Revolution Acquire \$250,000 in General Allocation Money from Inter Miami CF

New England sends 2026 international roster spot to Inter Miami CF

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. (August 15, 2026) – The New England Revolution have acquired \$250,000 in General Allocation Money from Inter Miami CF in exchange for a 2026 international roster spot, which will expire on Dec. 31, 2026. New England will receive \$125,000 in 2026 GAM and \$125,000 in 2027 GAM.

General Allocation Money, or GAM, is one of several mechanisms MLS clubs deploy to add talent to the roster. In addition to the Salary Budget and the six prime roster spots that feature unlimited spending on up to three Designated Players and up to four U22 Initiative Spots, General Allocation Money can be used to sign or retain top talent. Along with the annual allotment of \$3.28 million GAM provided to each team in 2026, clubs can acquire GAM in the following ways:

- Up to \$3 million from eligible transfer revenue converted to GAM.
- Via trade with another MLS club.
- Qualifying for the CONCACAF Champions Cup.
- Failing to qualify for the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs.
- The 2025 third Designated Player charge distribution.
- Clubs can also receive up to an additional \$2 million in 2026 GAM along with a fourth U22 Initiative Roster Spot if they select the U22 Initiative Roster Construction Path.

TRANSACTION: New England Revolution acquire \$125,000 in 2026 General Allocation Money (GAM) and an additional \$125,000 in 2027 GAM from Inter Miami CF in exchange for a 2026 International Roster Slot, which will expire on Dec. 31, 2026.

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About the New England Revolution

The New England Revolution, owned and operated by the Kraft family, began play in 1996 as one of the original founding clubs of Major League Soccer (MLS). Through 30 MLS seasons, the Revolution are five-time MLS Eastern Conference champions and claimed the 2021 Supporters' Shield after a record-setting campaign. The Revolution also won the 2008 North American SuperLiga and 2007 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup titles. The Revolution play their home matches at Gillette Stadium in Foxborough, Mass. The club and its acclaimed pro pathway, including Revolution II (MLS NEXT Pro) and the Revolution Academy, are headquartered at the Revolution Training Center, which opened ahead of the 2020 season.

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
