GAME PREVIEW: New England Revolution at New York City FC *@NERevolution, #NERevs, #NYCvNE*

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. – The New England Revolution (7-10-9, 30 pts.) will travel to Yankee Stadium for a meeting with New York City FC (14-7-6, 48 pts.) in the clubs' second and final meeting of the season on Wednesday, Sept. 5. The match kicks off at 7:00 p.m. ET at Gillette Stadium and will be televised locally on NBC Sports Boston with Brad Feldman, Paul Mariner, and Naoko Funayama calling the action. Authenticated subscribers may stream the match on NBCSportsBoston.com and on the NBC Sports app. The contest airs on the radio with 98.5 The Sports Hub broadcasting the action in English and 1260 AM Nossa Radio providing Portuguese commentary.

The Revolution enter the midweek match aiming to snap a nine-game winless run and gain ground in the Eastern Conference playoff race, where the club sits six points back of a postseason berth in eighth place. The Revs played NYCFC to a 2-2 draw in the sides' first meeting on March 24 at Gillette Stadium, earning the point courtesy of goals from Diego Fagundez and Juan Agudelo, while Wilfried Zahibo contributed his first two MLS assists. New York City FC is an unbeaten 10-0-3 at home this season, while the Revs own a 1-2-2 all-time mark at Yankee Stadium.

Following Wednesday's match, the Revolution will return to action on Saturday, Sept. 15 when the club travels to Los Angeles for its inaugural meeting with expansion side LAFC. The match will kick off at 10:30 p.m. ET on NBC Sports Boston, 98.5 The Sports Hub, and 1260 AM Nossa Radio.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

Here are some relevant storylines ahead of Wednesday's match against New York City. Click [HERE](#) to view the complete Revolution Game Notes for Wednesday's match.

- New England potentially giving New York City FC (10-0-3 home record) its first loss at Yankee Stadium season, where the Revs are 1-2-2 since the series began in 2015.
- The club boasting at least two 10-goal scorers for the second straight year, and the fifth time in club history. **Teal Bunbury** has 11 goals while **Cristian Penilla** (9) and **Diego Fagundez** (7) are approaching the double-digit mark. The Revs have never had three players with 10-or-more goals in the same campaign.
- Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** recording two more goals to become the youngest MLS player to reach 50 career regular season goals, per the Elias Sport Bureau. Fagundez leads all active Revs players in career goals against NYCFC with four tallies.
- Defender **Michael Mancienne** potentially making his fourth MLS and Revolution appearance after playing 90 minutes in three straight matches.
- There are several notable connections between the Revolution and NYCFC:
 - Revolution defender **Jalil Anibaba** and NYCFC defender Saad Abdul-Salaam were teammates with Sporting Kansas City in 2015.
 - Abdul-Salaam and Revolution midfielder **Scott Caldwell** were teammates at Akron University in 2012.
 - Revolution assistant coach **Ruben Garcia** served as New York City FC's Academy Goalkeeper Director from 2015-17.
