected 82 caps and was a member of three World Cup squads (1994, 1998, and 2002). The Lakewood, Ohio native also represented the U.S. at two Olympics Games in 1992 and 2000, and earned the 1992 Hermann Trophy as the NCAA's top collegiate player while at UCLA.

The 2018 class includes four members in addition to Friedel: former U.S. Women's National Team stars Cindy Parlow Cone (veteran) and Tiffeny Milbrett (player), MLS Commissioner Don Garber (builder), and former U.S. Soccer president Dr. Bob Contiguglia (builder).

A MEMORABLE MONTH FOR HOMEGROWN PLAYER ISAAC ANGKING

Revolution midfielder **Isaac Angking**, who became the club's fourth ever Homegrown Player signing in January 2018 after more than four years with the club's Academy, made his home debut in the club's 2-0 win over Orlando City SC on Oct. 13. In his previous appearance on Sept. 15 at LAFC, the Providence, R.I., native played nine minutes after replacing fellow Homegrown Player Diego Fagundez, and chested a ball down to Teal Bunbury that led to Brandon Bye's equalizing goal.

Angking made his professional debut as a second-half substitute in the Revolution's crucial 1-0 away win on Sept. 5 at New York City. He contributed a calm, composed performance that helped New England protect its 1-0 lead and snap a nine-game winless run. In 19 minutes of play, he recorded one shot – which hit the post – one chance created, 12 touches, and nine passes. The 18-year-old signed a Homegrown Player contract with the Revs on Jan. 2, 2018, but missed several months with a non-soccer related illness.

One day after making his MLS debut, Angking flew to Bradenton, Fla., where he joined the United States Under-19 Men's National Team for the 2018 U.S. Soccer U-20 Men's Invitational. The camp marked his first international appearance at the U-19 level. The four-team tournament also featured the U.S. U-20 MNT, the Jamaica U-20 National Team, and Venezuela. Angking appeared in each of the U-19's three matches, starting two, and helped the side finish atop the tournament table with seven points. He also converted a penalty kick in the U-19's final match against the Jamaica U-20s, a 4-1 win for the Americans.



KNIGHTON SLOTS IN BETWEEN THE STICKS FOR REVS

Goalkeeper **Brad Knighton** has provided a calming presence since making his return to the Revolution's starting lineup on Sept. 5 at New York City. Knighton made his first league start of the season at Yankee Stadium and helped deliver a shutout win with a six-save effort. He has backstopped the Revs to a 2-2-2 record over the club's last six games.

The 11th-year veteran has posted 29 saves during his run of starts, which is second most among all MLS goalkeepers since Sept. 1, trailing only D.C. United's Bill Hamid (32).

Knighton, 33, is currently in his second stint with New England after re-joining the club as a free agent in 2014. Of his 63 career MLS starts in net, 36 of them have come with the Revs, good for the sixth-most starts among goalkeepers in club history. The UNC-Wilmington Hall of Famer became the sixth Revs keeper to eclipse 3,000 minutes played on Sept. 29 at Toronto.

GUILLERMO HAUCHÉ FACTORS INTO REVS ROTATION

On Sept. 13, the Revolution signed Argentine forward/midfielder **Guillermo Hauche**. Hauché, a 25-year-old native of La Plata, Argentina, has experience in both Argentina and Chile's top-flight divisions after six professional seasons in the Argentine Superleague, Argentine Primera B Nacional, and Chilean Primera División. Prior to joining MLS, the attacker amassed more than 2,000 minutes and played in 33 appearances across all competitions.

Hauché made his MLS debut as a halftime substitute in the club's 2-2 draw on Sept. 22 vs. Chicago. In 45 minutes of action, Hauche delivered a spark from the right wing, registering one shot and 36 touches. He earned a spot in New England's starting XI on Sept. 29 at Toronto, and played 59 minutes in his first career MLS start. He logged a second consecutive start on Oct. 6 at Atlanta, and played 14 minutes as a substitute on Oct. 13 vs. Orlando.

A product of Club Atlético Lanús' youth system, Hauché began his professional career with Argentine powerhouse Racing Club in 2013. He made three appearances, including two starts, for La Academia in the 2013-14 campaign, before joining second-division side Almargo on loan for the 2015 season. In 2017, Hauché completed another loan stint with Unión Española of Chile's Primera División. Most recently, the forward played for another Chilean Primera División outfit, Deportes Temuco, on loan from Racing Club and made eight appearances.

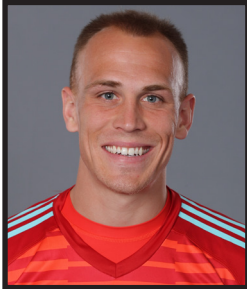
Forward **Brian Wright** made the most of his first career MLS start on Sept. 5 at New York City, opening his professional account with the game's lone goal in the 70th minute. Wright cleaned up a rebound with his left foot to put New England ahead, 1-0, and ultimately take all three points from the pivotal intraconference clash. With Teal Bunbury sidelined, Wright stepped up and submitted a solid 70-minute shift, which also included a shot that hit both posts in the 25th minute.

Wright again slotted into New England's starting XI against LAFC and played 57 minutes in the 1-1 draw. He put a shot on net that forced a difficult save from LAFC goalkeeper Tyler Miller in the 55th minute.

An imposing six-foot-one, 200-pound forward, Wright was selected by the Revolution with the 20th-overall pick in the 2017 MLS SuperDraft after scoring 39 goals at the University of Vermont – good for second most in school history. In his MLS career to date, he has registered 245 minutes played across 10 appearances, eight of them coming as a substitute.

- One of the most experienced goalkeepers in English Premier League history with 450 league appearances over 17 seasons with Liverpool, Blackburn Rovers, Aston Villa, and Tottenham Hotspur.
- Decorated U.S. international with 82 career caps and six FIFA World Cup appearances in a 13-year senior career.
- Developed young talent with Tottenham Hotspur's academy, multiple U.S. Youth National Teams, and as head coach of the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team.
- Appeared in a league-record 310 consecutive Premier League contests and ranks among the top 10 with 132 clean sheets.
- First-ballot inductee to the National Soccer Hall of Fame as part of the 2018 class.

Brad Friedel is in his first season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on November 9, 2017. The seventh head coach in club history, Friedel joins the Revolution following a decorated club career that spanned more than 20 professional seasons, including 17 in the English Premier League, and a 13-year international career with the United States Men's National Team.

Friedel, 46, joins the Revolution following two seasons at the helm of the U.S. Under-19 squad, during which he assisted with multiple other Youth National Team sides. He helped guide the Under-20 national team to the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship as an assistant under Tab Ramos. Friedel holds a UEFA 'Pro' Coaching License, the

highest certification available, and began accruing valuable coaching experience in his final seasons as a player, assisting in player development at all levels of the Tottenham Academy.

The Lakewood, Ohio native established himself as one of the most distinguished players in American soccer history through a 22-year professional career. After brief stints with Turkish powerhouse Galatasaray (1995-96) and Major League Soccer's Columbus Crew (1996-97), he joined Liverpool F.C. of the English Premier League, where he would thrive for the next 18 years as one of the England's preeminent goalkeepers. Between 1997 and 2015, Friedel made 450 league appearances in England's top flight with four clubs: Liverpool (1997-2000), Blackburn Rovers (2001-08), Aston Villa (2008-11), and Tottenham Hotspur (2011-15).

Friedel holds the Premier League record for most consecutive appearances with 310 and ranks third among goalkeepers in league history with 450 appearances, which is also the most games played in the league by an American. His 132 clean sheets and 771 saves both rank among the top 10 in Premier League history.

As a U.S. international, Friedel collected 82 international caps – the fourth most among American goalkeepers – and was a member of three United States World Cup squads in 1994, 1998, and 2002. He was the USMNT's first-choice goalkeeper for 2002 FIFA World Cup campaign, where he started all five matches and backstopped the team to a Quarterfinal appearance. In addition, Friedel represented the United States at two Olympic Games, having appeared at the 1992 Summer Olympics in Barcelona and the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney.



MIKE LAPPER
ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Lapper is in his first season as assistant coach with the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. The accomplished United States international enters his 10th MLS season as a coach and his 16th season in the league overall, having spent 15 campaigns with the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach (2005-13) and a defender (1997-2002).

Lapper brings more than 13 years of coaching experience to New England, including nine seasons in MLS as an assistant under with the Columbus Crew beginning in 2005. He most recently served as an assistant coach under Friedel with the U.S. Under-19 Men's National Team, and also spent two seasons alongside head coach Marlon LeBlanc as an assistant coach, and later as associate head coach, at West Virginia University from 2013-15.

The Redondo Beach, Calif. native began his coaching career in October 2004 as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-20 Men's National Team under Sigi Schmid. He served as an assistant during the 2005 FIFA World Youth Championship in the Netherlands. In 2005, Lapper joined the Columbus Crew as an assistant coach, where he worked with a number of head coaches, most notably Schmid from 2006-08, until 2013. During his tenure as an assistant coach, Lapper saw the Crew claim an MLS Cup (2008), two Supporter's Shields (2008, 2009), and an appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League Quarterfinals (2009).

In December 2013, Lapper was named as an assistant coach on West Virginia University's staff. Prior to the 2015 season, Lapper was elevated to the role of associate head coach. While Lapper was at West Virginia, the Mountaineers posted a record of 18-19-1 over two years. Following the 2015 season, Lapper joined Friedel as an assistant coach with the U.S. U-19 Men's National Team.

Before pursuing coaching, Lapper enjoyed a 12-year professional playing career as a defender from 1991-2002. Lapper played at both the club and international level, excelling for the U.S. Men's National Team from 1991-95. He earned 43 career caps with the United States, participating in the 1991 Pan American games, 1992 Summer Olympics, and 1995 Copa America tournament. Lapper was also on the USMNT roster for the 1994 FIFA World Cup.



MARCELO NEVELEFF
ASSISTANT COACH

Marcelo Neveleff is in his first season as assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in November 2017. Neveleff brings extensive coaching experience at both the domestic and international levels to New England. He most recently served as a U.S. Soccer technical advisor for the Southeastern United States as part of the Boys' Development Academy.

A native of Argentina, Neveleff has previously served as head coach for six different clubs over the course of his coaching career. He coached the Fort Lauderdale Strikers of the North American Soccer League (NASL) in 2015 after serving as manager for Bolivian top-flight sides C.D. Jorge Wilstermann (2011-12) and Club Aurora (2012). With Wilstermann, Neveleff led the club in the 2011 Copa Libertadores – the most prestigious club tournament in South America.

Prior to coaching in Colombia, Neveleff worked as an assistant coach with the NASL's Miami FC from 2009-10, and was head coach at Brazilian side Clube Desportivo Sete de Setembro from 2007-08. While with Sete de Setembro, Neveleff led the club to promotion into Brazil's top flight. He was also head coach for United States Interregional Soccer League (now USL) clubs Jacksonville Cyclones from 1997-98 and Myrtle Beach Sea Dawgs in 1999.

Before joining U.S. Soccer's Boys Development Academy as a technical advisor, Neveleff also spent time on the U.S. Soccer Federation's instructional staff and on the Under-14 Boy's National Team staff. He was a member of the coaching staff, along with Brad Friedel, for the Under-20 national team that won the 2017 CONCACAF U-20 Championship.

In addition to his coaching experience, Neveleff served as the technical director of Weston FC, a U.S. Soccer Development Academy and one of the preeminent youth clubs in South Florida, from 2009-15. He oversaw the development of both the boys and girls program and was named U.S. Soccer Academy Coach of the Year in 2010-11. In 2015, he helped the club earn an expansion bid to the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL).

Neveleff holds the USSF National 'A' and Youth coaching licenses.

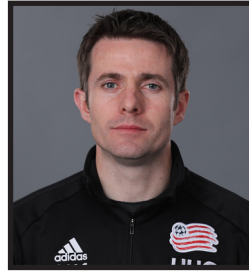

He brings a wealth of playing and coaching experience to the Revolution, most recently serving as the Academy Goalkeeper Director for New York City FC and Goalkeeping Coach for all United States Youth National Teams between the Under-14 and Under-23 age groups.

Prior to joining NYCFC in 2015, Garcia served on the technical staffs at Spanish powerhouse Atlético Madrid, in addition to the TSF Academy – an elite youth development program in New Jersey. From 2012-17, he coached goalkeepers at all levels of the U.S. Youth National Team program, where he worked alongside Friedel.

After concluding his player career in Spain, Garcia earned his UEFA 'B' professional football coaching license from the Spanish Soccer Federation in 2012. He later earned his UEFA 'A' coaching license in 2014, and is currently on course to secure his UEFA PRO license from the Spanish Soccer Federation.

Before entering the coaching ranks and moving to the United States, Garcia enjoyed a 14-year professional career. ANTON McELHONE
HEAD OF FITNESS

Anton McElhone is in his first season as Head of Fitness for the New England Revolution after joining Head Coach Brad Friedel's staff in December 2017. He brings significant fitness experience with top-flight clubs in the United Kingdom to the Revolution, most recently with Tottenham Hotspur Football Club.

McElhone has spent the last 10 years on the technical staff of Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur F.C., including the last six as the club's First Team Fitness and Conditioning Coach. He assumed the role in July 2011 after nearly four years as the Development and Fitness Coach of the Under-21 and Under-18 squads, where he oversaw strength and conditioning and sports science beginning in November 2007.

Prior to joining Tottenham, McElhone began his professional career as the First Team Sports Scientist with Hibernian FC in the top-flight Scottish Premiership. He spent three years with Hibs from 2004-07, and during that time earned his Master of Science degree in strength and conditioning from the University of Edinburgh.

MICHAEL BURNS
GENERAL MANAGER

Michael Burns is in his 14th season with the New England Revolution and his seventh as the team's General Manager. He was promoted to his current role in November 2011 after four seasons as the club's Vice President of Player Personnel.

As General Manager, Burns leads all aspects of the club's soccer operations, which includes oversight of the coaching staff, player acquisitions and scouting, the youth development program, and the team's day-to-day operations and management.

Since Burns assumed his role ahead of the 2012 season, the club amassed a 78-82-44 record in his first six seasons, improving upon its five-win campaign in 2011 with a core of burgeoning, explosive players. The Revolution made three consecutive playoff appearances from 2013 through 2015, a run that included the Revs' fifth trip to MLS Cup in 2014.

The former Revs defender and team captain returned to the club at the start of the 2005 season as Director of Soccer before earning a promotion to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008.

A mainstay in New England soccer circles, Burns was born and raised in nearby Marlborough, Mass., and was named Massachusetts High School Player of the Year in 1987. After a standout career at Hartwick College (1988-91), Burns became a regular for the U.S. Men's National Team, earning 75 caps including two starts for the USMNT in the 1998 FIFA World Cup. He was also a member of the 1994 U.S. World Cup squad.

In addition to his day-to-day duties with the Revolution, Burns serves on MLS' Technical Committee and its Combine Committee. Prior to returning to the Revolution in a management capacity, Burns served on the MLS Disciplinary Committee and was also a member of U.S. Soccer's Board of Directors and the U.S. Soccer Athlete Counsel.

Burns holds a USSF "A" coaching license. He also is a member of the Board of Directors of the Boys and Girls Club of MetroWest that includes Marlborough, Hudson, and Framingham.



REMI ROY
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his ninth season with the New England Revolution and his first as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his new role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

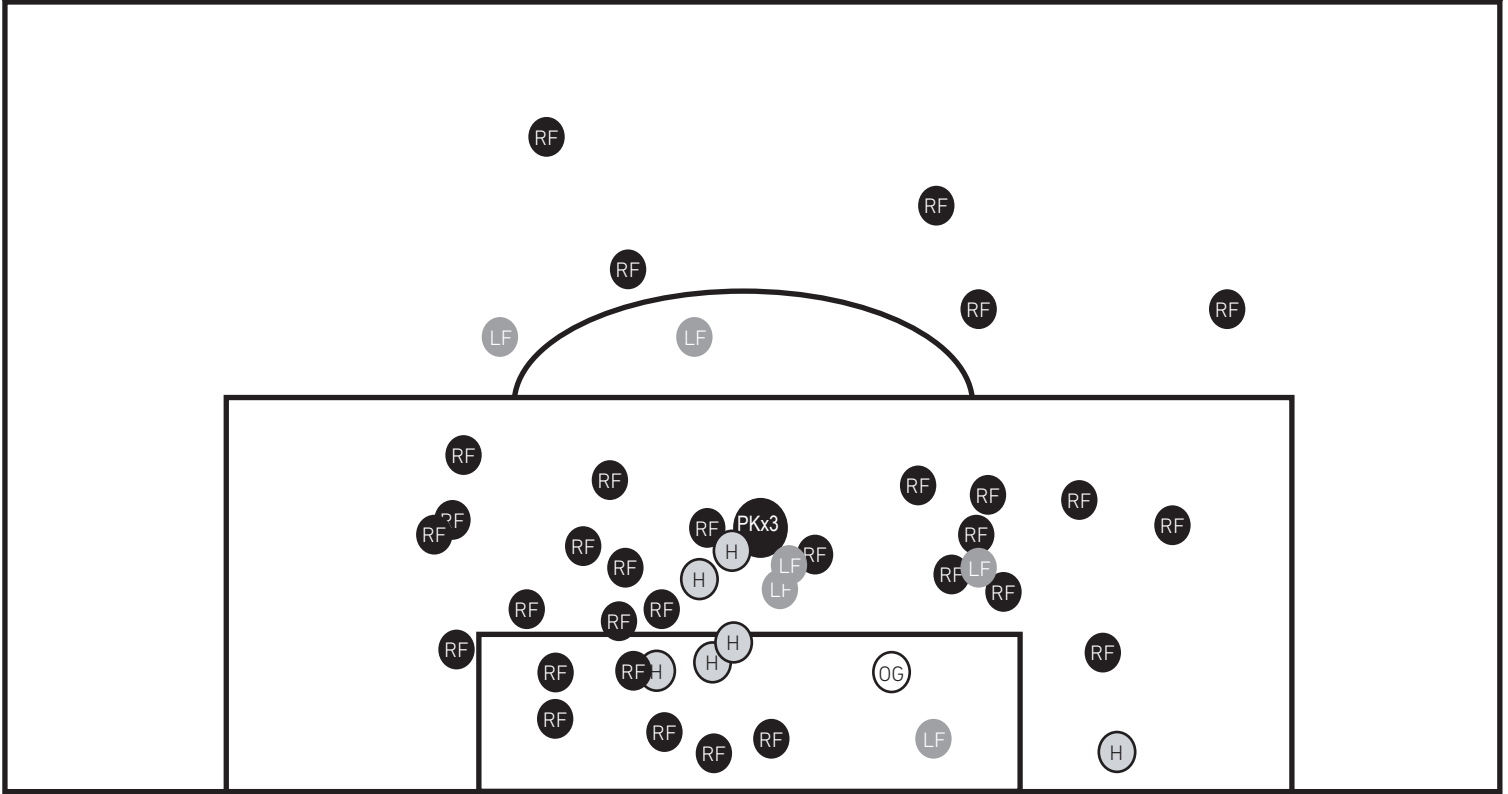
