REVS OPEN HOME SLATE, MEET MINNESOTA FOR FIRST TIME

New England opens its home slate against Minnesota United FC on Saturday following the postponement of its original home opener against Orlando City SC on March 11 due to extreme weather conditions.

The Revs enter Saturday's match with a 12-5-4 all-time record in home openers, including a 8-3-4 record in home openers at Gillette Stadium, which opened in May 2002. New England is unbeaten in its last 10 home openers, compiling a 6-0-4 record during the run. The team's last four home openers have all ended in scoreless draws.

Saturday's match also marks the Revs' first ever meeting with Minnesota United FC, which joined MLS this season as an expansion team. New England, one of Major League Soccer's eight charter clubs, has compiled a 5-4-4 record in its first matches against expansion sides.

- **M Lee Nguyen** scoring his 42nd career goal to tie Steve Ralston for the second most goals on the Revs' all-time chart.

- **M Kelyn Rowe** scoring three more goals to reach 30 for his MLS and Revolution career.
- **D Chris Tierney** joining Shalrie Joseph (254), Matt Reis (253), and Jay Heaps (238) as the only players to make at least 200 starts with the Revolution.

REVS-MINNESOTA UNITED FC CONNECTIONS

- Minnesota United FC goalkeeper **Bobby Shuttleworth** spent the first eight seasons of his professional career with the Revolution (2009-16). He ranks second in club history in games started in goal, minutes played in goal, wins, saves, and shutouts. He was traded to Minnesota in exchange for Femi Hollinger-Janzen on Feb. 15, 2017.
- Revolution forward **Femi Hollinger-Janzen** was selected by Minnesota in the fifth round of the 2016 MLS Expansion Draft. He was reacquired by New England in exchange for Bobby Shuttleworth on Feb. 15, 2017.
- Two Revolution players - goalkeeper **Cody Cropper** and forward **Teal Bunbury** - have roots in Minnesota. Cropper moved from Atlanta, Ga. to Maple Grove, Minn. at age 12 and played youth club soccer with the Minnesota Thunder, while Bunbury grew up in Prior Lake and attended Shattuck-St. Mary's High School.
- Revolution forward **Kei Kamara** and Minnesota United FC midfielder **Mohammed Saied** were teammates on Columbus Crew SC in 2015 and part of the 2016 season.
- Revolution assistant coach **Tom Soehn** previously served as Director of Development and Recruiting for the National Sports Center in Blaine, Minn. Soehn was also teammates with Minnesota's Sporting Director **Manny Lagos** for parts of two seasons with the Chicago Fire in 1998 and 1999.



TEAM NOTES

REVS NEW CENTER BACK PAIRING BUILDS CHEMISTRY

The Revolution opened the 2017 MLS season with a fresh look in central defense. In January, New England added a pair of center backs through the international market to reinforce its back line, acquiring Slovenian **Antonio Delamea** and Ivorian **Benjamin Angoua** to the roster using TAM (targeted allocation money). Both players made their Revolution debuts on March 4 at Colorado, playing the full 90 minutes, and again played full, 90-minute shifts against FC Dallas on March 18.

Delamea, 25, joined the Revolution via transfer from Slovenian first-division side Olimpija Ljubljana. He made a combined 134 appearances across all competitions in his senior career in Slovenia, registering five goals with three assists since going pro in 2008. Delamea's previous experience includes five campaigns with NK Olimpija Ljubljana (2011-17) in Slovenia's top-flight PrvaLiga, and three seasons with NK Interblock Ljubljana (2008-11) in both the PrvaLiga (2008-10) and the Slovenian Second League (2010-11). The Celje, Slovenia native earned his first international cap for the Slovenian National Team on Nov. 14, 2016, appearing as a halftime substitute in a friendly against Poland.

Angoua arrived in New England after making a combined 309 appearances across all competitions in France, Hungary, and Côte d'Ivoire. The 30-year-old spent the last seven years in France's Ligue 1, making 152 appearances and 138 starts for EA Guingamp (2014-17) and FC Valenciennes (2010-14). He also played with Budapest Honved (2006-10) in Hungary's OTP Bank Liga and Africa Sports (2004-06) in the Côte d'Ivoire Ligue 1. The Anyama, Côte d'Ivoire native has collected 17 international caps for Les Elephants, scoring one goal. Angoua has experience on the continental level as well, competing in the UEFA Europa League with both Guingamp and Budapest Honved.

KOUASSI PLAYS 79 MINUTES IN MLS DEBUT

Revolution midfielder and Designated Player **Xavier Kouassi** made his MLS debut in the club's match against FC Dallas on March 18. Kouassi started and played 79 minutes, managing 36 total touches, 22 total passes, three tackles, and completed 81.8 percent of his passes. With his debut, Kouassi became the third player from Côte d'Ivoire to appear for the Revolution, joining Arsene Oka and current teammate Benjamin Angoua.

Kouassi joined the Revolution in July 2016 after signing a pre-contract with the club in February 2016. He missed the entire 2016 campaign after suffering a torn ACL with FC Sion shortly after he was signed.

The Ivorian international joined the club in July 2016 after eight professional seasons in Switzerland, where he most recently captained FC Sion in the Swiss Super League from 2013-16. Kouassi also played four seasons with Servette FC (2009-13) in Switzerland and began his career in the top-flight Ivorian League 1.



REVS HEAD WEST EARLY AND OFTEN

This season, the Revolution travel to face a total of five Western Conference opponents, including four in the club's first five away trips. New England opened the season at the Colorado Rapids on March 4 and at FC Dallas on March 18. The Revolution's next two trips both take them to the Pacific Northwest for April for meetings with the Portland Timbers (April 2 on ESPN2) and defending MLS Cup champions Seattle Sounders FC (April 29). The Revs' final trip to play a Western Conference foe will be on Sept. 16 against Sporting Kansas City. In 2016, the Revolution posted a 1-1-3 away record against Western Conference opposition.

LIGHTS, KAMARA, ACTION!

Forward **Kei Kamara** enters the 2017 season with an eye on the MLS record books. Kamara currently sits in 12th place on the League's all-time goal-scoring chart after bringing his total to 86 last year, leaving him just two goals outside of the top 10.

He currently ranks second among active players in goals scored, trailing only San Jose's Chris Wondolowski, who has registered 122 goals in MLS regular season play for his career.

JUAN NATION, JUAN TEAM

Forward **Juan Agudelo** entered preseason having received a call up to the United States Men's National Team for its annual January Camp. He now owns 23 caps in his senior international career.

Under the guidance of recently hired head coach Bruce Arena, Agudelo appeared in both of the USMNT's friendlies against Serbia and Jamaica. After appearing as a late-game substitute against Serbia on Jan. 29, Agudelo started and played a full, 90-minute shift against Jamaica on Feb. 3, helping lead the United States to a 1-0 win.

The call up was Agudelo's second since October, when he was named to the USMNT's squad for a friendly against New Zealand on Oct. 11. New England's reigning Golden Boot winner will be seeking a spot on Bruce Arena's roster for an upcoming pair of 2018 FIFA World Cup Qualifiers in late March.

In the Feb. 3 match against Jamaica, Agudelo suffered a small facial bone fracture. The forward underwent a successful minor procedure to reduce the fracture and has worn a protective mask since rejoining the Revolution in February.

TEAM NOTES

REVS BEGIN 2017 IN DIAMOND

The Revolution will seek to build off the success of last season's switch to a 4-4-2 diamond formation. New England made the transition to the new alignment on Aug. 24, 2016 at San Jose and concluded the season with a 5-3-1 mark in its final nine matches.

The offense saw an uptick in production with the switch to the formation, as New England averaged 1.66 goals per game and recorded three goals in four of its final nine 2016 matches. The Revs also recorded at least 13 shots in seven of the team's final nine matches of 2017. The striker duo of **Juan Agudelo** and **Kei Kamara** combined for five goals and four assists in the final five matches of 2016.

The Revolution defense also saw success with the switch to the new formation, with the Revs conceding only eight goals over the final nine contests and recording three shutout performances.

SOME REAL KEEPERS

New England enters the 2017 MLS season with quality depth at the goalkeeper position.

Midway through the 2016 MLS regular season, **Brad Knighton** began a string of starts on Aug. 20 at Columbus where he started in net for nine of New England's final 10 matches. In those nine matches, Knighton posted a 4-3-1 record, recorded 20 saves, registered two shutouts, and held a goals against average of 1.02. In all, Knighton finished the 2016 regular season with a 6-5-1 record and was named the Players' Player of the Year by his teammates.

Cody Cropper joined the New England Revolution on Aug. 18 and made his Revolution debut in the club's season finale on Oct. 23 vs. Montreal. Cropper registered a pair of saves and posted a shutout in the Revs' 3-0 victory. He returned to the net to start the first two matches of the 2017 regular season, at Colorado on March 4 and at FC Dallas on March 18.

Matt Turner had a number of opportunities with the Richmond Kickers during the 2016 USL season. The second-year goalkeeper posted a 0.43 goals against average and registered four shutouts in seven starts.

TOP ITALIAN CLUBS COME TO FOXBOROUGH FOR ICC

On Sunday, July 30th, Gillette Stadium will host AS Roma and Juventus F.C. for an International Champions Cup contest. The match is set to kick off at 4 p.m. ET and will be broadcast nationally on ESPN. Juventus F.C. played a friendly against Spanish side FC Barcelona at Gillette Stadium on July 27, 2003. AS Roma has not previously played a match at Gillette Stadium.

AS Roma and Juventus F.C. currently sit atop the Italian Serie A league. The two clubs have developed a strong rivalry budding from past success. Juventus F.C. is in position to secure its sixth consecutive Serie A title while AS Roma is looking for its first since 2001.

Gillette Stadium has hosted 36 international soccer matches since 2002 at both the club and national team level. Most recently, it hosted three matches during Copa America Centenario in 2016, which featured South American national teams including Argentina, Brazil, and Chile.

FEMI RETURNS

New England re-acquired forward **Femi Hollinger-Janzen** from Minnesota United FC on Feb. 15, 2017 in exchange for goalkeeper Bobby Shuttleworth. Femi was originally selected by the Revs in the third round (51st overall) of the 2016 MLS SuperDraft, but was taken by Minnesota in the 2017 MLS Expansion Draft. In 2016, the Indiana University product made 19 appearances, including one start, scoring two goals and adding one assist in 273 minutes played. Last season, Femi was one of three players selected in the third round of the 2016 MLS SuperDraft or later to record minutes.

Femi made his 2017 debut on March 18 at FC Dallas, playing 11 minutes as a second-half substitution.

WATSON, DELAMEA TAKE INTERNATIONAL STAGE

In addition to **Juan Agudelo** (USA), defenders **Je-Vaughn Watson** and **Antonio Delamea** have each played international matches since the conclusion of the 2016 MLS regular season.

Watson received the call up to the Jamaica national team prior to a pair of February friendlies against the United States (Feb. 4) and Honduras (Feb. 17). Watson started both matches, played a full 90 minutes, and captained the Reggae Boyz in both contests.

Prior to joining the Revs, Antonio Delamea made his international debut with the Slovenia national team. The defender earned his first cap as a halftime sub in a friendly at Poland (Nov. 11).



REVS ADD PAIR OF SUPERDRAFT SELECTIONS

The New England Revolution made a pair of additions to the 2017 roster through the MLS SuperDraft. The Revs selected University of Vermont forward **Brian Wright** with their first-round selection (20th overall) and University of San Francisco defender **Josh Smith** with their fourth-round pick (75th overall). Wright signed a MLS contract prior to the SuperDraft and the Revs officially signed Smith on March 1.

Wright, 21, was a four-year starter at Vermont and made 80 total appearances with 66 starts. He finished his career ranked second all-time in Vermont history in scoring with 103 points, tallying 39 goals and 25 assists. The UVM standout was a 2016 MAC Hermann Trophy Semifinalist and also earned NSCAA All-America Second Team, All-East Region First Team, and America East All-Conference Team as a senior.

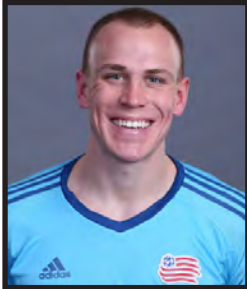
Smith, 24, was a four-year starter at the University of San Francisco. The defender was one of two Dons to start all 16 games in 2016, while his three goals and two assists helped earn him second-team All-WCC honors. He has been a member of the Revs' 18-player match day squad in each of this season's first two games.

REVS DEBUT NEW SECONDARY KIT IN COLORADO

New England debuted its new secondary kit in the 2017 season opener in Colorado. The new red-and-white uniform, which evolved from the club's "Flag of New England" kits, brings an authentic, classic soccer design to Major League Soccer. The shirt's design is symbolic of the 13 stripes on the American flag representing the original colonies, including the six that comprise New England. These secondary kits are a reminder to fans of the Revolution's pride in representing all of New England.

JAY HEAPS
HEAD COACH

Jay Heaps is in his sixth season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after becoming the sixth head coach in club history on Nov. 14, 2011. The Nashua, N.H. native and Longmeadow, Mass. product has led the Revs to three MLS Cup Playoff appearances, including a trip to MLS Cup in 2014, and to the 2016 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final.

With his appointment in 2011, Heaps brought his hallmark qualities that fans and teammates appreciated during his playing days to the bench: spirit, energy, charisma, toughness, and passion. He is the first former Revs player and the only New England native to coach the club.

In 2016, Heaps led the Revolution to the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final – the 10th major tournament final in club history. In regular season play, Heaps oversaw the implementation of Designated Player Kei Kamara, who was acquired in a midseason trade, and helped players such as Juan Agudelo, Kelyn Rowe, and Brad Knighton flourish. After Heaps instituted a 4-4-2 formation late in the season, the team won five out of seven MLS games to close the season.

Heaps was named head coach after an 11-year MLS playing career that included nine seasons with the Revolution. He anchored the club's defense from 2001-09, making 243 appearances and 238 starts, both the third most in club history. After his retirement, Heaps remained close to the club as an ambassador and color analyst on both its television and radio broadcasts, while also working in the investment banking industry.

After earning MLS Rookie of the Year honors with the Miami Fusion in 1999, Heaps returned to his hometown club in June 2001 through a trade. During the next nine seasons in New England, he cemented his legacy as not only a fan favorite, but also a driving leader on the field and in the locker room during the team's run of four MLS Cup appearances (2002, 2005-07). He is one of three Revolution players to start in each of the club's first four MLS Cup appearances and was also a member of the Revolution squads that won the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the 2008 North American Super-Liga titles. Heaps has participated in all but one of New England's 10 final appearances as a player or coach, including all three of its Open Cup Finals.

At the time of his retirement in 2009, Heaps held the distinction of being the longest-tenured Revolution player in the team's history. When he left the team, Heaps was the club's all-time leader in games played (243), starts (238), and minutes played (21,619). He also ranked fifth on the Revs' career assist chart (26) and had totaled nine career goals. In MLS record books, Heaps was ranked eighth all-time in MLS in games played (314), fourth in starts (299), and third in minutes played (27,363) at the time of his retirement. He concluded his playing career with 17 goals and 34 assists overall.

Heaps made at least 27 regular season appearances in each of his 11 professional seasons. Despite his physical playing style and fearless nature, Heaps missed just three games due to injury during more than eight seasons with the Revolution, making him one of the most durable and reliable players in MLS history.

Honored as the Revolution's Defender of the Year for in 2009, Heaps was rewarded for his stellar play with a call-up to the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2009 CONCACAF Gold Cup. He went on to earn all four caps on his USMNT résumé during the tournament, including his international debut on July 11, 2009 against Haiti in front of his hometown crowd at Gillette Stadium. Heaps is also a former member of the U.S. Under-17 and Under-20 National Teams.

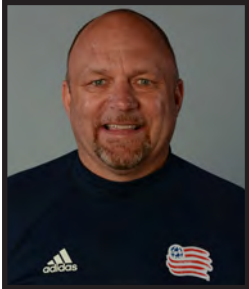
Heaps played collegiately at Duke, where he won the 1998 Missouri Athletic Club Award as the national player of the year. He was a three-time finalist for the Hermann Trophy, a four-time first-team All-ACC selection, and a four-time all-region choice. He left Duke's program ranked third in career goals (45), fourth in career assists (37), and tied for second in career points (127). In addition to earning Soccer America's National Freshman of the Year honors in 1995, Heaps also played three-and-a-half years of basketball under legendary Duke and USA Basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski before leaving midway through his senior year to pursue a professional soccer career. He was named one of Duke's "Top-10 Devils of the Decade" by the Duke Chronicle.

In addition to earning his USSF "A" Coaching License in March 2014, Heaps accrued three years of collegiate coaching experience during his MLS playing days with the Revolution. In 2004, he was a volunteer assistant coach at Boston College under Ed Kelly as the Eagles went 13-5-2 and advanced to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. He followed that with a two-year stint (2005-06) at Northeastern under Brian Ainscough in the same capacity.

TOM SOEHN
ASSISTANT COACH

Tom Soehn is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Jay Heaps' staff in January 2014.

Soehn has 13 years of MLS coaching experience as both a head coach and assistant, including three seasons with the Chicago Fire and six seasons with D.C. United. The Chicago, Ill. native began his coaching career as an assistant coach with his hometown club, the Chicago Fire, where he was Bob Bradley's first assistant in 2001 and 2002. Soehn moved to D.C. United in 2004, where he served as Peter Nowak's top assistant, helping the Black and Red win MLS Cup in 2004 and the 2006 Supporters Shield. He was promoted to head coach ahead of the 2007 season and led D.C. to a second straight Supporters Shield. In 2008, he guided D.C. to a U.S. Open Cup championship and into the group stage of the 2008-09 and 2009-10 CONCACAF Champions League tournaments.

In January 2010, Soehn was appointed as Vancouver Whitecaps FC's first Director of Soccer Operations, where he developed and managed the club's inaugural roster, player scouting, and identification and recruitment system as the club prepared to enter MLS in 2011. Soehn returned to the bench in late May 2011 and coached the team for the remainder of its debut season after head coach Teitur Thordarson was released. In 2012, he returned to the front office to direct soccer operations, helping craft the Whitecaps FC team that qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs – the first ever Canadian team to do so.

Before pursuing coaching, Soehn enjoyed a 13-year professional playing career as a defender and midfielder from 1998-2000. He played in both indoor and outdoor professional leagues during his career, including four seasons in MLS with the Dallas Burn (now FC Dallas) and the Chicago Fire. After being selected in the second round (13th overall) of the MLS Inaugural Player Draft in February 1996, Soehn saw his first action with Dallas in 1997 and helped the club win the U.S. Open Cup title.



CARLOS LLAMOSA
ASSISTANT COACH

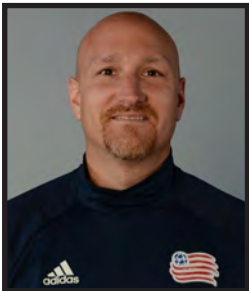
Carlos Llamosa enters his first season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in December 2016. Llamosa, 47, has been a mainstay in North American soccer over the past two decades, having enjoyed a 15-year career in MLS as a player and a coach, as well as an additional four years coaching in the North American Soccer League.

He arrives in New England following four seasons as an assistant coach for the New York Cosmos (2013-16), a span in which he helped guide the club to three NASL Soccer Bowl Championships. Before joining New York, Llamosa spent four seasons as an assistant coach with Chivas USA in MLS from 2009-12.

Llamosa's appointment marks a homecoming for the former MLS player, who enjoyed an 11-year career as one of the league's premier defenders. He spent nearly four years with New England from 2002 to 2005, appearing in 38 games, starting 36, for the club from 2002-03 before missing the 2004 season with a knee injury. In the postseason, he made eight additional appearances for the Revolution. Llamosa was a major contributor in the club's run to the 2002 MLS Cup, as he started five matches during the postseason including the final.

He totaled 154 career MLS appearances, 142 starts, three goals, and four assists in stints with D.C. United (1997-2000), Miami Fusion (2001), New England, and Chivas USA (2006-07). With D.C., he helped the club to three straight MLS Cup appearances from 1997-99, including championships in 1997 and 1999. Prior to MLS, Llamosa played professionally in Colombia with Colmena (1986-88) and Atlético Huila (1989-90) before immigrating to the United States in 1991. He began his U.S. career with the New York Centaurs of the A-League in 1995 before being selected by D.C. United in the 1997 MLS Supplemental Draft.

A native of Palmira, Colombia, Llamosa became a United States citizen in 1991 and was capped 29 times with the U.S. Men's National team. He played in the 1999 Confederations Cup and 2002 World Cup, appearing in wins against Portugal and Mexico in the latter.



REMI ROY
ASSISTANT COACH

Remi Roy enters his eighth season with the New England Revolution as an assistant coach, having joined the coaching staff in 2010. In addition to working primarily with the first-team keepers, Roy also manages the club's collegiate scouting efforts and provides additional training for the Revolution Academy's goalkeepers.

During his time with the Revolution, Roy has mentored several different goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in MLS. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins. He also tutored rookie Matt Turner through seven starts in USL action in 2016, a stretch in which he conceded only three goals. He also worked with MLS newcomer Cody Cropper after he was acquired during the 2016 campaign, leading to a shutout victory in his MLS debut in the season finale.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07). Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

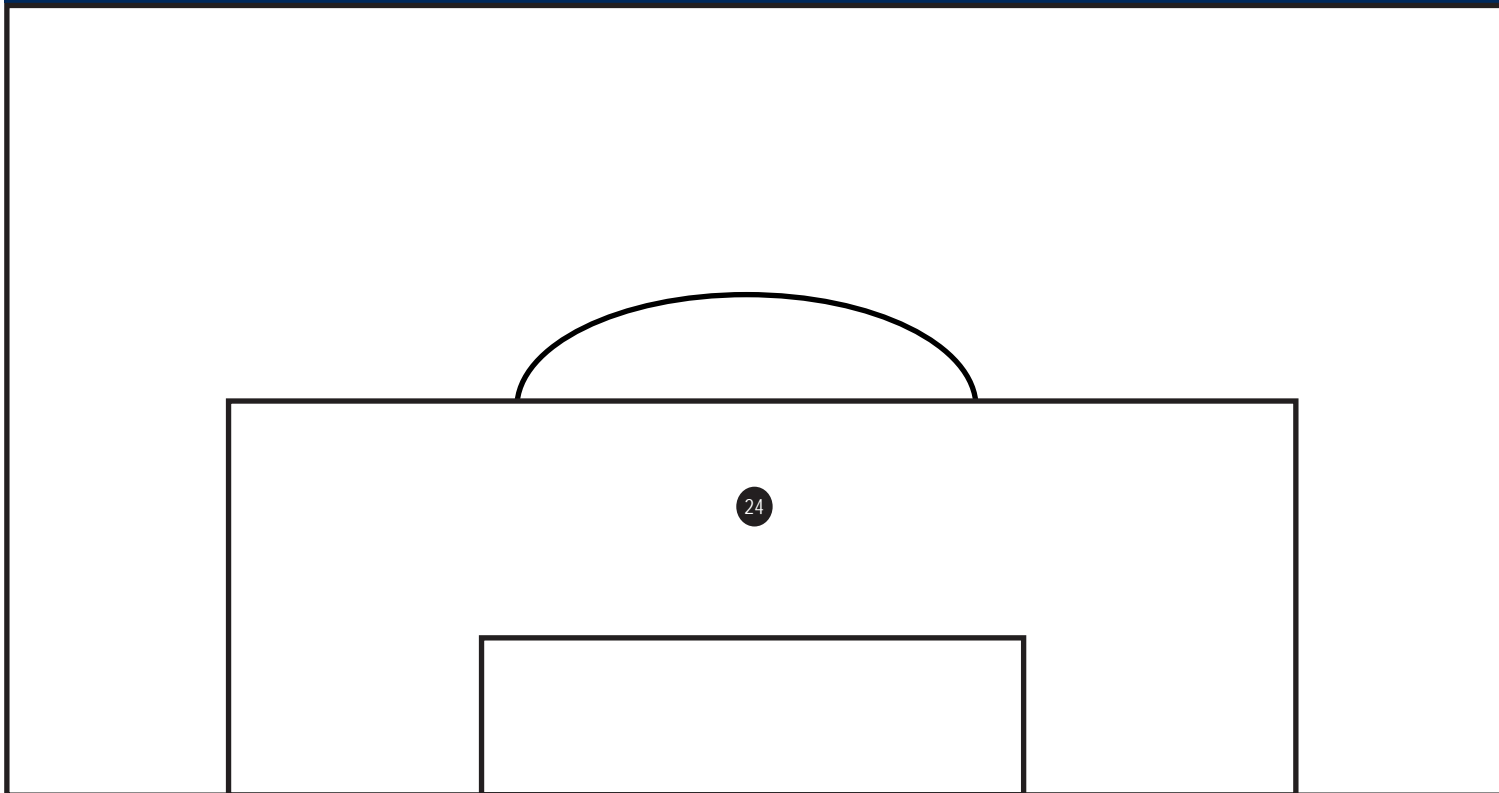

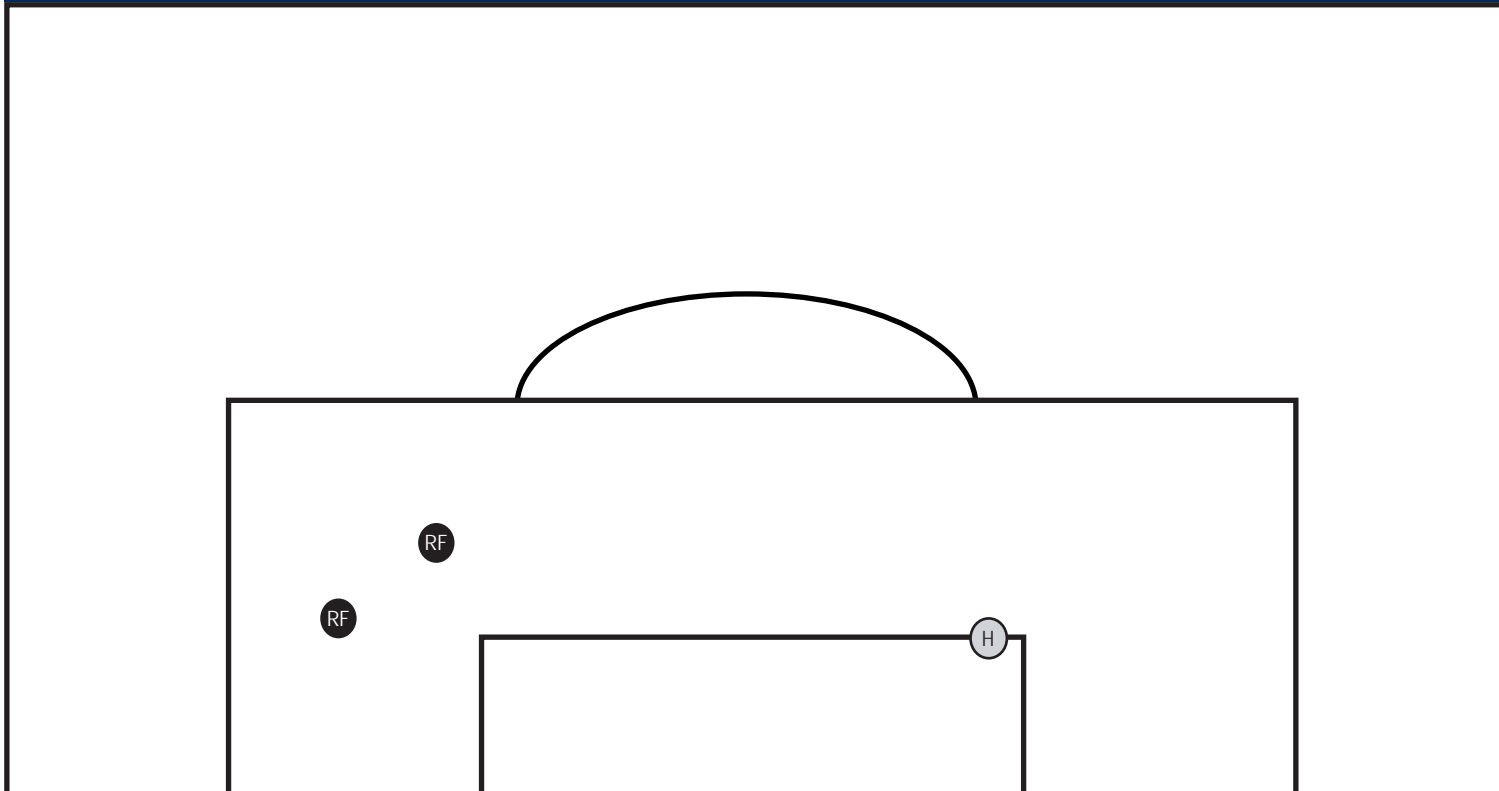

After a successful bid to host the World Cup in 1994, the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) founded MLS to bring a top level soccer league back to the country for the first time since 1984, when the original NASL folded. The league was set to begin play in 1996 with ten teams: Colorado Rapids, Columbus Crew SC, D.C. United, Dallas Burn (FC Dallas), Kansas City Wiz (Sporting Kansas City), Los Angeles Galaxy, New England Revolution, NY/NJ MetroStars (New York Red Bulls), San Jose Clash (Earthquakes) and Tampa Bay Mutiny.

The league's first match was played on April 6, 1996 as the San Jose Clash played D.C. United in front of 31,000 fans at Spartan Stadium. The league drew large crowds in its opening season, pulling star power from around North America and building on the excitement of the 1994 FIFA World Cup.

As MLS has continued to grow, clubs have begun moving out of shared American football venues and into soccer-specific stadium, led by the Columbus Crew who moved into the soccer-specific MAPFRE Stadium in 1999. Currently, 14 teams play in soccer-specific venues.

The league is split into the Eastern and Western Conferences. Each team plays 34 matches during the season. Teams play all conference opponents twice, once at home and once on the road, and each team in the other conference once, with an even balance of home and away matches. The remainder of the schedule is filled with matches against conference opponents. The top six teams in each conference at the end of the year qualifying for the MLS Cup Playoffs.

The postseason begins with the third through sixth seeds in each conference playing in a knockout round. The winners advance to the conference semifinals to play the first and second seeds in the conference. In this round, the format switches to a two-match aggregate series, with the team scoring the most goals over the series moving on. The same format is used for the conference finals. The winner of the conference final moves on to face the other conference champion in the MLS Cup Final. The final is a single match, hosted by the team with the best record in the regular season, with the winner being declared MLS Cup Champion.

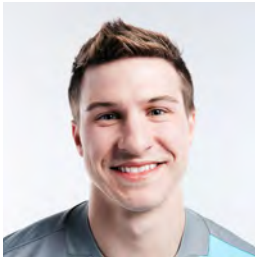

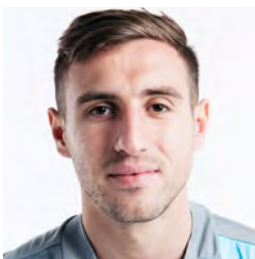

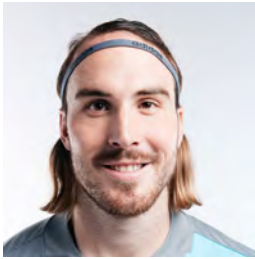

After playing over 18 years in Europe, Heath spent the next 11 years coaching in England for clubs such as Burnley, Sheffield United and Coventry City before coming to the United States in 2008. The Englishman was named head coach of the USL expansion side Austin Aztex. The team spent two years in Austin before relocating to Orlando in 2010, to become Orlando City. In just four years under Heath, Orlando City won two USL Pro championships and three Commissioner's Cups. The club joined MLS in 2015, and Heath's influence helped build the club for a very successful inaugural season, narrowly missing out on the playoffs.

IAN FULLER | ASSISTANT COACH

Fuller joined Minnesota in 2016, following a successful stint with Orlando City SC. He was a player coach with Orlando helping the team to multiple titles in USL during his five years with the Lions. Fuller is a Portland native, and first met Heath when he joined Heath's Austin Aztex in 2010. He was promoted to player-assistant coach for the club's USL journey and then was tapped to join the coaching staff full time as an assistant coach when Orlando joined MLS.



MARK WATSON | ASSISTANT COACH

Watson, a former Canadian national team defender and assistant coach, brings a wealth of MLS experience to MNUFC, having played for teams including the Seattle Sounders, Vancouver Whitecaps and D.C. United. Additionally, Watson managed the San Jose Earthquakes before joining Orlando City as an assistant under Heath in 2014. During his tenure at San Jose, Watson helped guide the team to a playoff berth in 2010 and the club's second Supporters' Shield in 2012. He was named interim head coach in June 2013 and closed the season with the best record in MLS at 11-5-3. In addition to his MLS experience, Watson previously served as assistant coach with the Canadian Men's National U-20 and senior teams, as well as several years as an assistant with the USL PRO Charleston Battery.



MARIUS RØVDE | GOALKEEPER COACH

A Norwegian native, Røvde brings nearly thirty years of playing and coaching experience to Minnesota. As a player, he enjoyed a very successful career, starting with his hometown club Rosenborg BK. He played with teams across Europe, playing in top leagues in Norway and Scotland, as well as League One in England. From 2008 to 2011, he was the head goalkeeping coach of Trinidad and Tobago Professional Football League side Joe Public FC. While working with the club, he also was involved with the Trinidad and Tobago national team program and was part of the coaching staff for several youth national teams, the women's national team, and was the country's director of goalkeeping.
