Providence Park opened on April 14, 2011, in front of a sold-out crowd in the Timbers first-ever home match as an MLS team. The club proceeded to sell out all of its regular-season home games in the team's first six MLS seasons. Spanning the 2013 and 2014 seasons, the Timbers compiled an MLS-club record 22-game unbeaten streak (12-0-10) at Providence Park from April 6, 2013 to June 1, 2014. The streak ranks as the third-longest all-time in MLS history.

HEAD COACH CALEB PORTER

Head coach Caleb Porter enters his fifth season with the Timbers in 2017. Since joining the club for the 2013 season, Porter has compiled one of the league's top winning percentages among active coaches with a record of 56-39-44, while leading the Timbers to their first MLS Cup title in 2015, two Western Conference Championship appearances and double-digit victory totals in each of his first four seasons.



During his tenure, the Timbers have qualified for CONCACAF Champions League twice (2014-15, 2016-17), finished in the top three in the Western Conference twice and made their deepest run in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, reaching the semifinals in 2013.

Porter coached in his 100th game as an MLS coach against Real Salt Lake on Oct. 14, 2015, posting a record of 39-25-36 in those games, which tied Dominic Kinnear for the fewest losses (25) in MLS history in a coach's first 100 career games. In addition, his .570 winning percentage during that span ranked fourth among then-active coaches through their first 100 games, behind the Bruce Arena (62-37-1, .625), Sigi Schmid (52-33-15, .595) and Kinnear (40-25-35, .575).

Ending the 2015 campaign with a nine-game unbeaten run across all competitions, the Timbers lifted their first MLS Cup trophy with a 2-1 win over Columbus Crew SC on Dec. 6, 2015. Portland finished the regular season with an MLS-club-record 15 wins, while also tying for the league lead in shutouts (13). On the road, the Timbers finished the 2015 season tied for the most road wins (7) in the league.

Porter, who led the Timbers to a club-record 12 home victories in 2016, is a two-time recipient of the Oregon Sports Awards' Slat Gill Award for Sportsperson of the Year (2013, 2015), becoming the fourth soccer-related figure to receive the honor since it was founded in 1957. On Aug. 6, 2014, Porter helped guide the MLS All-Stars to a 2-1 win over Bayern Munich in the 2014 AT&T MLS All-Star Game at Providence Park.

In his first season with the club, Porter was named the 2013 MLS Coach of the Year after assembling one of the biggest turnaround seasons in league history, guiding the Timbers to a 23-point improvement and a plus-43 goal-differential increase over the previous season. The 2013 club finished atop the Western Conference to secure its first MLS playoff berth and posted a league-best 15 shutouts, including a league-record 11 clean sheets at home.

Prior to joining the Timbers, Porter, who holds a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" license, was one of the most successful coaches in NCAA history during his tenure as head coach at the University of Akron (2006-12). He compiled a career mark of 123-18-17 and was named 2009 NSCAA National Coach of the Year. Porter led the Zips to back-to-back NCAA College Cup appearances (2009, 2010) and the school's first national title in any sport in 2010.

Porter's coaching career also includes time as the head coach of the U.S. U-23 Men's National Team during 2012 CONCACAF Olympic qualifying and three years as an assistant coach on the U.S. U-18 National Team (2009-11). Porter was an assistant coach for six years (2000-05) at Indiana University, winning two national championships with the Hoosiers.

Porter graduated from Indiana in 1998 with a degree in sports management. He and his wife, Andrea, have three children – two sons, Colin (8) and Jake (6), and a daughter, Stella (5).

MATCH RECAP

The Portland Timbers received first-half goals from forward Fanendo Adi and winger Dairon Asprilla, but surrendered a late goal in the second half, falling 3-2 to Columbus Crew SC at MAPFRE Stadium on March 25. With his fourth goal of the season, Adi moved into a tie with John Bain for the most goals scored (45) in Timbers history across all eras of the club (since 1975).

The Timbers (3-1-0, 9pts), who sustained their first loss of the season after starting the campaign with three straight victories, struck early against Crew SC, opening the scoring in the fourth minute of play when Asprilla scored from the right side of the box, with a finish that ranks tied as Portland's quickest away goal during the club's MLS era.

Shortly afterward, Crew SC (2-1-1, 7pts) added two goals in an eight-minute span to take the lead as midfielder Justin Meram pounced on a bouncing ball off a corner kick, finishing from close range in the 11th minute to level the score, before forward Ola Kamara delivered a chipped shot from the edge of the box in the 19th minute.

Pushing to even the score before halftime, Portland recorded several close scoring chances in the final 15 minutes of the first half, including a strike from distance from midfielder Diego Valeri that rattled off the far post in the 30th minute. Following Valeri's attempt, the Timbers equalized in stoppage time of the first half when Adi registered his fourth goal in four games played this season.

Remaining on the front foot to begin the second half, the Timbers nearly took the lead less than a minute into the half on a well-worked sequence off a corner kick. With the ball floated to the back post, midfielder Amobi Okugo rose above his defender to send a header back across the face of goal, with Adi redirecting a powerful header on frame, forcing a strong save from Crew SC goalkeeper Zack Steffen.

Later in the game, Blanco and Adi each created additional chances, with Blanco pushing a strike from distance in the 73rd minute just wide of the post, while Adi put a powerful header on target in the 83rd minute. In the 84th minute, Columbus managed to score the game-winner when midfielder Niko Hansen converted a follow-up attempt after Portland goalkeeper Jake Gleeson made an initial save on Columbus' close-range attempt. Five minutes later, Portland came close to leveling the score when Adi chested the ball down for second-half substitute Jack Barmby, whose first-time volley went just wide of the near post.

NOTES

- Portland leads MLS with four goals in the first 15 minutes of matches this season.
- Sebastián Blanco tallied his second assist of 2017, becoming the third Timbers player to record at least two assists in the team's first four matches.
- Dairon Asprilla's goal in the fourth minute is tied for the quickest away goal during the Timbers MLS era in a regular-season match.
- The goal was Asprilla's first finish of 2017, and his third career goal for Portland. In addition, Asprilla is the sixth different Timbers player to tally a goal this season.
- With his goal, Fanendo Adi is now tied for the most goals scored across all eras for the club (since 1975) at 45 goals, which equals John Bain's scoring output.
- Adi has tallied four goals in four career games against Columbus, scoring three goals in Portland's last two regular-season road matches against Crew SC.
- Adi has scored four goals in his first four matches this season, which ranks tied for second in MLS with Diego Valeri.
- Alvas Powell registered his first assist of 2017 becoming the eighth different Timbers player to record an assist this season.
- Portland has scored at least two goals in four straight regular-season meetings with Columbus, dating back to the 2014 season.
- The Timbers lead MLS in goals scored (12) and assists (11) through the first four weeks of the season.

Portland Timbers head coach Caleb Porter

On his overall thoughts on the game...

"I didn't think we created enough in the second half to win the game, but I don't think we gave up enough to lose the game either. I thought they struggled to break us down. They didn't get many clear chances. The two clear chances they got in second half were from the same play. We need to get better pressure on the ball and we have to pick up [Ola] Kamara. We've been winning games and we've been looking at each game objectively and we've been getting better by evaluating them – win, lose or draw – so we will do the same thing with this. But my number one takeaway is we have to get out of this game on the road with at least a point because we were in position to do that and we can't concede that late goal, especially with the chances that they had which were few and far between."

On the positives he can take away from the match...

"I thought our response was good when we went down. We came back, so that was a positive. I thought we created some good chances. We should have scored more than two goals, but I thought a couple times in the second half we needed to do better on the counter and find the right pass. Be a little bit more opportunistic. There were a few little half-chances, but we weren't quite as effective as first half. Credit to Columbus they did a good job shutting down the counter. They stayed on the ball and they were patient. But I thought we were organized and they had a hard time finding chances. That is why the goal we gave up was very disappointing because it was kind of a cross out of nothing we should be able cut it out and get out of here with a point and we are feeling a little bit better. We will go back to work and we will evaluate the game. Definitely look at all three goals. We can be better on all three goals and get ready for New England."

ALL-TIME SERIES NOTES

Sunday's fixture marks the eighth regular-season match between Portland and New England since the Timbers joined MLS in 2011. Since falling 1-0 to New England on March 24, 2012, Portland is unbeaten against the Revolution in the last four games played between the two teams (1-0-3). In their only match against New England in 2016, the Timbers took a point on the road, battling the Revolution to a 1-1 draw after conceding an own goal in the 88th minute. Midfielder Jack Barmby recorded his first MLS goal during the 2016 draw against New England, scoring in the 64th minute. At home, the Timbers are 2-0-1 against the Revolution since 2011, outscoring the Eastern Conference side 5-0 during that stretch.

LAST TIME VS. NEW ENGLAND

SCOUTING NEW ENGLAND

After opening the 2017 season with back-to-back road games, falling 1-0 to Colorado on March 4, before suffering a 2-1 defeat to FC Dallas on March 18, New England earned its first win of the season with a 5-2 victory against Minnesota United FC on March 25. Four different players scored for New England in the win against United FC, with forward Juan Agudelo recording his first brace of the season, while midfielder Lee Nguyen recorded a goal and an assist. Through three games played, Nguyen leads the team in goals (2), while midfielder Diego Fagundez, who also notched an assist against Minnesota, leads the team in assists, setting up two goals.

GOAL DIFFERENCE

With the most goals scored (12) in MLS through four weeks of action, the Timbers currently have the second-highest goal difference (+6) heading into the match against New England after scoring two first-half goals against Columbus Crew SC on March 25.

STARTING STRONG

So far this season, the Timbers have scored first in each of their four regular-season games played (3-1-0). Additionally, the Timbers have only trailed once going into halftime, with the team scoring three second-half goals to defeat the Houston Dynamo on March 18 after trailing 2-1 at the half.

HOME FORM

Dating back to the start of the 2016 MLS season, the Timbers rank tied for the most home wins (14) with the New York Red Bulls, compiling a 14-3-2 record at Providence Park. To start the 2017 MLS regular season, Portland is unbeaten at home (2-0-0), with the Timbers averaging 4.5 goals at home (nine goals scored), while holding their opponents to an average of 1.5 goals (three goals scored). Additionally, the Timbers have won seven straight games at home.

FEWEST LOSSES

Since 2013, the Timbers have lost the third-fewest games in MLS in regular season action (40), and the second-fewest in the Western Conference. During that stretch, only the New York Red Bulls (39) and the LA Galaxy (37) have lost fewer matches in regular-season play.

FIRST AND LAST

So far this season, the Timbers have scored the most goals in the first 15 minutes, with Portland scoring four times in the opening portion of matches in 2017. Conversely, Portland also ranks first in MLS for the most goals scored in the final 15 minutes of matches, scoring four times in the final moments of the game.

UPCOMING MILESTONES

With a win against New England, the Timbers will record their eighth consecutive win at home, dating back to the 2016 campaign. The Timbers current seven-game win streak at home is the longest in club history. Additionally, with a win or draw against New England, the Timbers will extend their unbeaten streak against the Revolution to five games.

Following his next finish, Darlington Nagbe, who has recorded 24 goals since joining the Timbers, will move into a tie for ninth place for goals scored in club history across all eras (since 1975). Additionally, with one more assist, Nagbe, who has 27 career assists, will move into fifth place in club history across all eras (since 1975) for assists.

With his next MLS goal, forward Fanendo Adi will record the most goals scored across all eras of the club (since 1975). With 45 finishes, Adi currently ranks tied with John Bain for the most goals scored across all eras in club history.

EFFECTIVE PARTNERSHIP

Since the beginning of the 2016 season, Portland Timbers forward Fanendo Adi and midfielder Diego Valeri have combined to score 38 goals in 38 regular-season games played. Valeri and Adi's 38 finishes rank nine more than any other set of current MLS teammates during that span, with Toronto FC's Jozy Altidore and Sebastian Giovinco combining for 29.

STRIKE RATE

Dating back to the 2015 season, Portland has scored at least once in 21 consecutive regular-season home matches, the longest current streak in MLS. Over that span, the Timbers have posted a 15-3-2 home record with 48 goals scored and a plus-23 goals against average. Additionally, Fanendo Adi has scored in seven straight home games, with Portland winning all seven of those matches at Providence Park.

GOAL-SCORING RECORD

With a finish against Columbus Crew SC on March 25, forward Fanendo Adi is now tied for the most goals scored across all eras for the club (since 1975) at 45 goals, which equals John Bain's scoring output. Adi has scored four goals in his first four matches this season, which ranks tied for second in MLS with Portland midfielder Diego Valeri. Additionally, since joining MLS on May 13, 2014, Adi has scored the second-most goals in MLS during that stretch, with forward Bradley Wright-Phillips ranking as the only player to score more goals (60).

FINAL THIRD

So far this season, the Portland Timbers have taken 105 touches in their opponent's penalty area. No other MLS team has taken more than 86 touches in the opposing team's penalty area.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Through four games played, a total of eight different Timbers players have been credited with at least one assist in 2017, with Sebastián Blanco, Diego Valeri and Darlington Nagbe tallying a team-high two assists. Additionally, with Dairon Asprilla recording his first goal of the season on March 25, six different players have scored for the Timbers through the team's first four games.

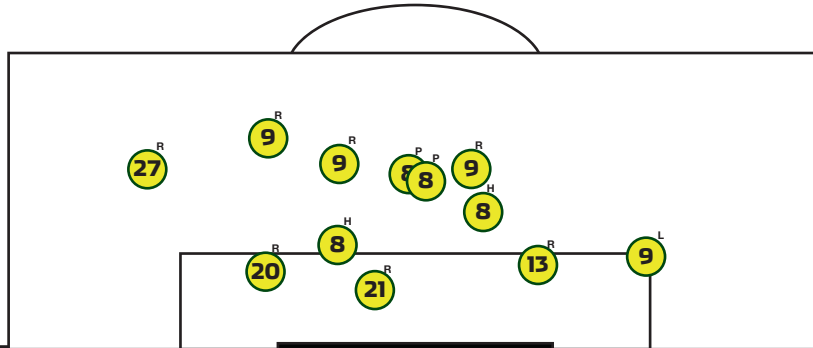

New England Revolution Head Coach Jay Heaps

On maintaining an attacking mindset on the road without sacrificing defense:

Coach Heaps: "That really is the critical decision when you're playing on the road, because you've got teams that are also risking it the other way, so you can be stuck in situations where you have less numbers at the back. At home, it's risk-reward. On the road, you have to know when to take that risk and when it's mindful to be smart. We're usually more aggressive than most, but [we] also have to know the boundaries of what the aggressive play will lead to if there is a turnover, if there's something that goes against us."

Revolution Midfielder Lee Nguyen

On trying to replicate Saturday's performance against Portland on Sunday:

Nguyen: "You've got to approach away games with the same mentality as home games. That's what we have to learn is that we do have the talent and the ability to play like we do at home, away. We will try to put opposing teams on the back foot early and at the same time, if it's getting close, we know that we're going to have to tighten the screws a little bit."

New England Revolution Defender Antonio Delamea

On adjusting to the travel demands of MLS:

Delamea: "It's something new for me. In my former league, the longest travel was one hour and a half. So, it's a new thing for me, but I think I adjust very good. I have some problems maybe with flying, but I can handle that, because we always take two- or one-day trips before the games, so it's easy to adjust. I don't think it will affect much of my game."

TOP ITALIAN CLUBS COME TO FOXBOROUGH FOR ICC

On Sunday, July 30th, Gillette Stadium will host AS Roma and Juventus F.C. for an International Champions Cup contest. The match is set to kick off at 4 p.m. ET and will be broadcast nationally on ESPN. Juventus F.C. played a friendly against Spanish side FC Barcelona at Gillette Stadium on July 27, 2003. AS Roma has not previously played a match at Gillette Stadium.

AS Roma and Juventus F.C. currently sit atop the Italian Serie A league. The two clubs have developed a strong rivalry budding from past success. Juventus F.C. is in position to secure its sixth consecutive Serie A title while AS Roma is looking for its first since 2001.

Gillette Stadium has hosted 36 international soccer matches since 2002 at both the club and national team level. Most recently, it hosted three matches during Copa America Centenario in 2016, which featured South American national teams including Argentina, Brazil, and Chile.

REVS-PORTLAND TIMBERS CONNECTIONS

- Portland Timbers Head Coach **Caleb Porter** coached Revolution forward **Teal Bunbury** and midfielder **Scott Caldwell** at the University of Akron. In 2010, Porter and Caldwell won the NCAA Men's Division I National Championship against a Louisville team that featured Revolution defender **Andrew Farrell**.
- This match features several other Akron connections between Portland and New England. **Scott Caldwell** was teammates with Timbers forward **Darren Mattocks** at Akron for two seasons (2010, 2011). Both Caldwell and **Teal Bunbury** played alongside Timbers midfielders **Darlington Nagbe** and **Ben Zemanski** and Timbers defender **Zarek Valentin** in 2009. In total, five players from Akron's 2009 squad are expected to suit up for Sunday night's match.
- Revolution midfielder **Lee Nguyen** and Timbers midfielder **Darlington Nagbe** shared the field during a US Men's National Team friendly vs. Iceland on Jan. 31, 2016. Nagbe and Revolution forward **Juan Agudelo** also represented the USMNT together in a friendly vs. Jamaica on Feb. 3, 2017.
- Timbers forward **Darren Mattocks** and Revolution defender **Je-Vaughn Watson** are both regulars for the Jamaica National Team.
- Revolution forward **Juan Agudelo** was teammates with Timbers midfielder **Ben Zemanski** on Chivas USA in 2011 and part of the 2012 season.
- Revolution midfielder **Scott Caldwell** and Timbers defender **Zarek Valentin** both played for the Michigan Bucks (PDL) in 2010.

TEAM NOTES

HIGH FIVE: REVS OFFENSE COMES TO LIFE

The Revolution attacking group provided firepower in the club's 5-2 victory over Minnesota United FC in the team's home opener on March 25. The five goals marked the Revs' most ever in a home opener, eclipsing the previous high of four goals set on April 14, 2007 and April 10, 2010, both against Toronto FC.

The match marked the ninth five-goal performance in Revolution annals. The last time the team scored at least five times was on May 17, 2014 at Philadelphia. By halftime, the Revs had already netted four goals. The last time the Revolution scored four first-half goals was also the last time the team scored five goals in a home match, a 5-0 win vs. Seattle on May 11, 2014.

Two of the team's five goals came on penalty kicks, as Lee Nguyen and Chris Tierney each slotted home their attempts from the spot. The Revs now have three penalty kick goals through the first three games of the 2017 season. The match against Minnesota was the first time the Revs earned two penalties in a match since Sept. 21, 2013 vs. D.C. United.

NGUYEN CLIMBS REVOLUTION SCORING CHART

With **Lee Nguyen's** penalty kick goal over Minnesota United FC on March 25, the Revolution midfielder is now tied with Steve Ralston for second place on the club's all-time goal scoring list. 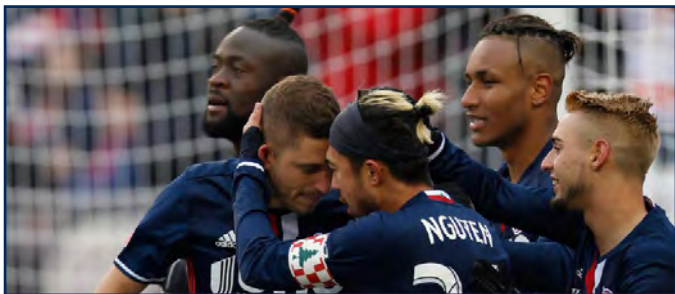

REVS DOMINATE WEEK 4 AWARDS

Following the 5-2 win vs. Minnesota United FC on March 25, five Revolution players were named to MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week. In addition, forward **Juan Agudelo** was voted the Alcatel MLS Player of the Week for Week 4 by the North American Soccer Reporters.

Defender **Chris Tierney**, midfielders **Diego Fagundez** and **Lee Nguyen**, and forwards **Agudelo** and **Kei Kamara** all received the honor for their performances in the 5-2 victory over Minnesota United FC. Head Coach **Jay Heaps** was named Coach of the Week.

Agudelo's Alcatel MLS Player of the Week award comes after he registered two goals in the home opener. It was Agudelo's third career brace and his first in MLS since a 5-1 victory over the Philadelphia Union on Aug. 25, 2013. The Player of the Week nod is the second of Agudelo's career, as his first came in March 2013 as a member of Chivas USA.



SEVERAL REVS TOP ASSIST CHARTS

Multiple Revolution players have been advancing up the club's all-time assists chart this season, as four players are currently in the top 10 in Revs history. Revolution defender **Chris Tierney** moved into second place on the list with his 36th assist in the home opener on March 25 vs. Minnesota. Midfielder **Lee Nguyen** is only one helper behind him with 35 career assists, tied for third in the New England record books. With his 26th career assist on March 25, midfielder **Diego Fagundez** became the first Homegrown Player to crack the top 10.

TURNER, WRIGHT ON SHORT-TERM LOAN

Goalkeeper **Matt Turner** and rookie forward **Brian Wright** are currently on short-term loans to the Richmond Kickers and Tulsa Roughnecks FC, respectively.

Turner is set to join the Richmond Kickers for their April 1 match at New York Red Bulls II. He made his professional debut with the Kickers on April 30, 2016 vs. Toronto FC II and has since joined Richmond on multiple short-term loans. Turner yielded only three goals in 630 minutes across seven starts last season.

Wright will join Tulsa for its April 1 match vs. Rio Grande Valley FC. Should he make an appearance, it will be Wright's first minutes at the professional level.

TIERNEY SHINES IN MILESTONE MATCH

Chris Tierney entered 2017 as the longest-tenured member of the Revolution in his 10th MLS season, all of them with New England. On March 25, 2017, he became the fourth player in club history to record 200 starts with the team, joining Shalrie Joseph (254), Matt Reis (253), and Jay Heaps (238) on the list.

Tierney made the most of his 200th start by recording both a goal and an assist in the same match for the second time in his career (last time: May 17, 2014 at Philadelphia). The left back's goal came from the penalty spot, his second career penalty kick conversion (last time: Oct. 17, 2013 at Columbus). The assist moved him into sole possession of second place in club history.

After the match, Tierney addressed the media and shared his thoughts on playing 10 seasons in New England:
"I sound like a broken record at this point, but I'm so proud to be a Revolution player and I really can't see myself playing for any other club. So to start 200 games is really special for me and it's something I'll look back on one day and say, 'Wow, that was pretty cool.'"

TEAM NOTES

REVS NEW CENTER BACK PAIRING BUILDS CHEMISTRY

The Revolution opened the 2017 MLS season with a fresh look in central defense. In January, New England acquired a pair of center backs through the international market to reinforce its back line, adding Slovenian **Antonio Delamea** and Ivorian **Benjamin Angoua** to the roster using TAM (targeted allocation money). Both players made their Revolution debuts on March 4 at Colorado and have started all three matches thus far in 2017.

Delamea, 25, joined the Revolution via transfer from Slovenian first-division side Olimpija Ljubljana. He made a combined 134 appearances across all competitions in his senior career in Slovenia, registering five goals with three assists since going pro in 2008. Delamea's previous experience includes five campaigns with NK Olimpija Ljubljana (2011-17) in Slovenia's top-flight PrvaLiga, and three seasons with NK Interblock Ljubljana (2008-11) in both the PrvaLiga (2008-10) and the Slovenian Second League (2010-11). The Celje, Slovenia native earned his first international cap for the Slovenia National Team on Nov. 14, 2016, appearing as a half-time substitute in a friendly against Poland.

Angoua arrived in New England after making a combined 309 appearances across all competitions in France, Hungary, and Côte d'Ivoire. The 30-year-old spent the last seven years in France's Ligue 1, making 152 appearances and 138 starts for EA Guingamp (2014-17) and FC Valenciennes (2010-14). He also played with Budapest Honved (2006-10) in Hungary's OTP Bank Liga and Africa Sports (2004-06) in the Côte d'Ivoire Ligue 1. The Anyama, Côte d'Ivoire native has collected 17 international caps for Les Elephants, scoring one goal. Angoua has experience on the continental level as well, competing in the UEFA Europa League with both Guingamp and Budapest Honved.

KOUASSI PLAYS 79 MINUTES IN MLS DEBUT

Revolution midfielder and Designated Player **Xavier Kouassi** made his MLS debut in the club's match against FC Dallas on March 18. Kouassi started and played 79 minutes, managing 36 total touches, 22 total passes, three tackles, and completed 81.8 percent of his passes. With his debut, Kouassi became the third player from Côte d'Ivoire to appear for the Revolution, joining Arsene Oka and current teammate Benjamin Angoua.

Kouassi joined the Revolution in July 2016 after signing a pre-contract with the club in February 2016. He missed the entire 2016 campaign after suffering a torn ACL with FC Sion shortly after he was signed.

The Ivorian international joined the club in July 2016 after eight professional seasons in Switzerland, where he most recently captained FC Sion in the Swiss Super League from 2013-16. Kouassi also played four seasons with Servette FC (2009-13) in Switzerland and began his career in the top-flight Ivorian League 1.



REVS OPEN AGAINST WESTERN CONFERENCE

The Revolution open the 2017 season with five consecutive games against Western Conference opposition, including three games on the road. This marks the first time in club history the Revs will play five games against the west before facing Eastern Conference opposition.

In total, the Revolution travel to face five Western Conference opponents this season. New England opened the season with one-goal losses at Colorado on March 4 and at FC Dallas on March 18. The Revolution's next two trips take them to the Pacific Northwest for April meetings with the Portland Timbers (April 2 on ESPN2) and defending MLS Cup champions Seattle Sounders FC (April 29). The Revs' final trip to play a Western Conference foe will be on Sept. 16 against Sporting Kansas City. In 2016, the Revolution posted a 1-1-3 away record against Western Conference opposition.

LIGHTS, KAMARA, ACTION!

Forward **Kei Kamara** entered the 2017 season with an eye on the MLS record books. Kamara currently sits in 12th place on the League's all-time goal-scoring chart after bringing his total to 87 with his goal on March 25 vs. Minnesota. Kamara is now just one goal shy of the top 10.

He also ranks second among active MLS players in goals scored, trailing only San Jose's Chris Wondolowski, who has registered 122 career goals in MLS regular season play.

JUAN NATION, JUAN TEAM

Forward **Juan Agudelo** entered preseason having received a call up to the United States Men's National Team for its annual January Camp. He now owns 23 caps in his senior international career.

Under the guidance of recently hired head coach Bruce Arena, Agudelo appeared in both of the USMNT's friendlies against Serbia and Jamaica. After appearing as a late-game substitute against Serbia on Jan. 29, Agudelo started and played a full, 90-minute shift against Jamaica on Feb. 3, helping lead the United States to a 1-0 win.

The call up was Agudelo's second since October, when he was named to the USMNT's squad for a friendly against New Zealand on Oct. 11. New England's reigning Golden Boot winner will be seeking a spot on Bruce Arena's roster for an upcoming pair of 2018 FIFA World Cup Qualifiers in late March.

In the Feb. 3 match against Jamaica, Agudelo suffered a small facial bone fracture. The forward underwent a successful minor procedure to reduce the fracture and has worn a protective mask since rejoining the Revolution in February.

TEAM NOTES

REVS BEGIN 2017 IN DIAMOND

The Revolution have already shown the ability to build off last season's late success in the 4-4-2 diamond formation. New England made the transition to the new alignment on Aug. 24, 2016 at San Jose and concluded the 2016 season with a 5-3-1 mark in its final nine matches.

The offense has seen an uptick in production with the switch to the formation, as New England averaged 1.66 goals per game and recorded three goals in four of its final nine 2016 matches. At home, the Revs are especially productive with an average of 3.2 goals per home game since making the transition. **Juan Agudelo, Kei Kamara,** and Lee Nguyen comprise the tip of the attack and have already combined for five goals through three games in 2017.

The Revolution defense also saw success with the switch to the new formation, with the Revs conceding only eight goals over the final nine contests and recording three shutout performances.

SOME REAL KEEPERS

New England enters the 2017 MLS season with quality depth at the goalkeeper position.

Midway through the 2016 MLS regular season, **Brad Knighton** began a string of starts on Aug. 20 at Columbus where he started in net for nine of New England's final 10 matches. In those nine matches, Knighton posted a 4-3-1 record, recorded 20 saves, registered two shutouts, and held a goals against average of 1.02. In all, Knighton finished the 2016 regular season with a 6-5-1 record and was named the Players' Player of the Year by his teammates.

Cody Cropper joined the New England Revolution on Aug. 18 and made his Revolution debut in the club's season finale on Oct. 23 vs. Montreal. Cropper registered a pair of saves and posted a shutout in the Revs' 3-0 victory. He returned to the net to start the first two matches of the 2017 regular season, at Colorado on March 4 and at FC Dallas on March 18.

Matt Turner had a number of opportunities with the Richmond Kickers during the 2016 USL season. The second-year goalkeeper posted a 0.43 goals against average and registered four shutouts in seven starts.

FEMI RETURNS

New England re-acquired forward **Femi Hollinger-Janzen** from Minnesota United FC on Feb. 15, 2017 in exchange for goalkeeper Bobby Shuttleworth. Femi was originally selected by the Revs in the third round (51st overall) of the 2016 MLS SuperDraft, but was taken by Minnesota in the 2017 MLS Expansion Draft. In 2016, the Indiana University product made 19 appearances, including one start, scoring two goals and adding one assist in 273 minutes played. His 18 substitute appearances ranked second on the team. Last season, Femi was one of three players selected in the third round of the 2016 MLS SuperDraft or later to record minutes.

Femi made his 2017 debut on March 18 at FC Dallas, playing 11 minutes as a second-half substitution.



WATSON, DELAMEA TAKE INTERNATIONAL STAGE

In addition to **Juan Agudelo** (USA), defenders **Je-Vaughn Watson** and **Antonio Delamea** have each played international matches since the conclusion of the 2016 MLS regular season.

Watson received the call up to the Jamaica National Team prior to a pair of February friendlies against the United States (Feb. 3) and Honduras (Feb. 17). Watson started both matches, played a full 90 minutes, and captained the Reggae Boyz in both contests.

Prior to joining the Revs, Antonio Delamea made his international debut with the Slovenia National Team. The defender earned his first cap as a halftime sub in a friendly at Poland (Nov. 11).



GILLETTE STADIUM RECEIVES SAFETY ACT CERTIFICATION

On March 30, 2017, Gillette Stadium became the first venue in New England to achieve Safety Act designation and certification, the highest level of protection awarded by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. The Safety Act, enacted in 2002, encourages the creation and use of anti-terrorism technologies and practices.

Gillette Stadium is not only the first sports and entertainment venue in New England to achieve the designation, but it is also the first MLS venue and only the fourth NFL venue to be certified under the Safety Act.

The Revolution's home in Foxborough has previously been recognized for a variety of security achievements. Last season, Gillette Stadium ranked No. 1 among NFL venues in safety and security according to an annual survey of

REVS DEBUT NEW SECONDARY KIT IN COLORADO

New England debuted its new secondary kit in the 2017 season opener in Colorado. The new red-and-white uniform, which evolved from the club's "Flag of New England" kits, brings an authentic, classic soccer design to Major League Soccer. HEAD COACH

Jay Heaps is in his sixth season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after becoming the sixth head coach in club history on Nov. 14, 2011. The Nashua, N.H. native and Longmeadow, Mass. product has led the Revs to three MLS Cup Playoff appearances, including a trip to MLS Cup in 2014, and to the 2016 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final.

With his appointment in 2011, Heaps brought his hallmark qualities that fans and teammates appreciated during his playing days to the bench: spirit, energy, charisma, toughness, and passion. He is the first former Revs player and the only New England native to coach the club.

In 2016, Heaps led the Revolution to the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final – the 10th major tournament final in club history. In regular season play, Heaps oversaw the implementation of Designated Player Kei Kamara, who was acquired in a midseason trade, and helped players such as Juan Agudelo, Kelyn Rowe, and Brad Knighton flourish. After Heaps instituted a 4-4-2 formation late in the season, the team won five out of seven MLS games to close the season.

Heaps was named head coach after an 11-year MLS playing career that included nine seasons with the Revolution. He anchored the club's defense from 2001-09, making 243 appearances and 238 starts, both the third most in club history. After his retirement, Heaps remained close to the club as an ambassador and color analyst on both its television and radio broadcasts, while also working in the investment banking industry.

After earning MLS Rookie of the Year honors with the Miami Fusion in 1999, Heaps returned to his hometown club in June 2001 through a trade. During the next nine seasons in New England, he cemented his legacy as not only a fan favorite, but also a driving leader on the field and in the locker room during the team's run of four MLS Cup appearances (2002, 2005-07). He is one of three Revolution players to start in each of the club's first four MLS Cup appearances and was also a member of the Revolution squads that won the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the 2008 North American Super-Liga titles. Heaps has participated in all but one of New England's 10 final appearances as a player or coach, including all three of its Open Cup Finals.

At the time of his retirement in 2009, Heaps held the distinction of being the longest-tenured Revolution player in the team's history. When he left the team, Heaps was the club's all-time leader in games played (243), starts (238), and minutes played (21,619). He also ranked fifth on the Revs' career assist chart (26) and had totaled nine career goals. In MLS record books, Heaps was ranked eighth all-time in MLS in games played (314), fourth in starts (299), and third in minutes played (27,363) at the time of his retirement. He concluded his playing career with 17 goals and 34 assists overall.

Heaps made at least 27 regular season appearances in each of his 11 professional seasons. Despite his physical playing style and fearless nature, Heaps missed just three games due to injury during more than eight seasons with the Revolution, making him one of the most durable and reliable players in MLS history.

Honored as the Revolution's Defender of the Year for in 2009, Heaps was rewarded for his stellar play with a call-up to the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2009 CONCACAF Gold Cup. He went on to earn all four caps on his USMNT résumé during the tournament, including his international debut on July 11, 2009 against Haiti in front of his hometown crowd at Gillette Stadium. Heaps is also a former member of the U.S. Under-17 and Under-20 National Teams.

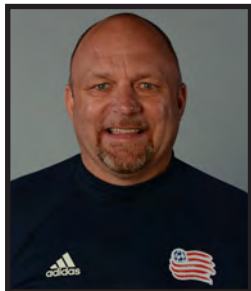
Heaps played collegiately at Duke, where he won the 1998 Missouri Athletic Club Award as the national player of the year. He was a three-time finalist for the Hermann Trophy, a four-time first-team All-ACC selection, and a four-time all-region choice. He left Duke's program ranked third in career goals (45), fourth in career assists (37), and tied for second in career points (127). In addition to earning Soccer America's National Freshman of the Year honors in 1995, Heaps also played three-and-a-half years of basketball under legendary Duke and USA Basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski before leaving midway through his senior year to pursue a professional soccer career. He was named one of Duke's "Top-10 Devils of the Decade" by the Duke Chronicle.

In addition to earning his USSF "A" Coaching License in March 2014, Heaps accrued three years of collegiate coaching experience during his MLS playing days with the Revolution. In 2004, he was a volunteer assistant coach at Boston College under Ed Kelly as the Eagles went 13-5-2 and advanced to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. He followed that with a two-year stint (2005-06) at Northeastern under Brian Ainscough in the same capacity.

TECHNICAL STAFF BIOS



TOM SOEHN
ASSISTANT COACH

Tom Soehn is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Jay Heaps' staff in January 2014.

Soehn has 13 years of MLS coaching experience as both a head coach and assistant, including three seasons with the Chicago Fire and six seasons with D.C. United. The Chicago, Ill. native began his coaching career as an assistant coach with his hometown club, the Chicago Fire, where he was Bob Bradley's first assistant in 2001 and 2002. Soehn moved to D.C. United in 2004, where he served as Peter Nowak's top assistant, helping the Black and Red win MLS Cup in 2004 and the 2006 Supporters Shield. He was promoted to head coach ahead of the 2007 season and led D.C. to a second straight Supporters Shield. In 2008, he guided D.C. to a U.S. Open Cup championship and into the group stage of the 2008-09 and 2009-10 CONCACAF Champions League tournaments.

In January 2010, Soehn was appointed as Vancouver Whitecaps FC's first Director of Soccer Operations, where he developed and managed the club's inaugural roster, player scouting, and identification and recruitment system as the club prepared to enter MLS in 2011. Soehn returned to the bench in late May 2011 and coached the team for the remainder of its debut season after head coach Teitur Thordarson was released. In 2012, he returned to the front office to direct soccer operations, helping craft the Whitecaps FC team that qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs – the first ever Canadian team to do so.

Before pursuing coaching, Soehn enjoyed a 13-year professional playing career as a defender and midfielder from 1998-2000. He played in both indoor and outdoor professional leagues during his career, including four seasons in MLS with the Dallas Burn (now FC Dallas) and the Chicago Fire. After being selected in the second round (13th overall) of the MLS Inaugural Player Draft in February 1996, Soehn saw his first action with Dallas in 1997 and helped the club win the U.S. Open Cup title.



CARLOS LLAMOSA
ASSISTANT COACH

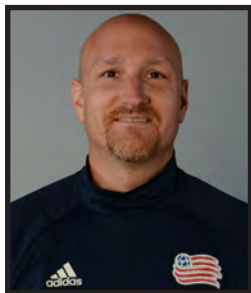
Carlos Llamosa is in his first season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in December 2016. Llamosa, 47, has been a mainstay in North American soccer over the past two decades, having enjoyed a 15-year career in MLS as a player and a coach, as well as an additional four years coaching in the North American Soccer League.

He arrives in New England following four seasons as an assistant coach for the New York Cosmos (2013-16), a span in which he helped guide the club to three NASL Soccer Bowl Championships. Before joining New York, Llamosa spent four seasons as an assistant coach with Chivas USA in MLS from 2009-12.

Llamosa's appointment marks a homecoming for the former MLS player, who enjoyed an 11-year career as one of the league's premier defenders. He spent nearly four years with New England from 2002 to 2005, appearing in 38 games, starting 36, for the club from 2002-03 before missing the 2004 season with a knee injury. In the postseason, he made eight additional appearances for the Revolution. Llamosa was a major contributor in the club's run to the 2002 MLS Cup, as he started five matches during the postseason including the final.

He totaled 154 career MLS appearances, 142 starts, three goals, and four assists in stints with D.C. United (1997-2000), Miami Fusion (2001), New England, and Chivas USA (2006-07). With D.C., he helped the club to three straight MLS Cup appearances from 1997-99, including championships in 1997 and 1999. Prior to MLS, Llamosa played professionally in Colombia with Colmena (1986-88) and Atlético Huila (1989-90) before immigrating to the United States in 1991. He began his U.S. career with the New York Centaurs of the A-League in 1995 before being selected by D.C. United in the 1997 MLS Supplemental Draft.

A native of Palmira, Colombia, Llamosa became a United States citizen in 1991 and was capped 29 times with the U.S. Men's National team. He played in the 1999 Confederations Cup and 2002 World Cup, appearing in wins against Portugal and Mexico in the latter.



REMI ROY
ASSISTANT COACH

Remi Roy is in his eighth season with the New England Revolution as an assistant coach, having joined the coaching staff in 2010. In addition to working primarily with the first-team keepers, Roy also manages the club's collegiate scouting efforts and provides additional training for the Revolution Academy's goalkeepers.

During his time with the Revolution, Roy has mentored several different goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in MLS. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins. He also tutored rookie Matt Turner through seven starts in USL action in 2016, a stretch in which he conceded only three goals. He also worked with MLS newcomer Cody Cropper after he was acquired during the 2016 campaign, leading to a shutout victory in his MLS debut in the season finale.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07). Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

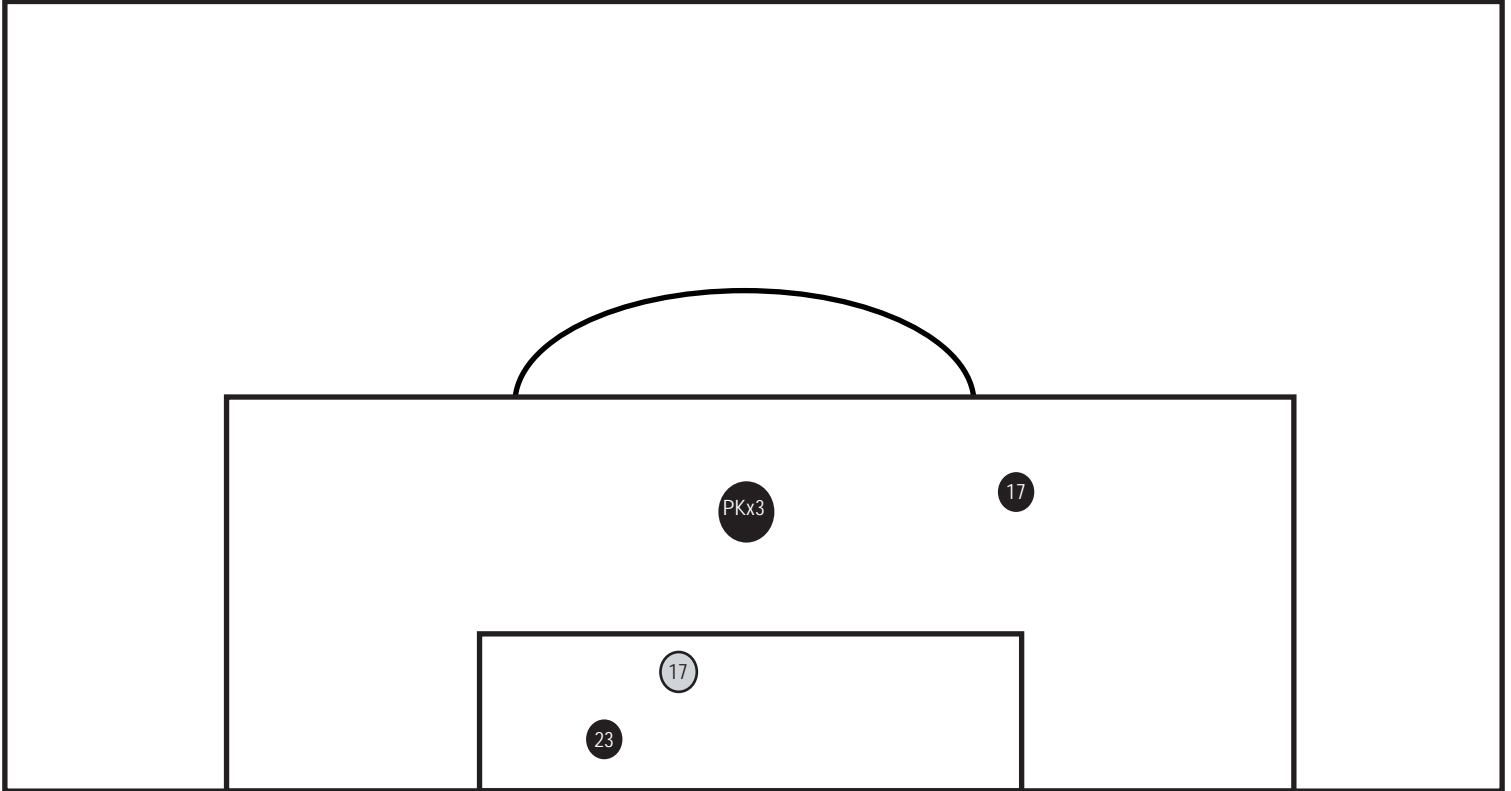

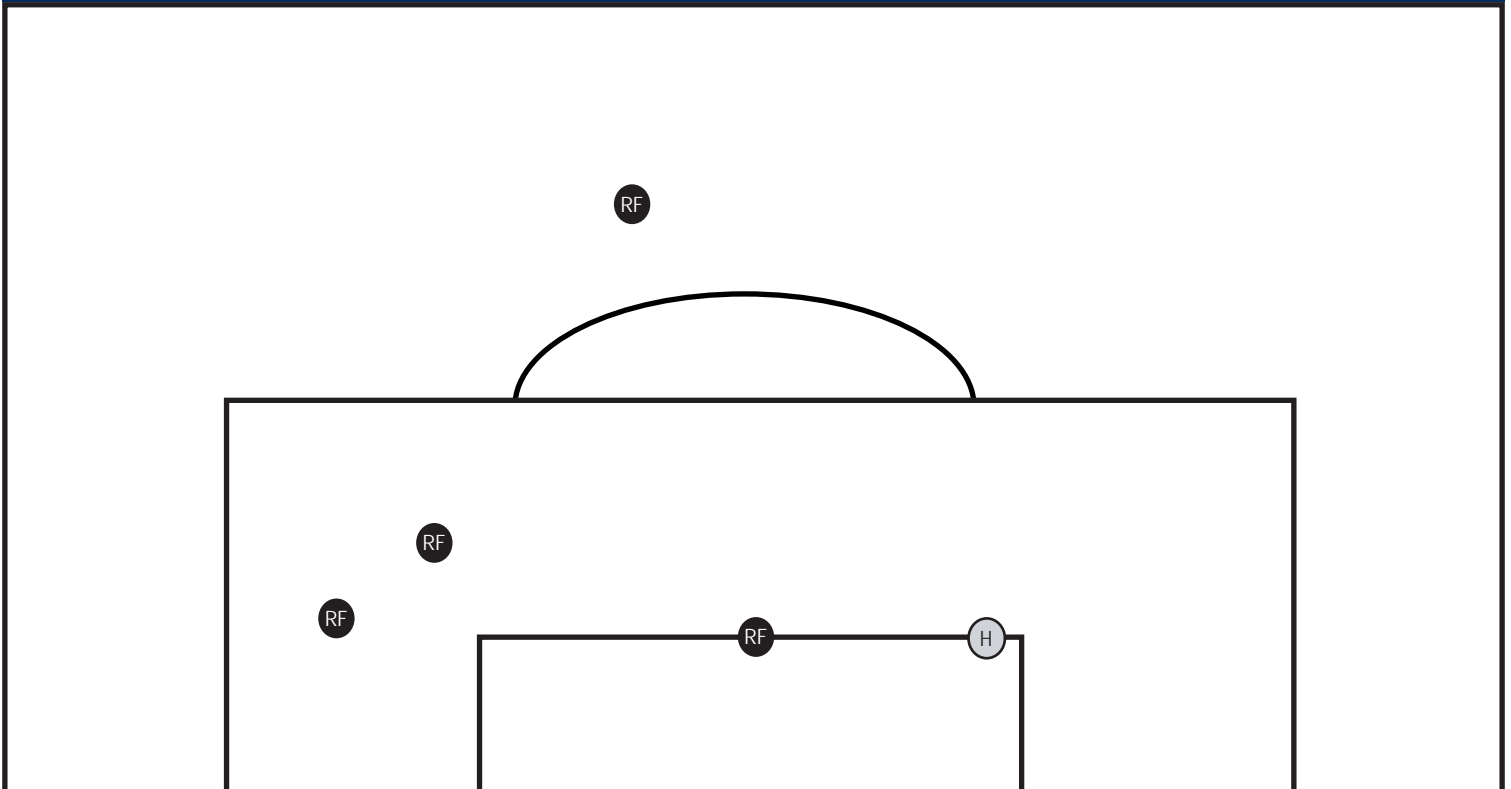
