CONCUSSION AWARENESS NIGHT WITH THINKTAYLOR

The New England Revolution and ThinkTaylor are teaming up for the Revs' third annual Concussion Awareness Night on Saturday, Sept. 2 at Gillette Stadium. ThinkTaylor, founded by the Revolution's all-time leading scorer and ESPN analyst **Taylor Twellman** in 2011, strives to change the culture of traumatic brain injuries by educating all athletes, coaches, and their families from the amateur level through the professional ranks.

During the match on Saturday, fans will participate in an "Orange Out" of Gillette Stadium during the 20th minute. Orange ThinkTaylor posters featuring the #TTPLedge will be distributed to the first 10,000 fans as they enter the stadium, and all fans are also encouraged to wear orange to the match.

The Revs' Concussion Awareness Night takes place ahead of Concussion Awareness Week in Massachusetts from Sept. 11-15, during which more than 85,000 student athletes will receive concussion education and take the #TTPLedge.

New England Revolution Head Coach Jay Heaps

On facing Orlando City SC for the first time in 2017:

Coach Heaps: "They are very dangerous. You add someone like Dom Dwyer to your team – anytime – you're going to be a good team. That's what they are. They're tough to break down at times as well. It's going to be a big game for us."

New England Revolution Forward Juan Agudelo

On the team's confidence level going into a two-game homestand:

Agudelo: "The confidence is very high, because we're a very tough team to beat at home. It's very important for us to get three points and we need everyone to put in an effort, because I know we're going to miss a couple of guys [due to international duty], but we're fairly confident at home."

New England Revolution Defender Andrew Farrell

On the team's mentality heading into the regular season's final nine games:

Farrell: "For us, the playoffs start now. Every game is important. Every game at home is important. We must win a lot of the games left to give ourselves a chance, so that's the mentality. Every game, we take it one by one, but every game is a playoff game. Orlando coming up this Saturday, it's a must-win. We're gearing for that and that's where the mentality is at."

WHAT TO WATCH FOR vs. ORLANDO CITY SC

Team:

- The Revs keeping a clean sheet in three straight home games for the first time since a four-game stretch in 2014 (March 22 - May 11). The club record for consecutive home shutouts is five games (April 9 - May 28, 2005).
- The club improving on its 8-2-2 record at Gillette Stadium this season.
- New England recording at least nine home wins in the regular season for the fourth consecutive MLS campaign. The Revs have earned at least 10 home wins in four MLS seasons and last did so in 2014.

Individual:

- **F Teal Bunbury** scoring his sixth goal since the beginning of July. The forward has recorded five goals in the club's last seven matches.
- **F Kei Kamara** scoring his 100th overall MLS goal between the regular season (94) and postseason (5). Only 11 players in league history have previously accomplished the feat.
- **F Juan Agudelo** scoring his 30th career Revolution goal.
- **M Lee Nguyen** scoring two goals to become the second player in club history with 50 goals as a Revolution player.
- **Nguyen** (8 goals/10 assists) potentially becoming the first MLS player to record 10 goals and 10 assists in 2017.
- **M Diego Fagundez** scoring two goals to become the fifth player in club history to record 40 goals as a Revolution player.
- **D Chris Tierney** (455) delivering two corner kicks to pass Steve Ralston for the all-time club record, which currently stands at 456 career corners.

REVOLUTION - ORLANDO CITY CONNECTIONS

- Revolution Head Coach **Jay Heaps** and Orlando City SC Head Coach **Jason Kreis** both played collegiately at Duke. Kreis (1991-94) graduated one year before Heaps (1995-98) arrived on campus.
- Orlando City defender **Kevin Alston** played seven seasons with the Revolution (2009-15) and made more than 150 appearances for the club, including MLS Cup in 2014.
- Revolution forward **Juan Agudelo** and Orlando City SC defender **Jonathan Spector** have shared the field with the United States Men's National Team multiple times, including when Agudelo became the youngest player to score for the USMNT on Nov. 17, 2010 against South Africa. Forward **Teal Bunbury** was also on the field when Agudelo scored the historic goal.
- Revolution midfielder **Diego Fagundez** and Orlando City SC defender **José Aja** were both born in Montevideo, Uruguay.
- Revolution defender **Je-Vaughn Watson** and Orlando City forward **Giles Barnes** were teammates on the Houston Dynamo in 2012. The pair have also played together at the senior international level for Jamaica.

WHEN THE REVS SCORE, BOSTON SCORES

The Revolution and Boston SCORES have teamed up through the "Revs Score, Boston SCORES" initiative to assist under-resourced youth in the greater Boston area. For every goal the Revolution score at Gillette Stadium this season, the New England Revolution Charitable Foundation will contribute \$100, which equates to the cost of one week of programming for a child. Through 12 home games in 2017, the Revs have raised **\$2,900** for Boston SCORES, or **29 weeks of programming**.

The collaboration, which began in October 2016, expands player involvement with youth in Boston SCORES' after-school program through Academy-run soccer clinics and participation in SCORES' Service Learning Projects.

In addition, the 13th annual SCORES Cup at Gillette Stadium on July 15 raised over \$320,000 for Boston SCORES. In partnership with the Revolution, the corporate charity soccer tournament brought over 600 players and more than 50 sponsors together for the record-breaking fundraising event.

For every Revolution goal scored at Gillette Stadium this season, the New England Revolution Charitable Foundation will contribute \$100 per goal to BOSTON SCORES.

TEAM NOTES

DIELNA DELIVERS IN FIRST TWO REVS APPEARANCES

On July 28, the New England Revolution signed defender and Designated Player **Claude Dielna**, a 29-year-old left-footed center back with more than 10 seasons of professional experience in France, England, Romania, and Slovakia. Dielna made his Revolution/MLS debut on August 20 at NYCFC, where he played 90 minutes and recorded two tackles, two clearances, and one interception. He submitted another strong, 90-minute shift the following week against D.C. United on Aug. 26.

Following his debut against New York City, forward **Teal Bunbury** was effusive in his praise for Dielna's performance: "Coming into a new team, a new environment, a new culture, a new playing style probably for him, and I think he fit in just great. ... He's a special type of player."

In addition to his contributions along back line, teammates are also noting the veteran's vocal presence in the locker room. "He's a very vocal, physical presence," defender **Andrew Farrell** said. "I think he leads in practice and in the locker room and in games. It's something that I think we need more of and I'm glad to have that."



FINDING NEMO: REVS ADD KRISZTIÁN NÉMETH

New England added another piece to its attacking group before the close of the secondary transfer window, acquiring former Sporting Kansas City forward and Hungarian international **Krisztián Németh**. Németh was officially acquired on Aug. 9 via a trade with Columbus Crew SC, which used its top position in the MLS Allocation Ranking Order to sign the forward before trading him to the Revolution in exchange for Targeted Allocation Money in 2018, General Allocation Money in 2018, and an international roster spot through the 2018 season.



Németh, 28, brings 12 seasons of professional experience to New England, having totaled 205 senior appearances, 62 goals, and 43 assists across all competitions in his club career. He most recently spent two seasons with Al-Gharafa SC of the top-flight Qatar Stars League, scoring 12 goals with five assists in 24 league appearances, including 22 starts. A proven MLS goal scorer, Németh spent the 2015 season with Sporting Kansas City and totaled 16 goals and seven assists across all competitions, including five goals en route to the 2015 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title. He also has playing experience in Greece, Hungary, Netherlands, and England, where he signed for Liverpool FC at age 18 and starred for the Liverpool Reserves.

STREAKING STRIKERS: BUNBURY AND KAMARA IN TOP FORM

Since the beginning of July, the Revolution's attack has been catalyzed by veteran forwards **Teal Bunbury** and **Kei Kamara**. With Bunbury's five goals and Kamara's four tallies since July 5, the pair is responsible for nine of New England's 11 goals during that seven-game span.

Bunbury has seen his production explode since he opened his 2017 account on July 5. In the team's next match against LA on July 22, he came in as a substitute and recorded his first Revolution brace with two goals in a four-minute span. Similarly, Kamara has four goals and one assist in the team's last six games, including his 15th career brace in a 3-0 win against Philadelphia on July 29. His next goal will be No. 100 in his MLS career between the regular season and postseason, a milestone only 11 other MLS players have ever reached.

LEE-DING THE PACK: NGUYEN EYES MLS ASSISTS LEAD

Midfielder **Lee Nguyen** currently owns 10 assists on the season, which matches his previous career high set in 2015 and 2016. Nguyen enters Saturday's matchup with Orlando City SC just four assists shy of the league lead, currently held by Toronto's Victor Vazquez (14). With two more goals, Nguyen could become the first MLS player with 10 goals and 10 helpers in 2017.

With 10 assists in each of the last three seasons, Nguyen's distribution places him in elite company in both Revolution history and recent MLS history. Here's a closer look at some facts on Nguyen's assist totals dating back to 2015:

- Nguyen is the only Revolution player to record at least 10 assists in three different seasons. Steve Ralston is the only other Revs player with two such campaigns.
- He is also the only player in Revolution history with double-digit assists in consecutive seasons (now three straight from 2015-17).
- Only two MLS players - Nguyen and Sacha Kljestan - have recorded at least 10 assists in each of the last three MLS seasons.
- Nguyen's 30 assists dating back to 2015 are the fourth most in MLS during that span.

FOR THE NGUYEN: LEE AMONG TOP 5 IN CHANCES CREATED

Midfielder **Lee Nguyen** has been a key driver of the New England attack this season. Nguyen currently leads the team in assists with 10 and is tied with **Juan Agudelo** and **Kei Kamara** for the team lead in goals scored (8). In addition, Opta has Nguyen ranked fifth in MLS with 69 chances created, despite missing New England's last two matches due to injuries.

With his assist on May 31 at New York City, Nguyen joined former Revolution player and all-time MLS assists leader Steve Ralston (42 goals, 73 assists) as the only players in Revs history with at least 40 goals and 40 assists. Nguyen has 48 goals and 44 assists in 183 career MLS appearances.

KAMARA CLOSING IN ON TRIPLE-DIGIT GOALS

Forward **Kei Kamara** entered the 2017 season keen on moving up the all-time goal scoring list. He broke into the top 10 in MLS history in goals scored on May 13 vs. Real Salt Lake, when he tallied his 89th and tied Carlos Ruiz, and later claimed sole possession of 10th place by scoring his 90th on May 31 at New York City.

With four goals in New England's last six matches, Kamara is now only six goals shy of reaching 100 regular season tallies. His next MLS goal will be No. 100 overall between the regular season and MLS Cup Playoffs, making him the 12th member of MLS' triple-digit club.

Kamara currently ranks second among active MLS players in goals scored, trailing only San Jose's Chris Wondolowski, who has registered 132 career goals in MLS regular season play.

CALDWELL & FAGUNDEZ LEADERS IN HOMEGROWN MINUTES

Midfielder **Diego Fagundez** made history in the 15th minute of the April 8 contest against the Houston Dynamo. The seventh-year pro became the first MLS Homegrown field player to reach 10,000 career minutes. On May 6 at Columbus, midfielder **Scott Caldwell** – the second Homegrown Player signing in Revs history – became the second Homegrown field player to eclipse the milestone. The pair remain two of only four Homegrown field players ever to reach the mark, while D.C. United goalkeeper Bill Hamid was the first Homegrown to reach the mark.

After signing his first professional contract at just 15 years old, Fagundez is now a leader on the team at only 22. He is the second-longest tenured member of the Revolution behind **Chris Tierney** and has been a major contributor this season with four goals, seven assists, and 26 shots on goal.

Caldwell has shone as a beacon of consistency in the Revolution midfield. He currently leads the team in passing accuracy at 86.48 percent and ranks fourth on the Revs with 646 completed passes. His performance two seasons ago led to Revolution fans and teammates voting him their MVP and Players' Player of the Year for the 2015 MLS season.

FORTRESS FOXBOROUGH: HOME RESULTS KEY FOR REVS

Maximizing points at home is key to success in MLS, and the Revolution have been effective at securing points at Gillette Stadium in 2017. Through 12 home games this season, the club owns an 8-2-2 record (26 pts.) with 29 goals scored (2.4 goals per game). New England enjoyed an 11-game unbeaten run (9-0-2) at Gillette Stadium that began on Sept. 3, 2016 vs. the Colorado Rapids and ended with a loss to the Chicago Fire on June 17. The Revs' 11-game home unbeaten run was the third longest in club history.

Throughout nearly all of Head Coach Jay Heaps' tenure, Gillette Stadium has provided one of the League's best home-field advantages. Since 2013, New England has totaled 45 wins at home, the fourth most in MLS.

DELAMEA THRIVING IN DEBUT MLS CAMPAIGN

The Revolution opened the 2017 MLS season with a fresh look in central defense, led by newcomer **Antonio Delamea**. The Slovenian has wasted no time adjusting to his new surroundings as he leads all Revolution field players with 2,059 minutes played. He also ranks tied for seventh among MLS players in interceptions (55), fourth in clearances (129), and fourth in headed clearances (64).

The 26-year-old's contributions have been noted by the rest of the League and his home country. Delamea earned back-to-back selections to MLSsoccer.com's Team of the Week in Weeks 4 and 5 of this season. He later opened his MLS scoring account with a headed finish against Chicago on June 17.

Delamea's performance in MLS also continues to catch the eye of Slovenia's national team. He will miss the Sept. 2 match for Slovenia's pair of upcoming World Cup Qualifiers at Slovakia on Sept. 1 and vs. Lithuania on Sept. 4. He previously made his first international start in a World Cup Qualifier against Malta and played all 90 minutes in the 2-0 win.

FARRELL, NGUYEN AMONG MLS IRON MEN

Two Revolution players – defender **Andrew Farrell** (13,487) and midfielder **Lee Nguyen** (13,136) – rank first and second, respectively, among all MLS field players in minutes played dating back to the beginning of the 2013 season.

Both players also rank among the top 10 in games played, as do midfielders **Diego Fagundez**, (4th - 150 games played), **Kelyn Rowe** (T-6th - 148 games played) and **Scott Caldwell** (T-9th - 145 games played). Farrell and Nguyen are tied for second with 153 appearances, trailing only Felipe, who has played in 155 games since 2013.

WATSON TO FEATURE IN FRIENDLY FOR JAMAICA

Revolution defender **Je-Vaughn Watson** has been a key figure in Jamaican football in the last few years. He has led the Reggae Boyz to consecutive runner-up finishes in the CONCACAF Gold Cup, featuring as captain in several of those matches. Watson, the owner of 70 career caps and four international goals, has joined Jamaica for a friendly against Canada at BMO Field in Toronto on Saturday, Sept. 2.

This year's Gold Cup marked the third of Watson's international career. The 33-year-old also played for the Reggae Boyz in the 2011 and 2015 Gold Cup tournaments. In the 2017 Gold Cup, the seventh-year MLS veteran scored Jamaica's lone goal in the 2017 Gold Cup final against the United States and added an assist on Romario Williams' game-winning goal in Jamaica's 2-0 win against Curacao on July 9.



AGUDELO ON PACE FOR CAREER YEAR

Forward **Juan Agudelo** enters the final stretch of the regular season on pace for a banner year, having scored eight goals in 20 league appearances to date. Despite missing two matches to injury and three more for international duty, where helped the U.S. Men's National Team raise the 2017 CONCACAF Gold Cup trophy, he remains tied with **Kei Kamara** and **Lee Nguyen** for the team lead in goals.

Agudelo added his eighth tally in his first appearance back from the 2017 Gold Cup on July 29 vs. Philadelphia. The headed finish pushed Agudelo above his previous Revolution-career high of seven goals – a mark he also reached in 2013, 2015, and 2016. One more tally will match his overall career high of nine goals set in 2013 with both New England and Chivas USA.

Dating back to 2016, the 24-year-old has 14 goals in his last 28 appearances across all competitions. Agudelo is particularly dangerous at home with nine goals and one assist in his last 10 appearances at Gillette Stadium.

Now in his fourth campaign with the Revolution, Agudelo is beginning to etch himself into the club's record books as well. In his Revs career, he has scored 0.48 goals per 90 minutes and boasts a scoring percentage of 18.5 percent, both second best in club history. He is currently in eighth place on New England's all-time goal scoring chart with 29 goals.

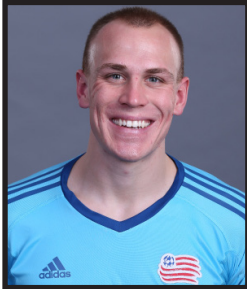
Revolution midfielder **Kelyn Rowe** has earned his reputation as the most versatile player on the Revolution roster. The club's 2016 Team MVP made his 10th career start on the back line and his eighth career start at left back in New England's match at Chicago on August 5. When Rowe starts in defense, the Revolution are 4-2-4 with five clean sheets.

This season, Rowe started at left back in two shutout victories vs. Houston on April 8 and vs. Philadelphia on July 29. Rowe's first three career starts in a defensive position all came last season, when he logged minutes at every position except for center back and goalkeeper. He then scored his first international goal with a clever right-footed finish against Nicaragua on July 15.

JAY HEAPS
HEAD COACH

Jay Heaps is in his sixth season as Head Coach of the New England Revolution after becoming the sixth head coach in club history on Nov. 14, 2011. The Nashua, N.H. native and Longmeadow, Mass. product has led the Revs to three MLS Cup Playoff appearances, including a trip to MLS Cup in 2014, and to the 2016 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final.

With his appointment in 2011, Heaps brought his hallmark qualities that fans and teammates appreciated during his playing days to the bench: spirit, energy, charisma, toughness, and passion. He is the first former Revs player and the only New England native to coach the club.

In 2016, Heaps led the Revolution to the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final – the 10th major tournament final in club history. In regular season play, Heaps oversaw the implementation of Designated Player Kei Kamara, who was acquired in a midseason trade, and helped players such as Juan Agudelo, Kelyn Rowe, and Brad Knighton flourish. After Heaps instituted a 4-4-2 formation late in the season, the team won five out of seven MLS games to close the season.

Heaps was named head coach after an 11-year MLS playing career that included nine seasons with the Revolution. He anchored the club's defense from 2001-09, making 243 appearances and 238 starts, both the third most in club history. After his retirement, Heaps remained close to the club as an ambassador and color analyst on both its television and radio broadcasts, while also working in the investment banking industry.

After earning MLS Rookie of the Year honors with the Miami Fusion in 1999, Heaps returned to his hometown club in June 2001 through a trade. During the next nine seasons in New England, he cemented his legacy as not only a fan favorite, but also a driving leader on the field and in the locker room during the team's run of four MLS Cup appearances (2002, 2005-07). He is one of three Revolution players to start in each of the club's first four MLS Cup appearances and was also a member of the Revolution squads that won the 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup and the 2008 North American Super-Liga titles. Heaps has participated in all but one of New England's 10 final appearances as a player or coach, including all three of its Open Cup Finals.

At the time of his retirement in 2009, Heaps held the distinction of being the longest-tenured Revolution player in the team's history. When he left the team, Heaps was the club's all-time leader in games played (243), starts (238), and minutes played (21,619). He also ranked fifth on the Revs' career assist chart (26) and had totaled nine career goals. In MLS record books, Heaps was ranked eighth all-time in MLS in games played (314), fourth in starts (299), and third in minutes played (27,363) at the time of his retirement. He concluded his playing career with 17 goals and 34 assists overall.

Heaps made at least 27 regular season appearances in each of his 11 professional seasons. Despite his physical playing style and fearless nature, Heaps missed just three games due to injury during more than eight seasons with the Revolution, making him one of the most durable and reliable players in MLS history.

Honored as the Revolution's Defender of the Year for in 2009, Heaps was rewarded for his stellar play with a call-up to the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2009 CONCACAF Gold Cup. He went on to earn all four caps on his USMNT résumé during the tournament, including his international debut on July 11, 2009 against Haiti in front of his hometown crowd at Gillette Stadium. Heaps is also a former member of the U.S. Under-17 and Under-20 National Teams.

Heaps played collegiately at Duke, where he won the 1998 Missouri Athletic Club Award as the national player of the year. He was a three-time finalist for the Hermann Trophy, a four-time first-team All-ACC selection, and a four-time all-region choice. He left Duke's program ranked third in career goals (45), fourth in career assists (37), and tied for second in career points (127). In addition to earning Soccer America's National Freshman of the Year honors in 1995, Heaps also played three-and-a-half years of basketball under legendary Duke and USA Basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski before leaving midway through his senior year to pursue a professional soccer career. He was named one of Duke's "Top-10 Devils of the Decade" by the Duke Chronicle.

In addition to earning his USSF "A" Coaching License in March 2014, Heaps accrued three years of collegiate coaching experience during his MLS playing days with the Revolution. In 2004, he was a volunteer assistant coach at Boston College under Ed Kelly as the Eagles went 13-5-2 and advanced to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. He followed that with a two-year stint (2005-06) at Northeastern under Brian Ainscough in the same capacity.

TOM SOEHN
ASSISTANT COACH

Tom Soehn is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Jay Heaps' staff in January 2014.

Soehn has 13 years of MLS coaching experience as both a head coach and assistant, including three seasons with the Chicago Fire and six seasons with D.C. United. The Chicago, Ill. native began his coaching career as an assistant coach with his hometown club, the Chicago Fire, where he was Bob Bradley's first assistant in 2001 and 2002. Soehn moved to D.C. United in 2004, where he served as Peter Nowak's top assistant, helping the Black and Red win MLS Cup in 2004 and the 2006 Supporters Shield. He was promoted to head coach ahead of the 2007 season and led D.C. to a second straight Supporters Shield. In 2008, he guided D.C. to a U.S. Open Cup championship and into the group stage of the 2008-09 and 2009-10 CONCACAF Champions League tournaments.

In January 2010, Soehn was appointed as Vancouver Whitecaps FC's first Director of Soccer Operations, where he developed and managed the club's inaugural roster, player scouting, and identification and recruitment system as the club prepared to enter MLS in 2011. Soehn returned to the bench in late May 2011 and coached the team for the remainder of its debut season after head coach Teitur Thordarson was released. In 2012, he returned to the front office to direct soccer operations, helping craft the Whitecaps FC team that qualified for the MLS Cup Playoffs – the first ever Canadian team to do so.

Before pursuing coaching, Soehn enjoyed a 13-year professional playing career as a defender and midfielder from 1998-2000. He played in both indoor and outdoor professional leagues during his career, including four seasons in MLS with the Dallas Burn (now FC Dallas) and the Chicago Fire. After being selected in the second round (13th overall) of the MLS Inaugural Player Draft in February 1996, Soehn saw his first action with Dallas in 1997 and helped the club win the U.S. Open Cup title.



CARLOS LLAMOSA
ASSISTANT COACH

Carlos Llamosa is in his first season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in December 2016. Llamosa, 47, has been a mainstay in North American soccer over the past two decades, having enjoyed a 15-year career in MLS as a player and a coach, as well as an additional four years coaching in the North American Soccer League.

He arrives in New England following four seasons as an assistant coach for the New York Cosmos (2013-16), a span in which he helped guide the club to three NASL Soccer Bowl Championships. Before joining New York, Llamosa spent four seasons as an assistant coach with Chivas USA in MLS from 2009-12.

Llamosa's appointment marks a homecoming for the former MLS player, who enjoyed an 11-year career as one of the league's premier defenders. He spent nearly four years with New England from 2002 to 2005, appearing in 38 games, starting 36, for the club from 2002-03 before missing the 2004 season with a knee injury. In the postseason, he made eight additional appearances for the Revolution. Llamosa was a major contributor in the club's run to the 2002 MLS Cup, as he started five matches during the postseason including the final.

He totaled 154 career MLS appearances, 142 starts, three goals, and four assists in stints with D.C. United (1997-2000), Miami Fusion (2001), New England, and Chivas USA (2006-07). With D.C., he helped the club to three straight MLS Cup appearances from 1997-99, including championships in 1997 and 1999. Prior to MLS, Llamosa played professionally in Colombia with Colmena (1986-88) and Atlético Huila (1989-90) before immigrating to the United States in 1991. He began his U.S. career with the New York Centaurs of the A-League in 1995 before being selected by D.C. United in the 1997 MLS Supplemental Draft.

A native of Palmira, Colombia, Llamosa became a United States citizen in 1991 and was capped 29 times with the U.S. Men's National team. He played in the 1999 Confederations Cup and 2002 World Cup, appearing in wins against Portugal and Mexico in the latter.



REMI ROY
ASSISTANT COACH

Remi Roy is in his eighth season with the New England Revolution as an assistant coach, having joined the coaching staff in 2010. In addition to working primarily with the first-team keepers, Roy also manages the club's collegiate scouting efforts and provides additional training for the Revolution Academy's goalkeepers.

During his time with the Revolution, Roy has mentored several different goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in MLS. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins. He also tutored rookie Matt Turner through seven starts in USL action in 2016, a stretch in which he conceded only three goals. He also worked with MLS newcomer Cody Cropper after he was acquired during the 2016 campaign, leading to a shutout victory in his MLS debut in the season finale.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07). Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

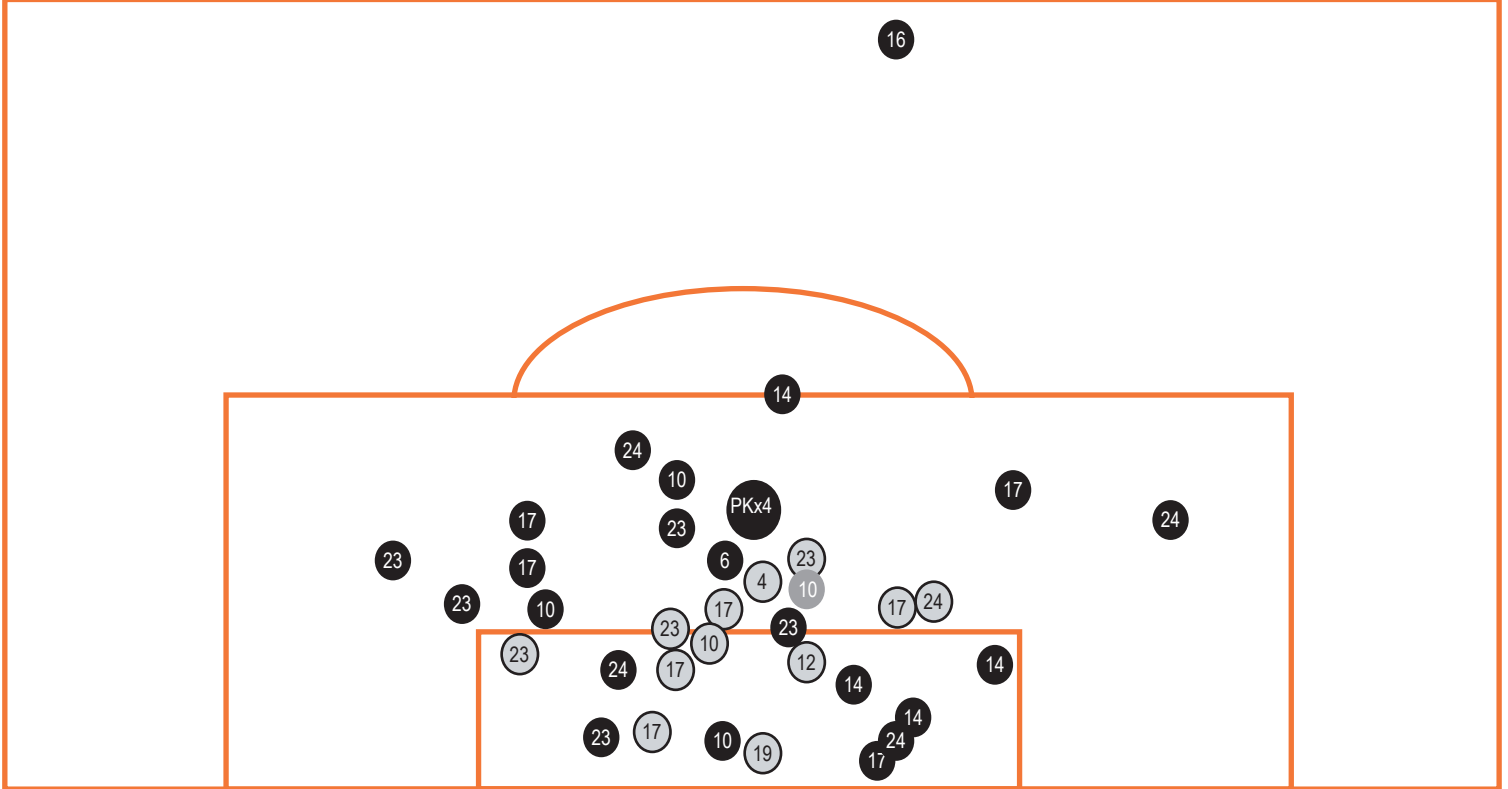
