New England Revolution Head Coach Jay Heaps

On what he believes makes for a successful week of training:

Coach Heaps: "When you outline the objectives for the day and you put it together in a big picture for the week, and then we hit on all those objectives. Obviously, as a staff, we discuss it with the players, what we want to hit. Last week, it was simple messages, but we hit all the objectives in each training session

New England Revolution Midfielder Lee Nguyen

On the attacking group's performance against Philadelphia:

Nguyen: "Kei [Kamara] put in a good shift, Teal [Bunbury] put in a good shift, Diego [Fagundez] did the same thing, and then Juan [Agudelo] did the same thing when he came in. Overall, everyone that stepped up needed to step up. It's a big victory. I told you before [the July 22 match vs. LA] we needed to win both these games at home. It's playoff time now for us, because every point, every game is crucial. That's what we have to think going forward now."

New England Revolution Goalkeeper Cody Cropper

On how locked in the team will need to be against Chicago:

Cropper: "Very. We're going to have to be locked in again for 90 minutes. They have a very strong attacking line and we have to really be switched on for 90 minutes and really prepared for a 90-minute battle. So for me, it's just going to be doing the simple things right. For us as a group, doing those simple defensive things correctly again and really working for those 90 minutes."

TEAM NOTES

REVOLUTION SIGN DEFENDER CLAUDE DIELNA

On July 28, the New England Revolution signed defender **Claude Dielna**, a 29-year-old center back with more than 10 seasons of professional experience in France, England, Romania, and Slovakia. He will be officially added to the club's roster as either a Designated Player or via the use of Targeted Allocation Money (TAM) upon receipt of his International Transfer Certificate (ITC) and P-1 Visa.

Across all competition as a professional, Dielna has totaled 162 appearances, 136 starts, five goals, and two assists in 12,628 total minutes of action. Of those appearances, 109 were split between Ligue 1 (22 games) and Ligue 2 (87 games) in France. A native of Clichy-la-Garenne, France, Dielna also played in 23 games in the England's Football League Championship with Sheffield Wednesday FC during the 2014-15 season.



FLOODGATES OPEN FOR FAGUNDEZ

Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** has seen his productivity pick up over the last two months, bringing his season totals to four goals and seven assists to date. The Homegrown Player has recorded four goals and three assists in his last nine MLS appearances for New England. He also tallied in New England's U.S. Open Cup Round of 16 win against D.C. United on June 28, curling a free kick past Travis Worra from about 20 yards out.

After recording his second career brace against Columbus on May 21, Fagundez spoke about building off his first goal.

"It's one of those crazy things. I don't know why, but the first one is always the hardest for me." Fagundez said, "But once the first one comes, my confidence boosts and that second and third will come. So now I just have to keep playing the same way I've been playing. Nothing changes, I just have to help out the team out as much as possible and when I get those chances, I need to finish them."

FARRELL, NGUYEN AMONG MLS IRON MEN

Two Revolution players – defender **Andrew Farrell** and midfielder **Lee Nguyen** – rank first and second, respectively, among all MLS field players in minutes played dating back to the beginning of the 2013 season.

Both players also rank among the top five in games played, as do midfielders **Diego Fagundez** (3rd; 146 games played) **Kelyn Rowe** (4th; 145 games played). Nguyen is tied with Felipe for most games played since 2013 with 151 appearances, while Farrell ranks second with 149 appearances.

FOR THE NGUYEN: LEE SECOND IN MLS IN CHANCES CREATED

Midfielder **Lee Nguyen** has been a key driver of the New England attack this season. The only Revolution player to start every match so far this season, he currently leads the team in assists with nine and is tied for Juan Agudelo for the team-lead in goals scored with eight. In addition, Opta has Nguyen ranked second in MLS with 64 chances created, trailing only New York's Sacha Kljestan.

With his assist on May 31 at New York City, Nguyen joined former Revolution player and all-time MLS assists leader Steve Ralston (42 goals, 73 assists) as the only players in Revs history with at least 40 goals and 40 assists. Nguyen has 48 goals and 43 assists in 181 career MLS appearances.

DELAMEA THRIVING IN DEBUT MLS SEASON

The Revolution opened the 2017 MLS season with a fresh look in central defense, led by newcomer **Antonio Delamea**. The Slovenian has wasted no time adjusting to his new surroundings as he leads all Revolution field players with 1,789 minutes played. He also ranks tied for eighth among MLS players in interceptions (48), sixth in clearances (107), and tied for seventh in headed clearances (49).

The 25-year-old's contributions have been noted by the rest of the League and his home country. Delamea earned back-to-back selections to MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week, first garnering recognition after stifling a dangerous Portland Timbers' attack in a 1-1 draw on April 2. He also opened his MLS scoring account with a headed finish against Chicago on June 17.

Delamea's performance in MLS earned him a second career call-up to the Slovenia national team for its World Cup Qualifier against Malta. He made his first international start and played all 90 minutes of the 2-0 win.



TEAM NOTES

AGUDELO, ROWE HELP USMNT LIFT GOLD CUP TROPHY

New England Revolution forward **Juan Agudelo** and midfielder **Kelyn Rowe** both played instrumental roles in helping the U.S. Men's National Team win its first CONCACAF Gold Cup title since 2013.

Agudelo was with the USMNT's squad for the duration of the regional tournament and lifted the trophy at Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara, Calif., on July 26. The 24-year-old competed in the second Gold Cup of his career, having also represented the United States in the 2011 tournament. The Barnegat, N.J. native owns 26 career caps and has scored three goals in his international career. In the 2017 Gold Cup, Agudelo made one start against Martinique on July 12, and made two additional substitute appearance against Panama on July 8 and Nicaragua on July 15.



Rowe earned three Starting XI selections from Head Coach Bruce Arena in his debut spell with the USMNT. The Federal Way, Wash. native made his debut in the stars and stripes during a friendly against Ghana on July 1 before making two starts in the Group Stage of the Gold Cup. Rowe started in the USMNT's first Gold Cup match against Panama on July 8 and delivered an assist for the squad's lone goal. He then scored his first international goal with a clever right-footed finish against Nicaragua on July 15.



2016 TEAM MVP ROWE SHOWCASES VERSATILITY

Revolution midfielder **Kelyn Rowe** has earned his reputation as the most versatile player on the Revolution roster. The club's 2016 Team MVP made his ninth career start on the back line and his seventh start at left back in New England's 3-0 win against Philadelphia on July 29. When Rowe starts in defense, the Revolution are 4-1-4 with five clean sheets.

This season, Rowe also started at left back in two shutout victories vs. Houston on April 8 and vs. Philadelphia on July 29. Rowe's first three starts in defense came last season, when he logged minutes at every position except for center back and goalkeeper.

Rowe made two starts at right back on May 14, 2016 vs. Chicago and Aug. 24, 2016 vs. San Jose, and one at left back on Oct. 23, 2016 vs. Montreal.

THE CHOSEN JUAN: AGUDELO ON PACE FOR CAREER YEAR

Forward **Juan Agudelo** enters the second half of the season on pace for a banner year, having scored eight goals in 16 league appearances to date. Despite missing two matches to injury and three more for international duty, he remains tied for the team lead in goals.

Agudelo added his eighth tally in his first appearance back from the 2017 CONCACAF Gold Cup on July 29 vs. Philadelphia. The headed finish pushed Agudelo above his previous Revolution-career high of seven goals – a mark he also reached in 2013, 2015, and 2016.

Dating back to 2016, the 24-year-old has 14 goals in his last 24 appearances across all competitions. He closed last season with four goals and three assists over New England's final seven matches. Agudelo is particularly dangerous at home with nine goals and one assist in his last nine appearances at Gillette Stadium.

Now in his fourth campaign with the Revolution, Agudelo is beginning to etch himself into the club's record books as well. In his Revs career, he has scored 0.50 goals per 90 minutes and boasts a scoring percentage of 18.5 percent, both second best in club history. He is currently in eighth place on New England's all-time goal scoring chart with 29 goals.



WATSON SCORES FOR JAMAICA IN GOLD CUP FINAL

Revolution defender **Je-Vaughn Watson** was also a key figure in this year's Gold Cup. The Jamaican international played 90 minutes in all six of the Reggae Boyz' matches during their run to the Gold Cup Final, where he scored the team's lone goal by volleying a corner kick inside of the back post to level the score at 1-1. Watson also picked up an assist on Romario Williams' game-winning goal in Jamaica's 2-0 win against Curacao on July 9.

This year's Gold Cup marked the third of Watson's international career. The 33-year-old also played for the Reggae Boyz in the 2011 and 2015 Gold Cup tournaments. A seven-year MLS veteran, Watson owns 70 career caps, including several of them as captain, to go along with more than 150 MLS appearances.



TEAM NOTES

CALDWELL & FAGUNDEZ LEADERS IN HOMEGROWN MINUTES

Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** made history in the 15th minute of the April 8 contest against the Houston Dynamo. The seventh-year pro became the first MLS Homegrown field player to reach 10,000 career minutes. On May 6 at Columbus, midfielder **Scott Caldwell** – the second Homegrown Player signing in Revs history – also eclipsed the milestone. The pair remain the only two Homegrown field players to reach the mark, as the only other Homegrown player to do so is goalkeeper Bill Hamid (D.C. United).

After signing his first professional contract at just 15 years old, Fagundez is now a leader on the team at only 22. He is the second-longest tenured member of the Revolution behind **Chris Tierney** and is currently in the midst of an impressive run of form with four goals and four assists in his last 11 MLS games.

Caldwell has shone as a beacon of consistency in the Revolution midfield. He currently leads the team in passing accuracy at 86.56 percent and ranks second on the Revs with 612 completed passes. His performance two seasons ago led to Revolution fans and teammates voting him their MVP and Players' Player of the Year for the 2015 MLS season.

KOFFIE IMPACTFUL IN SECOND TOUR WITH REVS

Midfielder **Gershon Koffie** joined the Revolution on loan from Hammarby IF (Sweden) for the remainder of the 2017 MLS season on May 8 and picked up right where he left off in 2016. Koffie made his 2017 MLS debut as a halftime substitute against Columbus on May 21 and saw 45 minutes of action in the Revs' 2-1 win. He has started all nine of New England's matches since and has reinstated his physical presence in central midfield.

His performance this season earned the 25-year-old his first career call up to Ghana's national team. Koffie was available on the bench for Ghana's friendlies against Mexico on June 28 and vs. the United States on July 1.

With the New England Revolution last season, Koffie made 22 appearances, 19 starts, and contributed a career-high four assists. The midfielder was named to the MLSsoccer.com Team of the Week twice for his performances. Through the first month of the 2017 season, Koffie made three appearances across all competitions for Hammarby, starting two games as a defensive midfielder.

FORTRESS FOXBOROUGH: HOME RESULTS KEY FOR REVS

Maximizing points at home is key to success in MLS, and the Revolution have been effective at securing points at Gillette Stadium in 2017. Through 11 games this season, the club owns a 7-2-2 record (23 pts.) with 28 goals scored. New England enjoyed an 11-game unbeaten run (9-0-2) at Gillette Stadium that began on Sept. 3, 2016 vs. the Colorado Rapids and ended with a loss to the Chicago Fire on June 17. The Revs' 11-game home unbeaten run was the third longest in club history.

Throughout nearly all of Head Coach Jay Heaps' tenure, Gillette Stadium has provided one of the League's best home-field advantages. Since 2013, New England has totaled 44 wins at home, tied for fourth most in MLS.

KAMARA SCORES NO. 92 & 93, EYES 100TH MLS GOAL

Forward **Kei Kamara** entered the 2017 season keen on moving up the all-time goal scoring list. He broke through into the top 10 in League history in goals scored on May 13 vs. Real Salt Lake, when he tallied his 89th and tied Carlos Ruiz, and later claimed sole possession of 10th place by scoring his 90th on May 31 at New York City. With three goals in New England's last two matches, including a brace on July 29 vs. Philadelphia, he is now only seven goals shy of reaching 100.

Kamara currently ranks second among active MLS players in goals scored, trailing only San Jose's Chris Wondolowski, who has registered 129 career goals in MLS regular season play.

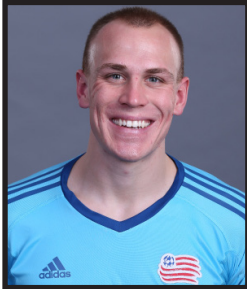
KOUASSI SHOWS CLOUT IN MIDFIELD

After making his MLS and Revolution debut against FC Dallas on March 18, midfielder and Designated Player **Xavier Kouassi** has become a dynamic force in the club's midfield. Kouassi has made 13 appearances with 10 starts on the season and played all 90 minutes in nine of 10 contests between April 2 to May 27. Perhaps his biggest moment to date came against NYCFC on May 31, when he equalized in the 86th minute and sealed an away point for the Revs despite suffering a quad injury just minutes earlier.

The 27-year-old has shown his ability to be an effective two-way player by cutting down the opposing attack and quickly transitioning to the Revolution going forward with numbers. Kouassi's 34 interceptions are currently second most on the team and tied for 10th most among MLS midfielders.

Kouassi also currently ranks third on the team in passing accuracy (85.34 percent), trailing only **Scott Caldwell** (86.56) and Antonio Delamea (86.34). His passing rate into the final third is also third best on the squad at 76.06 percent.

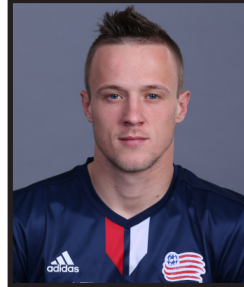

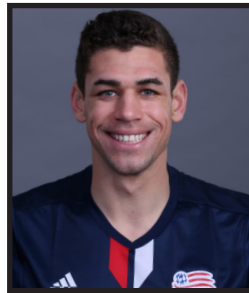

HEAD COACH

Jay Heaps is in his sixth season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after becoming the sixth head coach in club history on Nov. 14, 2011. The Nashua, N.H. native and Longmeadow, Mass. product has led the Revs to three MLS Cup Playoff appearances, including a trip to MLS Cup in 2014, and to the 2016 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final.

With his appointment in 2011, Heaps brought his hallmark qualities that fans and teammates appreciated during his playing days to the bench: spirit, energy, charisma, toughness, and passion. He is the first former Revs player and the only New England native to coach the club.

In 2016, Heaps led the Revolution to the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final – the 10th major tournament final in club history. In regular season play, Heaps oversaw the implementation of Designated Player Kei Kamara, who was acquired in a midseason trade, and helped players such as Juan Agudelo, Kelyn Rowe, and Brad Knighton flourish. After Heaps instituted a 4-4-2 formation late in the season, the team won five out of seven MLS games to close the season.

Heaps was named head coach after an 11-year MLS playing career that included nine seasons with the Revolution. He anchored the club's defense from 2001-09, making 243 appearances and 238 starts, both the third most in club history. After his retirement, Heaps remained close to the club as an ambassador and color analyst on both its television and radio broadcasts, while also working in the investment banking industry.

After earning MLS Rookie of the Year honors with the Miami Fusion in 1999, Heaps returned to his hometown club in June 2001 through a trade. During the next nine seasons in New England, he cemented his legacy as not only a fan favorite, but also a driving leader on the field and in the locker room during the team's run of four MLS Cup appearances (2002, 2005-07). He is one of three Revolution players to start in each of the club's first four MLS Cup appearances and was also a member of the Revolution squads that won the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the 2008 North American Super-Liga titles. Heaps has participated in all but one of New England's 10 final appearances as a player or coach, including all three of its Open Cup Finals.

At the time of his retirement in 2009, Heaps held the distinction of being the longest-tenured Revolution player in the team's history. When he left the team, Heaps was the club's all-time leader in games played (243), starts (238), and minutes played (21,619). He also ranked fifth on the Revs' career assist chart (26) and had totaled nine career goals. In MLS record books, Heaps was ranked eighth all-time in MLS in games played (314), fourth in starts (299), and third in minutes played (27,363) at the time of his retirement. He concluded his playing career with 17 goals and 34 assists overall.

Heaps made at least 27 regular season appearances in each of his 11 professional seasons. Despite his physical playing style and fearless nature, Heaps missed just three games due to injury during more than eight seasons with the Revolution, making him one of the most durable and reliable players in MLS history.

Honored as the Revolution's Defender of the Year for in 2009, Heaps was rewarded for his stellar play with a call-up to the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2009 CONCACAF Gold Cup. He went on to earn all four caps on his USMNT résumé during the tournament, including his international debut on July 11, 2009 against Haiti in front of his hometown crowd at Gillette Stadium. Heaps is also a former member of the U.S. Under-17 and Under-20 National Teams.

Heaps played collegiately at Duke, where he won the 1998 Missouri Athletic Club Award as the national player of the year. He was a three-time finalist for the Hermann Trophy, a four-time first-team All-ACC selection, and a four-time all-region choice. He left Duke's program ranked third in career goals (45), fourth in career assists (37), and tied for second in career points (127). In addition to earning Soccer America's National Freshman of the Year honors in 1995, Heaps also played three-and-a-half years of basketball under legendary Duke and USA Basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski before leaving midway through his senior year to pursue a professional soccer career. He was named one of Duke's "Top-10 Devils of the Decade" by the Duke Chronicle.

In addition to earning his USSF "A" Coaching License in March 2014, Heaps accrued three years of collegiate coaching experience during his MLS playing days with the Revolution. In 2004, he was a volunteer assistant coach at Boston College under Ed Kelly as the Eagles went 13-5-2 and advanced to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. He followed that with a two-year stint (2005-06) at Northeastern under Brian Ainscough in the same capacity.

Tom Soehn is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Jay Heaps' staff in January 2014.

Soehn has 13 years of MLS coaching experience as both a head coach and assistant, including three seasons with the Chicago Fire and six seasons with D.C. United. The Chicago, Ill. native began his coaching career as an assistant coach with his hometown club, the Chicago Fire, where he was Bob Bradley's first assistant in 2001 and 2002. Soehn moved to D.C. United in 2004, where he served as Peter Nowak's top assistant, helping the Black and Red win MLS Cup in 2004 and the 2006 Supporters Shield. He was promoted to head coach ahead of the 2007 season and led D.C. to a second straight Supporters Shield. In 2008, he guided D.C. to a U.S. Open Cup championship and into the group stage of the 2008-09 and 2009-10 CONCACAF Champions League tournaments.

In January 2010, Soehn was appointed as Vancouver Whitecaps FC's first Director of Soccer Operations, where he developed and managed the club's inaugural roster, player scouting, and identification and recruitment system as the club prepared to enter MLS in 2011. Soehn returned to the bench in late May 2011 and coached the team for the remainder of its debut season after head coach Teitur Thordarson was released. In 2012, he returned to the front office to direct soccer operations, helping craft the Whitecaps FC team that qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs – the first ever Canadian team to do so.

Before pursuing coaching, Soehn enjoyed a 13-year professional playing career as a defender and midfielder from 1998-2000. He played in both indoor and outdoor professional leagues during his career, including four seasons in MLS with the Dallas Burn (now FC Dallas) and the Chicago Fire. After being selected in the second round (13th overall) of the MLS Inaugural Player Draft in February 1996, Soehn saw his first action with Dallas in 1997 and helped the club win the U.S. Open Cup title.



CARLOS LLAMOSA
ASSISTANT COACH

Carlos Llamosa is in his first season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in December 2016. Llamosa, 47, has been a mainstay in North American soccer over the past two decades, having enjoyed a 15-year career in MLS as a player and a coach, as well as an additional four years coaching in the North American Soccer League.

He arrives in New England following four seasons as an assistant coach for the New York Cosmos (2013-16), a span in which he helped guide the club to three NASL Soccer Bowl Championships. Before joining New York, Llamosa spent four seasons as an assistant coach with Chivas USA in MLS from 2009-12.

Llamosa's appointment marks a homecoming for the former MLS player, who enjoyed an 11-year career as one of the league's premier defenders. He spent nearly four years with New England from 2002 to 2005, appearing in 38 games, starting 36, for the club from 2002-03 before missing the 2004 season with a knee injury. In the postseason, he made eight additional appearances for the Revolution. Llamosa was a major contributor in the club's run to the 2002 MLS Cup, as he started five matches during the postseason including the final.

He totaled 154 career MLS appearances, 142 starts, three goals, and four assists in stints with D.C. United (1997-2000), Miami Fusion (2001), New England, and Chivas USA (2006-07). With D.C., he helped the club to three straight MLS Cup appearances from 1997-99, including championships in 1997 and 1999. Prior to MLS, Llamosa played professionally in Colombia with Colmena (1986-88) and Atlético Huila (1989-90) before immigrating to the United States in 1991. He began his U.S. career with the New York Centaurs of the A-League in 1995 before being selected by D.C. United in the 1997 MLS Supplemental Draft.

A native of Palmira, Colombia, Llamosa became a United States citizen in 1991 and was capped 29 times with the U.S. Men's National team. He played in the 1999 Confederations Cup and 2002 World Cup, appearing in wins against Portugal and Mexico in the latter.



REMI ROY
ASSISTANT COACH

Remi Roy is in his eighth season with the New England Revolution as an assistant coach, having joined the coaching staff in 2010. In addition to working primarily with the first-team keepers, Roy also manages the club's collegiate scouting efforts and provides additional training for the Revolution Academy's goalkeepers.

During his time with the Revolution, Roy has mentored several different goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in MLS. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins. He also tutored rookie Matt Turner through seven starts in USL action in 2016, a stretch in which he conceded only three goals. He also worked with MLS newcomer Cody Cropper after he was acquired during the 2016 campaign, leading to a shutout victory in his MLS debut in the season finale.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07). Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

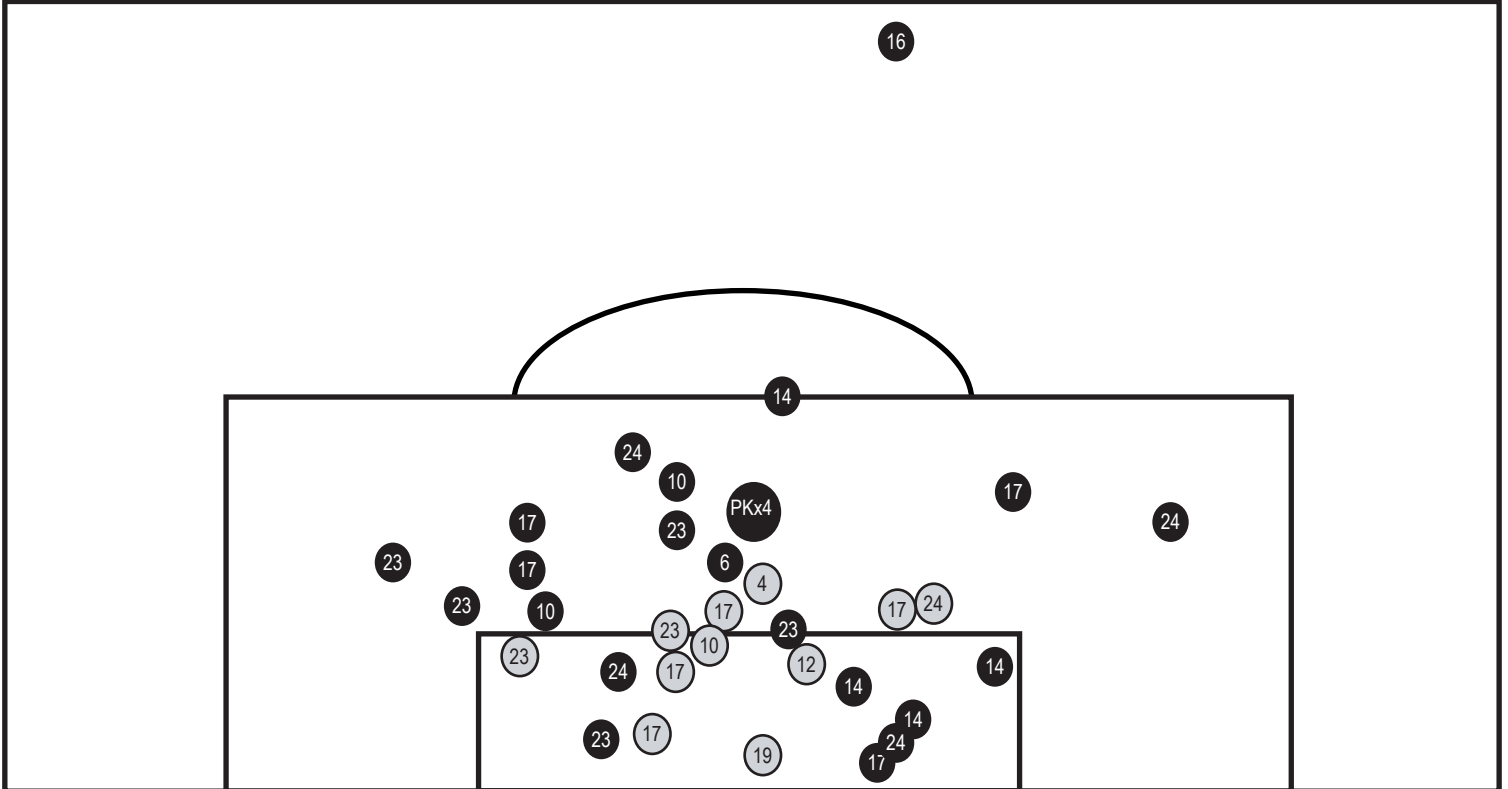
